MINUTES OF PROCEEDINGS of the Rural District Council, acting as the Rural

Sanitary Authority, under the above-mentioned Acts, at a Meeting held on

Monday the 13<sup>th</sup> day of December 1915

Read letter from Mr. T. Nolan, Engineer dated 11<sup>th</sup> Dec., 1915 stating that Messrs Jas. Bonner Sons, Contractors have done nothing to the cottage on Plot 34 Tullyally since last inspection.

The Application of Mr. A.W. McFaughlin, dated 10<sup>th</sup> Dec. 1915 for payment of £1-1-0 balance fees as block of works under scheme No 3 was passed.

Read letter from Mr. Denis Doherty, rent collector, Runewana dated 14<sup>th</sup> Nov., 1915, stating that Robt McKinlay had given him the key of cottage No 116 and promised to pay the arrears in instalments.

The application of Philip McFaughlin to become tenant of this cottage was approved. He being well recommended by Mr. H. MacRory, D.J.

Mr. Neil McDauid was accepted as tenant for the vacant cottage in Farnagrove and Mr. Patsy Doherty directed to have the lock repaired or a new one supplied.

The proposal of James McDauid to become tenant of the



vacant cottage in Ballylawry was held over for inquiry,

Mr. Denis Doherty reported that Charles Friel tenant of cottage No 113 had sub-let to Philip Doherty and he had warned him against it.

Applications were received from Philip Doherty and Mrs. Bridget Doherty to be accepted as tenant of same, but the consideration was deferred the existing tenancy of Charles Friel not being determined.

Mr. O'Flaherty reported that cottage No 25<sup>landmark</sup> is smoky.  
 Mr. Patsy Doherty reported that cottage No 47<sup>John</sup> farrow<sup>is smoky</sup> is smoky.  
 Read letter from Edward Doherty, Inagheward, dated 13th December, 1915 complaining of great smoke in his cottage No 40 Cashel.

Ordered that the attention of Mr. Nolan, Engineer be called to these cottages in order to have the new pattern of chimney pot tried.

With reference to entry on Minutes of 8th Nov. 1915 allowing 4/- to John Doherty new tenant of cottage No 35 Pentogher for glazing 2 broken windows damaged prior to his tenancy. It was reported that the allowance was insufficient as the glass alone would cost 5/4. It was decided to increase the allowance to 6/-.

Read letter from L. Govt Board dated 12th Nov. 1915 No L. 11.227, Dushower P.D. inquiring whether the loans of £2,040 and £1,190 granted to the Dushower P. D.C. for the purposes of their Unopposed and Opposed Orders of 1909 under the Labourers Acts (Scheme No 3) may now be closed by the advance of £32 and £7 respectively.



It was decided to reply that these loans may now be closed by the advance of these sums.

Read further letter from L. Govt Board dated 12<sup>th</sup> Nov. 1915 No. L. 11.218. Inishowen P.D. Stating that they had recommended the Irish Land Commission to issue a further instalment of £150 out of the loan of £4250 sanctioned for the purpose of the Inishowen P.D. Lotts (Unopposed) Order of 1912 pending final inspection of the works by one of their Architects. Also requesting the Council to take steps to expedite the completing of the cottage on Plot 34 Tullyally.

Ordered that the Engineer be written to to push on the work at this cottage without further delay.

Read intimation from the Irish Land Commission dated 18<sup>th</sup> Nov. 1915 of the payment to the Council's Treasurer of £150. the seventh instalment on account of the loan of £4250 sanctioned for the purpose of the Unopposed Order of 1912.

Read further letter from the L. Govt Board dated 12<sup>th</sup> Nov. 1915 No. L. 11.217. Inishowen P.D. Stating that they will cause a final inspection of the works executed under the Opposed Order of 1912 <sup>(loan of 510)</sup> with a view to authorizing the issue of the balance of the loan available viz. £20.

The Clerk stated there would be a deficiency on this loan of £31-2-5 chiefly on account of law costs and preliminary expenses in connection with the abandoned site in Clonsilla.

On the motion of Councillor McConalogue seconded by



founcillor fole it was resolved that the local Govt. Board be respectfully requested to give the founcil permission to charge the aforesaid deficiency of £31-2-5 to the loan of £4250 under the Irishower P.D. Labours (Unopposed) Order of 1912 on which there will be a considerable surplus. Both loans were under Improvement Scheme No. 4.

The Minutes of the last Meeting (or ~~Meetings~~) were read and signed.

The Reports of the Clerk on execution of Orders previously made.

An Estimate of the liabilities and expenditure and of the probable Revenue of the Council for the coming financial year was considered after due notice to each councillor. The expenditure was estimated at £ 950 and the Revenue at £ 460, and after taking into account an estimated credit balance of £ 12.4 at end of current financial year a Demand for £ 366 from the County Council was adopted on the motion of councillor John seconded by councillor P. Kavanagh, and the seal of the Council affixed and duly attested.

A deputation, consisting of Rev. Charles Byrne, C.C., Rev. P. C. Duncan, M.A., Rev. R. Binns, J.P., D. P. O'Fallaghans, J.P., Messrs Jas O'Doherty, J.P., and James Haskins, appeared before the Council with reference to the very bad condition of part of the road from Carrdonagh to Derry with a view to its repair.

After a long discussion the following resolution proposed by councillor Patrick McConalogue seconded by



The following Letters from the Local Government Board for Ireland, and others, were read by the Clerk, and directions given to answer them, respectively, to the following effect (or Orders made on them, respectively, as follows):—

Councillor John Scott was unanimously adopted:—

That having heard from an important deputation of ratepayers of the impassible condition of the main road from Landedonagh to Londonderry for seven miles between the Glentogher <sup>quarry</sup> and Quigley's Point occasioned by the extraordinary traffic in transporting road metal over it with heavy traction engines &c, more than a year ago for the purpose of improving the main road from Brouville to Derry between Redcastle and Traff under Road Board Grant, a description of traffic which a great part of it was never intended to carry, and being aware of the intolerable inconvenience and loss which the inhabitants of the district, from Inalin Head to Quigley's Point, which it serves, suffer, in as much as motor traffic is entirely suspended, motor having to make a detour of eleven miles, and some of the carters to Derry have ceased carting, that ordinary local users along the said road have to adopt all sorts of expedients to get along it with vehicles, and seeing that it has remained in such a disgraceful state so long that legal proceedings are threatened against the District and County Councils, we strongly urge the County Council to take the necessary steps to have the road complained of put into a proper state of repair so as to again carry the normal traffic and render unnecessary an action in the Courts.

Read Report dated 11<sup>th</sup> February 1916 from Mr. Patrick Doherty S.D.O. stating that the residents in River Row, Droville having complained to him about the flooding of their houses with sewage he drew the attention of the Droville Public Health Committee to the condition of the main sewer. The Committee had this opened and found that the stoppage was due to a six inch deposit of solidly ~~settled~~ settled sediment and they could not effect a remedy as no amount of flushing would be any use. He recommended that the sewer should be lifted and cleaned and some means provided for keeping the tide from backing up the sewage. In the case of Mrs. Elkins, one of those who complained, the water rose 12 inches and she was threatening proceedings.

Nolan, Engineer, Inverkeithing, dated 12<sup>th</sup> February 1916, stating he would attend to Mr. Foley's report and as soon as the weather permits would try the new pot on the other smoking chimneys. That the Contractor has done nothing since his last report to the Cottage in Lallyally but that he does not expect this class of work to be pressed forward at this season.

Read letter from Mr. Edward O'Fallaghan, Engineer, Runcrana dated 12<sup>th</sup> February 1916 with reference to the L<sup>y</sup> Govt. Board's Architect's report stating that the only remedy to dry the plots Nos 9, 10, & 11 is to sink the pipe across the County road <sup>and</sup> make a tail drain 50 perches in length. The fence complained of was high enough when built but the material was of a boggy nature and dried up. The entrance to the plot would require to be widened from 9 to 15 feet.
