months.

The motion to adjourn the subject was carried by 5
votes to 3.

Read application from Mr Joseph Lynch, Rent Collector,
asking the Council to reconsider their decision in
regard to Poundage rate allowed him.

Ordered, that as there is a probability of more
cottages being erected the consideration of the application
be postponed for six months.

Read report from Committee appointed to carry out
certain repairs to well at Carrigans, which was adopted
and the Committee were authorised to ascertain what
the probable cost of effecting the repairs would be,
and report to next meeting of Council.

The clerk submitted copy Dairy Regulations as
adopted by the Londonderry No 11 Rural District
Council

Council with approval of the Local Government Board.
On the motion of Mr Craig, seconded by Mr McIntosh, the
Regulations were adopted, and Sanitary Sub-officer Buchanan

Read Reports of analysis of water by Professor Pebody, the samples having been forwarded by Mr Hamilton Burt District, as directed by the Local Government Board. The Clerk was instructed to forward the analysis to the Local Government Board.

Read Circular of July 1900, from the Secretary Department of Agriculture, and Technical Instruction for Ireland, Forwarding Pamphlet of suggestions drawn up to aid local authorities in framing schemes. Ordered that application be made for two dozen copies of the Pamphlet for the use of the members of Council.

Read letter of 2nd inst from the Local Government Board to 42378. In reference to the proposal to increase the salary of Sanitary Sub Officer Buchanan, and requesting that the Medical Officers of Health might be asked to furnish reports as to the manner in which he discharged his duties during the past twelve months. The Clerk submitted Reports from the Medical Officers as requested and he was directed to forward copies of same to the Local Government Board.

Read letter of 7th inst from the Local Government Board to 38688. Stating they approved of the Regulations recently adopted with respect to Dairies &c in the District.

Read letter of 21st inst from the County Inspector R. J. C. Lestrick. In reply to the Clerk, stating he had given instructions to the Police to render every assistance to put a stop to the destruction of Public Property in the District.

Read communication signed by a number of Rate payers in Inch, complaining of the condition of the main road from Burnfoot, which was overrun with water to a considerable depth. After discussion, the Clerk was instructed to forward the County Surveyor a copy of the Document and ask a report from him as to what he would recommend to be done to remedy the state of affairs complained of.

The Clerk submitted 3 Representations under the Labourers Acts received from Jack & Hans Electoral Division Messrs Craig, Peoples & Co, and Mr Arthur were appointed a Committee to visit the District, and report at next meeting as to the necessity or otherwise for additional houses in the locality.
