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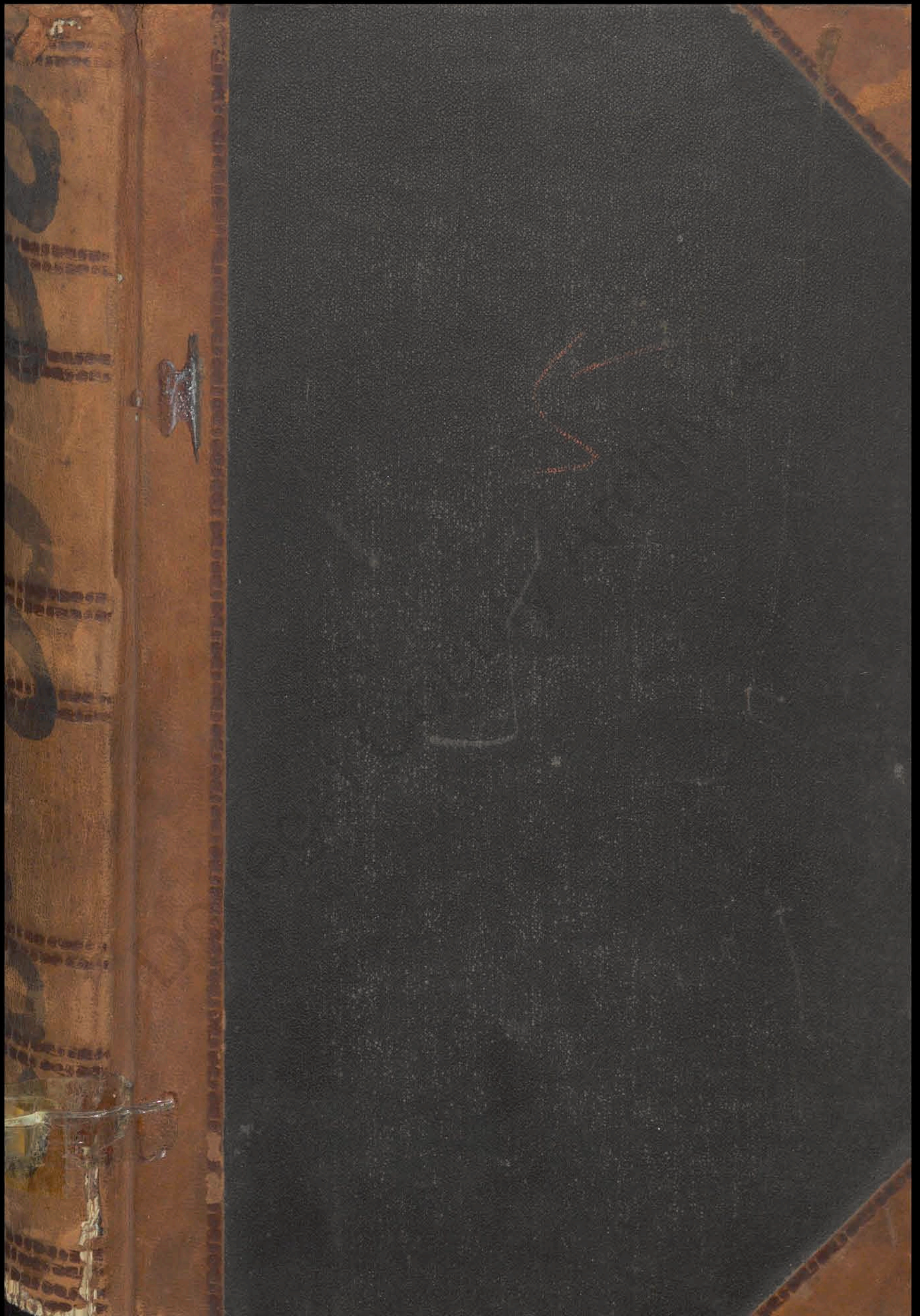

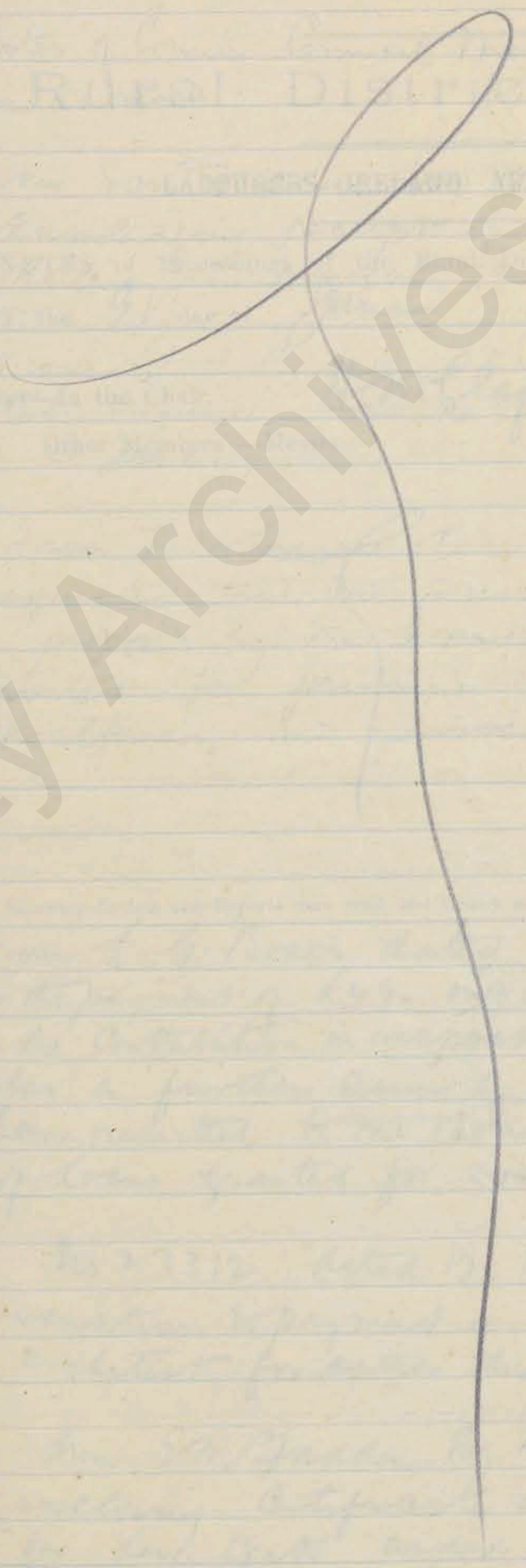

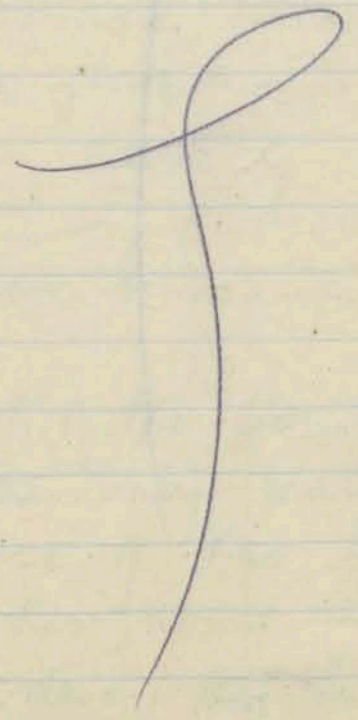

The Clerk stated that by order of the Council the Government the Minutes of the Council were read and taken into consideration as follows: The Clerk was so far as the order for the Minutes was concerned.

The Clerk proceeded to read the Minutes of the Council Meeting, and when he was about half through or thereabout the Minutes were interrupted by the Chairman taking exception to the Minutes and taking the Minutes from before the Clerk, and without taking the Minutes to the Board in any way informing the Board what he proposed writing processes to tamper with the Minutes Book, when the Clerk interrupted him in this act and took the Minutes Book from the Chairman and stated that he would not allow him to alter any Minute that had been given at a previous meeting and repeatedly without taking the Minutes of the Board as to whether it was a correct record of the proceedings. The Clerk also stated that the Minutes were accurate, and requested the Chairman present to be taken into consideration on the day of the Council Meeting - this was refused - but several members stated the Minutes were correct. The Clerk further stated that Mr. W. H. W. was in a majority of the votes of the members present and by the character of the Chairman, and proposed a member of the Council at the Council Meeting, and that he would not allow alteration to be made in the Minutes already signed without an authority from the local Government Board; and would not

recognise Mr. Daly as a member of the Council.

The majority of the members protested in the most forcible manner against the action of the Chairman in attempting to tamper with the Minutes by altering them, and as a result of the protest 19 of the 26 members present left the Boardroom - The meeting being so noisy and unruly that nothing could be done, and the Chairman declared the meeting over, when the members separated.

The following Letters from the Local Government Board for Ireland, or others, were read, and directions given thereon, as follows:—

The question re water supply to the village of Manorcunningham was under consideration.  
 Mr W Montgomery proposed that a pump be erected in the village at a cost not exceeding £25 and that the area of chargeability be the Dispensary District. Mr John Montgomery seconded.

Mr J M Dermott proposed that no pump be erected (as an amendment) as he considers Manorcunningham one of the best watered villages in the Union, and because the parties who signed the document applying for a pump are all small Ratepayers.  
 Mr J R Strenson seconded.

On a vote being taken there votes for the motion 2 and for the amendment 10 -  
 The motion was declared lost
