No 44123. Read letter from the L.G.B forwarding a letter which they received from John Sweeney Ardara relative to the water supply and requesting the observations of the Council on the subject.

Resolved That we have nothing to add to our reply as entered on the minutes of the 11<sup>th</sup> July 1903 further than that we are satisfied that the inhabitants of Ardara are already supplied with a sufficient supply of good water within 100 yards of the centre of the town. Acting upon a recent report of the Sanitary officer the Council decided to permit the persons who use this pump and well referred to to keep same in a proper state of repair.

No 44353. Read letter from the L.G.B dated 31<sup>st</sup> July 1903 forwarding a copy of a letter received from Thomas Coll Arranmore in connection with the disinfection of the premises in Arranmore where Fever broke out and requesting that the Sub Sanitary officer be instructed to have these premises disinfected immediately and explain the cause of the delay in this matter. The Clerk reported that he had instructed the S.S.O to have the disinfection carried out.

Explanation for delay  
James Boyle S.S.O who was present submitted a medical Certificate from Dr. C. E. Gardner Dungle which showed that he was confined to bed from 25<sup>th</sup> July to 1<sup>st</sup> Aug 1903 with an ulcerated leg. The Council are satisfied that this was sufficient cause for the delay specified which was only 3 days from the patient left until this letter was written and is considered satisfactory.

James Boyle S.S.O wrote, stating that he had disinfected the premises in Arranmore on August 3<sup>rd</sup> 1903 and suggested that the disinfecting apparatus should be procured as suggested by Dr. Clibborn.

Dr. H. C. Cardley wrote suggesting to the Council that they should obtain a small disinfecting apparatus.

The Council unanimously decided to purchase the apparatus as suggested and request the L.G.B to approve of this expenditure.

Read letter from Dr. W. G. Walker S.P. Burtonport requesting the Council to make provision for the removal of the patients to and from the Island of Arranmore.

The Council directed the clerks to reply to Monsignor Walter and point out to him that they would not take any action in this matter pending the report of the viceregal Commission.

Read letter from the Secretary of the Poor Law Reform Commission requesting the clerks to forward the replies to the queries after the meeting on the 8<sup>th</sup> inst.

The clerks submitted the queries which were fully answered by the Board and ordered to be sent to the Secretary and the clerk was at the same directed to ascertain when and where the representatives from this District would be required to attend also if he would be required to attend himself.

Read letter from B. S. O. Rutledge stating that he destroyed some clothing and disinfected a house in Ardara in accordance with the directions of Dr. G. H. Talbot Ardara where a patient was removed from supposed to be suffering from Typhus fever.

The Council decline to pay this claim and do not approve of the action of Dr. Talbot destroying the clothing until he was satisfied that the <sup>patient</sup> suffered from fever.

In accordance with the Factory and Workshops Act 1901 Peter G. G. Chief Sanitary Inspector wrote stating that an old cunell of Sulcor is employed as a contractor by Messrs Council of Banatyne Glasgow.

F. H. O'Donnell Esq Doonbeg drew the attention of the Council to the State of the road between Doonbeg & Inntown and requested the Clerk to write the County Surveyor on the subject.

Read letter No 44653/1903 from the L<sup>d</sup> G.B dated 5<sup>th</sup> August 1903 which was again before the Council in accordance with the notice appearing on the Agenda relative to the Byelaws proposed to be adopted regulating the keep and management of Common Lodgings Houses in this District

It was unanimously resolved to adopt the Code of Byelaws submitted and that the proper notice by advertisement be issued re same. The Council will formally apply for confirmation of above named Code of Byelaws on Saturday 3<sup>rd</sup> Oct 1903

No 46,193 Read letter from the L<sup>d</sup> G.B dated 30<sup>th</sup> Aug 03 forwarding to be laid before the Council an extract from the report of their Inspector Dr MacCarthy relating to the recent outbreak of Typhus Fever on Annamore Island and the Local Govt Board request that the Council inform them what action they are taking to carry out the recommendations made by their Inspector.

The Council wish to state that they have taken the following steps re the outbreak of Typhus in Arranmore.

1<sup>st</sup> That the Sanitary sub officer have all the convalescent patients removed to Glenties Typhus Hospital and their dwellings

properly disinfected. A Disinfecting Apparatus is ordered  
2<sup>nd</sup> That the Sanitary officers visit the Island and report to this Board the Dwellings requiring attention from a Sanitary point of view  
3. The sanitary condition of Burtonport will receive attention.  
No necessity arises for providing a Boat for the removal of the Patients from the Island as the Council are in treaty with the C.D.B with a view to acquiring a suitable site for an Hospital on the Island

Read letter from the C.D.B dated 3<sup>rd</sup> Sept 03 stating that there is no vacant House on Arranmore Island which would be suitable for an Hospital and suggesting the Council obtain a report from their Medical Officer of Health before entertaining the proposal re the old Barracks. The C.D.B point out that their Inspector Mr Gahan will be at Burtonport during the week and would confer with their Medical officer re a site (on which an hospital might be erected)

Read letter from Mr H.C. Coardley Burtonport pointing out that in his opinion the repairs required to make the old Barracks suitable for an Hospital would be extensive.

The Council decided to ask Mr Coardley to meet Mr Gahan and confer with him on the subject and report to the Council.



Read report of James Boyle S.S.O Dungle dated 3<sup>rd</sup> Sept 1903 stating that the present tenement of the old Barracks would not let it on any terms as an Hospital and that he has arranged for the removal of Hannah Rodgers and her daughter to Glenties Fever Hospital in order that their place may be disinfected. No 49583. Read letter from the L. G. B. dated 18<sup>th</sup> Sept 1903 respecting the Law Expenses incurred in reference to the sanitary condition of Burtonport and pointing out that if the Council are satisfied as to their liability in respect of these costs the Board presume they will submit the bill for taxation before making payment thereof.

The Council unanimously decided to nominate Mr James Boyle Solicitor Tranorlar or in his absence Mr James Yoner to represent the Council at the taxation of these bills of costs and inform the Council as to their liability regarding certain items.

No 52391. Read letter from the S. G.B dated 17<sup>th</sup> Sept 1903 pointing out to the Council the procedure to be adopted with reference to the adoption of the Byelaws regulating the proper keep and management of Common Lodging houses.

The Clerk reported that the notice re the intention of the Council to apply for confirmation of these Byelaws was inserted in the Papers and the Council would formally apply for same on the 14<sup>th</sup> October.

No 50907 Read letter from the S. G.B. dated 10<sup>th</sup> Sept drawing the Council's attention to the extracts from the reports of the Medical Officers of Health for the Dungle No. 1 + No 2 Dispy District re the water supply.

The Council decided to take no action in this matter until the representatives of the District fix the Area of Charge upon the Dispy District concerned in case urgent necessity arises for attention to this matter which is not in their opinion likely.

No 52391. Read letter from the S. G.B dated 15<sup>th</sup> Sept 1903 expressing their sanction to the expenditure of £2.10 in removing patients from Arramore Island to Burtonport.

No 21353. Read letter from the C. B. acknowledging receipt of the Clerk's letter dated 7<sup>th</sup> Sept 03 with reference to the proposed site for an Hospital on Arramore Island and pointing out that it would be laid before the Board at their next meeting.

Read letter from Dr H. E. Cardley Burtonport stating that he had selected a site for the proposed Hospital on Arramore Island and that Mr Gahan had mapped it out. The site contains about 2 acres. He also made certain suggestions re the size of the Hospital but it was decided to take no further action in this matter pending the report of Mr Gahan C. E. the C. B. Inspector and an estimate of the cost.

Read letter from James Boyle S. S. O Dungle stating that portion of the clothing in the house of Maurice Call should be destroyed and asking the Council for authority to burn the several articles specified by the Doctor.

The Council decline to give him any authority to burn clothing.

James S. S.O. reported that he received the Disinfecting Apparatus and that he was using in Aranmore. He recommended the roof of the dwelling of Hannah Rodgers be burned and that he was of opinion that the C. D. B. would put on a new roof. He also sent in a claim for clothing in this case with reference to above the Council directed the Clerk to inform Mr Boyle that the question of burning the roof of Rodgers and replacing it by a new one was one that should be arranged between the C. D. B. Inspector and Rodgers. The Council decline to authorise the destruction of the clothing or the burning of the roof in this case.

Read letter from S. S. O. Routledge stating that he served sanitary Notices upon Pat Dorman Paddy Savigan & Chas In Hugh and that they refuse to act. The Council decided to take no action in this matter for the present.

On the motion of Bernard Gallagher as seconded by Michael Boyle the Clerk was directed to obtain certain particulars re the cost of roads in this District and it is hoped that the G. B. will instruct the County Council Secretary to supply the information asked for in case it is refused.

The Sanitary condition of the houses in Aranmore Island has improved within the past 12 months. In new houses that are being built more attention is paid to the necessity of having a sufficiency of light and air by having larger windows made. Outhouses are being built for cattle. There is still much that can be done in this latter respect and I anticipate a great deal of good if the offer of assistance by the County District Board is taken advantage of. I would suggest that the rooms in which people have died of consumption be disinfected as the germs of the disease floating in the air are injurious to those breathing them. I recommended that the bed clothes in Dr Maurice Galls should be burned and I find that the Sanitary Authority does not,

see its way to do so. It is not improbable  
that not burning such clothes may lead  
to another outbreak of fever. Coll's House

The following Letters from the Local Government Board for Ireland, or others, were read, and directions given thereon as follows—

No 116 In. Read letter from the L. G. B dated 6<sup>th</sup> October 1903 with reference to publishing precautions against the spread of consumption.

It was unanimously decided to post and circulate Bills setting forth these precautions in the District and that the Sub Sanitary Officers be asked to leave a bill in each school and with each manager in the District no necessity arising for inserting this notice in the local papers and no good would arise therefrom.

No 57675 Read letter from the L. G. B dated 10<sup>th</sup> Oct 1903 to inquire why no action was taken on the report of Sanitary Sub Officer Boyle respecting the cleansing of an open sewer in the village of Dungloe.

The Council decided to have the sewer cleaned at a cost not to exceed the sum of 10/- and fix the area of charge upon Dungloe Dispensary District.

Dr L. E. De Gardiner - Dungloe wrote stating that he had sent one case of Diphtheria and 1 case of Typhoid to the Yeager Hospital Glenties during the week.

No 57675 Read letter from the L. G. B dated 10<sup>th</sup> October 1903 pointing out that no action was taken either on the recommendation of Mr Gardley Medical Officer of Health re the destruction of clothing in the house of Maurice Coll or in regard to the application of Mrs John Rodgers for compensation for clothing which had been burned and at the same time warning the Council of the serious results that might accrue from their action and that it was open to the Council to compensate these people.

The Council desire to inform the L. G. B that they fail to see why they should compensate these people for the clothing destroyed seeing that they have not given an order for the destruction of clothing in these cases.

Dr L. E. De Gardiner sent in an application for 7/6 for Professional reports under the Infectious Diseases Notification Act (1889)

No 62, 168 Read letter from the L. G. B. dated 11<sup>th</sup> November 1903 with reference to the adoption of the Byelaws regulating the keep of the Common Lodging Houses and requesting to be furnished with a copy of the Newspaper Express containing the Notice.

The Clerk to have this letter attended to.

Read letter from Hugh Doherty N. J. Dingle dated November 7<sup>th</sup> 1903. re the allocation of the Equivalent Grant and suggesting that the Council urge upon the Parliamentary Representatives the importance of having portion of it allocated to Primary Education in Ireland.

The subject matter of this letter has already received the attention of this Council therefore no reason for suppressing their views further on the minds of our Parliamentary Representatives inasmuch as we have already received their promise of support and cooperation. no 8, 465. Read letter from the L. G. B, dated 12<sup>th</sup> February 1904 acknowledging receipt of the copies of the byelaws made by the Glenties Rural District Council with respect to Common Lodging Houses.

no 8524. Read letter from the L. G. B, dated 22<sup>nd</sup> February 1904 stating that their Medical Inspector Dr Brendon MacCarthy is unable to agree with the Council's opinion that the condition of the Glenties, Poochan and Killybegs Dispensary District is satisfactory from a Sanitary point of view and pointing out that the Sub-Sanitary Officers should inspect the Districts more systematically and that no action was taken on the report of Sanitary Sub-officer Camon as to the failure of Mr Doogan to comply with a notice served on him for the abatement of a nuisance on his premises.\*

Sanitary Sub-officer Boyle reported on the state of the houses in Arranmore where Sanitary Notices were ordered to be served in order that they might be forced to comply with the terms of the offer of the Congested Districts Board from which it would appear that they all seem anxious to take advantage of the Congested Districts Board grant or subsidy & granted time to comply.

The Council decided to grant an extension of time for one month as some of the persons responsible for the delay are at present in Scotland. The Sanitary Officer Boyle to report to the Council how they have progressed at their meeting on March 19<sup>th</sup> 1902.

There was only one tender submitted for the repairs of the Barmahall wall around the old graveyard at <sup>roughed</sup> ~~arranmore~~ namely that of Mr Thomas Boyle for the sum of £5.10.6 which was accepted.

Sanitary Sub Officer Cannon reported that Mr Gallagher Killybegs received from him 3 reports on 3 houses in the Killybegs Dispensary District. Mr Cannon again drew the attention of the Council to the fact that Coudy Doogan Peter Killeen has not yet complied with the law.

The Council decided to prosecute Doogan.

Read letter from the Clerk of the District Council Castlecomer wishing to be informed if the clothes belonging to the late Malachy Durne who is stated to have died of Typhus Fever in the General Fever Hospital were thoroughly disinfected.

The Clerk reported that he replied stating that he was informed that the clothes were properly disinfected and that the patient Durne died of Typhoid not Typhus Fever.
