### Mr Stephenson's Report.

The Local Govt. Board wrote under date the 21st June 1915 letter No 33846 : 1915, enclosing extracts from the report of their Medical Inspector Mr Stephenson relating to the sanitary condition of the Rural District and requesting that the several matters referred to may receive the careful consideration of the Council and that orders may be made where requisite.

The Board would be obliged if the Council will give their attention to the Inspector's remarks as to the administration of the Dairy Order of 1908 in the Rural District, especially as regards the completion of registration and compliance with Art. 1 (2) of the Order - copy enclosed.

The Board would ask that early consideration be given to the defective water supply of Cresslough and the sewerage of Dunfanaghy as well as to the nuisance caused by the accumulations of manure in the Rural District.

The Board would again ask the Council in the interests of the public health to adopt the Infectious Disease (Notification) Act 1889 and (Prevention) Act 1890 in the Rural District.

### County Surveyors Report.

The report of the Co. Surveyors for the half year ended Sept 30th was read as follows:—

"During the half year under consideration, the surface work generally on the roads has not been sufficient, rolling stones have not been gathered often enough. On a great many roads the water is doing more harm to the road surface than the traffic owing to inattention to the water tables and outlets. A great deal could be done also to improve the bases by judiciously applying the metal as I have pointed out to all contractors by a circular sent to each.

The liabilities of the District up to but not including on the list of applications coming before you amount to £1617.

For the financial year ending March 1914 the limit of expenditure will be required to meet the outlay re maintenance contracts and other works.

The report was adopted unanimously, and on the motion of Councillor McGinley seconded by Councillor McGadden (P.) and supported by Councillor Sayers the Clerk was directed to write to the Co. Council and request them to ask the Local Government Board to allow the District Council to increase their limit of expenditure by £251 : 5 : 0 in respect of the financial year ending March 1915 1914."
