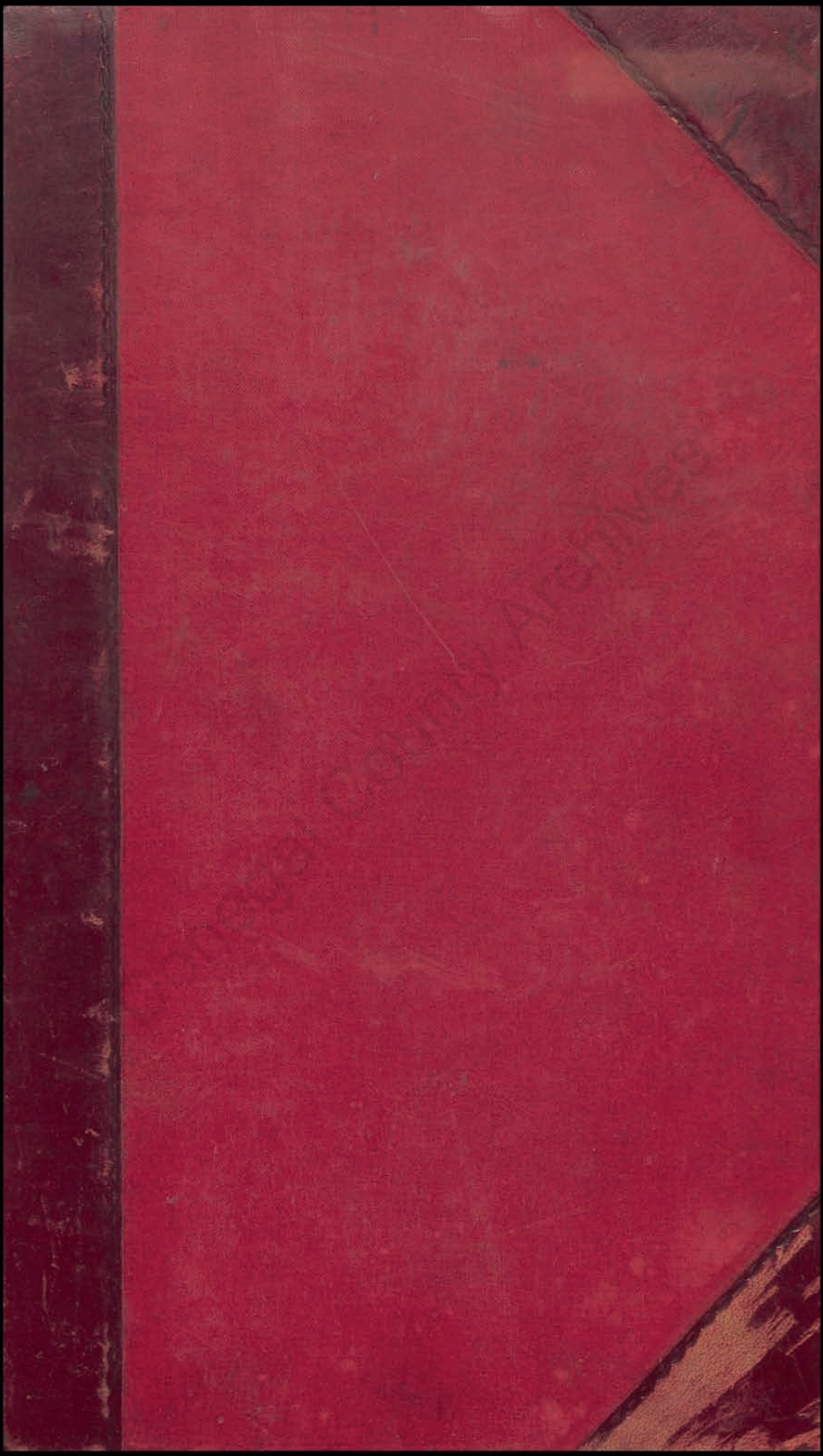

Malicious Injury Claim

A claim amounting to thirty five pounds from Mr Michael Henry Ardmore for malicious injury to a Meesh Cow was referred to the Council's Solicitor.

The following resolutions were unanimously adopted :-

That we the Dunfanaghy Rural District Council wish to enter our emphatic protest against the continued detention of the Irish political prisoners at present confined in England, the Six Counties and the Twenty Six Counties those sentenced and those unsentenced for the following reasons :-

(a) It is not in accordance with the spirit of democracy that some 300 persons should be deprived of their liberty mainly on account of their political beliefs especially in a country like Ireland which for the past 40 or 50 years agitated for free political thought and suffered accordingly

(b) It is not quite fair that the families of these people should be deprived of them for such a prolonged period

(c) When it is reflected that in the past Ireland adopted resolutions of protest, held Public Meetings, and generally condemned in strong language the Government of England or any other country that imprisoned

their political opponents; it is surely a sad commentary on Irishmen to revert to the methods condemned by them, in launching their new Constitution.

"The District Council wish to express their regret at the retirement of Mr. Michael O'Callaghan who for 35 years acted as Assistant Surveyor in this Rural District and they hope that he will be long spared to enjoy his well earned pension"

"The Council noting from the Press that Mr. Michael Cunningham Assistant Surveyor has applied for a transfer to this Rural District would wish the County Council to accede to the application."

"The District Council would draw the attention of the County Council to the very unsatisfactory condition of the roads, and that several contracts already entered into have been altogether neglected and that the County Surveyor should be instructed to have these contracts carried out without any further delay."

"That the County Surveyor be requested to pay at his earliest convenience the sum of Five Pounds to Owen McGadden, Carrick which was promised to him in November 1922 and delayed through some misunderstanding."

Auditor's Reports.

The Local Government Department wrote under date the 6th instant, transmitting copies of the Auditor's reports and abstracts of accounts of the Council in respect of the five half years ended 31st March 1924, the accounts of the late Board of Guardians for the three half years ended 31st March 1923.

The Auditor drew attention to the following

- (a). Credit balance in Royal Bank Limerick to be transferred to present Treasurer
- (b). One surety of Rent Collector dead
- (c). Clerk's War Bonus adjusted to present scale

Answered:

- (a) This amount is now transferred
- (b) Present Rent Collector is resigning
- (c) Clerk's War Bonus now adjusted as per the Department's circular letter dated 5th instant.

The Department also forwarded a copy of the Auditor's report and abstract of accounts of the late National Benefit Committee in respect of the period ended September 30th 1923

The Auditor stated that he had surcharged the sum of £6:5:0 being for non professional attendance on a sick person in a private house, also that the sum of £32:9:4 due by the Treasurer to the Committee should be lodged to the credit of the account of the Tircougal County Council.

The Local Government Department wrote that upon a revision of the Districts Mr S. MacGrath was now appointed Inspector for the area which included Dunfanaghy Rural District, and that Mr Eamon O'Galley was now appointed Auditor of the Council accounts.

Malicious Injuries

Mr William T. MacManamin Solicitor Ballybofer, forwarded on behalf of the Postmaster General three applications for malicious damages to Telegraph Wires and Poles in several parts of the Rural District, and reports from the Civic Guards on the claims were read.

Resignation.

The Sanitary Sub Office for the whole Rural District, Mr John McGinley stated that as he had resigned his position of Home Assistance or Relieving Officer to the County Board of Health he wished to consult the Council as to whether he would be entitled to a superannuation allowance if he retained the position of Sanitary Sub-Office. He had resigned on the ground of age as he was in his seventieth year.

The Clerk was directed to ascertain from the Local Government Department whether Mr John McGinley would require to resign all his positions in the public service before they would sanction a superannuation allowance to him in respect of Home Assistance Office or late Relieving Office and Rent Collector and Sanitary Sub Office.

"That the Council regret very much that Mr John McGinley has on account of age to retire from the positions of Sanitary Sub Office and Rent Collector and they tender to him their best wishes on his retirement"

resolution to the Tirone County Board of Health pointing out to them that Mr John Wainley had discharged the duties of Relieving Officer in this District for the past 26 years to the entire satisfaction of the Guardians and they strongly recommend the County Board of Health to allow him the highest superannuation allowance in their power."
