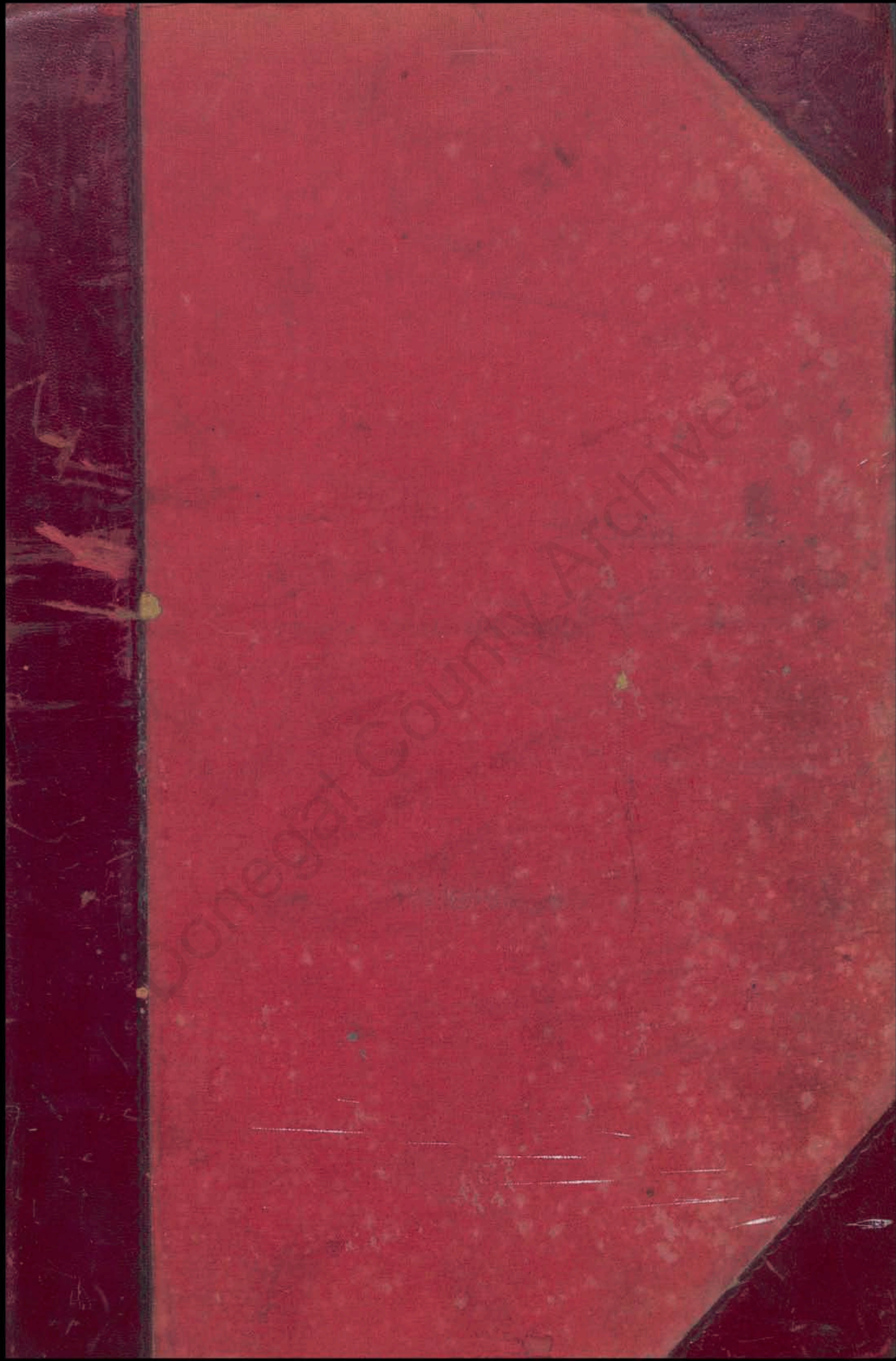

Read letter from Mr John Gillespie Rate Collector Ballyshannon, stating that he has been directed to supply list of Ratepayers, who have persistently refused payment of the Poor Rate in his District. Mr Leon Whully a Tenant of your Council is one these, he requests to be informed what action the Council have taken in this case.

The Clerk was directed to apply to the Dundoran Urban District Council for instalments due under Arbitrator's award of 1915. amount £73:19:10.

The Clerk reported that Mr Mulhern D.C. + himself inspected the yards of the Cottages at Westport, Ballyshannon, where a whole heap of Clay and stones fell into the yards from the banks adjoining. We employed Mr Daniel Doherty to have the place cleared of the rubbish and we recommend that he paid £1-5-0.

The following copy of a Specification submitted by J. Caffrey Esq., M. Inst. C.E.S. County Surveyor, Raphala Ballyshannon, for repairs to roofs of the two Cottages at Ballyhanna was approved.

Copy

Specification of work to be done and material to be used in covering roofs of thatched Cottages near G.H. Railway Station, Ballyshannon, for the Ballyshannon Dist. Council.

The members of the District Council do not bind themselves to accept the lowest or any tender nor will they accept any responsibility to parties tendering for the work.

The Contractor is to assume all responsibility and risk of the work from its commencement until the final payment has been made, he is also to take all liability under the Workmen's Compensation Acts and Employers Liability Act and indemnify the District Council against all claims by workmen or others under those Acts or otherwise howsoever.

During the progress of the work the Contractor is to make all provision for keeping the roof watertight by

providing and fixing the purlines or other covering while the work proceeds. The Contractor is to provide all labour, tools, plant, cartage and all material except the corrugated sheets, ridging and the nails and washers for fixing these to the purlines. These are to be provided by the Council but must be fixed by the Contractor.

Timbering of existing roofs. Provide and fix rafters $3\frac{1}{2} \times 1\frac{1}{2}$ scantling having collars half way up. These are to be fixed in the thatch at 5ft centres including one at each gable. They are to be secured to existing roof timbers and connected at apex of roof by ridge pieces $9 \times 1\frac{1}{2}$.

Purlines $3 \times 1\frac{1}{2}$ are to be fixed in concrete to connect the rafters. These are to be spaced from eaves to ridge at 3×9 centres and spiked to backs of rafters.

Fixing of Corrugated Sheets. The sheets are to be fixed to the purlines by means of drive screws & caps provided with the sheets. They are to have a proper lap and laid as directed by the Architect.

Ridging. After the corrugated sheets have been laid the ridge tiles supplied are to be fixed. These are in four foot lengths and are fixed similarly to the sheets by nailing to ridge pieces.

Flooding of Gables & Chimneys. Where sheets overlap gable walls of house a fillet of cement is to be formed. The sheets are to be cut to fit around chimneys. If the chimney should be too low after ridging is fixed they are to be raised either in concrete or bricked and in cement as instructed by the Architect.

The work is to be carried out to the satisfaction of the undersigned whose decision is to be final and binding on both parties to the contract.

We are confident that if the proposed repairs are carried out the present Cottages will be very nice & comfortable. Sanction requested."

Read letter from the Ministry of Local Govt sanctioning payment of a bonus of 2½% to Collector Luttrill in respect of the rents of Labourers Cottages collected and lodged by him to the credit of the Council for the half-year ended 31st March last.

It was unanimously decided to respectfully request the Minister for Local Government to refer to the Council's minute of the 12th April last, in which it was agreed to allow Collector Tuthill a bonus of $2\frac{1}{2}\%$ on rent + rates collected and lodged during year ended 31st March, 1924.

We now request the Minister for Local Govt to give his approval to the payment of a bonus of $2\frac{1}{2}\%$ to Mr Tuthill on the rent and rates collected and lodged for the $\frac{1}{2}$ year ended 30th September, 1923.

And we further request the Minister to give his sanction to an increase from 5 to $7\frac{1}{2}$ per cent in the rate of remuneration to Mr Francis Tuthill thus placing him on the same rate of pay as the other other Collector in the Rural District, Mr Peter McPhelim, sanction to date from 1st April last.

The Ministry sanctioned this increase to Mr Tuthill for one year on 30th May, 1923.

Ballyphannon Rural District.

Owing to the unsatisfactory condition of Collector McPhelim's rent collection, we have not paid him any fees since 30th June, 1922. He states that if the Council pays him what is due to him, that he will hand over to the Clerk or his sureties a substantial amount to be credited to certain tenants for the reduction of arrears, and that he will sign the pay order and hand it to the Clerk.

We request the Minister for Local Govt to allow the Council to ^{pay} him the fees due him, as we consider it is necessary to have his sanction in

This case Considering he has not received any salary for 2 years.

It was also decided to call on Mr McPhelim for his resignation for next meeting

Read letter from Mr R. H Reid Solicitor, Ballyshannon, stating that he was instructed by Mr John Anderson Ballyshannon to inform the Council that he cannot any longer submit to the loss he is incurring in the large meadow opposite the Convent, through the trespass of Fowl, Goats &c belonging to the Council's tenants of Cabours Cottages in Erne St Ballyshannon, the fence the Council erected is purposely cut in many places opposite the backs of the tenants houses, and the fowl get through these holes into the field and destroying it and also Goats.

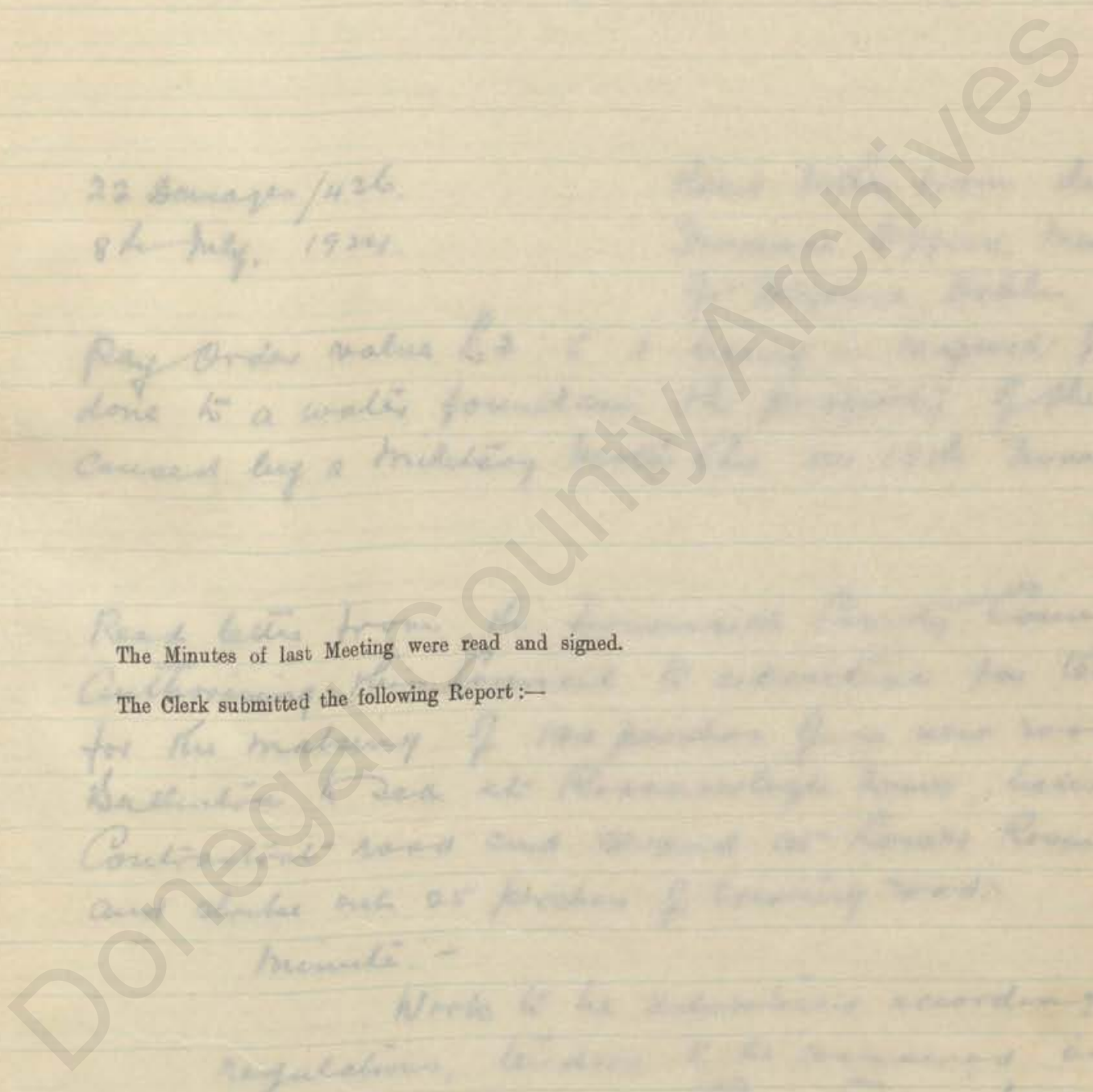

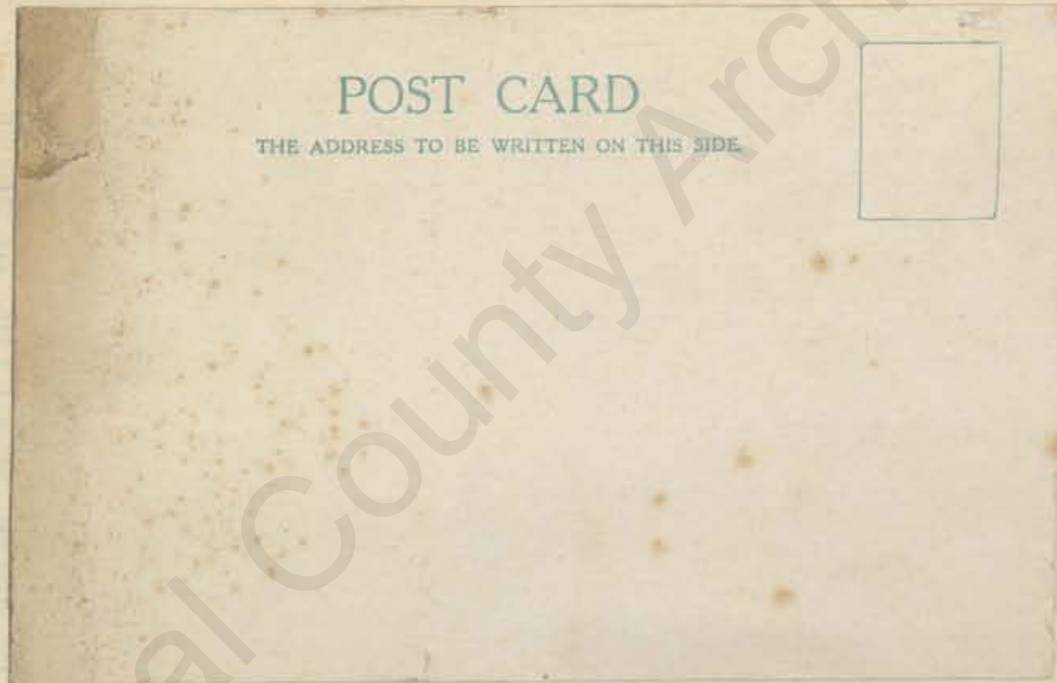
