County Surveyor's Report.

GENTLEMEN—During the Quarter ending the 30th June, 1900, the maintenance of the Roads has been rendered more difficult by the unfavourable weather. While a large proportion of the roads have been kept in fair order by contractors, at the same time, many sections of the leading roads leave much to be desired, and now that the contractors have had a reasonable opportunity of getting into the working of the new system, more stringent measures will in future be taken against those who fail to carry out their contracts in a more practical manner.

Herewith, my recommendations for those works which appear to me advisable should be passed by the District Council.
