

Read letter from James Dunleavy acknowledging receipt of the resolution of the Glenties District Council appointing him honorary director in connection with the Donegal electricity extension.

No 70982. 1900. Read letter from LHB dated Dec 7<sup>th</sup> requesting an explanation regarding the report of Mr Sanderson relative to the delay and inaccuracies in the checking of the Collector Books and in the form of proposals for payments as regards this District.

The Clerk reported that he replied that the delay was caused by the time taken to have the Treasurer's Receipts owing to the money been sent by cheque. The inaccuracies were in the discrepancies and clerical errors in the Rate Books &c. The forms of proposals for payment for Sept Quarter I did not receive from the County Surveyor. Nothing indicative of negligence exists here at present.

No 70457 1900. From L.G.B. requesting the Council as the Sanitary Authority to take action regarding the water supply of Carrick as shown in the Medical Officer's report for that district and pointing out the danger injury caused to the various tourists resorts owing to the insufficient supply of good water. The Council deferred taking action.

Read report from Sanitary Sub Officer Cannon stating that he served all the nuisance notices which he received from the Clerk.

Read letter from The Secretary The County Council dated Dec 10<sup>th</sup> 1900 transmitting the returns of arrears of the several Collectors in this Union and asking for the observations of the District Council on the subject.

The District Council suggest that the Secretary the County Council be instructed to inform the Rate Collectors that they should prosecute their labours with all the energy they can command and take such legal steps as they consider necessary for the recovery of all recoverable rates in their districts for the half year ending March 31<sup>st</sup> 1901 and furnish the list of arrears and the proceedings taken by them in all cases in respect of March 1901 half year.

Read the following letter from Dr. John Kelly Superintendent Medical Officer of Health. Glenties

22/12/00.

Gentlemen.

I have your letter of the asking me if I am willing to discharge the duties of Superintendent Medical Officer of Health in which position you have kindly appointed me for the district of Glenties at a salary of £10 per year. I beg to say that no matter how willing I may be to be useful and meet the wishes of your body, it would be impossible that the duties of that position involving a good deal of travelling through the Union could be expected to be done for a salary of £10 per year. I left the naming of the salary which was quite inadequate with your Board

and am now willing to leave the question with the Local Government Board.

The Council request the L.G.B. to inform them whether the aforesaid appointment is necessary, and also the salary which the officers holding such positions receive in other unions.

As Kelly in a report impressed on the Council the necessity of warning the several sub-sanitary officers in the Union & use every means in their power to prevent the spread of smallpox, and to act under the instructions of the Sanitary officers in each case.

Resolved that in these particular cases and in any others which from time to time may arise, that summonses be issued and that the sanitary sub officer appear for the sanitary authority in the prosecution.

The Council took into consideration the question of the water supply of the villages of Danglee & Carrick and with reference thereto passed the following resolution proposed by James Sweeney seconded by Patrick McNeilis that this Council wish to have it explicitly understood that they are anxious that the water supply of these villages be improved, but at the expense of the villages desiring improvement.

The following Letters from the Local Government Board for Ireland, or others were read and directions given thereon as follows:—

No 1732. 1901. Read letter from the L. G.B dated January 11<sup>th</sup> 1901 acknowledging receipt of a copy of the Annual Estimate and demand of the Glenties District Council on the County Council for the service of the ensuing financial year and with reference thereto desire to point out that the sums required for special expenses under the Public Health (Ireland) Act 1878 section 232 cannot be included in General District Charges but must be shown separately in Table C of the estimate. Special expenses leviable over the entire Rural District under the Boards order of the 15<sup>th</sup> May 1899 should be shown in the aggregate under the heading of 'separate charges' and those chargeable to the ratepayers to be given separately.

I have being no separate charges in this Union it is not necessary to set out separate charges. Sanitary officers salaries & office expenses is being the total expenditure.

Read Letter No. 1440. 1900. from the L.G.B. Stating that they will raise no objection to a sum of 30/- being paid to Sanitary sub-officer for remuneration of his services in burying carcasses of animals in his district.

Order No. 23. from last meeting deferred was ordered to be paid (on receipt of above letter) to John Ward S.S.O.

No 75777: 1901. Read letter from L. G.B dated Jan 10<sup>th</sup> 1901 relative to the water supply of the village of Carricks and drawing attention to the fact that certain residents from the locality have appealed to the Council to provide a water supply for this locality and the medical officer of Health has also on several occasions reported as to the defective condition of the water supply. The L. G.B request the Council to give this matter their consideration at a meeting to be specially convened for the purpose. In this connection the Board have to direct the attention of the Council to the provisions of Sec 15 of the Public Health Ireland Act 1896.

The Council desire to state that a meeting was specially convened to consider the letter of the L. G.B No 75457: 1900 recommending a better supply of water for the towns of Dungle and Carrick of which meeting each member got due notice to attend on January 5<sup>th</sup> 1901 when it would be considered. The questions of the supply of water for Dungle & Carrick having been duly considered the following resolution proposed by James Sweeney seconded by Patrick J. Donnelly was passed unanimously. "That the Council wish to have it explicitly understood that they are anxious that the water supply of these villages be improved but at the expense of the villages desiring improvement. These all complied except Condy Doogan of Lister butcar who done nothing to appear to defy the law.

Resolved that proceedings be instituted against the defaulters who have not complied with the terms of the abatement nuisances.

Read letter No 1440.1901 from the L.G.B dated the 24<sup>th</sup> Jan. 1901 respecting the salary to be paid to Dr Kelly as Medical Superintendent Officer of Health, and stated that no entry appears in the minutes of the Council under the Public Health Act on the 22<sup>nd</sup> ult, and asked particulars of the information which they were required to give.

The Minutes of last Meeting were read and signed.

In the letter the Clerk sent a reply to the effect, that the entry referred to could be found on the minutes of the District Council under the Miscellaneous heading, and a further reply from the L.G.B. acknowledging the receipt of the Clerk's communication and referring the Council to Act 1 of the Board's Sanitary Order No 1 of the 3rd May last and enclosing a copy of same for the Council's information.

The Council wish to be informed by the L.G.B. what is the sum paid to the Medical Superintendent Officer of Health in other towns.

Read letter No. 2000. 1901 from the L.G.B. enclosing a new amalgamated form of form nos 12 & 14, and requesting that this form be substituted for forms 12 & 14.

Read report from Sanitary Sub officer Ward stating that the occupants of the four houses in Ardara, who were ordered to be prosecuted, have since complied with the exception of Thomas Morrow, who will be summoned at next Ardara Petty Sessions.

Read letter from Rev. P. Kelly O.P. Ardara in which he stated that he petitioned the Postmaster General to the have time which Ardara P.O. is open on Sundays put back to 12.30 P.M. and received a reply asking whether the proposed alteration would not be disagreeable and inconvenient to the people of the district generally, and Jas. Kelly wished to have the opinion of the District Council on the matter.

The Council's opinion was to the effect that they not being conversant with the wants of the village of Ardara in that respect think that is a subject on which the opinion of Ardara people only should be consulted. They authorized the Chairman to sign the petition.

Proposed by Park & O'Donnell and seconded by Park & McNeilis, and unanimously resolved.

The District Council have under consideration the returns of the several Rate Collectors of the Glenties Union and after careful scrutinizing them, we have come to the conclusion that the rates returned as arrears at the close of the last half year are in almost all cases recoverable and we hereby ask the County Council to urge upon the Rate Collectors to be more diligent in the discharge of their duties and also to furnish a return of the arrears of the Collectors at the close of the half year ending 31<sup>st</sup> Mar. 1901.

The Council having taken into consideration the fixing of the salary for Medical officer of Health for Ardara and Dunglee No. 1. Dispensary and came to the following conclusion on the motion of Charles McGill seconded by Francis McNelis. That the salary of the Medical officer of Health of Ardara Dispensary District be fixed at the sum of £5. per year.

And with reference to the salary proposed to be given to the Medical officer of Health of Dunglee No. 1. Dispensary District it was proposed by Charles Kennedy seconded by Fra. J. McDermott. That the salary of the Medical officer of Health for Dunglee No. 1. Dispensary District be fixed at £5. per year.

The consideration of the applications for Medical officer of Health for Ardara Dispensary District then followed and Mr. John J. Jaren was unanimously appointed to that position, having previously handed in his resignation as Medical officer of Health of Dunglee No. 1. Board have had before them the minutes of Proceedings of the Glenties Rural Council relating to the recent outbreaks of small-pox in the Dungloe Dispensary District, and the Board forward, to be laid before the Council the accompanying copy of correspondence which has taken place in connection with this outbreak. No fresh cases of small-pox have been reported to the Board since the date of the last meeting of the Council and the Board trust that the further spread of the disease has been effectually checked. The Board regret, however, to have to inform the Council that they find it necessary to express their strong disapproval of the manner in which Mr Boyle discharged his duties as Sanitary Sub officer in connection with the disinfection of infected premises and the removal of patients to Hospital. In view of the very infectious nature of small-pox and the danger to the public health which would naturally follow the spread of this disease and they have now to request that the Council will be good enough to inform Mr Boyle that they are of opinion that his conduct was inexcusable and that in the event of any similar neglect of duty on his part in future being brought under their notice the Board will be compelled to require him to resign his office.

A fair quantity has been cured. I should estimate about 3000 barrels but a large quantity has been sent off fresh from Glenties Railway Station. Every available cart in the district seems to be employed and the terms paid to carters are 4/- per cran. Each cart takes from 2½ to 3 crans so that they can earn from 10/- to 12/- for a load to Glenties. Thus along with fishing benefits everyone. I am informed there is not a single unemployed cart in the district. The road is already badly cut up. It is not easy to see how carts can go over it. If this work is to be carried on a new road will have to be made along the south shore of the bay leading up to the road made by the Board to join the Gneetarra Budge. This would be about a mile in length and level all the way. At no other place where leaving fishing has been opened in Donegal has there been so much benefit derived by those not fishing as at Trillick owing to so many of the fish being sent to Glenties. Without having the Gneetarra Budge Cross this traffic could not be done. A. P. D.

The Council deferred the consideration of this matter till the members of the District would be present.

No 10462, 1901.

I beg to direct your attention of your Board to the fact that nothing has yet been done to remedy the state of things complained of in my letter of 6<sup>th</sup> October last. The inhabitants of Spout Street now, say that portion of their water supply is liable to pollution by the sewerage of the New Factory. The Ratepayers in this district believed that when the Sanitary Officer reported a certain portion of his district to be in an unsanitary state it was the duty of the Sanitary Authority to take the necessary steps to put the place or places complained of in a thoroughly sanitary condition. This it appears was a delusion. Probably it may be argued that Tullybegs has as low, if not a lower, death rate than most other towns but undoubtedly this happy state of things is due more to natural agencies than to the care of the Sanitary Authority. Since the Guardians seem determined to take no action in this matter my committee would feel obliged if your Board would inform them what steps they should take. B. A. Burtonport is no town and the sewage does not require any further improvements and we enter our protest against the continuous reports of Dr Smyth. We have no confidence in his reports and we must ask the L. G.B to relieve us of such an officer and get some sanitary officer who has no interest in the local property. The L.C. Committee have recommended the cleansing of the Harbour at a cost of £100 which will reduce the nuisance

created by Dr. Brown having let his yard for a curing station. Above proposed by James Quinn  
records by J. J. Dermott.

Read the following reports from Dr Wm Smyth Burtonport. By request of the L. G.B dated 20<sup>th</sup> May 1901 I this day inspected the Harbour bed at Burtonport and found a disgusting accumulation of sewage decaying seaweed & fish refuse, occupying the landward end of the dock, close to the quay and within a few yards of the post office and dwelling of Mr. Brown. When the sun is strong and the weather hot the stench along the quay is abominable and numerous complaints have been made to me of it while I have frequently reported this nuisance such is a nuisance and dangerous to the Public Health and I recommend that the Harbour bed be cleaned thoroughly without delay, the sewer diverted clear of the Harbour and that some person be appointed to remove without delay all refuse and prevent the recurrence of such a nuisance. For several months back as many as 5 vessels used this Harbour every spring tide the crews of these would average 8 and dues paid by them must have been considerable

William Smyth, June 12<sup>th</sup> 1901

I hereby report by order of the L. G.B 20<sup>th</sup> May 1901 that the sanitary condition of Burtonport is most unsatisfactory owing to the want of a proper <sup>drain as a main sewer</sup> water supply <sup>of the village</sup> lies in a narrow ravine down which the goes to the Harbour. The houses being built at a higher level on both sides the ground rising abruptly behind, drainage is only possible along the roadside where the original water table has been converted into a stone pipe over which a sidepath had to be constructed to meet the requirements of greatly increased traffic. Into this drain the sinks of 14 houses & numerous business stores & many drains float from Dranare & Keshford their way, over it during rain several shallow pools form containing all kinds of refuse gradually filtering

into the drain and leaving a striking deposit and I recommend that existing drain be replaced by a graduated earthenware pipe provided with suitable traps manholes etc and that all house drains ~~or cesspools~~ be replaced by earth closets or W.C.s and this drain be discharged into the sea clear of the Harbour bed but on low water marks, 13<sup>th</sup> June 1901

The Sier Committee have ordered the expenditure of the sum of £10 towards cleaning the Harbour & no action taken in the other part of the report.

If the Sanitary Authority overlook or allow the unsanitary condition set forth in my last report to go without remedy it is difficult to have district kept free from disease this is a serious matter demanding your attention

The Sub Sanitary Officer states that in some few of these cases the doctor did report <sup>later</sup> and the nuisances were abated but reaccumulated. The Doctor will desire to serve his notices on the Town when they will receive the attention of the Council.

Dear Sir, At your request I

visited the village of Burtonport on the 21<sup>st</sup> day of December 1900, and examined the harbour and the means of sewerage adopted in the village. There is a pipe running along the centre of the Public Road or Street from a point opposite the Police Barracks to the Harbour. This is a rough stone pipe obviously constructed for drainage purposes alone, and there is no connection between any of the houses in the village and this pipe for the purposes of sewerage except in the case of one house, in which a connection has been made, so far as I could discover without authority from the District Council Board of Guardians or any other body. No provision whatever is made by the Board of Guardians or District Council for the sewerage of the village. In the case of a few houses in the village there are earth closets, but except in these few cases all sewage matter is deposited on the surface of the ground, and is washed in time of heavy rains into the harbour, where there is a large and steadily increasing accumulation of sewage matter. I found in addition to the ordinary sewerage a number of manure heaps at various points in the village. When heavy rains come, a considerable quantity of sewage matter is washed from these manure heaps along the street into the Harbour. The deposit of sewage matter is at a distance <sup>varying</sup> from 15 yards to 4 from Mr. McKewen's residence shop and Post office. This deposit ~~matter~~ of sewage matter is here and exposed to the action of the sun at low water. I have observed it on several occasions during the last three years when in Burtonport about my usual business, and on these occasions I usually stopped at Mr. McKewen's Hotel

Mr. McKewen's Complaint.

Read the an extract from a report of Mr John M Barry C.E. Stranorlar regarding the Harbour Bed of Burtonport as follows  
 "The harbour bed is naturally fetid, as the flowing tide collects matter in suspension in the water, and carrying it forward deposits it in inlet. It is also the ash and refuse pit of premises no 1 and 4 on map and as fish curing is extensively carried on on these premises, the quantity of refuse swept into the harbour bed is enormous. Effluvia nuisance is being constantly generated by this mass of decomposable matter viz - rejected dead fish, fish filth and guts, house and shop rubbish, ashes and sweepings of every description all constantly agitated by the action of the tides. Fish curing on these premises should be prohibited as an offensive trade (see Public Health Act 1875 Sec. 91 also River Pollution Prevention Act 1876.) The harbour bed could be much improved by a little improvement on the pier accomodation.

The map referred to was produced and it was found that the owner and occupier respectively of premises nos 1 and 4 thereon are Dr. H. Smyth and Mr Dan Keown. Thereupon the following resolution on the motion of James Sweeney seconded by Lanty Hanlon was passed unanimously.

That considering the report of Mr M Barry C.E. relative to the Harbour bed of Burtonport we recommend that the occupiers and owners of Premises no. 1 and no. 4, be served with the necessary notices to have nuisances abated, otherwise that immediate proceedings be taken to enforce same.
