The Sanitary Sub-officer reported that he had again visited the premises of S. Gallagher of Calhane and that the manure heap had not been removed as directed by the Sanitary Authority.

Board No 46087, dated 10 September 1917 with reference to payment by the Council of a sum of £15.50 as compensation under Sec 138 of the Public Health (Ireland) Act 1878 in respect of infected clothing destroyed, and if the Council granted compensation in excess of the claim made to them in that behalf - the Council must be prepared to accept responsibility of the question is raised by the Auditor hereafter.

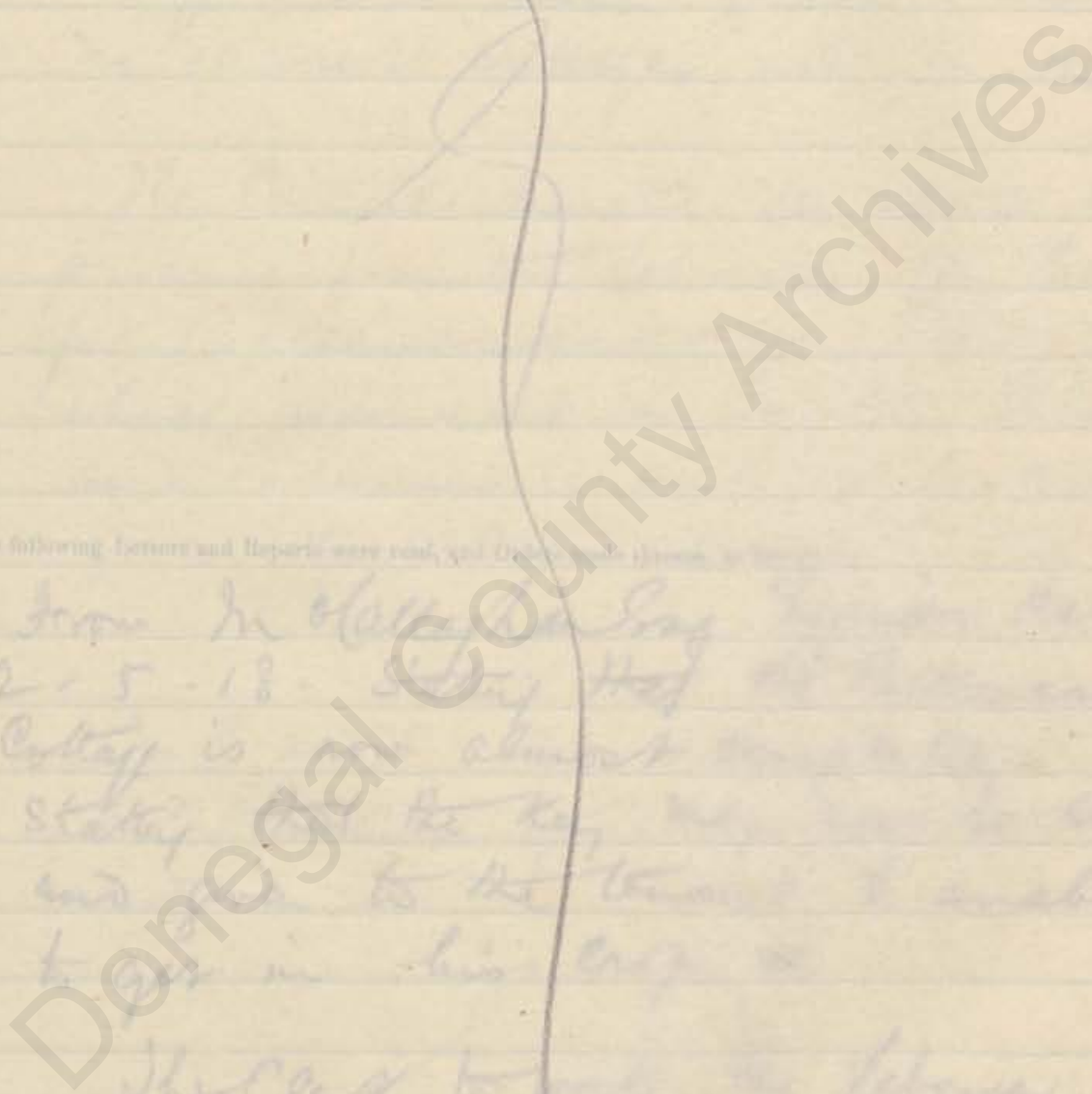

From file of the tenants of Bromore dated 2<sup>nd</sup> September 1918 complaining of the contamination of the well which is situate on the adjoining labourer's plot and which had been good and pure for the past eleven years, and stating that the tenant who has the allotment on which the well is, has let it for grass and the cows are not kept away from it, and it is in a bad state with cow manure and other dirt, also that none of the tenants who use the well can enter to clean the well without threats and abuse from Mrs Carson the tenant.

The Council directed that Public Works Engineers be instructed to get the well cleaned out and a paling erected around the well so that it may not be contaminated.

The Council was directed to write Mrs Carson tenant of the Cottage that she should not interfere with any one using the well.

Mr J. S. Sweeney moved that the resolution granting the Clerk an increase of salary of £30 a year passed on 5<sup>th</sup> July last be rescinded; but stated that in doing so he was in no way antagonistic to the Clerk, nor

opposed to him being allowed what would be fair for the increased duties owing to the extra work. . . seconded by Mr. Denis Kelly.

Mr. J. J. Leakey proposed as an amendment that the resolution be not rescinded, as it was not excessive, the amount that had been recommended seconded by Mr. J. R. Stevenson.

On a vote being taken 5 voted for the motion and 5 for the amendment. One member did not vote, so that the voting resulted in a tie.

After the Chairman had vacated the Chair Mr. Sweeney demanded that he exercise his casting vote which (while standing) he did in favour of the motion, although a number of the Councillors had left the Boardroom.
