THIS Council will, on SATURDAY, 23rd inst., consider TENDERS for Building Twenty-seven COTTAGES, including Fencing of Plots therefor, as specified hereunder, according to Plan and Specification to be had from me for 5s. A Contractor may Tender to erect all the Cottages or as many as he considers he could complete satisfactorily within Six Months after the Works have been laid out by the Architect, Mr. John M'Intyre, C.E., Letterkenny, under a penalty of £1 per Cottage for every week delayed. Intending Contractors should consider the Plan and Specification carefully, and inspect the Sites before Tendering, as no extra payment beyond the Contract amount will be allowed under any circumstances. Payments during the Work will only be certified for in three instalments—(1) When wall plates are laid; (2) when roof and floors are finished; and (3) when the whole work, including Fencing, is completely finished and ready to be taken over.

The Premises will not be taken over unless and until the Architect certifies that the Works have been fully completed in strict accordance with the Plan and Specification, in a substantial and workmanlike manner, and with materials of the best quality of the kind specified. 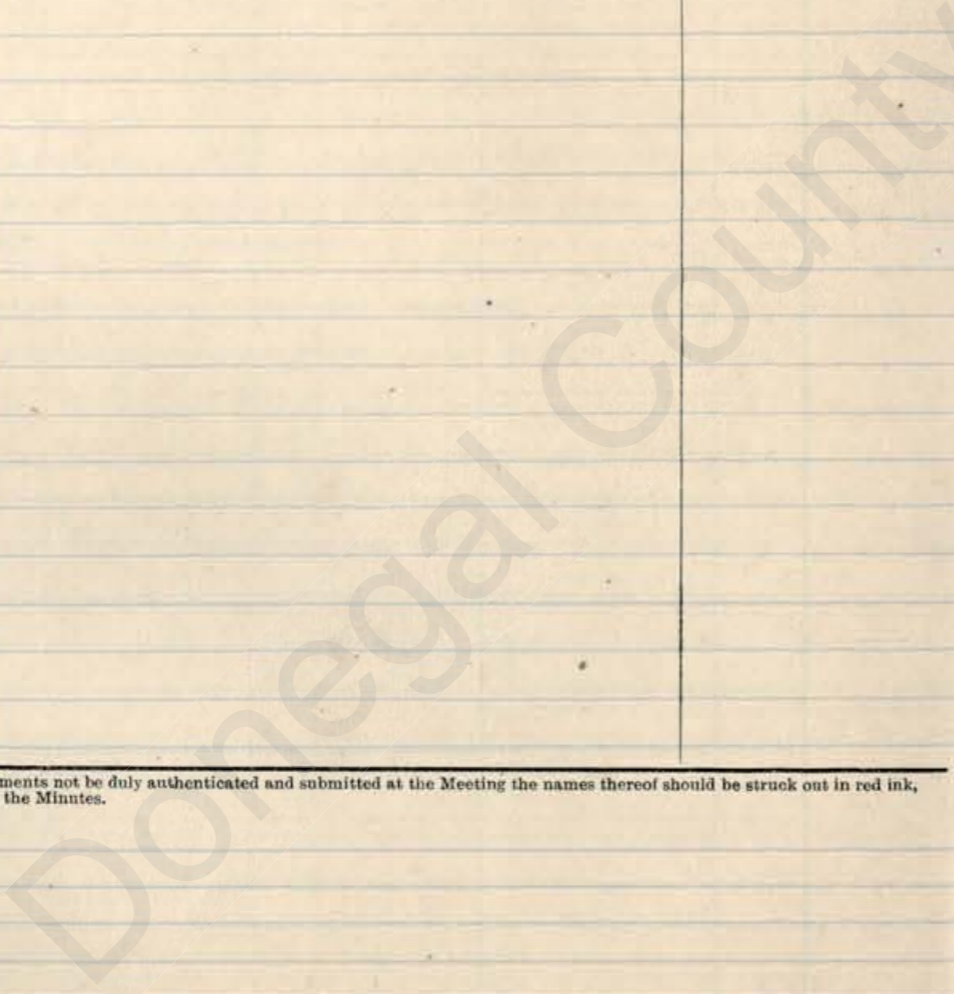
