The following Orders of the Local Government Board for Ireland were laid before the Board, and directions given thereon, as follows:—

Reports from Medical Officers of Health were read.

The following Letters from the Local Government Board for Ireland, or others, were read, and directions given thereon, as follows:—

From Michael Travers, tenant of a labourers Cottage and plot in Magheracar date 4<sup>th</sup> February 1911, stating that the fence on acre plot attached to the cottage given to him at last meeting of the Council has been changed since the last tenant left, and before Michl. Travers entered into possession. The fence was removed 12' 6" for 165 yards in on his acre. The Council having given no authority for so doing.

Messrs. T. Gorman Son & T. Gorman Jun. were appointed to inspect and report on the matter.

From Local Government Board date 30<sup>th</sup> Jan'y 1911 referring to an entry on the subject on Council's Minutes on 21<sup>st</sup> Inst. the Board presume that the salary of £10-a year proposed to be allowed to the Clerk, is for remuneration in respect of his duties as Registrar under the General Cowsheds, Dairies and Milkshops (Ireland) Order of 1908. If so the Board wish to be informed whether prior to the Meeting on 21<sup>st</sup> Inst. due notice was given to each Councillor in the usual manner of the intention to grant the Clerk the remuneration referred to.

Notice to be given to the members of the Council as notice of the intention of the Council was not

given for 21<sup>st</sup> Ult. relative to fixing the Clerk's salary as Registrar under the Dairies, Cowsheds and Milkshops Order 1908.

Mr. J. D. Reavy U.S. Veterinary Inspector under the Dairies &c. Order reported, date 28<sup>th</sup> January 1911. That he had visited up to date 78 Dairies & Cowsheds in Ballyshannon District. He has found with a few exceptions that owners are willing and anxious to carry out the Order and most of them have made any alterations he suggested.

Of course in this season of the year it would be impossible to carry out the Order relative to cementing floors, walls &c. they have all promised to do this when the cattle are put out to grass. In nearly all cases they have had the manure heaps removed and are making arrangements to store the manure at a proper distance from the Cowsheds. They have all had their Cowsheds lime washed and in most cases they have made arrangements for the proper drainage of same.

The report was considered satisfactory.

From Mr. Steadman Co. Surveyor, date 1<sup>st</sup> Feb. 1911 stating that when in Bundoran on 31<sup>st</sup> Ult. he noticed that the surface boxes in connection with the water main were in a very dangerous condition. It appears as if some one had been interfering with them. The attempt at resetting them is most crude and unworkmanlike. An accident may occur at any time, and

it is with a view of preventing the serious consequences that would result that he brings the matter before the Council -

No money should be paid whatever for the setting of these boxes - I understand this attempt at setting the boxes has been done by a man employed by the Council -

The Contractor for setting the boxes to be called upon to have the work done to the satisfaction of Mr. Steadman, County Surveyor -

From Mr. Patrick Cleary, Bundoran, date 3<sup>rd</sup> Feby. 1911, complaining that the nuisance caused by the drain on John Rogers' premises in Bundoran, has not been abated -

The Sanitary Sub Office to visit the premises and report as to whether the notice served on John Rogers for abatement of the nuisance has been complied with -

Mr. Meehan, 9 Brighton Terrace, Bundoran wrote date 27<sup>th</sup> January 1911 complaining of a nuisance caused by a man named George Maguire by depositing objectionable matter in a field in rear of his premises -

The Sanitary Sub Office to inspect and report on the matter -

The Clerk was directed to request Mr. Steadman

From Andrew Fanning, tenant of a cottage in Ballinacarrick, date 18<sup>th</sup> February 1911, complaining that the Cottage is very smoky and repairs are wanted to the back door, as it has rotted away at the bottom.

Patrick Daly to be employed to repair the Cottage, Messrs. Mulhern and Broslin to superintend the work.

A Memorial was received from the occupants of Cottages in Sminver requesting the Council to fill up and coat with broken stones the Lane leading to the Cottages in Townland of Sminver.

Messrs. Maguire, Mulhern and Daly were appointed as a Committee to examine the Lane.

With reference to the complaint made by Michael Travers tenant of a Labourers cottage in Magheracar, that the fence on the plot attached to the Cottage had been moved, Messrs. Gorman, the Committee appointed to report on the matter informed the Council that the fence had been changed from the position in which it was originally placed.

Bryan Doherty the adjoining tenant to be written to informing him that unless the fence is changed back to its former position, notice to quit will be served on him.

From John Cleary, Bundoran, date 3<sup>rd</sup> Feby. 1911 caretaker of Bundoran Waterworks and Sewerage, stating that he had performed the duty attached to the office during quarter -

On visiting the reservoir he found the gravel on the filtering beds put up in ridges having the water only flowing in the furrows, in his opinion this was done by some person, as it was evident it could not have been done by the floods - The surplus gravel had been removed leaving the bed quite level and the water flowing over all parts causing a much stronger output.

The report was approved of -

Mr. Cleary was appointed on 5<sup>th</sup> Novr. last. The Board have not yet approved of his appointment - Salary £15 a year - The Boards approval of Mr. Cleary's appointment is respectfully requested -

Proposed by Mr. Thos. Gorman Sen. and seconded by Mr. E. Mulhern

"That we respectfully request the Census Commissioners for Ireland to include in the <sup>area</sup> for the census of 1911 for the Town of Bundoran, the same Area which is at

present recognised as the Water and Sanitary Area of the Town. A map of this Area is at present lodged with the Local Government Board, and at the Office of the District Council -

In accordance with Notice given to fix the salary of the Registrar under the Dairies, Cowsheds & Milkshops Order.

Mr. Maguire proposed Mr. Gorman junior seconded, and it was passed unanimously.

From Bryan Doherty tenant of a cottage in Magheracar, stating in reply to a letter from the Clerk that he wants no land but what he is entitled to, and that is all he has, so if the Council send out a man to measure his plot he will assist him all he can, he is sure he is 20 perches short of his acre.

The tenant of the adjoining cottage having alleged that the fence on his plot was changed the Council ordered that Mr. Townsend L.E. be instructed to measure the plots.

From Local Government Board date 28<sup>th</sup> Feby. 1911 referring to an entry on the subject on Council's Minutes of 18<sup>th</sup> Inst. the Board inform the Council that their sanction to the proposed appointment of a caretaker to Bundoran Waterworks is not requisite.

From Local Government Board date 2<sup>nd</sup> Mar. 1911, referring to Council's Minutes on 18<sup>th</sup> Ult. the Board state that they have approved of the remuneration viz. £10-a-year proposed to be allowed to the Clerk by the District Council for his services as Registrar under the Dairies, Cowsheds, and Milkshops (Ireland) Order 1908, in the Rural District.

A copy of the Order is enclosed for the information of the Registrar, and his particular attention is drawn to Art. 1 thereof (Registration).

From the Census Commissioners date 3<sup>rd</sup> Dec. 1911 acknowledging receipt of Council's resolution of 18<sup>th</sup> Inst. ult. relative to the town of Bundoran and stating that the same area will be adopted for Census purposes as that recognised as the Sanitary area.

From Local Government Board date 3<sup>rd</sup> March 1911 stating that the Board have had before them for consideration the Report of their Engineering Inspector Mr. A. D. Price on the Local Inquiry held by him on 31<sup>st</sup> January last into the petition of the Ballyshannon Rural District Council praying for a Provisional Order to enable them to put in force the powers of the Land Clauses Acts for the purpose of taking otherwise than by agreement, certain lands required in connection with a scheme for the sewerage of the town of Bundoran in the Rural District. And with reference thereto the Board further state that they have decided to comply with the prayer of the Petition and to make the Provisional Order sought for, a copy of which will in due course be sent to the Council and to the Irish Office, London, for introduction into Parliament. If however it is decided that there should be inserted in the Bill confirming the Provisional

Order a clause extending the borrowing Powers of the Council in respect of the Area of Charge fixed for this scheme so as to enable them to borrow the full amount which may be found necessary for its completion the Board desire to state as pointed out in previous correspondence that it will be necessary for the Council to employ a Parliamentary Agent to act on their behalf and to take such other steps as may be necessary to secure the insertion in Parliament of such a clause in the Confirming Bill.

The Board observe that the Scheme as outlined at the inquiry does not provide for the Sewage of several important villas at the Western end of the town, and the Council would do well to have the plans and estimate amended so as to have the drainage from these residences dealt with in the Scheme.

As a result of his inspection of the outfall works already provided, the Inspector reports that owing to neglect and want of proper flushing the inlet to the tank had become choked, so that none of the sewerage was entering the tank, or reaching the outfall sewers, and that all the contents of the sewers were overflowing into a small river and giving rise to a serious nuisance.

The Council should at once take steps to have this condition of affairs remedied and care should in future be taken to maintain in proper order the Works so far as they

have been completed with a view to obviate any inflow of sewerage into the river. In conclusion the Board state that the Council should also strictly enforce the provisions of the Public Health Acts, so as to secure the abatement of nuisances, and they should make bye-laws to regulate the Sanitary condition of houses & yards.

A memorial was sent in from inhabitants in the East End of Bundoran complaining of the unsanitary condition of a right-of-way leading from the main road to the sea and requesting the Council to send the Sanitary Officer to inspect it, and take steps to abate the nuisance.

The Rent Collector reported seven tenants of cottages as in arrear two months rent each. He was directed to inform them that unless the arrears are paid up, proceedings will be taken against them.

From Local Government Board date 21<sup>st</sup> April 1911 informing the Council that they have made Provisional Order empowering the Council to put in force the powers of the Land Clauses Acts with respect to the purchase and taking otherwise than by agreement of certain lands required for the purpose of improving the Sewerage of the town of Bundoran in their District.

O'Connor cautioning the Council not to interfere with the Water Supply in Curriekboy in the Lane adjoining his land by directing the Water Supply and depriving his cattle of water and trespassing on his

as some misapprehension appears to have arisen as to the effect of the Boards' sanction to a loan the Board consider it advisable to draw attention to the terms of Sec 246 of the Act of 1878 above referred to, and to point out that, while it is open to the Council on receiving the sanction of the Local Government Board to a loan, to contract for it in the open market, the final decision as to whether the loan will or will not be made from public funds rests with the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury -

The Board are aware that their Lordships have

felt compelled to refuse their sanction to loans where rates were exceptionally high, or where there has been uns punctuality in payment of the instalments of loans already made -

In the latter case their Lordships before making any further loan, require an undertaking to pay the instalments on existing or future loan punctually on gale days on which they come due. In conclusion the Board state that application should be made to the Commissioner of Public Works for the loan if the Council desire that it should be recommended under Section 246 -
