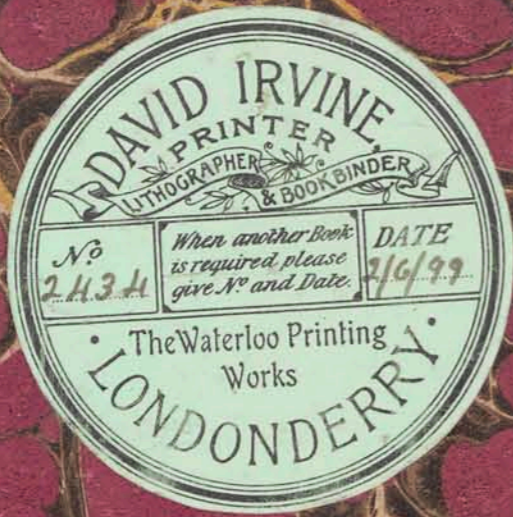

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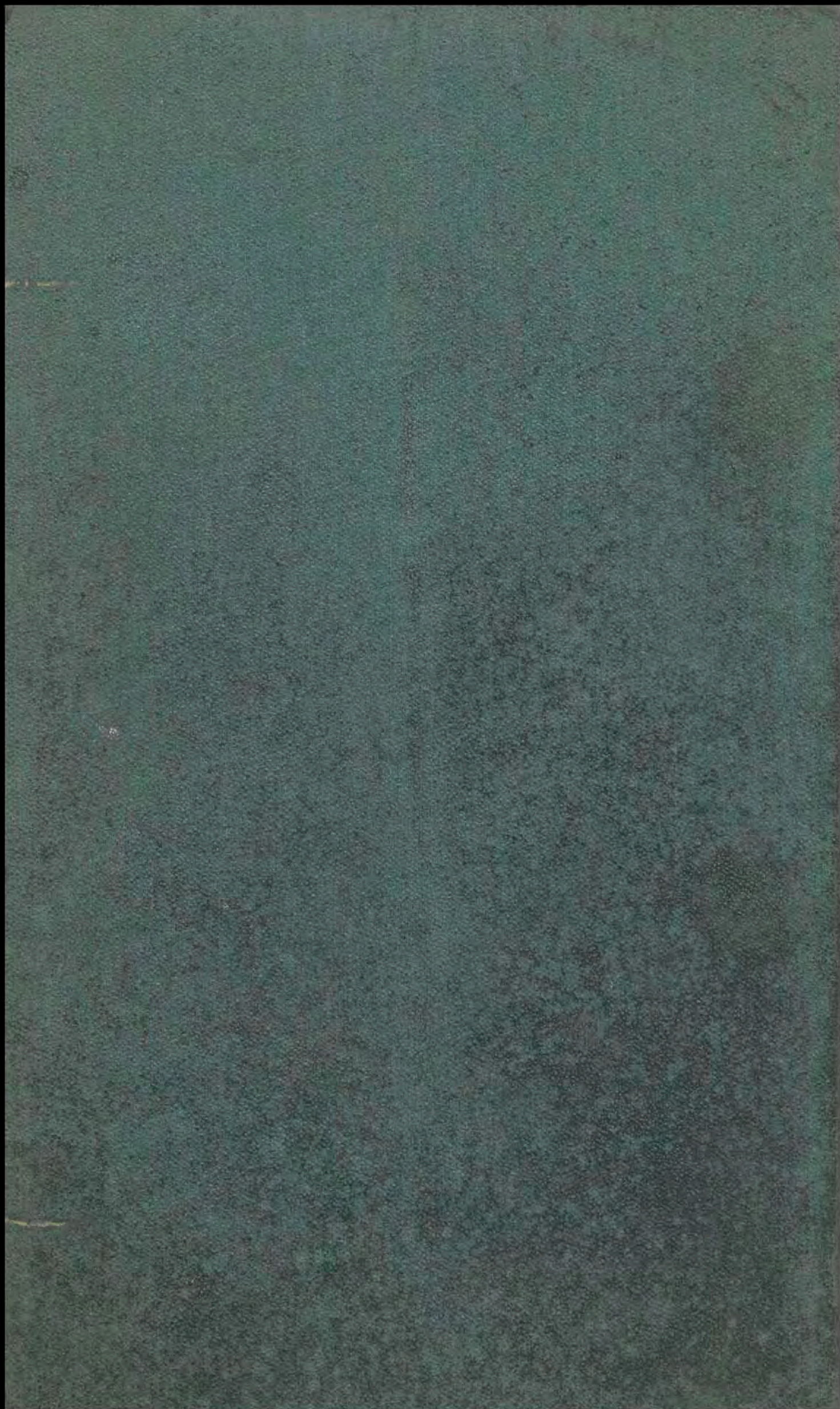

that the Clerk be instructed to send a demand to the
Donegal County Council before 22nd inst for whatever
amount he may estimate to meet the requirements of
this Council during the next three months.

Read Circular letter of 13th inst from the Local
Government Board. Forwarding two copies General
order for keeping and auditing the accounts of
District Councils in Ireland.

Read Circular letter of 13th inst from the
Appeal Commission Office, in reference to appeals

Read report from Dr Hamilton, Medical Officer of
Health of Burt Dispensary District, stating that a
mole existed on the premises of the Hugh Lully
Railway Company at Mahan Station and that two
men were ill of Typhoid Fever at same place. The
accommodation was very defective, and badly
ventilated. The Clerk stated he had on receipt forwarded a
copy of the report to Mr Dawson, Secretary to the Company. Also
letter from Mr Dawson in reply, contradicting some of the
statements and intimating that Mr O'Doherty, the Company's
Engineer, and their Engineer would appear before the Council
to attend to the matter. Also read letter of 30th instant from the
Government Board, forwarding letter they had
received from Dr Hamilton, and also copy of their reply,
in reference to the subject, and directing the Council's attention
to the provisions of the Public Health Act 1878, and to the
recommendations of the Medical Officer in regard to the
prevention of Infectious Diseases.

Read report from D. Hamilton medical officer of Health of Burt Dispensary District stating that a nuisance existed on the premises of the Lough Swilly Railway Company at Tahan Station, and that two persons were ill of typhoid fever at same place. The closet accommodation was very defective and badly attended to. The Clerk stated he had, on receipt, forwarded a copy of the report to Mr Dawson, Secretary to the Company. Also read letter from Mr Dawson, in reply, contradicting some of the Doctor's statements and intimating that Mr O'Doherty the Company's Solicitor, and their Engineer, would appear before the Council in regard to the matter. Also read letter of 27th inst from the Local Government Board forwarding letter they had received from D. Hamilton and also copy of their reply relative to the subject, and directing the Council's attention to Sec 127 of the Public Health Act 1875 and to the recommendations of the medical officer in regard to the notification of infectious diseases. Also read letter of 3rd inst from Mr O'Doherty, suggesting a conference of D. Ordered payment of £1. to John Fulton for keeping Carrigans Pump in order for year ending 1st May 1899 as per agreement Pursuant to advertisement the Board proceeded to let two labourers Cottages at Three Trees at present vacant, after discussion it was decided by 10 votes to 7 to let the houses to the former tenants John & Michael Doherty at 10 per week.

Read letter of 27th inst from Mr Wilson, Solicitor at Abane stating he had been instructed to appear on behalf of the Donegal County Council in cases for applications for compensation under the Criminal Injury to Property Act, and asking for information in the case of a constable named Dolphin who was claiming £700 for personal injuries received in the discharge of his duty. After full discussion it was decided to employ Mr J. H. Miller to appear on behalf of the Council he having already all the particulars of the case, and that the Clerk write Mr Wilson, that the Council will not require his services, Messrs O'Leary, McLaughlin, Coyle, Simpson, Logan & Fleming were appointed a committee to instruct Mr Miller in the case.

Read letter of 10th inst from the Local Government Board in reference to Guardians minutes of 15th February last, and asking whether the necessary repairs to the well at Ballyhaskey have since been executed. Ordered that the Local Government Board be informed that the well in question has been filled up.

Read circular from the Secy. to Donegal County Council forwarding copy resolution passed by them viz "that this Council declare that there shall be no main roads in the County, and that each District maintain all its roads."

Read circular letter of 15th inst from the Local Government Board in reference to the difficulties that appear regarding the dates in which the Council meetings are to be held, and making certain suggestions in reference to the matter.

Read the following Orders received from the L.G. Board viz 15th May 1899. Declaration of County Councils with respect to main roads.

15th May 1899. Sudden damage to Public works, objection by Council of District wholly chargeable with expense of repair.

9th May Compulsory acquisition of land by County Council for widening an old road or making a new one.

15th May. In reference to areas of charge for Rural Sanitary Expenses.

The Committee appointed on 3rd inst. In reference to the question of salaries reported as follows.

The Committee beg to report that they met on 13th May and after consultation with the Committee of No 1 District they recommended to the Council that the following salaries should be fixed: D. Spruille as Sanitary Officer for No 1 District £15. 15. 0 No 2 District £14. 10. 0, James Buchanan Sanitary Sub Officer for No 1 District £5. 15. 0 & for No 2 District £14. 0. 0, W. T. Panyas Clerk to Rural District Council £34. appointed part of work as Executive Sanitary Officer No 1 District £12 No 2 District £8, with regard to the salaries, the Committee have not sufficient material before them to arrive at an exact conclusion and they suggest that the salaries should be subject to revision at the end of the year, when the work to be done can be ascertained.

Resolved that the whole Council be appointed a Committee to examine the Sanitary Sub Officer's books, the Committee to meet fortnightly on every alternate Saturday at 11.30 o'clock, and report their proceedings at the monthly meetings of the District Council, four to form a quorum.

Read letter of 27th inst from Babington & Sons Solicitors stating that the Londonderry and Lough Swilly Railway Coy had been prosecuted for non abatement of a nuisance at Galan, and the case had been postponed for two months to allow Defendants to carry out what was wanted. The Clerk was directed to instruct the Council Solicitors to apply for all costs incurred at the adjourned hearing.

Read letter of 19th inst from the L.G. Board No 40587.

In regard to Dr Hamilton having received only two reports from the Sanitary Sub Officer, during the quarter ended the 30th ult and asking the Council to request him to submit reports of each meeting of the work performed since previous meeting. The Sanitary Sub Officer explained that the only cases he reported to the Doctors were those who failed to abate the nuisances on his own notice, and he was directed to report all cases in future in the first instance to the Medical Officer.

He could find no source whatever of the disease. These people live in a good house, well kept, nearly at the top of the mountain.
