That whereas the Lough Swilly Railway Company have given the greatest dissatisfaction to the Public, and very seriously injured the markets of the entire district of north-west Donegal in consequence of the manner in which the Letterkenny Railway has been worked: we earnestly pray that your honorable Board do make arrangements for the proper working of the Bartonport Extension, and we are of opinion that the working of the Extension should not be handed over to the said Lough Swilly Railway Company, without a solemn, formal, and binding understanding that the interests of the congested districts in regard to the development of the mines, minerals, and quarries, should be thoroughly safeguarded, and the fisheries fostered by cheap freights and a fast service.

Read letter from Mr H. A. G. and Mr P. stating that he would be prepared to introduce a private bill into Parliament to amend the Law regarding Drainage Boards and the Voters and Jurors Lists.

SOLVED—That as Section 83 (7) of the Local Government (Ireland) Act, 1898, deprives Clerks of Unions appointed subsequent to the passing of the said Act, of the duty of the preparation of the Parliamentary Voters' and Jurors' Lists, and as the Boards of Guardians in Ireland have already passed resolutions, asking that this Section be repealed and said duty re-transferred to all Clerks of Unions on the grounds that this work can be properly and efficiently performed only by Clerks of Unions who have the legal and local information at their disposal. We respectfully request the Chief Secretary and the Members of the Irish Party to have a clause inserted in the present Local Government Amending Bill repealing said Section, and providing for the re-transference of this duty to all Clerks of Unions, and that the question of compensation for loss of Fees to County Secretaries be determined by the Local Government Board in accordance with the provisions of the Seventh Schedule of the Principal Act, and the amount so determined on be paid by the Clerk of Union to the County Secretary in such manner as the Local Government Board may prescribe, as already too much work is concentrated in the County Office and the Secretaries are furnished with extra clerical assistance to discharge this duty for which they are afterwards paid the statutable fee, we see no reason why the Government should hesitate in making the proposed transfer, which is in our opinion most desirable. We are satisfied, after careful scrutiny and experience for the past 3 years, that this work cannot be efficiently discharged in the County Council Offices.
