

We fail to see why the Port of Londonderry should have a claim for advantages at the expense of County Donegal. This Council is of a opinion that preferential treatment only leads to apathy, and is altogether contrary to the principle of "Fair Competition"; as the Steamship Companies should maintain their position by providing suitable steamers and a proper service to meet the requirements of the trade. The traders of County Donegal are now sufficiently protected by the fact that the existing rates cannot be raised and the Port of Londonderry should be sufficiently protected by the provision that the facilities for traffic with Londonderry shall not be diminished. We believe that it will be a very great boon to County Donegal for industrial and commercial purposes that the Donegal Railway lines should pass into the hands of two powerful Companies with capital available to develop the resources of the County, and that

that the Baronies of Banagh and Boyleagh should be entirely relieved from all future liability involved in the loss that is certain to accrue from the working of the Donegal Railway lines while they remain in the hands of the Donegal Railway Company under the existing agreements"
