Read letter from the L.G.B dated 24th July forwarding a report from Dr Gardiner Dunblow relating to the failure of Sanitary Sub officer Boyle to carry out an interment for 5 days of a patient who died of Typhus Fever together with the explanation of Sanitary Sub Officer Boyle, and requesting the views of the Council in this matter before taking any further action in this matter.

Mr. James Breslin moved that the following facts be brought under the notice of the Lord Lieutenant:—Successive Tory Governments, recognising the utter inability of the vast majority of the ratepayers owing to their poverty to contribute anything towards the cost of construction, had caused to be constructed no fewer than four lines of railway in county Donegal out of the funds at the disposal of the Government. These lines were the Burtonport, the Glenties, the Carn-donagh, and the Killybegs Railways. The extension of the Glenties Railway to Ardara would cost a mere bagatelle compared with the outlay on these lines. The Glenties Union, important parts of which would be benefited by this line, was the most congested, and its valuation the lowest in the county, and perhaps with one exception in all Ireland. This year, owing to the almost total failure of the potato crop in the area to be benefited by the construction of this line, the pinch of poverty was keenly felt by the big majority of the poverty-stricken inhabitants. Under these circumstances, was it too much to expect that a Government professing to have the welfare of the people of Ireland at heart should undertake the construction of this short extension free of all cost to the locality, and so afford the people necessary employment during a year of privation and distress. Ardara was the great market for the sale of Donegal homespuns, with embroidery, drawn-thread work, crochet, lace, and knitting extensively carried on under the auspices of the Congested District Board, which had two depots at Ardara. In the parish were situated the famous fishing grounds of Rossbeg, Portnoo, and Lough-tes Point. All these industries would be materially helped and benefited by having railway accommodation brought near them. Taking all these facts and circumstances into consideration the Council earnestly hoped that his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant and the Chief Secretary for Ireland, Mr. Bryce, who on the occasion of his recent visit to Ardara last summer expressed himself as being in warm sympathy with the scheme, would use their best influences to prevail upon the Treasury to give a free grant for the making of this railway.

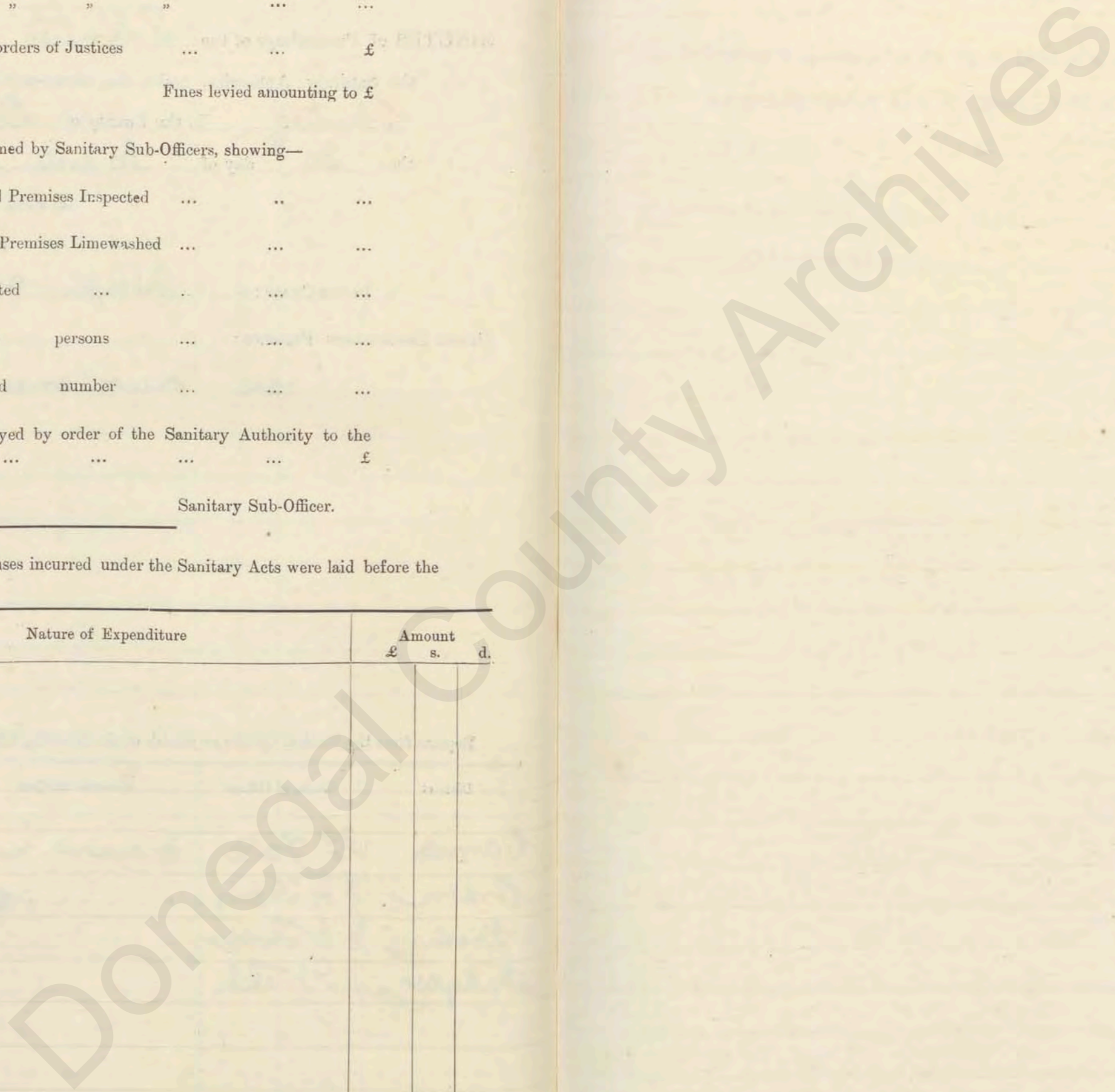

Apart from other interests connected with the election he thought that when he was building a valuable residence in the locality, and as a result would be heavily taxed, he should have a say in the administration of affairs in that district. The memorial was quite obviously a bogus one, and he wished to have it in his possession for some time in order to prosecute further inquiries to enable him to put his hand on the author.

On the motion of Mr. P. Boyle, seconded by Mr. M'Geehan, it was decided to let Mr. O'Donnell have the document for a month.

An application was received from Dr. Lipsitt, solicitor, Ballyshannon, on behalf of Unity M'Hugh, claiming £10 damages for the alleged malicious burning of property.
