Charr, Creeve Smith & Ballyhoe Glenear - 8 Cottages that the kitchen flues are not giving satisfaction, there being smoke, when all doors and windows are closed. That this can be remedied by building a back flue; provision for which was made in the Plans, if found necessary that he had got Mr. Platt Contractor to make a model which he tried and the result proved satisfactory. He would therefore recommend the Council to have these back flues built, the cost of which would not exceed £1. each if approved he will have them built as soon as possible.

Kennedy's Contract in Ballyhoe has not been satisfactorily completed, as the yard wanted some loads of gravel this however he was now informed had been supplied.

The Council directed the Architect to have the back flues built as soon as possible so that the smoke may be cleared away.

Also recommending some slight alterations to the Houses about

be erected under Scheme B, which will give more space at very little extra cost. Recommendations approved of subject to approval of Local Government Board.

The Clerk reported that he had only one application for the Labourers Cottages in Distillery. That the applicant's name was Edward Kelly, National School Teacher, and that as he offered the same rent and taxes as the other Cottages were let for that he had accepted him as tenant rather than have the House remain vacant, and handed Mr. Kelly the Key. Action of the Clerk approved of subject to the sanction of the Local Government Board.

From R. McComell Bog town dated 14th January 1904 stating that he claimed a right of way up through the plot in Ballylawn where Mr. Fadden's Cottage is built, and desired the steps in fence to be put up for his accommodation.

The Clerk stated that he had submitted Mr. McComell's letter with the newspaper publishing the Sittings of Arbitrator and requesting all claims to be sent in, before a date fixed for sitting; that no claim had been sent in by McComell.

Read letter from Mr. Fadden Esq. MP. Solicitor to the Council dated 4 February 1904 stating that in his opinion that if ever such a right existed, it had been extinguished by the Arbitrator's award, and that McComell should be so informed.

Sanitary Sub-officers Reports were submitted from B. Daly. The only matter requiring order of the Council being that Sawto's premises of Stackarnagh had not complied with the notice served to abate a nuisance ordered to be prosecuted—

From L.G. Board No 7202 dated 11 February 1904 stating that Thomas Dill S.S. Officer should be called upon to furnish a letter in writing explaining his neglect of duty in not sending in Reports.

The Clerk stated that he had seen Thomas Dill on the previous night and again requested him to furnish his reports, otherwise he would have to bring his neglect before the Council.

No reports however had been received from him—The Clerk to write for explanation.

With reference to the proposed increase of Salary to Bryan Daly. Mr. James Sweeney ~~stated~~ gave the following as his reasons for the proposed increase.

1. His district is considerably larger than that of any of the other Sub Sanitary Officers of the Union—
2. It is inhabited chiefly by the poorer class and a closer supervision is more necessary than in the other districts of the Union.
3. Its mountainous character and scattered population entails a considerable amount of most difficult travelling—
4. That having taken the aforesaid reasons into consideration as well as Mr. Dalys long years of faithful service, and efficient service we consider that he is justly entitled to the increase granted by this Council.

Owing to ~~the~~ the dilapidated state of ~~the~~ ^{the} Connaghans House in Attadash in which there has been an outbreak of Fever, which still continues, the House has been limewashed and disinfected twice but it is in such a dilapidated state that it really cannot be properly and thoroughly disinfected. The Council would be desirous of totally abolishing this house if they would be empowered to contribute toward the erection of another dwelling for Connaghans.

Mr. W. J. M. Kinney proposed that the Local Government Board be asked whether the Council

Council to contribute any funds at their disposal toward erecting a dwelling for Connaghan and for demolishing the existing hovel as it is considered unfit for human habitation, and cannot be disinfected properly, and also that fever still exists therein.
