The Council decided to grant him permission to stable his Donkey in the shed. The Council refuse to pay the 3/6 and request the Clerk to inform him that it is the duty of the tenant to keep the fence repaired

6.11.1913 From James Can D.C. asking the Council to postpone the consideration of above to the half yearly meeting on the 12<sup>th</sup> of Dec inst

29.X.1913 The Clerk submitted the correspondence from Mr Alexander Agnew C.E. Donegal relative to the Water supply for the village of Glenties from which it would appear that the Congested Districts Board is prepared to make a grant towards the proposed water supply and have the work carried out by their own Engineers on the same terms as Ardara.

After a considerable amount of discussion the following resolution was arrived at

and resolved unanimously  
That we approve of a water supply for the town of Glenties as per Congested Districts Board Inspectors letter Mr Agnew provided the ratepayers of the town of Glenties are willing to pay any taxation that may be incurred. We ask our Clerk to write Mr Peter Gallagher as secretary of the Glenties Improvement Committee to call a meeting of the town committee at an early date and summon all concerned and approach the Council in due course".

With reference to the Council's order to prosecute the following the Clerk submitted the following explanations which the Council considered satisfactory and decided not to prosecute for the present.

1. XI. 13 Charles Harkin wrote stating that he had no means of removing the manure at present owing to the situation of his premises but that he hoped the C. D. Board would soon be able to assist him

4. XI. 1913 From Dr. C. H. Falvey stating that Dr. N. Ellis reported to him that he admitted Maggie Dr. Coole of N. Arm as a suspected case of Typhoid Fever and that he has taken the precautions necessary to prevent a spread of the disease. This case is probably due to water which is bad in the place and that he is sending a sample of the milk for analysis
