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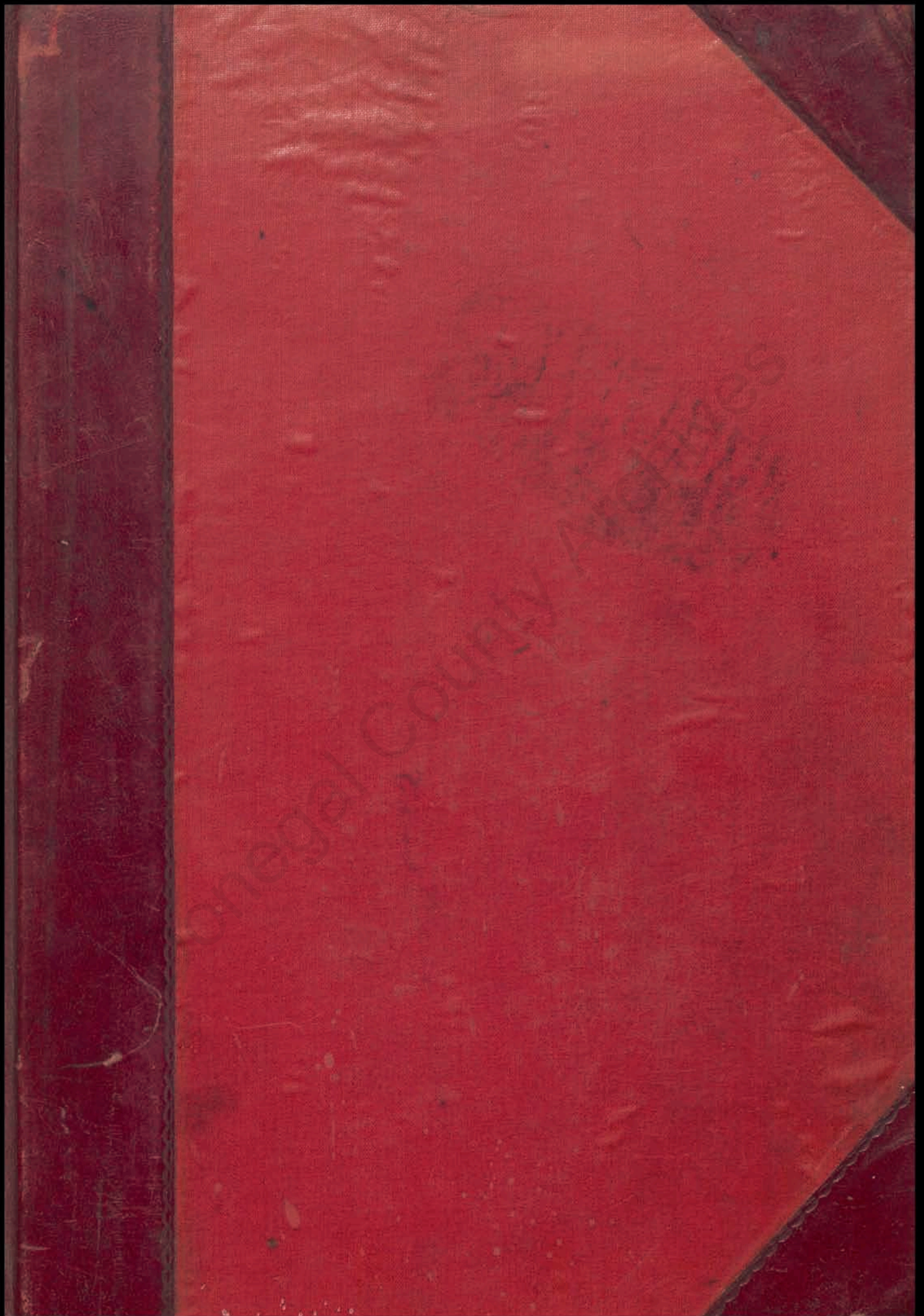

Reports from the Medical Officers of Health were read, and directions given thereon, as recorded in the Report Book of the Clerk of the Council.

(1) To build a new sluice house at south end of lake and raise surface of lake & take a new supply from new sluice house & lay with better & more uniform gradient. This should increase supply by 50%
(2) Lay a new main of pipe from south side of lake & connect to those existing. This will increase supply of water.
The present quantity of water coming into town for houses is 2000 gallons which should supply a much larger town than Ballyshannon.

The Council made the following recommendations:

The Council should examine all leakages in the town and have them repaired. Contractors to have bills rendered as suggested by him and to submit an estimate of cost of improving the supply.

The following Letters from the Local Government Board for Ireland or others were read, and directions given thereon, as follows:—

The Report of Ballyshannon Waterworks Committee at their meeting was submitted.

The report stated the following members were in attendance at meeting on 25th April 1922

Mr. P. M. Nulty, Presiding, N. Anderson, R. Keely, J. Kelly,
 F. McCready, J. M. Nulty, W. Puffer & O'Brien,
 also J. Caffrey Co. Surveyor.

J. Caffrey Co. Surveyor reported that the pipe running through the bog (source of supply) is running half full. He could not at that time fully investigate the matter as pipe runs through the river. To augment supply he suggested two courses

- (1) To build a new sluice house at south end of lake and raise surface of lake & take a new supply from south side of lake in addition to pipe coming from existing sluice house. Laid 2500 feet of pipe from new sluice house & relay with belts & more uniform gradient. This should increase supply by 50%
- or (2) Lay a similar set of pipes from south side of lake to reservoir to those existing. This will increase supply by 100%

At present the quantity of water coming into reservoir per 24 hours is 86400 gallons which should supply a much larger town than Ballyshannon

The Committee made the following recommendations

- (1) The Coroner & plumber examine all leakages in the town and have them repaired. Co. Surveyor to have lake dammed as suggested by him and to submit an estimate of cost of improving the supply.

" (2) That the water pipe used for driving machinery at
 " Donnal Vindicator office be cut off main.
 " The employment of Tom Rooney and son making
 " openings at pipes etc was approved of.

Circular from Inspector of Taxes stating as regards income tax for present year the proposals of the British House of Commons will be applicable to the Free State. All income tax levied will be payable to the Irish Exchequer.

The application of H.M. Inspector of Taxes for certified copy of accounts for last year was marked 'read' although recommended by registered letter.

6th June 1922

Letter from Secretary Incomail to Council stating the National Benefit Committee fixed for 10th inst has been postponed, owing to intimation being received from Local Govt Dept. that none of the candidates for position of Clerk to the Committee have qualified for appointment. The Clerk of Council is instructed to act as Clerk for the present.

29th May 1922

Letter from Local Govt Dept enclosing report of their Medical Inspector on the Inquiry into the charges of the Medical Officer charging fees to patients in the Workhouse Hospital.

Dr O'Dwyer in his report points out that he held an Inquiry on oath at Ballystanon on 24th May 1922 to investigate charges that the Medical Officer charged fees to patients in Hospital in addition to his salary.

Mr Bates, Solr. for Board of Guardians submitted the names of the following patients in respect of whom it was alleged Dr M. Mullen charged fees:-

Michael Goan admitted 30/7/20 still a patient
 Larry Mullan 20/11/20 discharged 5/1/21
 Bridget Meehan " 26/1/20 " 8/3/21
 Anne Kelly " 13/5/21 " 24/6/21
 Bridget O'Hagan 27/11/20 " 28/11/21

The charge was withdrawn in the case of Larry Mullan, and neither Michael Goan nor Anne Kelly, or any person on their behalf attended the inquiry although summoned by repeated letters.

It was admitted by Dr M. Mullen that he charged fees in the cases of Mrs Meehan and Miss O'Hagan. His Counsel Mr M. Maguire B.L. objected to the holding of the inquiry on the ground that no statute or regulation could be produced showing it to be an offence for a Workhouse Medical Officer to demand fees from paying patients.

Dr M. Mullen swore he never charges fees to poor persons or any patients except private patients. The patient O'Hagan consulted him at his own house previously to admission.

Dr Flood swore that the friends of Mrs. Meehan agreed to pay the Dr £2.2.0 a week arranged with Dr M. Mullen to admit Mrs Meehan, it was explained to them they would have to pay Dr M. Mullen £2.2.0 per week.

Mr G. O'Brien D.B. stated the objection he and his colleagues felt was that the doctors private patients occupied beds thus in some cases excluding poor persons. He mentioned a case named M. Gonzalez, and the Dr said this was a mental case & not a hospital one. However, alleged neglect against Medical Officer. Drs Kerrigan, Walsh, & Flood swore that so far as they knew paying patients in Workhouse Hospitals and County Infirmarys pay their medical attendants fees.

While there appears to be no regulation or statute preventing a workhouse Medical Officer ~~from~~ from demanding fees from private patients while in Workhouse Hospitals it is undesirable that private patients should be admitted without restriction or without limit. Limited accommodation should be provided for paying patients if possible in private wards. That accommodation should not be exceeded except by permission of the Board of Management. Fees payable only in respect of patients in the Wards. No patients from outside County or area on which Hospital is chargeable to be admitted without special permission from Committee of Management.

It should be the aim of the Board of Management to obtain the most skilled Surgeon or Physician, and pay him a considerable salary, or pay him a relatively small salary & allow him charge fees to private patients. Dr M. Mullin was appointed in 1914 @ £70 a year, now raised to £120.

There was no stipulation that he should receive no fees, and the salary does not appear sufficiently high to assume such restrictions. In the circumstances the Doctors demand for fees from persons who were not "Poor persons" which had been arranged for before their admission was not contrary to the Regulations, but cases from ~~out of~~ outside Ballyshannon area should have been specially reported to the Guardians.

The Inspector did not investigate nor enquire into the reasonableness of the fees that being outside the purview of the Inquiry.

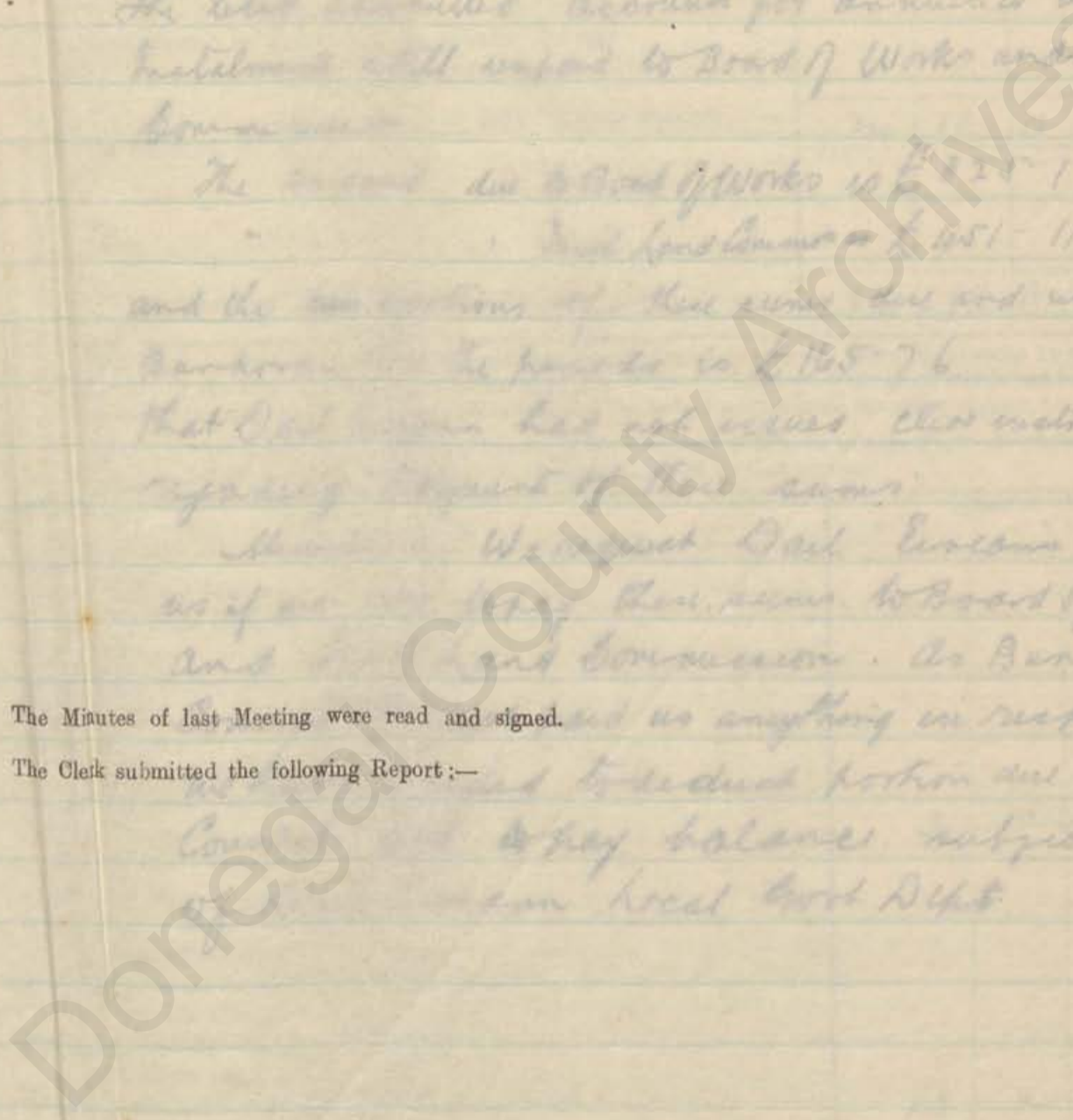

A Chair,

It is now more than two years since the local bodies of Ireland have pledged their allegiance to the Local Government Dept. of Dail Eireann. That pledge was given so that we might steel our nerves and our strength the better to fight against the British. It is a matter for congratulation that that pledge was fulfilled to the letter by the Local bodies of Ireland with a very few exceptions and the fighting attitude put up by the Local bodies of Ireland was no small factor in achieving the victory of the Truce of July 11th last year and, subsequently that of the Treaty of December 6th. Now more than ever is that splendid allegiance, which counted so much for Ireland's victory against the British, required of you. For today, the right of the free choice of the people of Ireland to declare under what form of Government they will live, the very sovereignty of the people itself, their right to choose their own political status, to order their own will-being, are being ruthlessly challenged. And the Government of An Dail which stands for the free choice of the people, for the rights of the plain people above all, is being attacked not by the verbose and unscrupulous rhetoric of lying politicians or of a lying Press but by desperadoes whose only arguments are the revolver and the rifle and the arrogant presumption of their Mexican-like leaders to choke the voice of the people; men whose feed is plunder and whose aim is the negation of all Government, men who by inviting a return of the British forces and renewal of the conflict with England will give us, the plain people of Ireland, not a republic, not a free state but an ash-heap. You men of Donegal who believe in the right of the people to override the decision of any minority within the nation, who believe that the Treaty of December 6th gives us, not the millenium but enough of it to enable us to juggle our own destinies as we wish them to be guided you surely will not idly look on whilst your rights and the Government which wants to protect your rights are being attacked formidably. Now more than ever must you stand by this Department and by the Government of An Dail. Now must sacrifices be made, that the people's rights may be vindicated, and that the Government of the plain people of Ireland, the first for centuries, and the most democratic Government in the world, may be enabled to give this unhappy land stable and ordered government. The issue is now one not between a Republic and a Free state but one between order and good government on the one hand and ruin and chaos on the other. We expect that the men of Donegal and especially the representatives of the people of Donegal, will see it that peace and good government will triumph over lawlessness and anarchy.

As a practical step I would suggest that public bodies urge the necessity for the forming of Local Defence Committees especially in Towns which may be invested by military forces the duties of such committees would be generally vigilance ordinary police work protection of private property, conservation and control of food supplies. District Organisations of imparted funds should take this matter up immediately and most seriously.

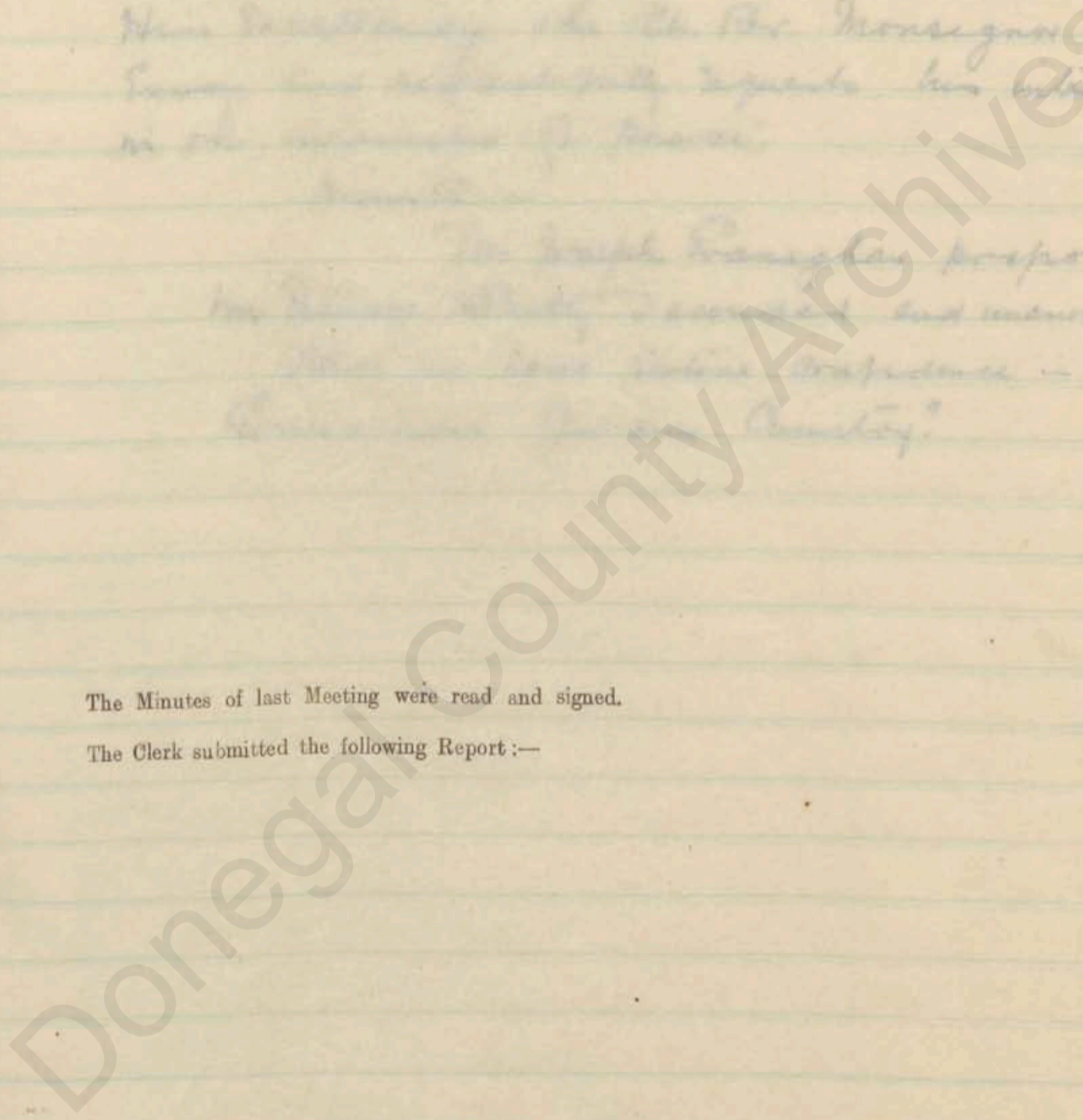
