In 1892, when it appeared necessary to repair the cottage in Dublin, the Council had to incur the cost of £10/- for the gate. It is now proposed to have a new gate put in at a cost of £10/-

Two tenders for the repairs to the Cottages were submitted and the lowest for each Cottage was accepted.

The tender of Patrick Quigley of Rosper being lowest for Cottage No 135 was @ 33/- accepted on the condition that he does the work; but as this is the only Cottage for which Mr Quigley's tender was accepted, and it being such a long distance from him, if he does not carry out the work, the other Contractor is to be allowed to carry out the work at the amount specified in his own tender, there being only 2/- of difference in the tenders -

Mr Wm Platts tender was therefore accepted for all the Cottages at a total cost of £43-12-0 unless Mr Quigley carries out the repairs to the one Cottage which would scarcely be possible.
