From Miss Mabel Scott, Townsend Cottage Lifford, dated 2nd Sept 1916. Stating that the water pipe on the Road by the gate had been removed causing difficulty in getting vehicles through the gate and asking for the pipe to be restored

Ordered that a proper sized cast iron pipe be provided and set at the gateway.

From Col. J. R. Baillie J. P. Strabane dated 23 Aug 1916

Asking that the erection of water closets on Mrs. Boyd's premises occupied by James Johnstone and Joseph Harrow as required by notice served be deferred until after the war.

Councillor Carroll proposed that the request be granted seconded by Councillor Robert McFlane

Noting - for motion: - Councillors Philip Carroll and Robert McFlane (2) Against Councillors Thomas Mac Fadden (Chairman) Henry Gallagher, Patrick Doherty Sen & James Gibbons (4) -
The Motion was therefore lost.

The Town Clerk was instructed to inform Colonel Baillie that the Council had decided not to grant his request but that they had extended the time mentioned in the notice for one month

from this date to allow the works to be carried out.

From the Irish Association of Gas & Paragers forwarding Resolution passed by them at their Meeting held in Dublin on August 15th on the subject of the coal supply to Ireland.

The Council unanimously adopted the Resolution

From the County Donegal Railways Joint Committee dated 21st August 1916. Acknowledging receipt of letter of the 17th Inst and stating that they would reply fully thereto in the course of a few days. Further letter stating that the consideration of the matter had been adjourned.

Inasmuch as the road deviation in question is now becoming impassible and often vehicles have to take circuitous route so as to avoid passing over same, the Council decided to wait no longer for the Railway Coy to carry out their legal obligations in the matter but that the Solicitor to the Council be instructed to forthwith issue a writ against the Railway Co as advised in the matter by Council

The Register of Notifications of Infectious Diseases was submitted and showed the following notifications:-

Margaret Stevenson Main Street Enniscorthy, Lizzy Haughey Rosemount Terrace, Enniscorthy, Connel Harkin, St. Columba's Terrace Enniscorthy.

The last two cases were removed to Hospital. In the case of Haughey the S. S. Officer had the premises properly disinfected and in that of Connel Harkin he applied to the Council for assistance in having the disinfecting carried out

Ordered that a man be employed to assist the S. S. O. in disinfecting the premises referred to at an expense not exceeding 5/-

The Sanitary Sub Officer reported that Mrs O'Saughlin no. 114 Ballynacool Terrace had complied with the requirements of the Sanitary notice served on her but that John Jollis no. 20 Ballynacool Terrace had not fully complied with the terms of the notice served on him.

Ordered that John Jollis be written to that unless the requirements of the notice are immediately complied with proceedings will be instituted against him.

The Record of work performed by the Sanitary Sub Officer since date of last meeting was submitted and showed that 60 premises had been visited and inspected - He reported that Messrs McKinnon & O'Sullivan had complied with the notice requiring the provision of water closet accommodation for premises occupied by Miss Barnett.

The Water Manager reported that during the past month there had been some leakages in water services. That the reservoir at Carranageogh was one foot below overflow. That he had been over the Lough Salt Muri, scoured same and found everything right. That the scraping of the Glenear Muri was in progress.

The Gas Manager reported that the Inspector of Weights and Measures had condemned the weigh bridge used for weighing coke and that a new one would have to be provided. He advised making enquiries regarding the price of another cargo of coal.

Ordered that a new weigh bridge be provided and that enquiries be made regarding the price of a further cargo gas coal.

The Gas Manager's collection account was submitted examined and showed appear to the amount of £36:9:11 to Quarters ended the 31st March 1916 outstanding.

The Rent collector's account for the month of August 1916 was submitted and showed that £ had been collected during the month and that the arrears due at the close of the month amounted to £.

 from Francis Cosgrave Esq, Local Government Auditor dated 25th Sept 1916. Notice of audit for 7th Oct 1916 at 12 o'clock noon of the accounts of the Council for the financial period ended 31st March 1916

"Notice of audit" has been duly published

The record of work performed by the Sanitary Sub Office since date of last Meeting was submitted and showed that 60 premises had been visited and inspected and that 2 dwellings had been disinfected

The Water Manager reported that during the past week there had been a few leakages in water services all of which had been made good. That the Reservoir at Farnham Bog was within one foot of the overflow

Ordered that the hand pump at Ramelton Road be forthwith put into proper order and repair

The Inspectors of Dairies, Fowsheds and Milkshops reported having inspected 24 Sheds and yards, found the dairy utensils in all cases clean; cow sheds and yards clean with the

exception of two cases viz John Spee Main St and John McEllinneys Main Street, both of which premises require to be lime-washed and a pile of manure in Spee's yard requires to be removed.

Ordered that notices be served on both defaulters requiring them to lime-wash their cowsheds within 7 days and that a further notice be served on John Spee requiring the removal of the manure heap within 7 days.

The Inspector under the shops Act reported that the provisions of the Act are being well observed throughout the District.

The Gas Manager reported again advising enquiries as to price for another cargo of coal and the securing of coke weigh-bridges.

The Gas Manager's collection account was submitted and showed that no progress had been made since last Meeting in getting in old outstanding arrears.

The Rent Collector's account for the month of Sept 1916 was submitted, examined and showed that £6-16-11 had been collected during the month and that the arrears due at the close of the month amounted to £24-13-7.

The Rate collector Mr. John McElean submitted schedule of uncollected Rates on vacant houses for half year ending 30th Sept 1916 and claimed repayment from the Council of same under Article 92 of the Public Bodies Order 1904 Amount £46-11-8.

The Council recommended that the amount £46-11-8 be struck off as unrecoverable for the reasons stated in the schedule and refunded to the collector.

forwarding Resolution adopted by them at meeting held on the 9th Oct 1916 demanding release of our fellow countrymen and women interned in English Prisons without trial and amnesty for those who have been sentenced to terms of

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imprisonment and pending their release requesting the Govt to consider the advisability of treating these as political prisoners

On the Motion of Councillor Patrick Doherty seconded by Councillor Thomas McFadden the Resolution was unanimously adopted

From the Kerry County Council dated 12 Oct 1916
Forwarding Resolution unanimously passed at their Meeting of the 5th October 1916 warning the Government of the grave consequences of any attempt to enforce conscription on Ireland which would result in turmoil and bloodshed and which, if at all, should only be imposed by an Irish Parliament

On the motion of Councillor John Gallagher seconded by Councillor Patrick Doherty the Resolution was unanimously adopted

From the Kerry Co. Council dated 12th Oct 1916
Forwarding Resolution unanimously passed by them at their Meeting on the 5th Oct 1916 again protesting against the partition of Our Country in any shape or form - &c

On the Motion of the Chairman seconded by Councillor Patrick Doherty the Resolution was unanimously adopted

From Mr. B. A. Flattery Agent for Mrs Finnegan dated 6th November 1916

Application for a metal pipe to be laid down at Mrs Finnegan's Property at Kilmacsenman Road and also a proper channel

The Application was unanimously granted

From Mr. Manus McSoraghe dated 6 Nov 1914
Applying for an increase of pay for horse work
performed for the Council and stating that owing to the great
advance in the price of feeding stuffs it would be impossible
for him to feed a horse on the present rate of 5/- a day
The Council unanimously advanced the rate of pay
to 7/- per day on and after this date

From Messrs James McKelvie & Co Edinburgh
Correspondence relative to cargo of gas coal and offering
a parcel of about 200,250 tons at price of 11/11 net per ton
delivered into the Council's Gas Works

The Town Clerk stated that he had accepted the offer, which
the Council now ratified.

From Colonel J. R. Baillie Agent for Mrs Boyd dated 11/10/14
Stating that he had given instructions to have a water closet
put into the house occupied by Joseph Harrow. That the house
lately occupied by James Johnston being now vacant and likely
to remain so for some time he would not in the meantime put in
a water closet but he promised the Council that before letting the
premises he will put in a water closet and usual connection

The Council decided not to take any further action in
this case until the house becomes occupied.

The Record of work performed by the Sanitary Sub
Office since date of last Monthly Meeting was submitted
examined and showed that 51 premises had been visited and
inspected.

He reported a nuisance existing at gateway or
entrance occupied and used by Wm Furber & John
McGilleney at Jones & Main St. - owned James Stewart

Ordered that notices be served on occupiers and owners
and 7 days allowed to abate the nuisance

The Water Manager reported that during the past month
there had been a few bursts in water services which has been put right.

That he observed in the press the complaint of Dr Moore R.M.S.
Asylum from which one would imagine he had a shortage of water
- such never was the case - that the reservoir may have gone
down but there was still always plenty

That level of water in Reservoir this day stands
at 8 feet or 6 inches below overflow

The Gas Manager reported that along with the general
run of all gas concerns there had been a decrease in consumption
owing to daylight saving act and earlier closing of Merchants
premises - That he was still working with one oven - an
unprecedented occurrence at this season of the year

That he had still a good stock of coal on hand

The Gas Manager's collection account was submitted
examined and showed arrears of previous Quarters outstanding

as £32 : 14 : 10

The Rent Collector's Account for month of October 1916 was submitted, examined and showed that £25:12:0 had been collected during the month and that the amount due at the close of the month amounted to £26:9:6.

Ordered that the lamps at the undermentioned places be lighted on Sunday nights and on the nights of Holyday - Railway Station, R. McFlures, Kelly Bros, Market Square, Saint Kennedy and Palace.

Ordered that a small grating and trap be put down at News Lane at the Hobart Council's Houses at McFlures Terrace so as to prevent surface water from same getting into premises occupied by James McDonald.

Councillor Farrell gave notice of a motion that at next Monthly Meeting he will move that the price of coke be fixed at such rate as may then be agreed upon as the existing price is too low.

The Town Clerk reported that Mr. Forbes, Manager of the Hobart & Port Denison Railway Co had called with him on the 3rd Inst and in the presence of the Council Solicitor undertook to pay to the Council the sum for which they offered to put the Road deviation to Gutter in proper repair and further to pay the law costs incurred by the Council in the matter since the offer was made. That he stated payment would be made at Meeting of the Directors on the 22nd Nov.

That in the meantime he authorised the Council to raise the required quantity of stones on the Company's premises at the Road in question.

The Council decided not to proceed further with the Suit against the Company pending the carrying out of Mr Forbes' undertaking.

An application from Hugh Doherty for an increase
in the price paid him by the Council for lime supplied
to the Gas works was submitted and considered

The Council unanimously decided to advance the
price from 1/2 to 1/4 per cwt.

Further ordered that the price henceforth to be charged
for lime sold by the Council at the Gasworks be at the rate of
1/8 per cwt instead of 1/4 per cwt hitherto

The Town Clerk submitted a letter received by him
containing a small torn piece of paper with the following
written on same i. o. w this to the Town Council and a
postal order for 2/6.

The amount was directed to be lodged to the credit
of the Council as "insurance money"

The record of work performed by the Sanitary Sub
Officer since date of last Monthly Meeting was submitted
and showed that 60 premises had been visited and inspected
That a number of ashpits in connection with Council's houses
at Rosemount required to be emptied and that a flow of water
at Daniel Dwyer's gateway Nam St caused a nuisance and
required attention

Ordered that the Town Surveyor have the ashpits referred
to at once emptied. Mr Henry Gallagher undertook to have
complaint re water at Dwyer's gateway attended to and the
matter set right

The S.S. Officer reported that Mr Curran John
McEllinney and James Stewart had not complied with the sanitary
notices served on them re filthy gateway used in common by
the first two and owned by the last named

Ordered that all parties be written to and seven days
allowed to comply with notices otherwise legal proceedings to
be instituted.

The S.S. Officer reported that John Ne Nam Street had
not complied with the Sanitary notice served on him requiring the
removal of a pile of manure

The Council extended the time allowed by the notice for
the removal of the manure until next Monthly Meeting

The Inspector of Dairies, cowsheds and milkshops reported that John Lee and John McElhinney both of Lam Street had each complied with the notices served on them requiring the cowsheds to be lime-washed

Proposal from Mr W. J. O'Connell, Watchmaker, Letterkenny and caretaker of Town clock to carry out all necessary repairs to the clock which has become deficient for the sum of £5:5:0 was submitted. The Town Clerk reported that on receipt of the tender he had authorised the work to be proceeded with and that the clock now was in perfect working order

The Council ratified the action of the Town Clerk.

The Town Clerk reported having invited proposals for quantity of coal slack at the Gas yard. That the highest offer was that of Mr S. A. Fleming, Portlaoise of 11/- per ton which had been accepted

From Michael Fuel stating that he cannot do any work at Gas House under 6/- a day. Councillor Carroll proposed and Councillor Poth Roberts Jun seconded that the work hitherto done by Michael Fuel be now given to Joe Gallagher and that Gallagher be paid at the rate of 5/- a day

Passed unanimously

From the Strabane & Letterkenny Railway Co dated 12 Nov 1917. Acknowledging receipt of letter of 7th Inst and stating that to meet the Council they are quite agreeable to have the corner rounded off at the Ramelton road subject to the work being done to the satisfaction of their Engineer

This work has now been completed

From the Urban District Council, Middleton, Co. Cork forwarding copy of resolution unanimously adopted by them on the 14th Inst protesting against the action of the Government in shutting down the Irish Pot Still distilleries in the interest of English and Scotch patent whisky and calling upon the Irish Members of all shades of politics to resist this latest injustice to Ireland

On the motion of Councillor Philip Carroll recorded by Councillor John Coherly Sen the resolution was unanimously adopted

from the Corporation of Cork forwarding copy of resolution passed by them on the 23rd November 1917 protesting against the conduct of Major F. O. Bowend. S.O. at the recent Court Martial trial in Cork in his insulting remark against the Irish language

On the motion of Councillor Spring Gallagher recorded by Councillor James Gibbons the resolution was unanimously adopted

The record of work performed by the Sanitary Sub Officer since date of last meeting up to 1st Dec 1917 was submitted and showed that 73 premises had been visited and inspected

The Sanitary Sub Officer reported that the dwelling houses at Kilmacrenan Road occupied by Mrs O'Connell and Samuel Boyle, owners Mrs Finnegan are in a dilapidated condition. Ordered that notices be served on the owners and one month allowed to have the premises put in order.

The Sanitary Sub Officer reported that a nuisance exists at Kilmacrenan Road caused by manure heap the property of Jas O'Sullivan

Ordered that notice be served and 14 days allowed to abate the nuisance

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The Inspector of cowsheds and dairies reported having inspected 23 cowsheds and found all clean

The Water Manager reported that during the month there had been very few leakages in services. That he visited Lough Salt track, scoured the main and found all correct. The level of water in reservoir at overflow

The Gas Manager reported that cargo of coal had arrived, that though not as free from slack as he would like it was better than last received. That the supply will tide over until well into the Spring

The Gas Manager's collection account was submitted and showed arrears of Quarters prior to 3rd Sept amounting to £37:10:1 outstanding

The Council proceeded to fix the price to be charged for Gas as and from 1st Jan 1918 consequent on the recent advance in the price of coal. It was unanimously decided that the price be 9/- per 1000 cubic feet less further orders

Councillor Carroll gave notice that at next Monthly Meeting he will move that the Council reconsider the price to be charged for coke, the present price being too low

Next Monthly Meeting of the Council to be held on Monday the 7th day of January 1918
