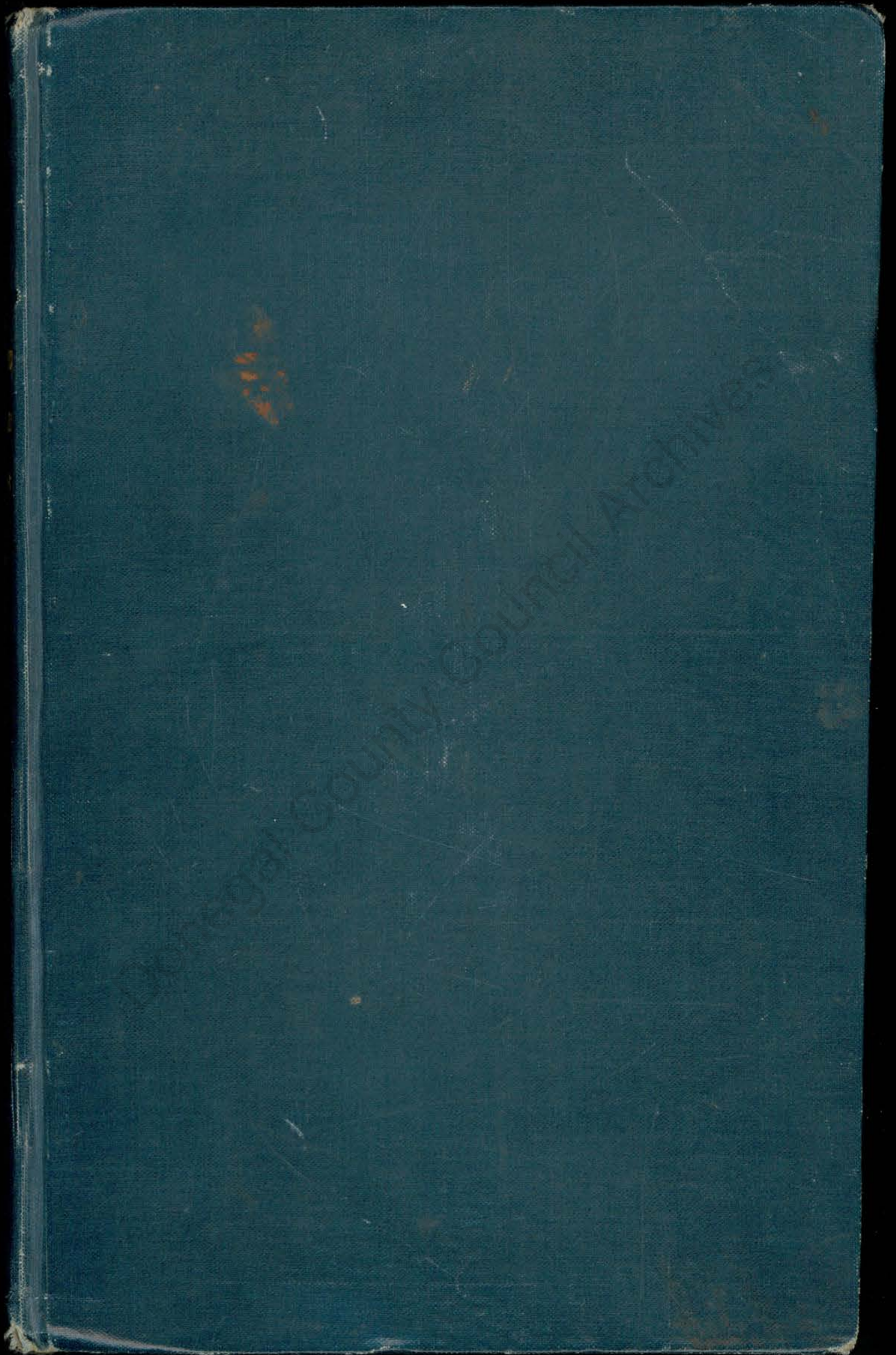

This Book is to be carefully kept by the Sheriffs, and the Sheriff's clerk, with regularity and fairly enter all his visits at the times they are made, together with his Observations on the State of the Prisons, conduct and behaviour of the Prisoners in the different Courts, he shall enter the names of all Prisoners who he shall find Misconducting themselves, or who shall have been reported to him, either by an Officer of the Prison, or by a Wardensman, and he shall enter all Complaints made to him by the Prisoners, so that the same may be submitted to the Sheriff and Governor, he will also take particular Care that this Book is kept clean and free from Blots.
