From Local Government Board date 6th April '10 referring to Minutes of the Council of 5th Ult. on the subject the Board state that they will not raise any objection to the Council's proposal to pay Mr. M'Quade, Contractor a sum of £8. for removing the material provided by him for the erection of two Labourers Cottages on a site in the townland of Ballyhanna, which was subsequently changed by the Council.

From Local Government Board date 14th April 1910, forwarding six copies of an Order which they have made under Sec. 16 of Labourers (Ireland) Act 1886 authorising the Council to exchange the sites of cottages and plots of land mentioned in the Schedule to the Order.

From Mr. R. H. Reid Council's Solicitor date 18th April 1910, the Local Government Board having made an Order on 6th April last changing the site in Ballyhanna on Edward M'Dermott's land, Mr. Reid forwards a Deed Poll for execution by the Council vesting the land in themselves.

The Deed was duly executed.

A Memorial signed by 18 tenants of Cottages in Townland of Magheracar date 30th April 1910,

complaining of the cottages, was received.

The Memorialists state

The gates in front of cottages are almost off.

The down spouting when rain comes destroys the fronts of the houses, because there is no grate to take away the water. Some of the cottages have two down spoutings.

The back road is disgraceful to any Contractor to leave it out of his hands.

There is no water for the cottages which there ought to be.

The Cottages are not yet taken off the Contractors hands. The Complaint of the tenants was referred to the Engineer.

From Local Government Board, date 4th May 1910 stating that they have received the report of their Medical Inspector Dr. MacCarthy, relating to the Sanitary condition of the Rural District, extracts from which are enclosed, and the Board request that they may receive attention.

The Board request that the Sanitary Sub Officer may be provided with a diary in which he should be directed to enter a record of his inspections &c. in accordance with the requirements of Act 17 (13) of the Board's Sanitary Order No. 1 of 3rd May 1900.

With respect to the omission of the Council to carry out the registration &c. of Common Lodging Houses in the District the Board point

out that the provisions of Secs. 87 and 91 of the Public Health (Ireland) Act are mandatory upon Local Authorities -

The Council would do well to take into consideration the question of providing in conjunction with the Kinlough and Belleek Rural District Councils and the Guardians of Ballyshannon Union a properly equipped disinfecting apparatus for use in the entire Union. The Board desire to call special attention to Dr. MacCarthy's observations as regards the non-enforcement by the Council of the Dairies Cowsheds and Milkshops (Ireland) Order of 1908 in the District and the Board wish to refer to an entry on the subject in the Council's Minutes of 17th Oct. 1908, and to state that they cannot consent to the Order remaining longer in abeyance in the District -

The Board ask the Council to be good enough to take the necessary steps at their next meeting for the registration and inspection of all dairies, cowsheds &c situated in the District in compliance with the terms of Articles 1 & 2 of the Order and for the appointment of a Veterinary Inspector for the execution of the Order -

See Art. 2 of the Boards Sanitary (Veterinary Inspectors) Order of 30th July 1909 a copy of which was enclosed -

The extracts from Dr. MacCarthy's report are as follow,

There is one Sanitary Sub Officer in the District, John Higgins, who resides in Ballyshannon. The blocks of notices show that 11 notices were served since 4th February 1909, some of these notices refer to a number of premises -

The Sanitary Sub Officer does not keep a diary showing the Sanitary work which he performs. No reports were made by the Sanitary Sub Officer to the Medical Officer of Health of Ballintra District -

No action has been taken to administer the Dairies Cowsheds and Milkshops (Ireland) Order of 1908 in the Rural District - There is no systematic inspection of the meat and milk supplies -

The Medical Officer of Health of Ballyshannon District made 15 reports to the Sanitary Authority since last inspection, and the Medical Officer of Health of the Ballintra Dispensary District made 15 reports also during same period. Much improvement is required in the Sanitary condition of these Districts -

Orders are made by the Sanitary Authority on the reports of the Medical Officers of Health and Sanitary Sub Officer and Notices served but little real attention is paid to Sanitary matters -

No prosecutions have been instituted by the Sanitary Authority under the Public Health Act since last inspection -

Much improvement in the Sanitary condition of the Rural District is required

The Village of Ballintra is practically without

a water supply. The Rural District Council was found, after an inquiry some years ago, to have made default in this matter.

The Ballyshannon drains are constructed of rough masonry and frequently get out of Order. More drains are required.

There are no bye-laws under the Public Health Acts in force in the District.

The Medical Officer of Health believes that there are a large number of houses in Ballyshannon used as Common Lodging Houses but no houses are registered either there or in Ballintra. The Sanitary Authority have not provided an efficient disinfecting apparatus in their District.

Consideration of Dr. MacCarthy's report was adjourned.

From Local Government Board date 29th April 1910 forwarding for the information of the Council a memorandum on the Duties of Veterinary Inspectors in the service of the Sanitary Authorities -

The Board also furnish the Council with copies of an Order made by the Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland in regard to Tuberculosis in cattle -

From Mr. R. H. Reid, Council's Solicitor date 30th April 1910, informing the Council that the County Court Judge had awarded £9- for malicious injury by breaking windows and damages to fences at Labourers cottages to Mr. McQuade Contractor -

Mr. James J. Kelly had also been allowed £27- for hay alleged to have been maliciously burned. Mr. Reid requests instructions as to whether he will proceed with an appeal which he has entered against the County Court Judge's award.

The question of appeal was left over for consideration.

Mr. Wray, of Bishop St. Ballyshannon complained of Sewerage at the rear of her premises turning the place into a cesspool.

The Sewer to be opened and cleaned out so as to remove the deposit on Mr. Wray's premises.

From the Bundoran Beach and Town Improvement Committee calling the Council's attention to the following matters:

- 1st to have the street hydrants repaired and indication of their position placed on the walls.
- 2nd to have fire hose provided, 3rd That the Notice boards as to the deposit of rubbish be repaired -
- 4th to have the town lit by electricity next ^{term} ~~time~~ -

The Improvement Committee appear to have no regard for the great increase in the rates of the Sanitary Area which the carrying out of their recommendations would cause, ^{while} ~~which~~ the District Council are quite willing that all necessary improvements should be effected still some regard must be had to coexpenditure -

Notices to quit to be served on the persons above named, if rent is not paid up without delay.

A bursting of Sewerage pipes having occurred in College St. Ballyshannon since last meeting and the street having been flooded, the matter being urgent the Chairman and Clerk employed James Gallagher to supply new pipes and do

the necessary repairs.

The work cost £14. 5. 6 which the Council ordered to be paid -

I would ask your Council therefore to compel him to build up this fence and leave it in the same state it was on 18th Inst, before he tossed the wall of which he carted away stones on 19th Inst.

On account of the treatment I am receiving and the trespass on my crop, I beg to withdraw the permission I gave Mr. J. Breslin and the occupiers of cottages to pass through a gate

The Auditor Mr. St. John Considine made the following entry on the Rent Collector's Book date 14th October 1910, on his Audit of accounts for half year ended 31st March 1910,

"Two tenants were evicted during half year under Audit leaving arrears unpaid of £8..13..6 of this sum £6..16..0 accrued since the present Council came into office - The rent collector constantly reported to the Council the backwardness of these tenants but it neglected to take effective steps till these large arrears accumulated - I consequently consider that it was through the neglect of the Council that this sum of £6..16..0 was lost to the rates and accordingly I surcharge the members of the Council individually and collectively with the sum of six Pounds, sixteen shillings - I surcharge Mr. Peter M'Phelim, Rent collector with eighteen shillings, the amount of arrears unpaid by a tenant who gave up possession of a cottage, as it was through his failure in insisting upon prompt payment of the rent that these arrears were created and became a loss to the rates - The rent collector in this ^{case} did not report to the Council the existence of these arrears and in allowing them to accrue acted on his own responsibility

The following was unanimously agreed to on the Chairman's motion:

"The Council had before them a surcharge made by St. J. Considine Esq., the Local Government Board Auditor, and regret very much that the Auditor has felt it his duty to make same -

The surcharge deals with two cases of rent due out of labourers cottages where the rent was allowed to accumulate and remain uncollected - The amount is £6..16..0 -

In one of these cases the tenant William Carty went to America, and the Council believing that in a short time Carty would send his rent and return to his people did not wish to disturb his belongings - He failed to do so -

In the second case, that of Travers, the tenant had been in delicate health for some time, he got into arrears, was admitted to the Workhouse and died there - The Council had hopes of his recovery, and did not during his illness disturb his family.

The rent and arrears in both cases became lost and the Council ultimately were obliged to take up possession of the cottages by eviction -

The management of the towns of Ballyshannon and Bundoran especially in sanitary matters and during recent years has absorbed a good deal of the Councils' attention -

after the first cottages in the District were ready for occupation the former Council allowed the tenants to go into ~~arrear~~ ^{occupation} without giving any security for rent payment -

The two tenants Carty and Travers were tenants of the former Council, and had no sureties

for payment of rent - The present Council has allowed no tenant into occupation without a solvent security, (which is never difficult for the labourer in the first instance). If the local Government Board will investigate the work done by the present Council while in office they will ascertain that they have endeavoured in all matters to carry out every requirement of the local Government Board without friction of any kind. In every case the Council has endeavoured to impress on the labourers the necessity of punctual payments of rents, and the Council will insist in future on regular payments.

The District Council respectfully urge the local Government Board in extenuation of any remissness in this matter to consider the Council's record since the inception of the local Government Act of 1898, the provision now made against loss of rent, and for punctual payment, and this Council's willingness and readiness in all matters to be guided by the local Govt. Board. While the Council does not in any way dispute the justice of the surcharge, still under all the circumstances we respectfully urge the local Government Board in the present instance to remit the surcharge of £6..16..0 made by the Auditor on his recent Audit -

From local Government Board date 14th Oct. 1910 referring to the Council's Minutes of 1st Inst. The Board inform the Council that they have approved of the salary, viz. £50 a year, proposed to be allowed

by the Council for the Veterinary Inspector to be appointed under the Dairies, Cowsheds and Milkshops (Ireland) Order of 1908 in this District - The Board also sanction the remuneration of £9 a year proposed to be allowed by the Council to Sanitary Sub Officer Higgins for acting as Dairy Inspector under the Order in the Rural District - The Board add that they would prefer that the remuneration granted to Sub Officer Higgins should be paid as a separate salary, and in respect of the duties appertaining to his new appointment, in accordance with the practice which obtains in other Districts -

From Local Government Board date 18th Oct. 1910, stating that they have sanctioned the proposal of the District Council to pay the clerk of the Council a further instalment of £10 - as remuneration for his services in connection with the Improvement Scheme confirmed by the "Ballyshannon Rural District Labourers Order 1908" -

From Local Government Board date 26th Oct. 1910 returning the draft Regulations of the Dist. Council under Sec. 29 of the Labourers Act 1906, respecting the letting of cottages and allotments and stating that the Board consider that the same rent should not be charged for cottages with acre plots as for cottages with half acre plots attached - The difference in the rent should be measured by the difference in the cost (other circumstances being similar) of providing each class of tenement and the Board request that the Council will re-consider the matter accordingly -

The Board also suggest that the wording of the Schedule to the Draft regulations may be altered as indicated therein, in pencil, and a rent fixed for cottages with plots exceeding half but not exceeding three quarters of an acre of land attached, and the Board add that it is not necessary for the Council to adhere to the form of the model Schedule, but the Schedule should be framed to embrace the

different class of holdings in the District

The Board further inform the Council at the same time, that it is a practice in many Rural Districts to let, temporarily, the plots of land acquired as sites for cottages under the Acts, pending the erection of cottages thereon, with consequent advantage to the rates -

The Regulations to be amended as directed by the Local Government Board.

From Local Government Board date 29th Oct. 1910, referring to an entry on the Minutes of the District Council of 15th Inst. relative to the surcharge of £6..16..0 made by the Auditor at the recent Audit of the Council's Accounts, the Board state that in order that they may be in a position to take the question into consideration application should be made to them by the persons aggrieved under Sec. 12 of the Local Government Board (Ireland) Act 1871 - The application may be made conveniently on the enclosed form and should be accompanied by a copy of the surcharge and of the statement of the Auditor's reasons for his decision in the matter as entered by him at foot of the account.

The Local Government Board's directions to be complied with.

From Local Government Board date 4th Nov. 1910, forwarding to be laid before the Council the enclosed communication which has been received from the

occupiers of the cottages erected by them at Magheracarr under the Labourers Acts, and the Board request that they may be furnished with the Council's observations on the matters complained of -

The Board further request that they may be informed what steps have been taken by the District Council to remedy the defects in these and other cottages in course of erection in the District, which were brought to notice in the report of the Board's Architect, Mr. Foley, of 15th June last.

The following report on the cottages referred to in the above letter was received from the Council's Architect Mr. J. G. Townsend C. E.

" With reference to the complaints from Magheracarr I went there yesterday and interviewed as many tenants as I could find - they one and all denied having made any complaint as to water lying under the floors, and I don't see how such a thing could occur possibly - If any of them will show me any water lying under the floors I will undertake to have it put right -

As regards the inner walls not being carried up to the roof in my opinion this is correct and is my usual practice having regard to the stringent regulations for thorough ventilation in the roof -

Ventilating ridge tiles are specified for the pipes at end of each block, these would be useless without thorough openings, the ceiling ventilators would also be useless. The true cause of this complaint I fancy is that the tenants are accustomed to live in small badly ventilated rooms with low ceilings and thatched

roofs which undoubtedly keep at a much higher temperature than these properly ventilated cottages with their high ceilings. A slate roof carries off the heat very much faster than thatching - As straw is practically a non conductor of heat. I do not think there are any grounds for complaints whatever -"

From Mr. J. G. Townsend, Architect, date Nov. 4th 1910, certifying that the delay in completing the 50 cottages in Wm McQuade's contract was due to the extremely wet and stormy weather during the time he was working and that no deduction need be made in consequence from his contract amount -

Payment of the balance due Mr. McQuade on his contract for the erection of cottages was ordered.

Mr. Townsend sent in an account for £6.15.0 for valuing plots for cottages and giving evidence before the Arbitrator, and stating that the legality of the claim had already been admitted and payment sanctioned in other Districts -

Payment ordered subject to sanction of local Govt. Board.

From Mr. Peter McPhelin, rent Collector with reference to the surcharge made on him by Mr. Cousidine, Auditor, at the last audit of the Council's accounts, of three months' rent, amount 18/-, on a cottage in the townland of Louvagee, states as follows: -

"I don't think I should be surcharged with

The Medical Officer of Health of Ballyshannon Dispensary District reported three cases of Scarlatina in St. Joseph's Orphanage, Bundoran, he cannot say the probable cause of infection, the children have been attending the National School where they may have come in contact with some cases of disease -

The children are strictly isolated in Orphanage Hospital and the schools in Bundoran are closed -

The Medical Officer also reported another case of Scarlatina in Bundoran, cause of infection not known - The case is isolated at home -

A case of enteric fever was reported by Medical Officer on Rock, Ballyshannon, source not known. The patient was removed to Fever Hospital and house disinfected -

Mr. R. H. Reid, Council's Solicitor wrote date 16th December 1910, enclosing in the case of Bundoran Sewerage Scheme, for signature by the Chairman and Clerk of the Council and the Council's Seal, a petition to the Local Government Board in the matter, and also an application for a loan -
