period mentioned, the medical officer of
Health concerned should be asked to
furnish a report as to the manner in

report, the Board will consider the
propriety of sanctioning his permanent
appointment. A copy of the Board's
Sanitary Order, of the 3rd May 1900 is
enclosed for the guidance of Mr M^cGinty

Cloughan Sanitary District within one month.

The Clerk submitted a claim for compensation amounting to £150, made by Andrew Berry of Lisecooly, for the alleged malicious burning of an engine house with the engine therein and a boiler house with the boiler therein.

The Clerk was directed to instruct the Council's Solicitor to defend this claim.

Letter from L.G.B. no 43473, date 5th Sept 19 forwarding a communication which they have received from Mr R. W. Linsay, complaining of the existence of a nuisance, caused by defective drainage near his premises and requesting that the Council obtain a report from the Medical Officer of Health concerned on the subject.

The attention of the L.G.B. is directed to the minutes of proceedings of the last meeting of the Council in which is recorded a report from Dr Johnston, Medical Officer of Health, on this matter.

Mr Livesey, in his letter to the L. G. B. points out that the attention of the local authorities has been called to this nuisance on various occasions which arises from the sewerage of ten houses collected in an earthenware pipe which runs past his house. This drain is frequently choked and bursts through the roadway forming a pool near at corner of terrace. The floors of the houses are often flooded, and Mr Livesey attributes an attack of dysentery to the forming of the cesspool caused by the bursting of the drain, near his residence and to remedy the matter an earthenware pipe is required to be made for 140 yds to the river.

The Clerk stated that a notice had been served on the owner of the ten houses referred to requiring him to provide proper sewerage & drainage accommodation as recommended by Dr Johnston in his report.

The conditions of this notice have not been complied with.

In connection with this matter, Messrs Elliott & Clark, Solrs wrote stating that Mr Woods, the owner of the ten houses referred to in Mr Livesey's letter, has handed them the notice served on him to provide sewerage accommodation for the said houses. Mr Woods informed his Solicitors that the drains from his houses are in good order and there is no obligation on him to repair the sewer to the river. The obligation of keeping this sewer in repair is on the Sanitary Authority.

It was unanimously Resolved to appoint a committee consisting of the Representatives of the Sanitary Division with the Clerk of the Council, and to wait on the Council's Solicitor and lay all the facts and particulars before him with the view of his advising the Council as to their liability to contract the sewer from the corner of Baynes house to the river.

Letter from L.G.B. no 4415 date 18th Sept 19
 respecting the report from Dr. Gormley as to the manner
 in which Mr W. G. Gormley, Sanitary Sub officer, has discharged
 his duties while on probation and requesting to be
 informed whether Mr W. G. Gormley has taken up his

Read letter from Mr Boyle, Solo to the Council, date 1st Nov. re Nuisance at Straucorlar on the property of Mr Woods, Ballybosny, returning copy of the notice served on him to provide proper drainage accommodation for his houses, which has not been complied with. Mr Boyle states that he has had an interview with the Committee and is clearly of opinion that Mr Woods is liable for to have proper drainage at the rear of his houses, after reading the various sections of the Public Health Act on the subject he is of opinion that the safest plan of the Council

is to get a Report from their Engineer giving exact details of the necessary requirements and a further notice served on Mr Woods. His Solicitors contend that he is not obliged to repair the sewer to the river. Mr Boyle thinks it was the duty of the Landlord, when erecting these houses, to provide sewerage accommodation. The Council's Engineer can give his opinion of the present sewer from the last of Mr Woods' houses to the river, but the Co. could not undertake to give an opinion as to whether, after the lapse of time, the onus is thrown on the Council now of providing such a main sewer. The sewer to the river was obviously sufficient before these houses were erected.

The matter is one of such importance as to merit opinion of Counsel.

It was resolved that the Co. Clerk instruct the Engineer to the Council to inspect the sewer in question and report fully on the capacity of the drain from the last of Mr Woods' houses to Railway gate & then to the River.
