

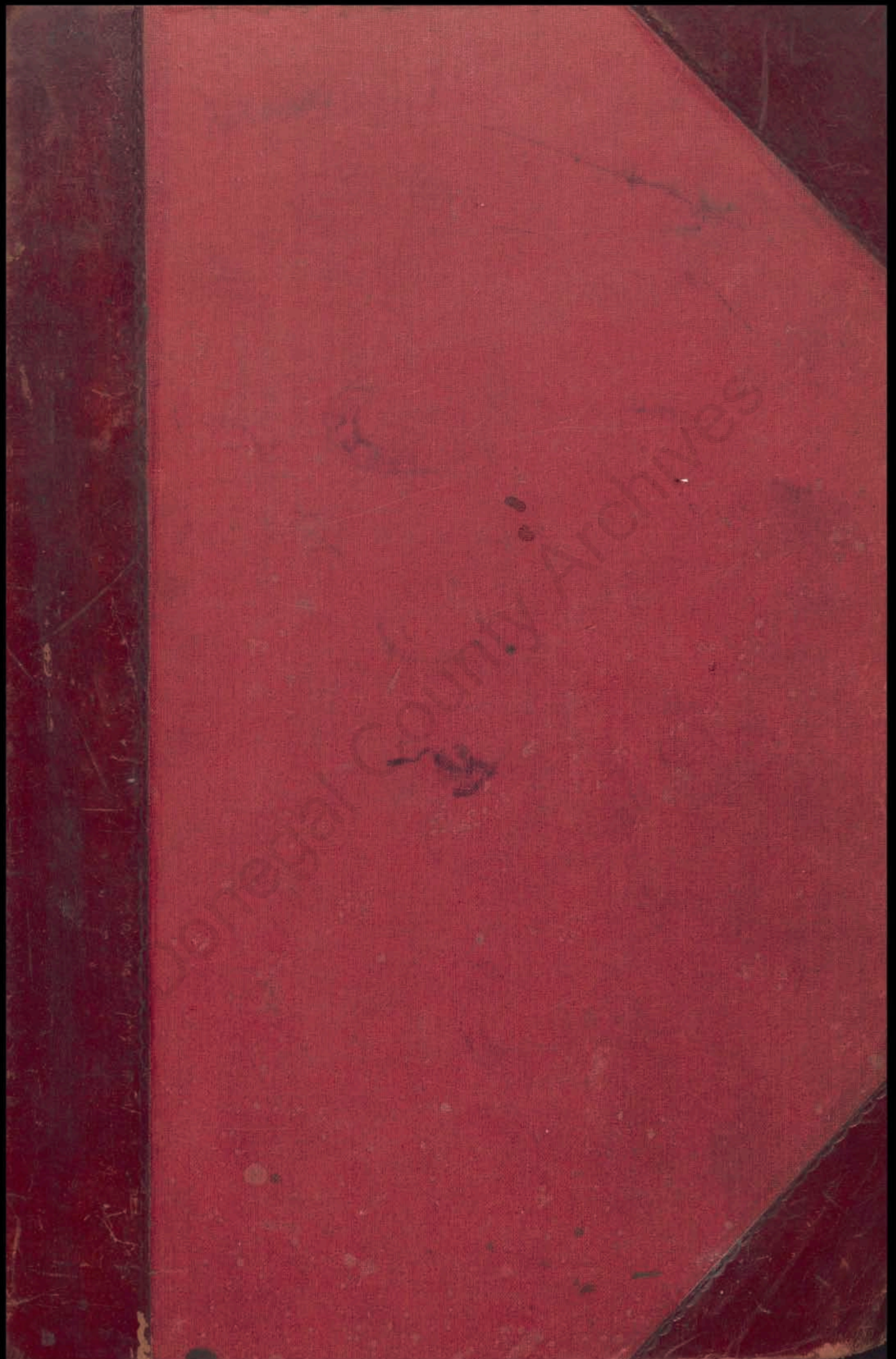

DIRECTIONS FOR USING
THE
Pen Duplicate and Triplicate Books

MANUFACTURED BY

DOLLARD, Printinghouse, **DUBLIN,** Ltd.

Place a sheet of one-sided carbon paper, face downwards, between the first and second leaves, and then the sheet of black board after the Duplicate. Write upon the first leaf with a Duplicator or Manifold Slip Pen, and two copies will be the result.

In the case of a Triplicate Book, a sheet of two-sided carbon paper is placed between the 2nd and 3rd leaves, and then proceed as above.

A CARBO-PLATE can also be supplied to take the place of the black board. This is a plate which grips the carbon, and at the same time provides an extra hard plate, made of aluminium, which gives an extra clear copy, and enables the carbon paper and support to be placed in position for writing and withdrawn without touching the carbon with the hands.

9th July 1921 Read letter from Bundoran Urban Council stating that in consequence of non-payment of the rents by tenants of Labourers Cottages they are not in a position to discharge their liabilities to Ballyshannon Rural District Council at present.

Minute:— The facts of the matter in relation to this case to be submitted to Local Govt. Department Dail Eireann for instructions. The facts are briefly as follows:—

About the year 1915 the town of Bundoran (which till formed part of Ballyshannon Rural District) obtained the powers of an Urban District. At that time there were 38 Labourers Cottages within the now Bundoran Urban area, said cottages having been erected by Ballyshannon Rural District Council under the Labourers Act.

The loans for erection of the Cottages were got by Ballyshannon Rural District Council from the Board of Works and

Irish Land Commission, to be repaid in 68½ years by halfyearly annuities.

The Rates of Ballyphannon Rural District are the security for repayment of said loans.

On 20th October 1915 Mr J W Dwyer Chief Auditor of the Local Government Board prepared an adjustment Award which amongst other matters stipulated that Bundoran Urban Council should pay to Ballyphannon Rural District Council a sum of £ 73-19-10 halfyearly in respect of repayment of these loans - this being the actual portion chargeable in respect of the houses in Bundoran area.

He also stipulated that Bundoran Urban Council should take over said cottages ^{which they had} and that the necessary transfers ^{deeds} should be made. Both Councils agreed to this, but the solicitor intimates there was some difficulty about the deeds owing to Bundoran Council not instructing him proceed with them.

Bundoran continued to pay the halfyearly annuities regularly up to and including December 1918, since when they have not paid any to this Council, leaving a sum of £ 369-19-2 due by Bundoran.

There was some difficulty in Bundoran Council getting rents from the tenants, and negotiations were going on about the purchase of the houses by the tenants. It is understood legal aid was obtained at these negotiations. but one point which is clear is that the Bundoran Urban Council have failed to carry out their duty to this Council by failing to pay their charge of £ 73-19-10

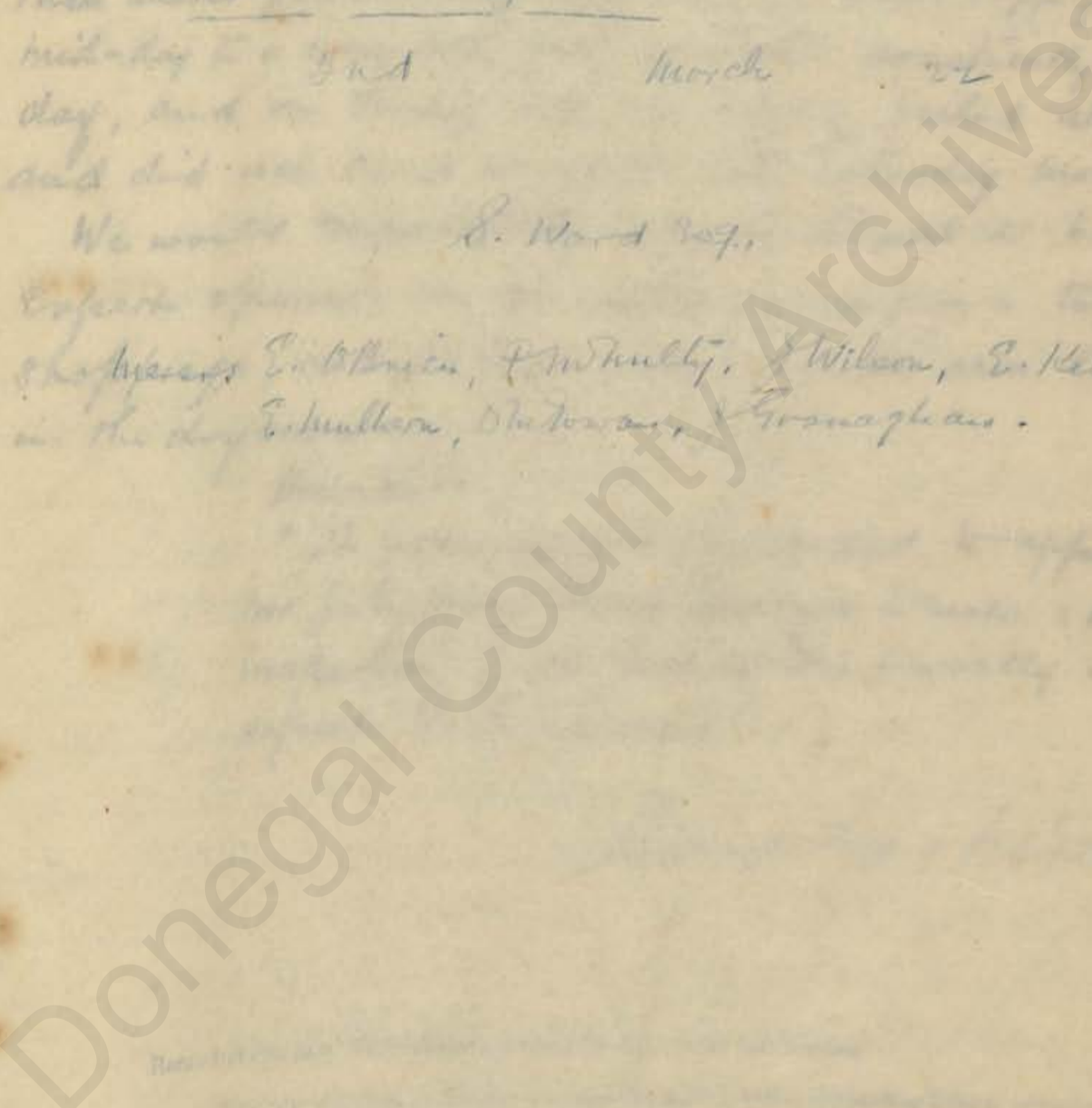

The Clerk reported that as instructed by the chairman of the council he summoned this ^{meeting} special, to deal with the shortage of water in the town of Ballyshannon.

It was decided to appoint a waterworks Committee who would meet periodically and report to the council. The following were appointed Messrs J. Cleary, E. Mulhern, S. Word, R. Keely, E. O'Brien, P. Whalley, F. Mcready, W. Biggs, H. Anderson J. Whalley.

Mr E. Mulhern proposed and Mr J. Cleary seconded that Mr James McGowan plumber be instructed to have all leakages in the main repaired and all defective pumps attended to.

It was also decided

The following Letters from the Local Government Board for Ireland or others were read, and directions given thereon, as follows:—

That the Plumber be employed along with Waterworks Undertakers to examine every Connection with the Main and submit a report on the position, bore and condition of each such Connection this to include all taps and fittings.

It was further decided that the Water Supply be cut off town from 8 pm to 8 am daily and provided that it be not turned on for Southern side of town for one hour after it is turned on each morning to allow pipes to fill up properly.

Report on the Waterworks, Ballyshannon.

To the members of the Rural District Council.

Gentlemen,

As instructed by you I made an examination of the Ballyshannon Waterworks. Owing, however, to the absence of any records such as plans, specifications etc. All the information ^{had} ~~was~~ to be obtained on the ground and the conditions ~~under~~ which these observations were made necessitated considerable delay.

The supply to the Service Reservoir is taken from the Northern side of Ardatton Lough by seven inch pipes which lead into a Sluice House. From this Sluice House one seven inch pipe is carried around the side of the Lough through a soft bog for a distance of 2,500 feet. It then takes the course of the river through Cavangarden demesne to the Donegal Road and along the side of this Road it goes to the Service Reservoir. The total length of this pipe is 14,200 feet and it is reduced somewhere on the Road to four inches in diameter. From the Sluice House to the Reservoir there seems no provision made for scouring out the pipe where it dips. An auxiliary intake has been made into the pipe from a stream which supplies the Lough, but this seems to be of very little assistance in augmenting the supply of water to the Town.

The placing of the Sluice House at the Northern side of the Lough and carrying over 1,000 feet of extra pipe through a soft bog seems strange and this can only be explained on the assumption that that side of the Lough is the deeper and freer from sediment than the South or outlet side. The laying of this pipe through the soft marl which underlies the bog must have been a difficult undertaking as it is about eight feet below the surface and when an opening is made the hole immediately fills with water.

The Sluice House has probably not been cleaned out since it was built as there was an accumulation of mud two feet deep in the sump in which the inlet and outlet pipes are placed. To remove this mud the entire system of pipes had to be emptied.

The undulating route which the pipe follows from the Lough to the Reservoir causes it to be liable to air lock in a number of places. On the rises of the pipe air valves are required but I have only been able to locate two. The others must be covered up. The two I examined were so rusted up that no air could escape and the both had to be cut to get them opened. What state the pipe is in where it passes through the bog I can only assume. There is however an obstruction of some kind either of sediment or air as the water flowing through the seven inch pipe after it leaves the bog is only three inches deep.

The Reservoir has a capacity of 75,000 gallons and the quantity of water coming in at present is 46,800 gallons per 24 hours. This amount allows 20 gallons per head per day of the population. Unfortunately ^{owing to} leaks in pipes and fittings throughout the town more than half of the water is going to waste. If the following recommendations are carried out the amount should supply the needs of the town until the supply from the Lough is augmented.

Recommendations

- (1) A waterworks Committee be formed to look after the water. This Committee to meet periodically to consider reports.
- (2) A plumber be at once appointed who is conversant with the pipes and fittings throughout the town to make inspections and to repair all leaking pipes and put the ^{foundations} and fittings in order.
- (3) The man in charge of the water be instructed to turn off the water each night at eight O'clock to prevent waste from defective pipes during the night and to turn it on at eight O'clock in the morning. With a view to giving a supply to the houses on the higher levels the valves controlling the lower levels of the town should be turned off for an hour or so while the water is high in the Reservoir. This turning off of the water at night to continue
