I could have the fence put up during the past fortnight by Mr W. McNeill Stracastle as directed but Mr Craig called with me on June 26 and stated he would not now allow fence to be erected on the line previously pointed out by him to Mr Smyth who marked same and prepared Plan and Estimate accordingly. The Plan provides a walk 4 yards wide to allow a cart to pass up to gates of the cottages but now Mr Craig says he will limit the Pass to 4 feet. This will entail great inconvenience to the tenants as they will have to deposit their turf or other Commodities 60 yards from their gates and carry them on their backs or otherwise up the narrow pass which Mr Craig proposes. I would strongly urge the Council to appoint a small Committee to interview Mr Craig with a view to have a more satisfactory Settlement. Personally I regard Mr Craig's attitude now as being a shade unreasonable. During the length the Council went to meet him in this matter. It is on right to mention that the Council cannot fix the whole cost of this prepared fence on Mr Townsend even tho it can be proved that the matter arose from his negligence.

On Mar 26th 1910 Mr Townsend furnished the Council with the acct in Scheme 1 & 2 at £27. He was present at the meeting that day and agreed to accept £15 in full settlement. At the time the Council were under the impression that the claim would cover the whole Scheme but Mr Townsend wants a further claim of £11.10 under Scheme 1. This £15 was paid in July 1910 after being duly sanctioned by the L.G.B.

On June 3rd 1910 the Council had before them complaints against the manner in which the Architect carried out his duties. Hamilton it appears applied for the tenancy of a cottage in January last and the Council decided to give it to him subject to his signing the usual letting agreement in such cases. On their calling attention to the provisions of Sec. 13 of the Labourers Act, 1883, as regards the proposed letting they were informed by the Council that "the proposal has now lapsed the Col. not having decided to take the cottage." The Minute of Mar. 11th following, however, contain the following entry - "From W. Hamilton, Rosbeg, an application for one of the vacant cottages at Rosbeg. Accepted." The Inspector having been in Rosbeg recently found Colonel Hamilton living in one of the cottages there and having subsequently inquired from the clerk at his office as to the circumstances under which Col. Hamilton became tenant was informed by him that the tenancy was with a labourer named Wm. Hamilton. On turning up a file of correspondence at the time the Inspector found a letter from Col. Hamilton to the Clerk, a copy of which is enclosed for the Council's information. The entry in Minute of Mar. 11th above referred to shows that the clerk complied at once with the suggestion contained in Col. Hamilton's letter namely - to suppress all reference to the fact of his position in

in life with the object of misleading and deceiving the Board. In the file perused by Mr. Coffey there is a further letter from Col. Hamilton thanking ~~the~~ ~~the~~ Mr. McNelis for the key of the cottage. The Clerk's conduct in this transaction seems most reprehensible, but before taking further steps in the matter they would be glad to be furnished with any explanation which he may desire to offer thereon.

The copy of letter enclosed reads as follows: - "Cliff View, Rosbeg, 10th Mar. 1911. My dear Mick, - I have now got a chance of letting this house so I can take the cottage from 1st April to 1st Oct. definitely. Do you think would there be any objection if my own name went down for it. There is a labouring man here named Wm. Hamilton, so if there was no mention of Col. or J. or Esq. there would be nothing to show that it was me and not the labourer of the same name. If you could send me the form I would fill it up and send you the rent for six months at once. A reply at your earliest convenience will much oblige as I cannot give a definite reply to the offer I have got till I hear about the cottage. - Yours sincerely, W. Hamilton. To Michael McNelis, Clerk of the Council."

That the Clerk be asked to furnish his explanation direct to the L.G. Board. The Council were aware that Col. Hamilton was the tenant and were quite satisfied to get any tenant for some cottage seeing it was unoccupied since built.

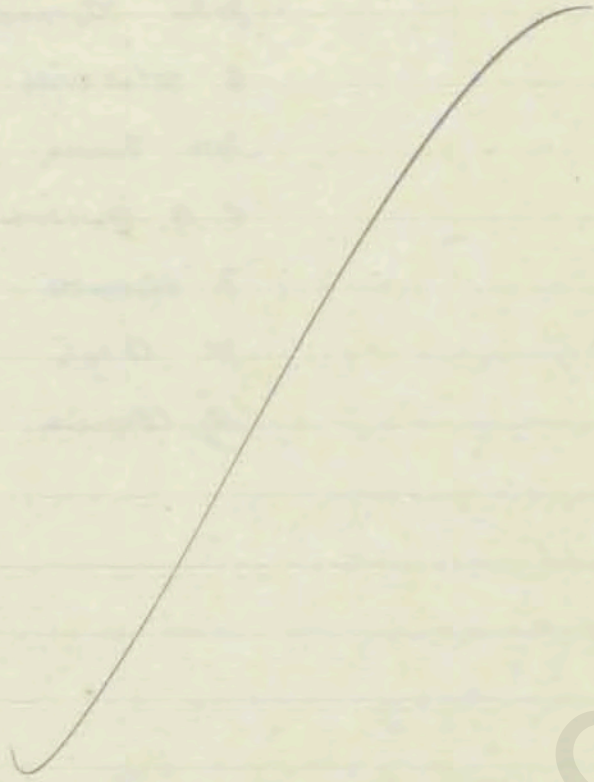

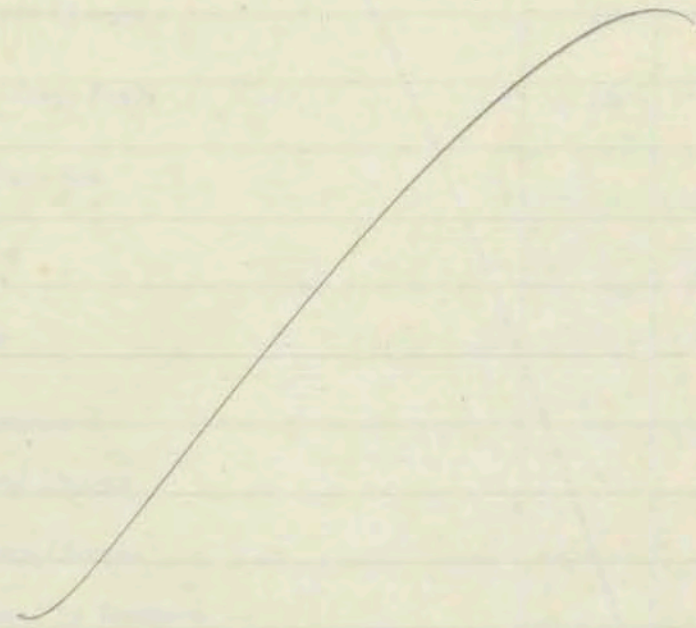

Act, and cannot be used for any other purpose beneficial to the district unless in pursuance of an Order by them under sec. 8 of the 1906 Act, after satisfying themselves that the cottage with any land attached could not be used with advantage for the purposes of the Act. Such a cottage could only be sold by public auction subject to the conditions and reservations laid down in Sec 8 of the 1896 Act. 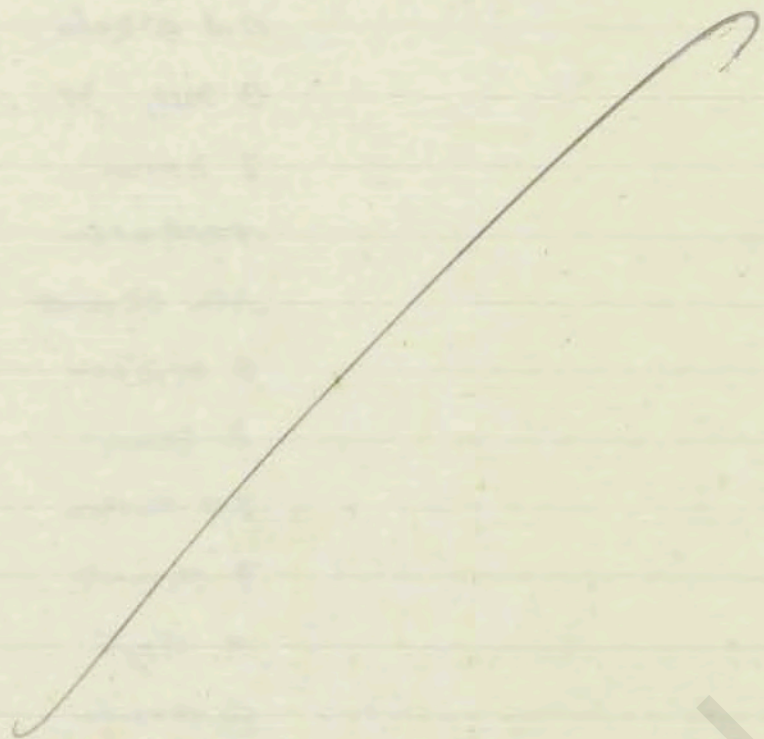
