A petition to President Wilson for the release of Mr. Larkin was signed by thirteen Councillors.

Reads letter from Mr. Edward Crossan, Meenavernaham, Bungleyp Point, dated 10th July 1920, asking ~~to be~~ for compensation for injury caused to his dwelling house by reason of a road contractor's metal being crushed $\frac{1}{2}$ in too close proximity to the building by the weight and vibration of the stone-breakers and stating he would settle by arbitrators.





Minutes of three previous meetings were confirmed.

The meeting was summoned to consider, and to devise what course to adopt so as to produce the best result with the least inconvenience and dissatisfaction in the situation created by a decision of the County Council relative to roads as set out in their circular letter of 15th Decr 1921.

The letter in question intimated that the road proposals of this District Council were rejected by the County Council at a meeting on 13th inst on the grounds that they were not sufficiently reduced, and stated the proposals should be revised leaving out any roads that in the meantime can do without repair and cutting down the outlay on others in such manner that the total expenditure on roads in the R. District for the year 1922-1923 shall not exceed one half of the County Surveyors

estimate that was approved of for the ensuing financial year. The letter also stated that the Rural District would have to provide copies of a supply of Form 20 if requested as the County Council do not now supply copies of this form, and contained a request for 20 copies of the amended list of proposals for submission to the County Council as the latter Body cannot go to the expense of having books of proposals for works printed again.

In reply to enquiries of Councillor McCallion ^{Tole} the Clerk stated that 403 road proposals were printed in first instance and 400 for adjourned meeting. The cost of this was slightly over £50. when tenders were considered contractors with their Surveys had attended and signed bonds in respect of 326 roads. In 9 other cases ~~the~~ tenders were accepted but the bonds were not signed, in 62 cases no tenders were accepted. With regard to the newspaper report referred to by Mr McCallion & no notification was received from the County Council before the work indicated above was proceeded with, that they would require a 50% reduction. The only suggestion previously received from the County Council was that contained in their Circular of 12th October which impressed upon "the several Rural D. Councils the necessity of going carefully into same so as to bring about an expenditure for each Rural District considerably less than at present prevails."

Mr. Michael Pomeroy, as a County Councillor present at the County Council's meetings being asked for his views stated there was no mention made at the County Council meeting of any fixed per centage by which reduction was to be made. He considered the keeping up of the roads a vital necessity if rates were to be levied or collected at all, and he regarded the desire to keep the expenditure on roads at such a very low level as a "war measure" and that if peace came to us now it would not be reasonable to continue war conditions for 18 months which he thought was the time which would elapse before the ^{period} covered by the estimate and the contracts now under consideration ended.

The matter having been discussed at some length in conjunction with suggestions from the County Surveyor Councillor Cole proposed and Councillor McQuinn ^{seconded} that Dail Cearann be requested to come and down an to inspect the Drishowen Roads and report to Dail Cearann as to the reasonableness of the amount proposed on road work in the Rural District.

But this was withdrawn and on the motion of Councillor

(3)

Councillor H. Doherty¹⁸ seconded by Councillor James Doherty it was unanimously resolved to return the road proposals to the County Council with the request that they be approved as they stood on the grounds —

(1) that the matter was carefully gone into at our Half-Yearly meeting and reductions made where considered possible; (2) that in this course the wishes of the County Council as expressed in their circular of 12th October 1921 (a copy of which was circulated to each W. District Councillor in Dúnchonnell) were carried out and while last year's estimate was £10,000 the total of the list of proposals now was £7,860-17-0, comprising £5,947-17-0 the amount of contracts entered into, and £1,930 in respect of proposals not tendered for. The County Surveyor's estimate was £8,200 in addition to our liability for Main Roads in other districts of the County.

(3) That if the proposal to cut down the expenditure to 50% of the County Surveyor's estimate were acted on it would be impossible to carry on Local Government as it would leave the roads, which are the only value the ratepayers believe they get for their money, practically impassible and it is the firm belief of the members of this Council, with their intimate knowledge of local conditions, that there would be a general resistance to the payment of rates either for next year or the second moiety for the present financial year.

(4) That during the past six years, when the rates for roads should in reality have gone up in proportion to the cost of living and of labour, a too rigorous economy was practised which resulted in a great deterioration of the roads and if this were continued it would make things worse in the near future taking into account the present rapid rate of deterioration which was contributed to by so much motor traffic.

(5) That the fact of so many roads being left untendered for

for was a consequence of the impossibility of doing them at the money offered owing to their wretched condition (6) That the members of this Council feel strongly that if there be a political settlement now the roads should be considerably improved and that the breaking of 328 contracts a month after they have been made, they are convinced by local feeling, would cause the greatest dissatisfaction among the road (1) contractors and leave many of them to give up contracting, thus reducing competition.

For the reasons stated, the Council cannot undertake the responsibility of cutting down the proposals and request the County Council to apply for approval of the extension of the road limit to £8500 as suggested by the resolutions of 7th November 1921

Read letter from the Donegal County Council dated 19th December 1921 stating the application of Inishowen R.D. Council for an extension of the limit of road expenditure by £3,242-10-0 which was not entertained by the County Council in view of the proposed reduction.

On the motion of Councillor Cole seconded by Councillor McCallion a vote of thanks to the County Councillors who attended was unanimously passed.

On the motion of Councillor P. Cole seconded by Councillor John Smith it was unanimously resolved -

"That we, the Inishowen R.D. Council appeal to the ~~the~~ ^{the} I.D.'s for North Donegal to ratify the Treaty as the desire of the people is quietness and in the belief that the further war threatened as the consequence of non-ratification would result in the loss to Ireland of those people who, judged by their disinterested and intelligent labours hitherto are the very ones needed to complete the independence of the Nation, and believing that their consideration should outweigh any scruple about an avowal of allegiance exacted under duress"
