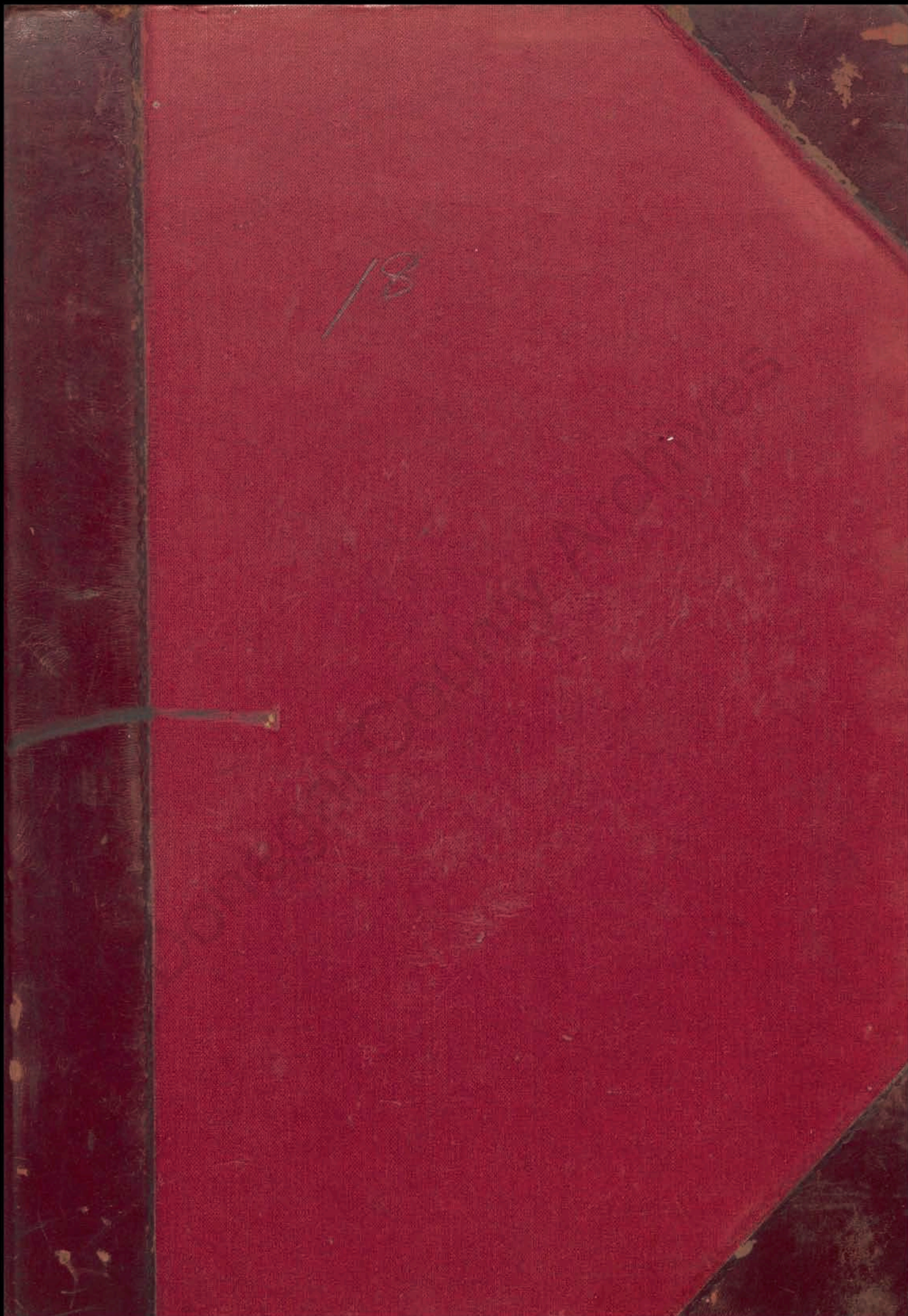


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Place a sheet of one-sided carbon paper, face downwards, between the first and second leaves, and then the sheet of black board after the Duplicate. Write upon the first leaf with a Duplicator or Manifold Slip Pen, and two copies will be the result.

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A CARBO-PLATE can also be supplied to take the place of the black board. This is a plate which grips the carbon, and at the same time provides an extra hard plate, made of aluminium, which gives an extra clear copy, and enables the carbon paper and support to be placed in position for writing and withdrawn without touching the carbon with the hands.

 I regret owing to illness I cannot attend the Meeting on Saturday. With reference to No. 11. on Agenda and letter which I received today from Mrs G. Ward who is at present in Scotland stating that she has received "Notice to quit" on the 13<sup>th</sup> inst on behalf of the Council from you this Cottage was leased under "Scheme I" on the application of George Ward deceased. It has always been occupied by Wards family. No bad debt was made through non payment of rent and although both Cottage and Fence were one of the worst finished in the Union if the list of expenditure on repairs is referred to it will compare favourably with the expenditure on other Cottages. Through expenses incurred by the Burial of her husband Mrs Ward had to go back to Scotland to earn these expenses. She left the key of her cottage with me. About 3 weeks ago a Mrs Boyle who lost her husband in France and who herself lost 2 fingers in Munition works was at Burtonport with her child and could find no place to stay. Through sympathy I gave her the key of Mrs Wards and guaranteed to keep a fire in it while she was in it. This was entirely without Mrs Wards knowledge or consent. Since then it would appear that the mischievous artisan who previously tried to evict Mrs Ward & her children has been renewing his efforts in this direction. Mrs Ward has done nothing to warrant her eviction and such an action would be cruel and heartless. She will be back with her family to re occupy the Cottage in October or earlier. Until she returns if the rent is not paid I will guarantee payment to the Rent Collector. As the Representative of the District I will be glad to see any correspondence that is sent you in connection with this cottage. The C. G. B. to inform the Council immediately how to act. The Council is inclined to determine this tenancy and give the Cottage to the present occupant Mrs Boyle for a short time.

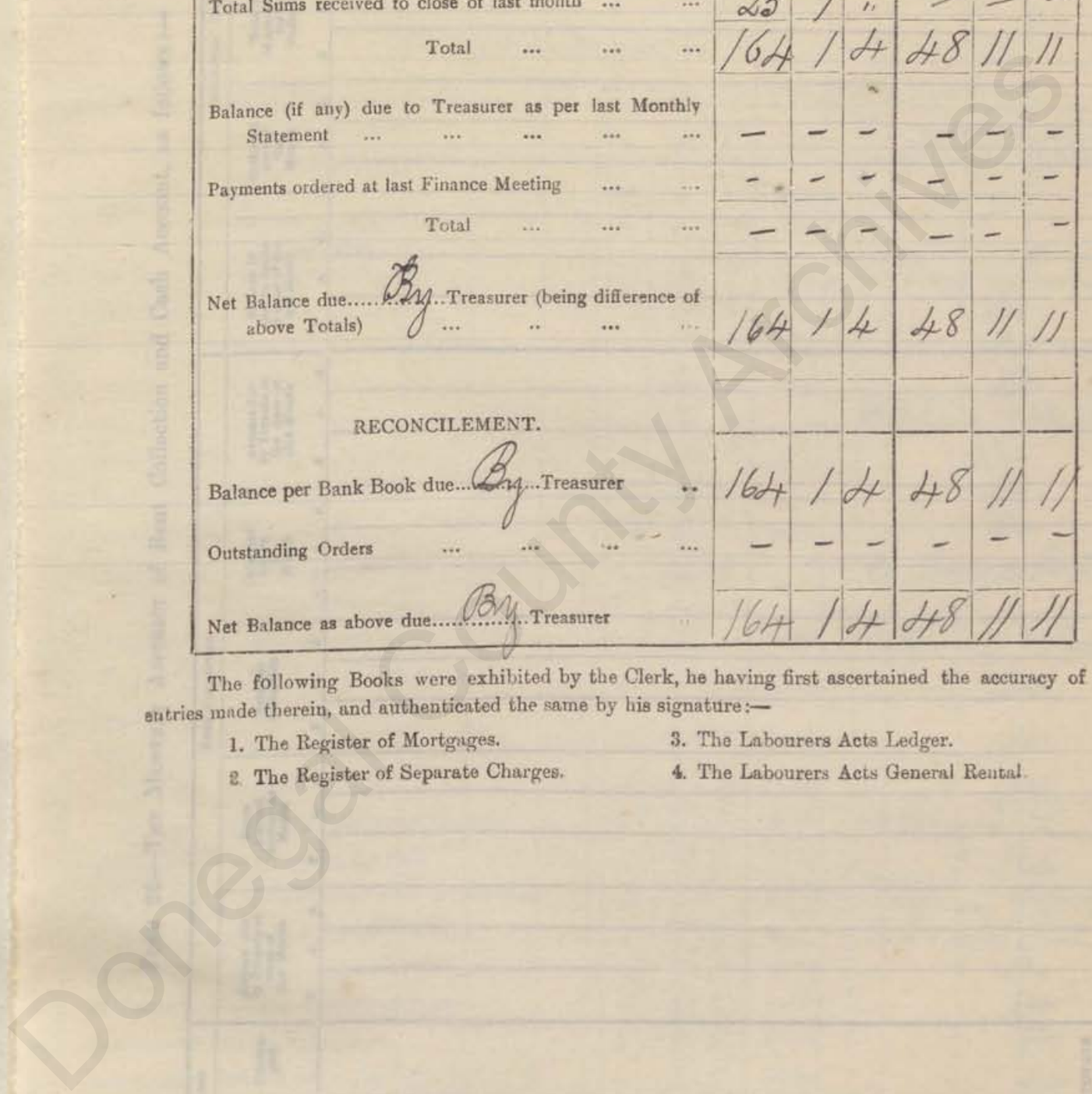

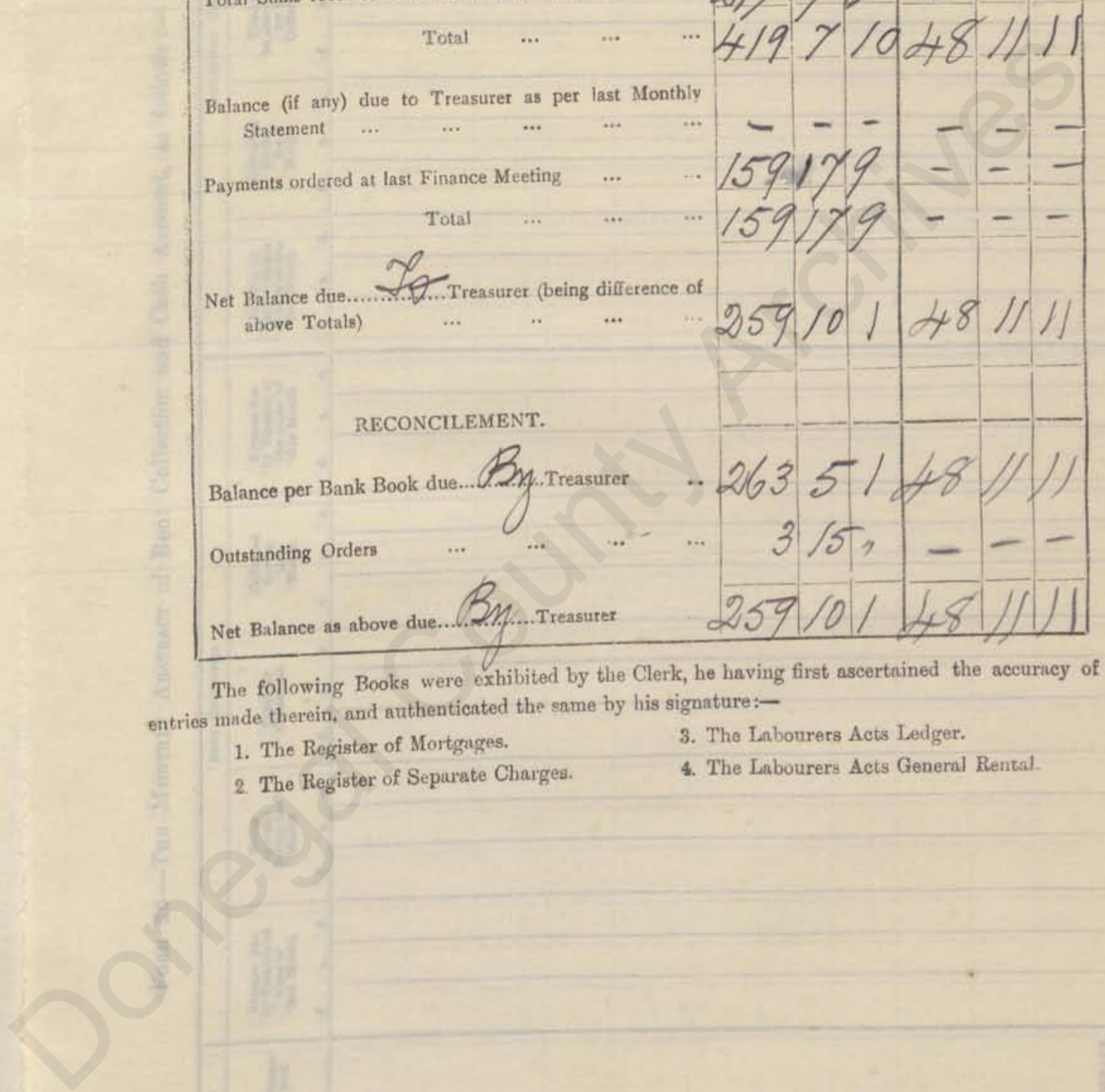

Since we were in correspondence with you the affairs of the late Charles McDevitt have been the subject of proceedings in the Chancery Court and when the matter came before Mr Justice Powell on the further consideration of His Lordship the Bishop of Raphoe pointed out in connection with the water supply that the sum of £1500 would not now be sufficient for providing a water supply from Rough Anna for Glenties which water supply Mr Charles McDevitt desired to be in memory of his brother Mr Hugh McDevitt. On the representation of the Bishop and his Co-executor Mr Gallagher to negotiate with the District Council for the construction of the works. The Judge increased the amount from £1500 to £3000. 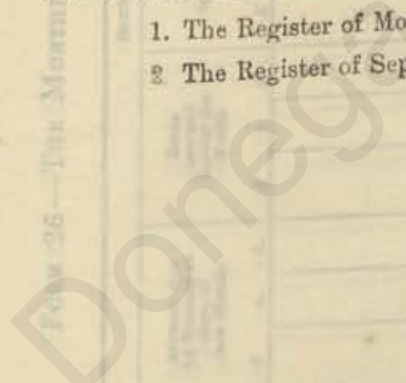


