J. O'Donnell seconded by Councillor ^{J. M'Ivor} and the Seal of the Council affixed and duly attested.

Read letter from the Hon. Secretary, The O'Rahilly Sinn Féin Club, Culdaff ~~for~~ dated 2nd Feb., 1918, forwarding copies of resolutions passed by the club on 22nd January, 1918, urging the conservation of Irish Food Supplies.

On the motion of Councillor McFarrow, seconded by Councillor Kelly, the resolutions were adopted.

Read letter from Mr. A.W. McLaughlin, Asst County Surveyor, dated 6th Feb 1918 relative to the supervision and maintenance of public works in his district, pointing out that owing to the construction of new roads in the ~~the~~
 miles

mileage in his charge has increased until it is now in extent about 500 miles - just twice the size of the average district for all Ireland, and asking the Council, as it is now almost a physical impossibility for one to see after it, to recommend its being divided into two.

On the motion of Councillor Philip Doherty seconded by Councillor John McCarron it was unanimously resolved

That we ask the Donegal County Council to re-
arrange ^{the districts and equalize} the mileage for the Assistant Surveyors so that no additional Surveyors will be required and no increase of salaries.

Councillor McCarron moved, pursuant to due notice sent to each Councillor, and Councillor Cole seconded -

"That the compulsory attendance clauses of the Education (Ireland) Act 1892 be put into operation in this Rural District"

Councillor Philip Doherty proposed as an amendment, Councillor J. McCarron seconding, that the Act be not enforced until a native Government comes into control.

On a division, those voted for the motion -
Councillors Cole, Lanny, Scott (Choman), McLaughan, McLaughan, Kelly, Smith, McSheffrey, John Doherty (Drum), Grant McCarron, and Joseph Doherty = 12

and for the amendment -

Councillors Carey, Philip Kearney, Ruddy, McCarron, Charles Doherty, Philip Doherty, P. Aughey, Jas Doherty, Devlin, Glackin, John O'Doherty, Neil Aughey. = 12.

The Chairman, Mr Scott, declined to undertake the responsibility of giving his casting vote and the consideration of the proposal was further adjourned till 11th March. Mr. Donnellon and Mr. Henry declining to vote.

Ordered that Notices be sent out inviting applications from labourers to become tenants of the cottage

Mrs. Galbraith who was accepted as tenant for Cottage No. 35 Glentogher intimated that she had been to see the cottage and it is in a very dirty state fowl evidently having had access through a broken pane in the window and stating she ought to get a greater consideration for cleaning it up than the three weeks allowed her free of rent, also requesting that the broken pane be glazed before she enters into possession.

Ordered that the Council get the window glazed, that Mrs. Galbraith get the three weeks free of rent and be expected to pay only the proportion of the taxes due for the time she shall have been in occupation of the cottage
