also dated 18 Oct 1902 enclosing Award.

The Clerk stated that the notice re. deposit of Arbitrator's award was duly prepared by him and advertised in the three Seag papers.

From J. Madden Esq. J.P. dated 27 Oct 02, stating that he understood the award had been lodged & should be forwarded for having the necessary notice prepared re deposit of same—
The Clerk had notice referred to advertised before receipt of letter—

From P. W. Fadden Esq. Solr dated 30 Oct 02, stating that he is of opinion this notice should have been prepared by him; as the matter of deciding the titles or are not to be decided by the Clerk.

The Clerk stated that he understood these documents would be forwarded to the Solr for the purpose of preparing the Conveyance when received, but would be before the Council at the next ordinary meeting be believed -

This was agreed to.

From L. G. B. No 54,989 dated 9th Oct 1902 acknowledging receipt of application for loan of £6,500 for purposes of Letterkenny R.D. Labourers Order 1902

No 54,989 dated 16 Oct 1902 stating that in the opinion of the L. G. Board the sum of £1,500 estimated for acquisition of land is excessive - and asking to be informed under what circumstances the Council propose to pay such a sum for land. also pointing out that under the previous Scheme, only £66 per acre was paid for land. although that is an unusually high price taking the average for sites for labourers cottages.

The Clerk stated that he replied to above letter on the 20th October stating that no payments had yet been made for land for Labourers Plots, that the estimate was prepared to meet any possible excessive claim for land without having to make application for a supplemental loan. & if the whole of the sum applied for was not required the last instalment might not be applied for in full.

The reply was considered most explicit and approved of -

From L. G. B. No 57,746 dated 27 October 02 in reference to foregoing application stating that the Board considers £1,000 sufficient for

the purpose of purchasing land; and returning application for sanction for amendments in this respect -

From Mr. O. Callaghan Esq. dated 29th October 02. stating that he had carefully considered the question of reducing the claim of £1,500 to £1,000, a sum which it appears the L. G. Board considers sufficient for the land, and having regard to the price fixed by Award recently received from the Arbitrator for Scheme A. (being at an average rate of £74.2-6 per acre) He considers the claim may be reduced to £1,250-0-0.

The Claim was therefore reduced to £6,250. instead of £6,500 and accordingly the amount estimated for purchasing land was reduced from £1,500, to £1,250. and the amendment on application for sanction of loan was initialled by the Chairman & Clerk and directions given to forward same to the Local Government Board for the sanction of that authority.

From L. G. B. No 48,820 dated 3rd November '02 re, additional allotments to existing Cottages, that same should not be separated by a Road and that the additional allotment should be taken from same holding as original plot had been taken.

No 51,866/1902. dated 16 October 1902 requesting particulars on Form A. in relation to loan of £2,000. sanctioned for Letterkenny Rural District Labourers Order 1901 -

From Dr. Brendan MacCarthy Med Insp L.G.B. requesting to be informed what action the Council had taken re. Tuberculosis.

The Clerk stated that he replied informing Dr MacCarthy that the Council had posted Notices throughout the District to prevent the spread of the Disease.

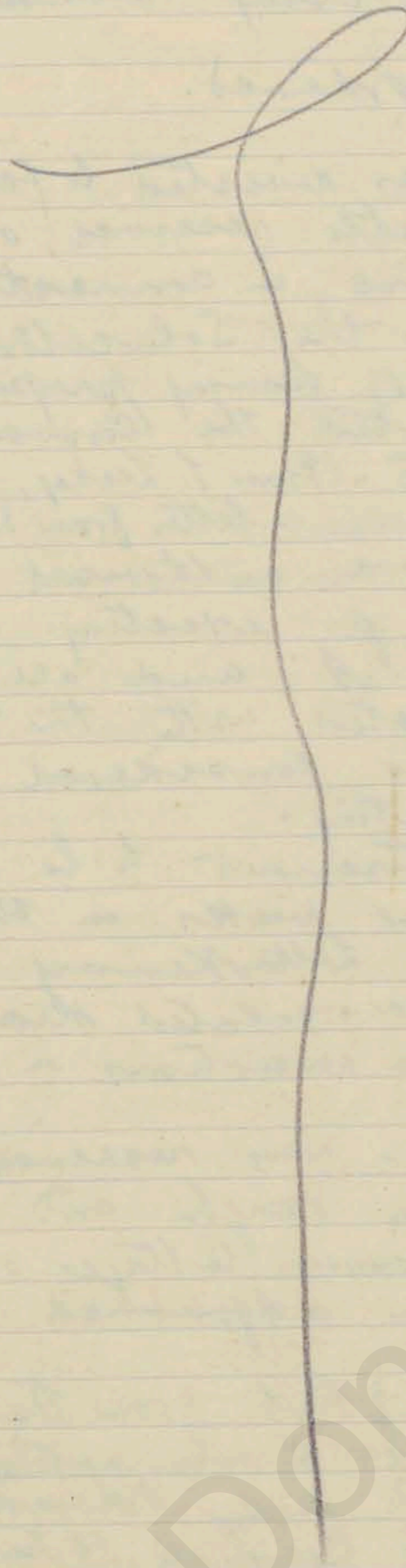

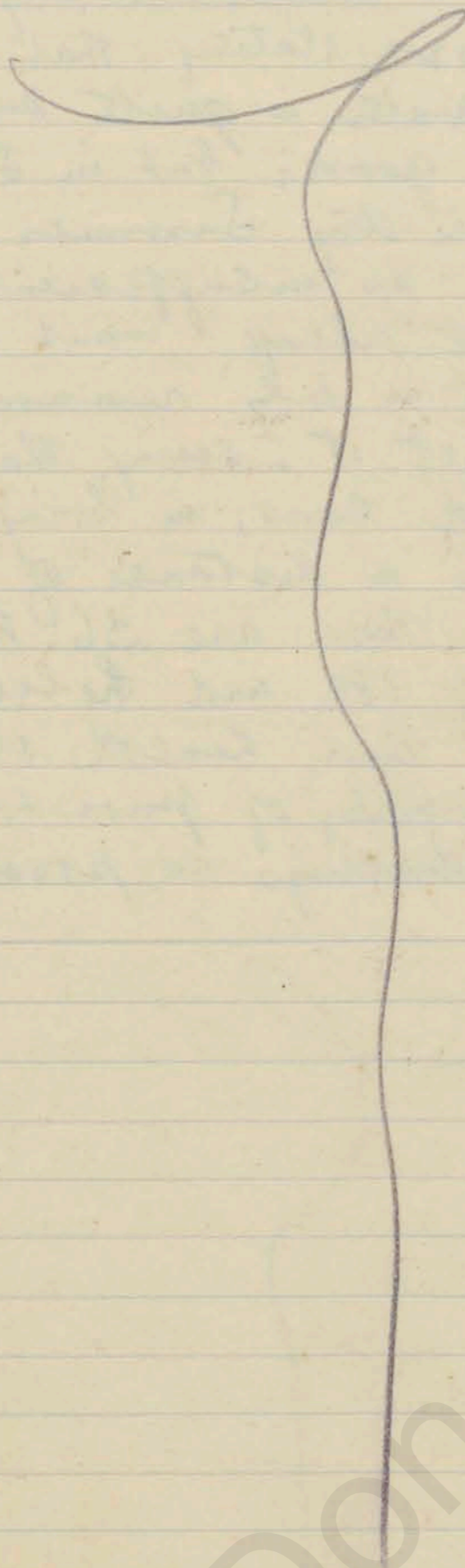

Besides the people in the village want a convenient supply, and it is only reasonable that they should get it, seeing that some of them have to go, and come, in bringing their drinking water a distance of 700 yards. In the village there are 36 houses with a population of 180, and he believes it would be conducive to their health & comfort, to have a plentiful supply of pure water brought as near their dwellings as possible.
