On the motion of Mr. Ritchie, the following resolution was passed, that the works to be undertaken by Mr. P. J. Ritchie in connection with the sewerage works at Bunceana be put in hand immediately, and that the Local Government Board be requested to sanction the proposed contract for the same. Mr. Ritchie has submitted a contract for the works to the Local Government Board, which has been approved by them, subject to the condition that the works should be completed by the end of the year 1904. Mr. Ritchie has also submitted a plan for the works, which has been approved by the Local Government Board. Ritchie for the sewerage of Bunceana with the following addition - That solid rock, if any, in the excavation be deemed an extra, and be separately paid for at 3/6 per cubic yard, provided that the full amount of extras on foot of said solid rock shall not exceed one hundred pounds."

The clerk stated he at once forwarded copy of this resolution to the L.G. Board.

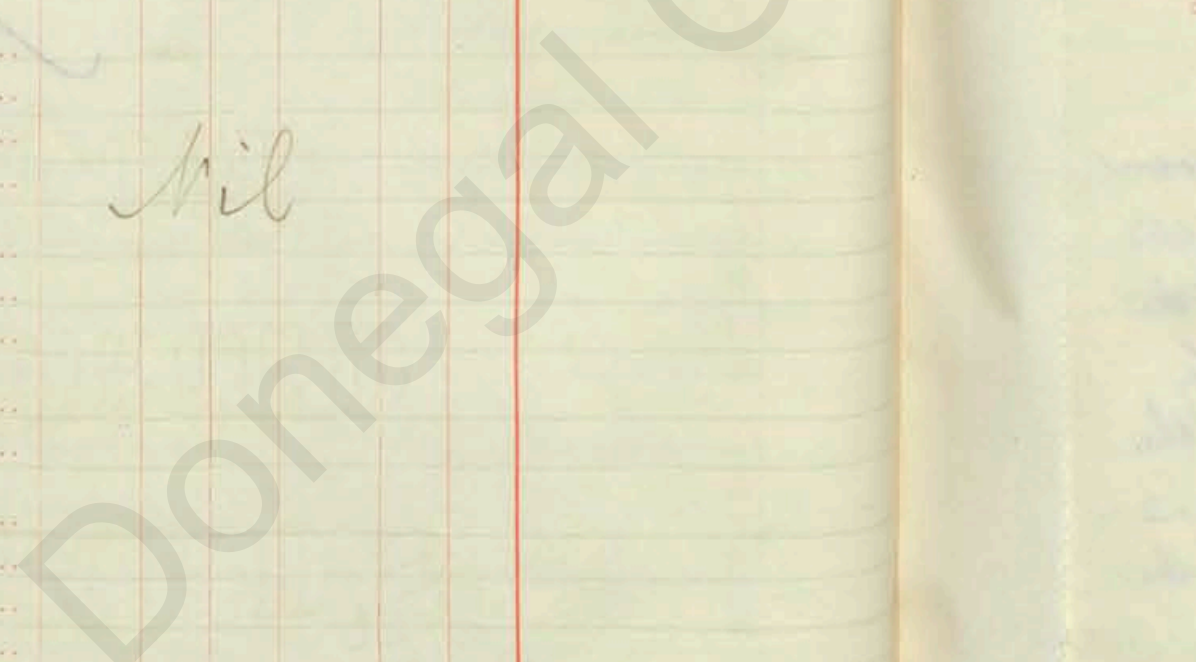

Board, dated 5<sup>th</sup> Nov. 1902, No. 62783, forwarding copy of a communication which they had that day sent to Mr Swan, Sec. of Buncrana Public Health Committee, in which they stated they would be prepared to consider any variation proposed in the outfall works of Buncrana Sewerage Scheme, and that due regard should be had to either securing an outfall below low water mark where tidal currents will prevent the return of sewage to the shore, or of providing against pollution of the foreshore by treatment of the sewage at outfall, and if necessary limiting the discharge to certain conditions of the tide.

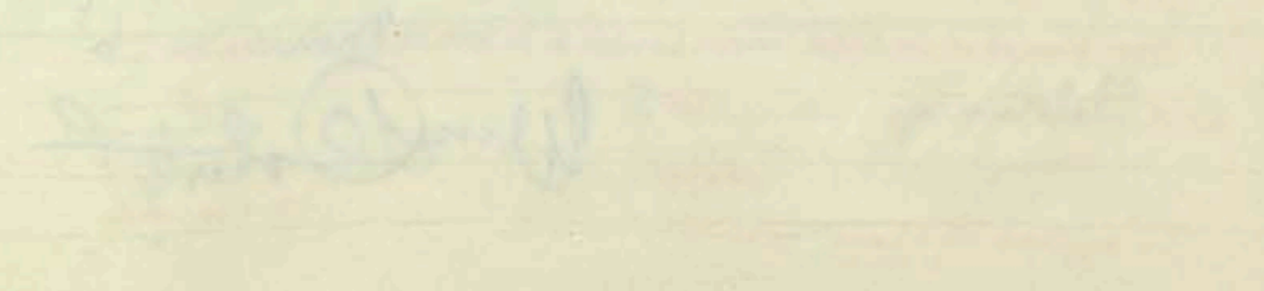
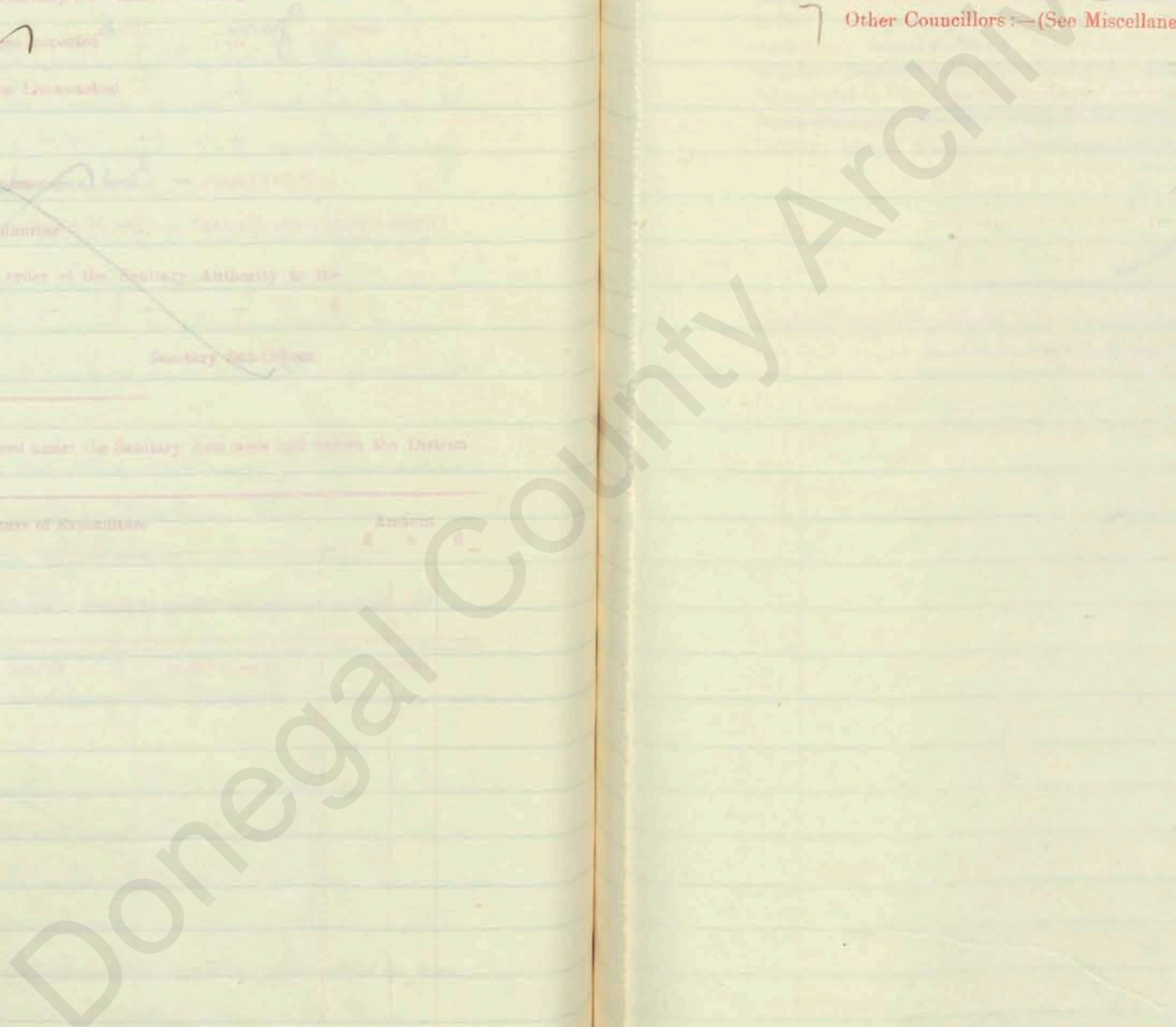

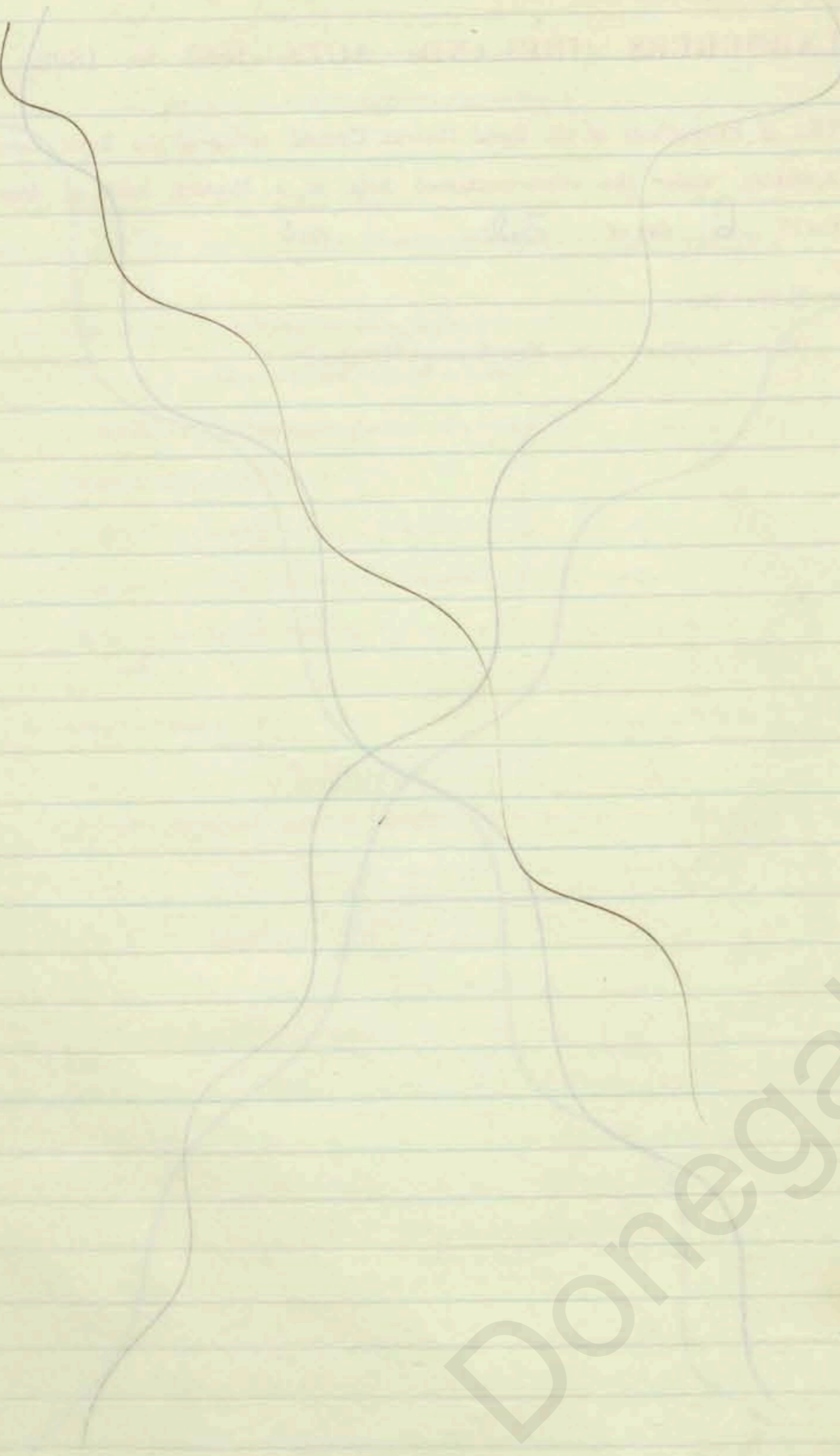

(5) That the contractor be called upon to go on with the manholes and lamp posts and finish up same, as road is dangerous.

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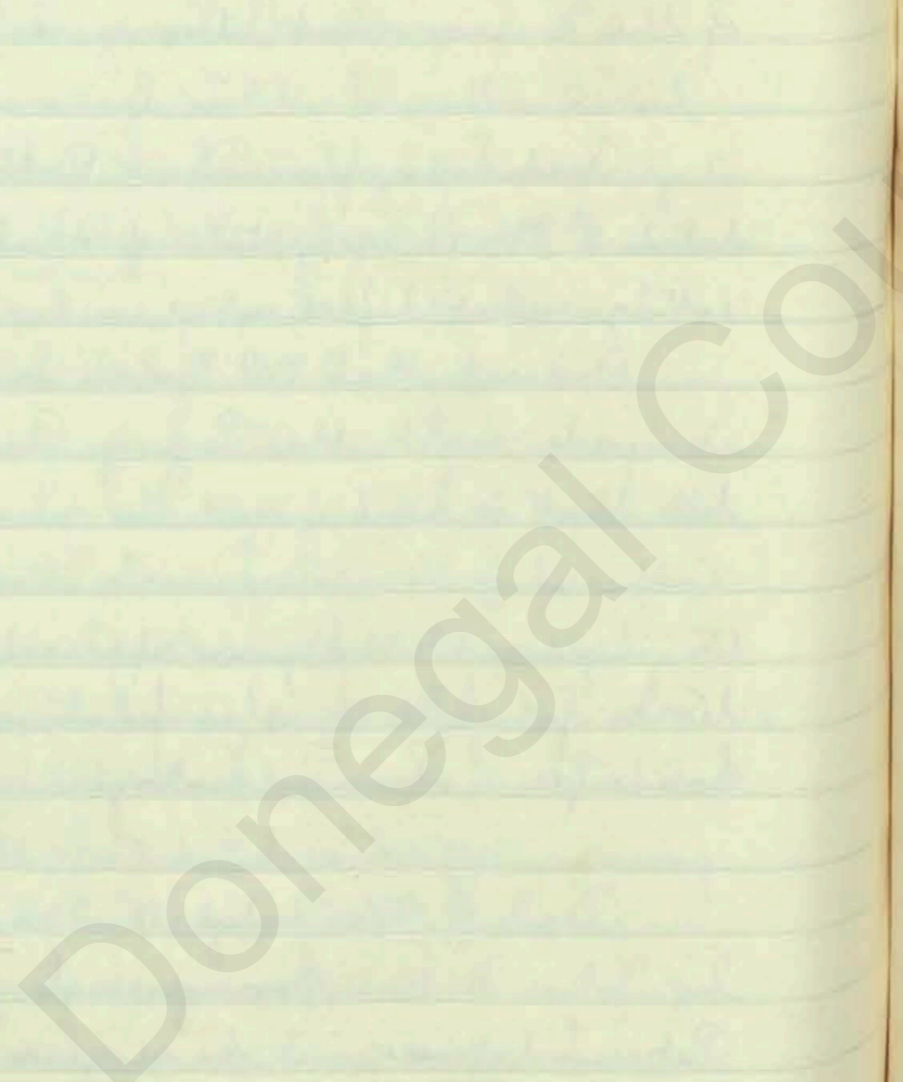

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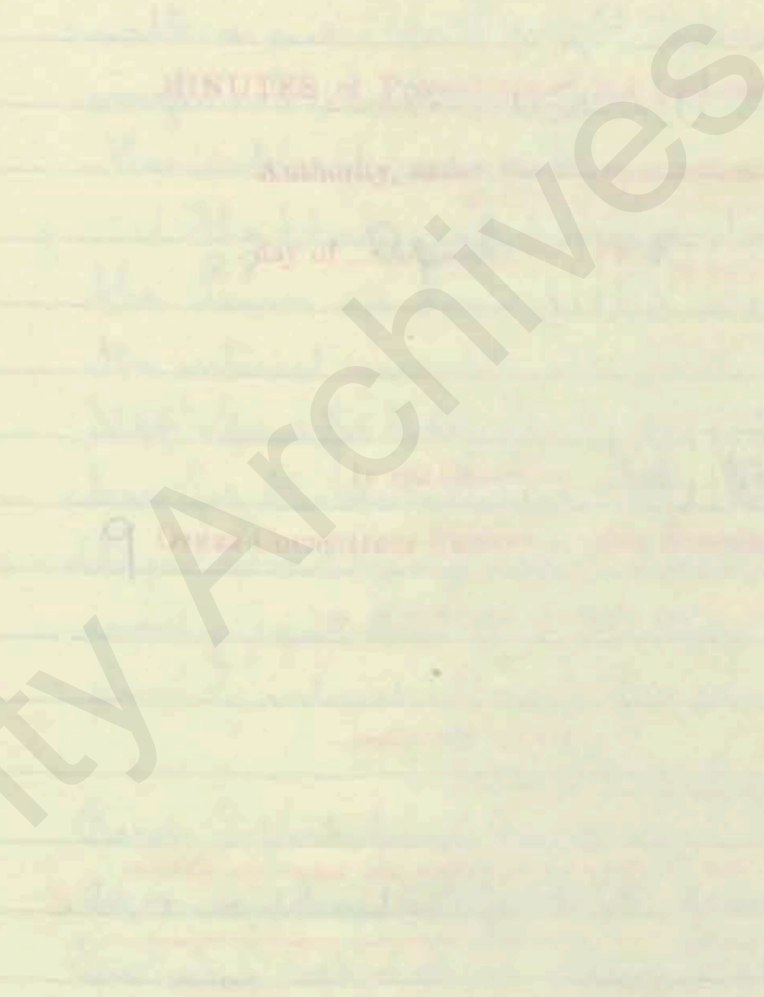

Read Letter from the L.G. Board, dated 15<sup>th</sup> Apl. 1905, N<sup>o</sup> 22,086, stating that they had received the Report of their Chief Engineering Inspector, Mr. Bourne, on the Inquiry held by him into the alternative outfall works proposed by the Council in connection with Buncrana Sewerage Scheme. The Plan now submitted provided for the discharge of the sewage effluent at a point outside the harbour, the sewer pipe being taken over the road bridge thus obviating the necessity of a siphon under the river as originally proposed.

The Board approve of the alteration in the Plans on the understanding that the discharge from the outfalls will be regulated so as to secure the outflow at a suitable state of the tide, and if at any time more complete arrangements are found necessary for receiving the sewage before discharge that the Council will undertake their execution. Also stating that the consent of the Board of Trade should be obtained to the alteration of the outfall works.

The Clerk stated he furnished a copy to the Local Committee.

Mr Francis McDaid, D.P.O., Blonmany, reported that he witnessed the burning by order of the Medical Officer of Health, Dr Doherty, and the L.S. Inspector, Dr MacCarthy, of certain articles of typhoid fever infected bedding belonging to Hugh Donaghy & John B. McDaid of Ballymore, and also the house occupied by the latter, and submitted inventory of the articles destroyed with the following total valuation:

The Report was approved & the Clerk directed to pay these amounts through the Petty Cash Account, Dr Doherty to be asked to report as to the cause and extent of the outbreak of typhoid & the steps taken to prevent its spread.

An account for £3.0.6 due to Messrs. John Cooke & Co. by the Donville Public Health Committee for repairs to street lamps & for a new Hinks 100 candle power lamp burner in August 1901, was submitted, having been received since last meeting from the Hon. Secretary of Committee.

The Clerk explained that the ap could not now be paid without the sanction of the L.S. Board.

It was unanimously Resolved on the motion of Councillor Smith that the L.S. Board be respectfully requested to sanction the payment, as the account was overlooked by the Committee & was incurred without the knowledge of the Council or Clerk.

Lists of Outworkers in connection with shirt agencies at Blonmany, Rosstown, & Carndonagh were received from Messrs. McDuff, Hogg, Marsh & Co., under the Factory & Workshop Act, 1901

With reference to the letter of the L.G. Board, dated 17<sup>th</sup> June 1905, N.37796, which was read at the monthly meeting on 10<sup>th</sup> July last.

A report was received from Dr O'Shallaghan relative to certain nuisances in public lanes & a few yards in Carndonagh which he said could be abated by the construction of some new sewers. Ordered that Dr O'Shallaghan be asked to send in a separate report on each case requiring abatement, on the proper form.

Inspector's Report.

Read letter from the L.G. Board, dated 25<sup>th</sup> July 1905, N.45066, forwarding Extracts from the Report of the Medical Inspector, Dr MacCarthy, relating to the Sanitary Condition of the Rural District.

The Inspector drew attention to the insufficiency of the water supply at Buncrana, and the defective supply at Carndonagh and stated nothing had been done to Slievebawn Well, and no change made in the privy accommodation at Malin Head Police Barracks. That the Common Lodging Houses are neither registered nor inspected and that there is a badly conducted one in Carndonagh. That the Fever Ambulance is a heavy two-wheeled vehicle. That no efficient disinfecting apparatus has been provided. That neither the Infectious Disease Notification or Prevention Acts have been adopted. That the blocks of the L.S.O. report books are not submitted to the Council, & no inspector of Dairies &c has been appointed.

Resolved that the L.G. Board be informed that the question of increasing the storage for water at Buncrana is receiving attention from the Local Committee, also that the inhabitants of Slievebawn have been already warned as to the danger of using the water from the Condemned Well. That the excessive cost is the bar to an improved supply in Carndonagh. That the Lodging House referred to in Carndonagh has been closed & the councillors are of opinion there are no others in the Rural District. That proceedings at Petty Sessions will be taken to secure the removal of the privy at Malin Head Barrack.

That as there is not sufficient necessity to justify the large expenditure involved, the question of providing a disinfecting apparatus be deferred.

Councillor Porter gave notice that on 11<sup>th</sup> Sept. 1905 he will move that the Infectious Disease (Notification) Act, 1889, and the Infectious Disease (Prevention) Act, 1890, be adopted in the District.

D. Macfarthy, Medical Inspector, attended the meeting, and strongly urged the members to procure a new fever ambulance as the present one is entirely unsuitable for use in cases where the patients are unable to go into the ambulance personally and the risk to the poor patients greatly aggravated. He considered any expenditure made with a view of adapting the present vehicle would be waste of money.

On the motion of Councillor Scott seconded by Councillor McMullan it was Resolved that a new Fever Ambulance of approved construction be procured, Councillor McDavid dissenting.

The Clerk was directed to write to some of the neighbouring Councils for particulars as to ambulances recently obtained.

### Buncrana Sewerage.

Read Report from Buncrana Public Health Committee dated 7<sup>th</sup> August 1905, stating (1) that owing to the scarcity of water during the drought they were obliged to cut off the supply at intervals to prevent waste, (2) that for the future before any service pipe is taken from the water main to a house a written permission must be first procured, signed by two members of the Committee and the connection made under the supervision of the Waterman. (3) That in response to the request of the Committee, Mr. J. Gordon Hayes, C.E. had resigned his position as Engineer of Buncrana Sewerage Scheme and recommending that the resignation be accepted. (4) Recommending the Council to appoint Mr. Thomas Johnston C.E. of Londonderry as Engineer in respect of the completion and maintenance and engineering in connection with Buncrana Main Drainage Schemes and that his fees be fixed at £40 to cover all. (5) Stating that for various reasons it is not the Committee's intention to accept any of the tenders sent in for No. 2 Scheme but when the new Engineer commences work that new plans & specifications will be prepared giving effect to the amendments suggested by the L.G. Board as to mode of carrying the steel piers across the river at the bridge.
