The Correspondence read and the orders made or resolutions passed thereon were as follow:—

From Local Government Board. Letter dated 6th December 1916, no. 127. H. 1916. miscellaneous relative to grant from Housing Fund - Clerk stated he returned the information sought. Approved.

From L.G. Board no. 58,742; 1916 dated the 7th day of Dec. 1916. stating that Poor Rate Collector has not as yet made any lodgment in respect of second moiety of Rate. Clerk was directed to ask Collector to expedite Collection.

From Ballyshannon Union dated 8th December 1916 in reply to letter from Council, stating that the amount which appears to have been given from Exchequer Contribution in respect of 6 Cottages transferred from Ballyshannon Rural District to Bundoran Urban District is £8.12.2 yearly. Clerk was directed to write to L.G. Board requesting to be informed whether the Bundoran Urban District Council should participate in Exchequer Contribution.

Letter no. 59275 from L.G. Board dated 9th December 1916 returning list of Arrears of Rate.

From G. N. Railway Company Dublin, dated the 28th December 1916, acknowledging receipt of letter from Council of 27th December 1916, relative to proposed improvement of Public Walk near Great northern Hotel Grounds.

Preliminary notice of Application for Compensation for Criminal Injury to Property, from R.A. Herbert Solicitor Enniskillen, on behalf of the ~~Joint~~ Committee of management of St. Joseph's Orphanage Bundoran for £10 compensation for wire fence. Council directed Clerk to instruct a Solicitor to oppose claim, on the grounds that the alleged injury was not malicious. Notice dated 30th December 1916.

Broken Drain
From County Surveyor, Donegal, dated 28/12/16 in reply to Town Surveyors letter, relative to broken drain in public Street.

The Clerk was directed to reply to County Surveyor that the Contractor is responsible under terms of

his Contract with the Donegal County Council to make good any damage to this drain.

The question of Food Production was discussed. Proposed by Thos Gorman Esq JP Chairman.

Seconded by Councillor Jas. Carroll, and passed "That owing to the evident shortage of labour in Ireland, we request the Government to provide sufficient implements for the cultivation of land and also to afford facilities whereby manures and seeds may be purchased at a cheap rate"

Seconded by Councillor Jas. Ward and passed

"That this Council is of opinion that the Department of Agriculture should have conferred on it, powers similar to those of the English Board of Agriculture, and immediately take over vacant land and waste places for tillage purposes; and that we urge upon the Government the application of the Small Holdings Act to Ireland"

Clerk stated that no reply had been received from Mr. Jas. Kearns, recently elected to fill the vacant office of member of the Council, to Clerk's letter informing him of the election and enclosing a Form of Declaration to be filled by Councillors. No action was taken.

An application from Mr. Michael Mulhern Rate Collector Bundoran Urban District for an increase of payment for Collection of Rates was read.

Councillor Thomas O'Gorman, J.P. proposed Councillor John Carty, seconded and it was unanimously resolved:-

"That subject to the approval of the Local Government Board, Mr. Michael Mulhern be allowed an increase of one penny in the pound for the collection of Rates in Bundoran Urban District"

Chairman thought that notice of motion of this resolution should have been given and that the resolution fixing Collector's present remuneration should be rescinded. Councillor O'Gorman thought that as only an increase was proposed there no necessity for a notice of motion to rescind former resolution.

A Report dated 30th December 1916 from Sanitary Sub Officer stated. "That the Septic tank is working good though some dirt has accumulated."

Typhoid Fever has occurred again at the house of Mrs. Mcgroory on 21st December. I visited the premises and he had the rooms newly lime washed and disinfected.

I also visited the premises of Mr. Charles Gorman, East End and he has also lime washed his premises. I gave an order to Mr. Pat. Gallagher East End to have his premises cleaned and refuse chared off. He has done so.

A Report dated 21st December 1916 from Sir Charles Cameron, on a sample of water from public water supply stated that very few micro-organisms present and none of them injurious. Under bacterial cultivation no spores were developed. This is an unusually good water.

Clerk was directed to obtain copies of magistrates orders made at recent Sanitary prosecutions and have them served on those who had not complied with the requisitions of notices of abatement of nuisance.

A notice of motion that Poliomyelitis and Cerebro Spinal meningitis be added to the schedule of diseases compulsorily notifiable under the Infectious Disease (notification) Act 1889. was handed in by Thos. Gorman Chairman.

Councillor Thomas Gorman, offered 20 acres of good land to the labourers present, at a rent of £2 ^{per acre} per year, and also to give six plots free of rent on condition of a sufficient quantity of suitable manure being applied. His offer was not accepted on the grounds that the land was inconveniently situated, being a little over half a mile from the residence of the most distant eligible workman.

Councillor Carty pointed out that in some places in Ireland labourers were given "3 acres and a cow" free.

Councillor Kelly remarked that many applicants were not eligible, being occupiers of land already, and as some of them applied for ten acres, he thought they should apply to the Estates Commissioners, or Congested District Board.

The Chairman promised the support of the Council in helping to acquire land for those willing to undertake the tillage of it. The labourers then left the Council Chambers.

Councillor Thomas Gorman J.P. (Senr) proposed; Councillor John Carty, seconded and it was unanimously resolved:-

"That our clerk be directed to request the Local Government Board to inform Council (1) whether land can be taken by compulsion to be let in allotments to eligible workmen. (2) the rent per acre that the Board would be prepared to sanction (3) if Council may agree to take land from a person who holds under the eleven months system (4) Largest area for allotment

The appointment of a ^{sub}Committee to supervise the carrying out of the allotment scheme was left over till meeting to be held on 19th January 1917.

Proceedings then terminated.

 Notification Act 1889

A report of Medical Officer of Health on the occurrence of an epidemic of Enteric Fever in Bundoran was read.

It stated that nine cases in all occurred between the dates November 20th and December 5th 1916.

The source of infection in the first cases in Mr Chas. Gorman's is doubtful. It appears to be due either to (a) a plying contaminated by faeces from visitors who were not well of the disease when staying at Bundoran, or (b) to some person who though not ill is capable of disseminating the disease — in other words is acting as a carrier.

I have sent the urine of a person for Bacteriological examination and will be able to say if there is anything in the latter contention in a few days.

All the later cases were due to direct association with the patients ill of the disease, or infection from milk.

All the cases were immediately sent to the fever hospital and the houses disinfected.

With regard to the future it is necessary to say a few words about the houses in which fever occurred. In my opinion it will be necessary for Mr Chas. Gorman to put up a W.C. and connect with the sewer at once; also to protect the public it would be better, if he sells milk, to see that none of his family who have suffered from fever should milk for some months after recovery ^{and handle milk}. In Gallagher's premises there is no sanitary convenience whatever and as this is the second time fever has broken out here it is absolutely necessary to have a W.C. put up at once. The Co. should endeavour to help this man to complete the drainage.

The new labourers' dwellings should all have W.C.s and be connected with sewer.

Council ordered that Charles Gorman be directed to put up a W.C. and connect with sewer, and that one pound be offered to Patrick Gallagher to help to make his premises sanitary.

Clerk stated that the sewerage of Artzians dwellings was almost completed.

A report from Rose Loughlin, 2 Town Hall, St. Bundoran, stated that the premises at the Town Hall Bundoran were in an unsanitary state dangerous to the public health for the last twelve months.

Council directed clerk to furnish a copy of report to R. H. Matthews, Solicitor, Ballyshannon, agent for the owners of premises.

The committee arranged that Clerk be informed if deputation was successful in procuring a suitable area for allotments, in which event notices for applications from workmen requiring plots, were to be published.

From Law Union and Rock Insurance Co. Ltd, dated 9th February 1917, acknowledging receipt of Paying Order for £1.12.2 premium on Policy E/K No. 043718.

From National Aid Association Dublin dated February 1917, enclosing copies of protest against the present treatment

of Irish Prisoners, and requesting council to obtain as many signatures of women as possible to document.

The Town Surveyor read the following Report.

To the Chairman and members of the Bundoran Urban District Council.

Gentlemen,

In accordance with Article 8 Paragraph 2 of the Urban (Transferred Business Procedure) Order 1906, I beg to submit the following Report for the Half year ended the 31st March 1917.

Roads.

The Road Contracts, under the Donegal County Council, numbered 16 and 17 in the list of County Proposals, for Half year ended 30th September 1916 expired on 31st March 1917, and these roads are now under the direct control of the Bundoran Urban District Council.

The state of portion of road numbered 16, comprised within the Urban Boundary is most unsatisfactory and will need attention.

In a letter dated 15th February 1917 in accordance with your instructions, I pointed out to the County Surveyor of Donegal, that owing to the neglected state of the road, a large expenditure of money from the Urban Council would be necessary to put the part within the Township in a suitable condition for traffic.

By your directions I procured six hundred and seventy tons of stone which are broken and ready for application.

Contract no. 1

The contractor has not yet supplied the necessary quantity of metal for road under Contract No. 1 dated 14th June 1915 - Bundoran to Keshbeg.

There is a deficiency of over forty tons up to the present date.

In the circumstances, I am unable to recommend the payment of an instalment on the amount of this Contract, but in case the required complement of stones is supplied, and all the work incidental to rolling them is executed, I recommend that the full amount due be paid to the contractor.

Generally the streets have been kept clean.

The water tables of the road from Bundoran to Garrison, under unexpired contracts require to be thoroughly cleared, and they require to be side-dressed.

Footpaths

The flagged footpaths are in many places in need of repair, but owing to the extremely high price of flags very little improvement can be effected. Some footpaths require to be gravelled.

Water Supply

Owing to a defect in the main supply pipe on the Dartry Road, the pressure for some time was low.

The defective length of pipe was removed and replaced by a new one, and the pressure is now normal.

There is a large deposit of gravel at the Intake and I would suggest that as much as possible of this deposit, be removed at the first opportunity. The Stand Pipe returned, has been repaired and fitted with a new length of hose.

The intense and prolonged frost during the winter, caused a number of bursts in service pipes. These were repaired without undue delay.

Sewers.

The Septic Tank requires cleansing. The tidal flap valve has been repaired.

The Sewer to the Artizans' Dwellings has been completed, but there is a lodgment of surface water, at the front of these houses which ought to be removed.

Steps towards this end will be taken as soon as possible.

Public Lighting

The Public lighting system, gave satisfaction during the term of contract.

The cost ought to be curtailed, now that the period of lighting is reduced by two months.

As no tenders were received for works of maintenance approved of at last meeting I would suggest that the Council employ a man whose duties should be defined to take charge of the roads in the District for at least six months.
