1914 Annual Meeting: 1914.

The first annual meeting of Londonderry No. 2 Rural District Council was held at the Boardroom in the workhouse on Tuesday 2nd June 1914. In the Chair, Mr Spelt in absentia. Also present Messrs, Cresswell, John Peoples, Roulston Black, O'Donnell, McDonnell, Craig Green, Mitchell, McEhinney, Rankin, Gallagher, Glenn, Marshall, Bradley & McRally.

Messrs W. Hanna, A. Bryce, W. J. Hucy, W. Heenan & H. Conaghan were proposed for cooption as additional Councillors.

A decision was taken when Mr Hanna received 18 votes Mr Bryce 10 Mr Hucy 9 Mr Conaghan 9 and Mr Heenan 8; the two first named being declared elected.

A further vote for third place was taken between Messrs Hucy and Conaghan, when Mr Conaghan was elected by 9 votes, against 8.

Mr Bradley proposed and Mr Craig seconded that Mr Spelt in absentia be elected Chairman for the ensuing year.

Mr McEhinney proposed, and Mr Rankin seconded, that Mr Spelt Mitchell be elected Chairman.

A decision was taken, when Mr Mitchell was elected by 10 votes against 6 the other being Mr Rankin, Messrs Cresswell, John Peoples, Roulston Black, McEhinney, Rankin, Gallagher, Marshall & Glenn 10.

Mr McEhinney, Messrs O'Donnell, McDonnell, Craig Green, Bradley & McRally 6.

Mr Mitchell having signed the prescribed declaration, then took the Chair.

On the motion of Mr Roulston, seconded by Mr McEhinney, Mr Bradley was unanimously elected Vice Chairman.

On the motion of Mr Craig, seconded by Mr Mitchell, it was unanimously passed that the Council recommend the Lord Chancellor to appoint Mr Rankin as a Justice of the Peace, he having acted in that capacity for the past 13 years by virtue of his office as Chairman of the Council.
