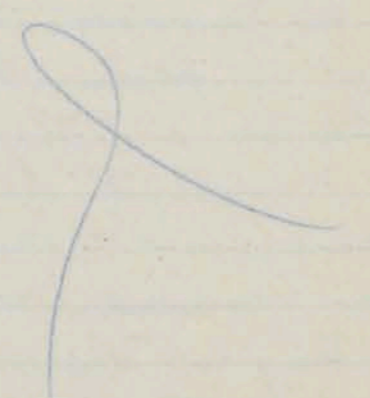

From J. W. Madden Esq Solicitor dated 5 Dec 1907 stating that in reference to the resolutions of the Council fixing the fees to be paid him for work in connection with Schemes under the Labourers Act, pointing out that as to Scheme C. now proceeding, he was appointed by the Council to do the legal work under it before the passing of the Labourers Act of 1906 and the making of the Local Government Rules under it. Under these circumstances he claims to be entitled to do all the legal work under it and to be remunerated on the scale in force before the Act of 1906. As you are aware, I consented to save trouble and delay in the completion of the Scheme to accept the fees fixed by the Resolution of the Council of the 2nd August last, and these fees were not excessive or exorbitant.

Your architect was in a similar position to him as regards this Scheme, yet the L. G. Board in his case departs from their order and allows him a remuneration in excess of that provided by their order, and which will work out at a much higher figure than that which the Council fixed for him as Solicitor, and his work is as heavy or heavier than that of the architect.

As he is of opinion he is entitled to be paid for Scheme C. at the old scale of fees the Council will see it is to their advantage to have the scale fixed in August carried out and it will prevent all cause of friction or delay in future. Therefore he requests them to ask the Local Government Board to reconsider their decision.
