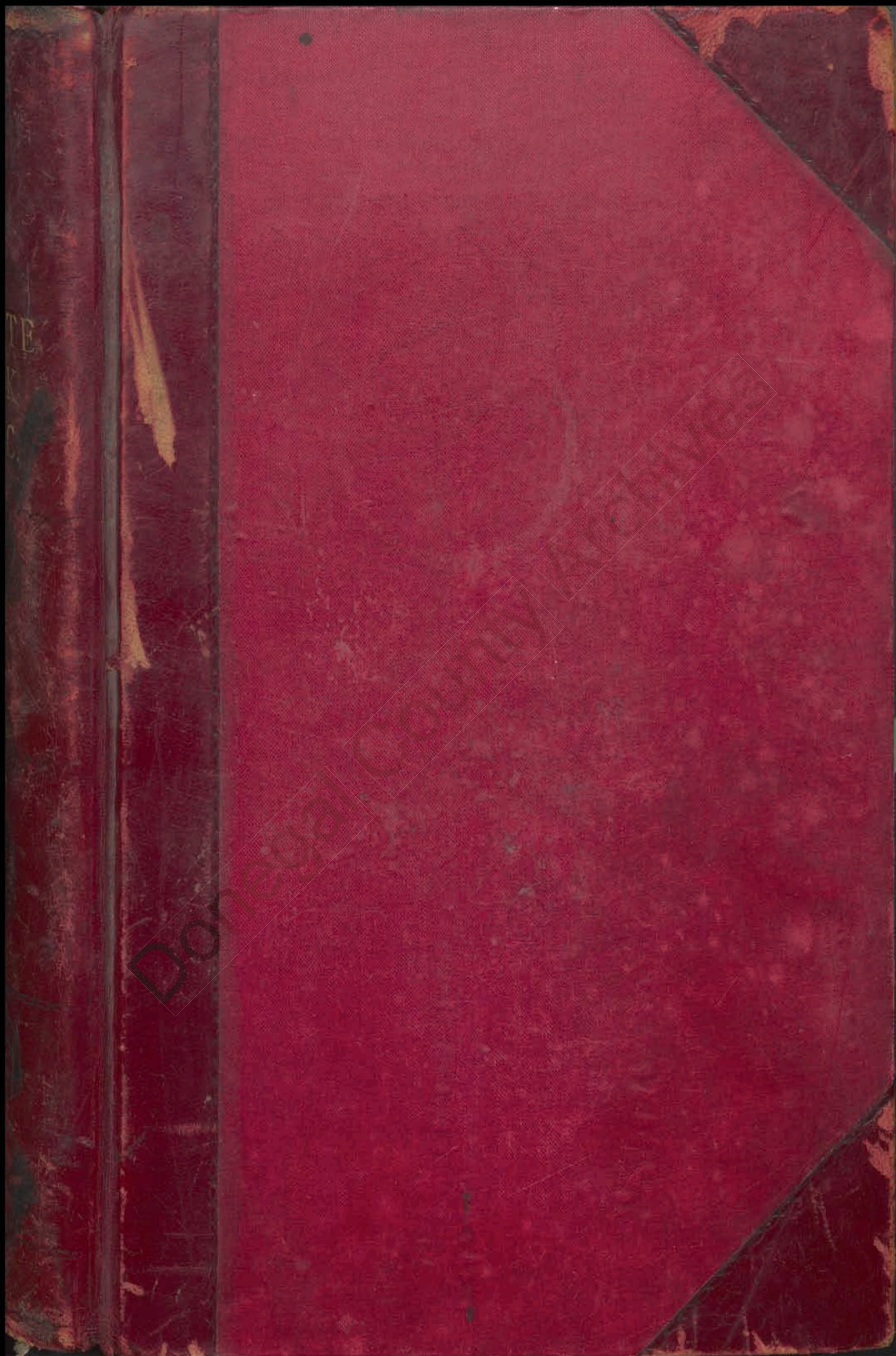



Sir. With reference to the salary of £20 a year proposed to be allowed me as Clerk of the Dunshaughy Rural District, I regret to say that I could not undertake to perform the duties for the sum mentioned. As I wrote you yesterday I was under the impression the emoluments connected with the office of Clerk of the Union, were worth over £30 a year, & in this I was quite mistaken. When I was elected on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Dec. last, I was called before the Board and asked by the Chairman if I was willing to leave the fixing of my salary as Clerk of the District Council in the hands of the Local Government Board, as a letter No 73139 dated 21<sup>st</sup> Decemr 1900. was before the meeting stating that the salary of Clerk of the District Council would be determined by them under Section 85(2) of the Local Government Act (1898) and of course I was only too happy to acquiesce in any arrangement the Local Government Board thought proper to make. But I must respectfully decline to undertake arduous and responsible duties for a salary of £20 a year, and I would ask your Board to kindly exercise the powers conferred on them by the Act, under the above-mentioned Sections, and fix my remuneration at a figure proportionate to the duties I am called upon to perform.

In reference to the above, it was proposed by Mr. Wolgan & seconded by Mr. Griffith that the consideration of the above subject be postponed, and that the Clerk be requested to write to the Secretary of the County Council asking to be appointed for the checking of the Rate Collectors Books. Maintenance Contractors have with some exceptions kept their roads in fair repair during the past three months. A few near the railway have been badly neglected; one in particular the Post Road between Coll's public House and Gesslongh has been entirely neglected deserted; and has been in a very bad state; the Contractor has given a few days notice both by myself and my assistant; I could not obtain a local contractor to give a satisfactory proposal to repair it but Messrs Pauling's have undertaken the work. Unfortunately a strike occurred which delayed the repairs. The old contract expired on March 18<sup>th</sup> and the new Contractor commences his on 1st April 1901. I am making application for renewing the continuing Maintenance Contracts which will expire in July. Also a few masonry repairs which I consider are necessary. You are doubtless aware that the Local Government Board are proposing to give the County and District Councils power to repair and maintain roads by direct labour (if the Councils think fit to do so) I am of opinion that in your District <sup>district</sup> labour would not be advantageous "chiefly" because it is much more costly, and would only be suitable "or practicable" in the case of first class roads.

at first and second class, and it is doubtful whether the roads would be kept in better repair. Direct labour requires close supervision, and it would be necessary to have a number of overseers who would be paid high wages: I believe the cost would probably be double what it is at present. Direct labour is best suited to Districts where there is a great amount of traffic and can afford to use "Steam Rollers" Scrapers, Sweeping Machines &c, and use the Council own quarries and Stone Breakers. The length of roads in this District First Class is  $26\frac{1}{3}$  Miles, costing about  $9\frac{1}{4}$  per perch per annum. The greater part of the labour and materials is supplied during the period between 1st October and 1st March each year, and consequently a larger staff would be required during that period; so that a permanent staff could not be employed, which would be a great disadvantage. I believe the 1st class roads could not be maintained for less than  $5\frac{1}{2}$  per perch per annum as compared with the present average cost of  $9\frac{1}{4}$  per perch per annum. Also that by reason of the increased in wages and consequent increase in the cost of maintaining the roads, there will be an extremely small margin to expend on new works. My estimate which I consider as low as can be made for such maintenance is £1580 for the financial year just commenced and the limit of expenditure is £1648:15:0 leaving only £64 for new works. It might be advisable to petition the Local Government Board under the Local G. Act 1898 Sec 27 sub Sec (2) to increase the annual limit of expenditure. The amount applied for on sheet for this quarter is £611:0:0 exclusive of County Surveyors Renewals of Maintenance Contracts amounting to £113:5:0. The amount of existing liabilities (continuing maintenance contracts) running from 1st April 1904 is £1239:10:0. Adding the renewals now applied for (£113:5:0) makes the total of maintenance contracts £1352:15:0 and deducting this amount from the legal annual limit of expenditure gives a balance to expend of £296. The amount applied for on the sheet is £315:0:0 in excess of that amount.

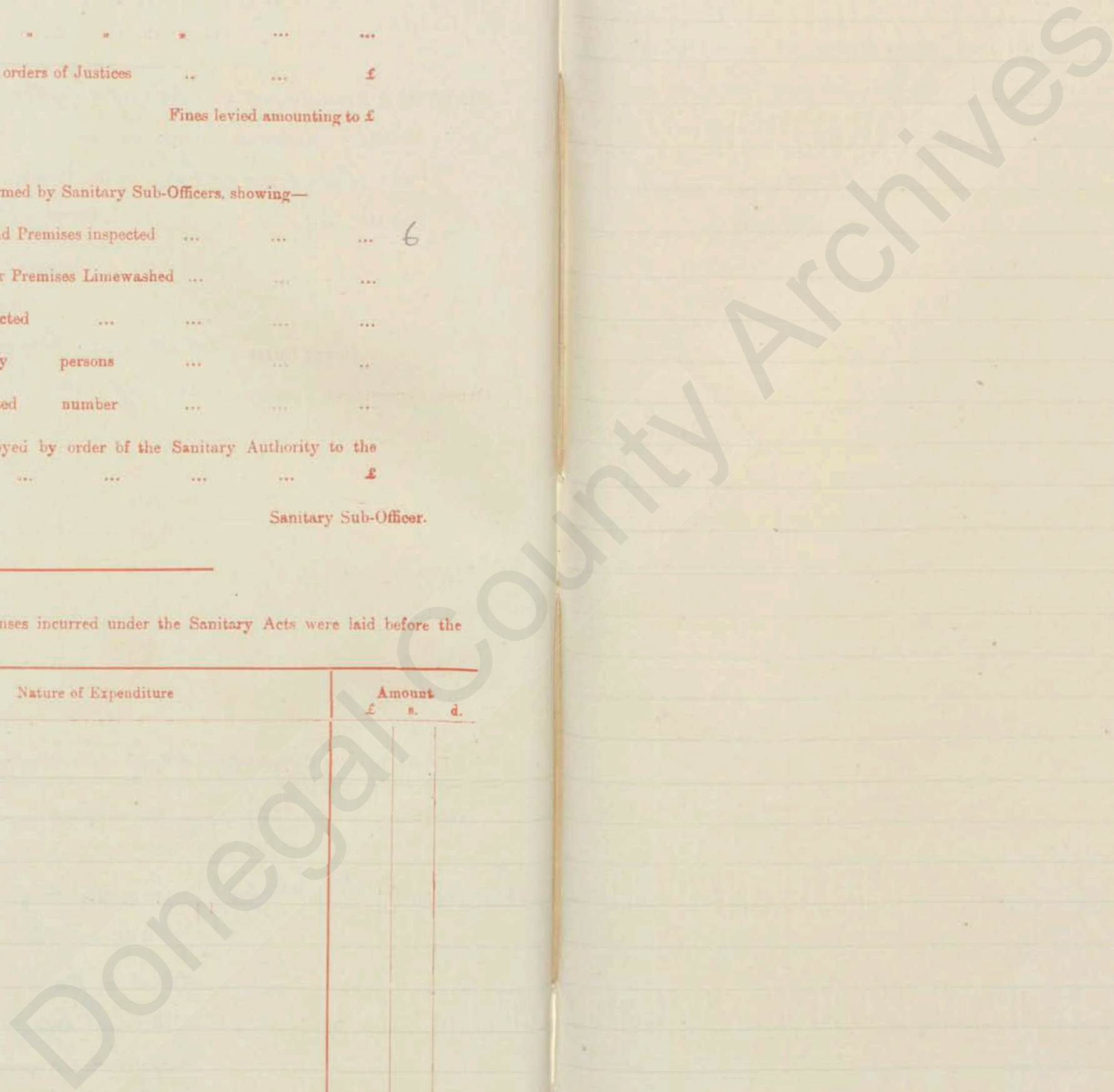

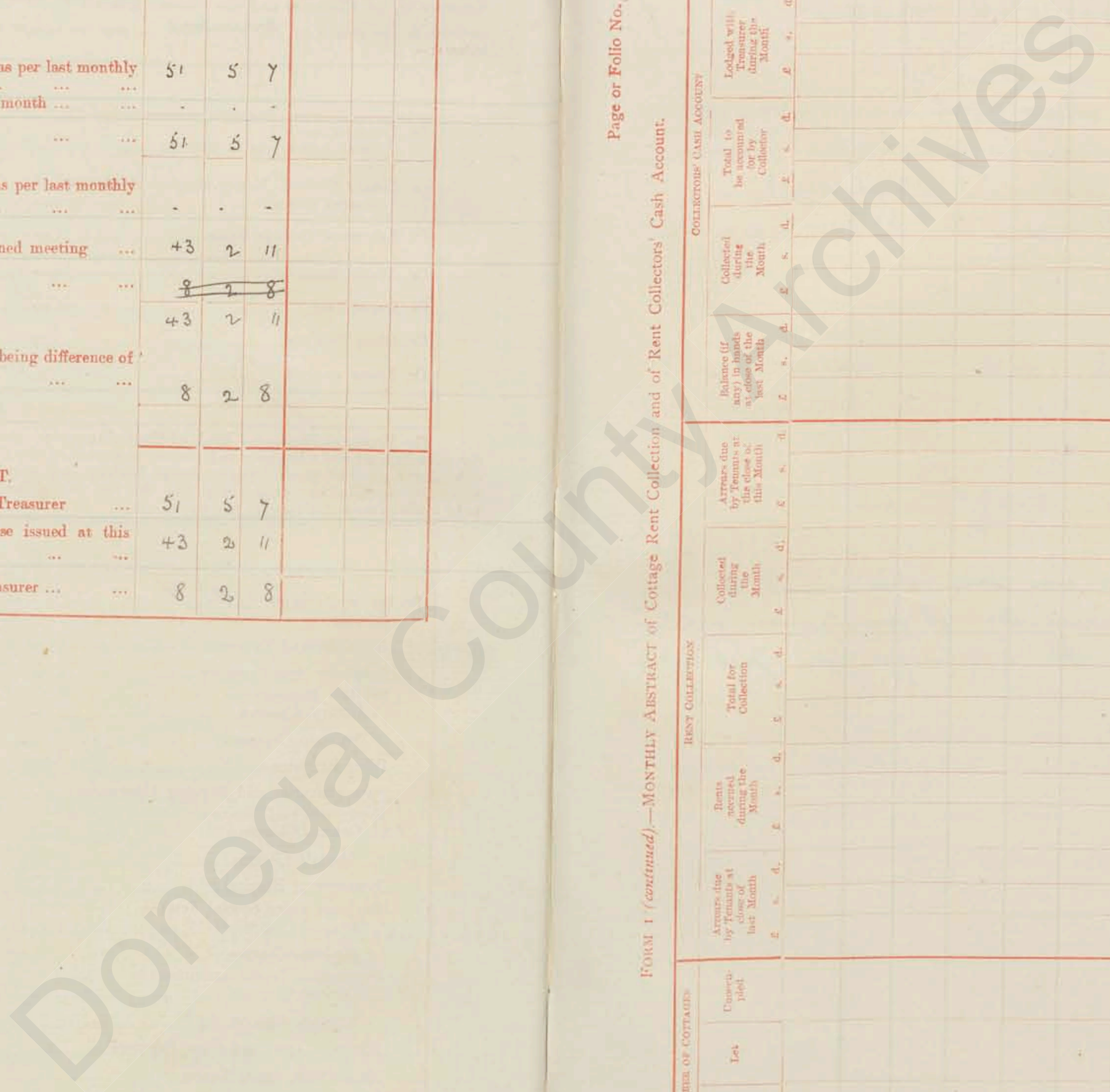

The L.G. Board have received the report of their Medical Inspector Dr. MacCarthy, relating to the Sanitary condition of the Dumfanagly Rural District, extracts from which are enclosed; and the Board request that each of the matters to which the Medical Officer has drawn attention may receive careful consideration, and that they may be furnished with the observations of the Council thereon.

As regards the failure of the Council to enforce the terms of notices, served for the abatement of nuisances, the Board desire to direct attention to Sections 109, 110, & 111, of the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878; and they have to request that the Council will direct their Executive Sanitary Officers to see that such notices are complied with in future.

The Board would urge the Council in the interests of the public health, to provide a suitable ambulance for use in their district, and they would also impress upon the Council the advisability of adopting the Infectious Disease (notification) and (Prevention) Acts in the Rural District, as wherever these acts have been adopted, they have proved a valuable aid in the early detection, and stamping out of outbreaks of infectious disease.

with reference to the outbreak of Scarlet Fever in this District I report to you that I have recommended that Ballymore and Dunfanagly Schools be closed for the present with a view to checking the disease.

I think it would be advisable in the interest of Public Health for the Sanitary Authority to communicate with the teachers and managers of the other schools in the District recommending their temporary closure.

Luckily the epidemic is of a mild type so far, and I have not come across a fatal case nevertheless due precautions should be taken, as the disease might become more virulent and assume alarming proportions.
