

Sewerage Scheme East Side of Main Street

As directed at last Meeting the Town Surveyor submitted Plans, Specification and Estimate for proposed Sewerage Scheme for the East Side of the Main Street Sett Kenny which were approved of by the Council.

Resolved that Application be made to the Minister for Local Government and Public Health for Sanction to a Loan of £1000 for the carrying out of the Scheme.

Gas Works Account for the Year ended 30th September 1925

The Town Clerk submitted the Gasworks Account for the period 1st April 1925 to 30th September 1925 which showed a loss on the Six Months Workings of £310. 12. 9.

The Account was adopted.

Electric Lighting Scheme.

The Council had under further consideration the Lighting of the District by Electricity and decided to call to their assistance in formulating a Scheme the Services of an Electrical Engineer.

It was unanimously decided to ask Mr R V Macrae, MICE, Londonderry to state his terms for preparing the Scheme providing for Public and Private lighting, preparing Maps Drawing Specifications Estimates &c. and generally bringing the Scheme to a successful completion.

Automatic Flushing Tank - St Columbs Terrace.

It having come to the knowledge of the Council that the Automatic flushing tank at St Columbs Terrace Mrs Finnegan's property has been too frequently acting for a considerable time past causing a heavy drain on the public Water Supply. The Council ordered that Mrs Finnegan be notified to have the flushing tank regulated so that the flushing should take place not often than once in the 24 hours.

Vaccination Acts

The following Resolution from the Kilkenny Urban Sanitary Authority was on the motion of Councillor John Curran seconded by Councillor John P. Speer and unanimously adopted:-

That we call upon the Government to bring in as soon as possible an Amending Bill which will provide that Irish parents who have a conscientious objection to Vaccination will not be compelled to have their children Vaccinated and thus have the law in the Saorstát the same as in England.

Report Medical Officer of Health

The Medical Officer of Health reported that a nuisance exists at the Workshop occupied by Dan Kelly Saddler caused by slops thrown from the houses occupied by Michael Curran and Henry Allison together with liquid manure from manure heap in yard of house occupied by Wm. Laughlin flowing down to the back door of the Workshop and recommended that a grating be laid opposite house occupied by Curran and Allison and connected with crockery pipes which would carry the water to the street sewer. That it is undesirable to have a manure heap at Wm Laughlin's yard but if it is allowed to remain it should be connected with the pipe above mentioned by means of crockeries and have a grating beside the manure heap into which liquid manure will flow.

Ordered that notices be served on the Owners and one month allowed to carry out the recommendations of the Medical Officer of Health.

Report of Sanitary Sub Office

The Record of Work performed by the Sanitary Sub Office since date of last Meeting was submitted and showed 40 houses yards and premises had been visited and inspected. That James Stewart had complied with the Sanitary Notice respecting house owned by him and occupied by Mrs Annie Lee.

Report Shops Act Inspector

The Shops Act Inspector reported that the provisions of the Act are being observed throughout the District.

Report of Water Manager

The Water Manager reported 3 feet water in Glenar reservoir. That the Upper reservoir at Barnamugagh is overflowing into the Town reservoir. That the Town was on full day supply during the past week. That the water service supplying Watt's premises will have to be taken off Barnamugagh main. Under the present arrangement it diminishes the supply to the College.

Ordered that Messrs. Watt & Co Ltd be notified that their connection with the Glenar main will have to be discontinued and the supply taken from the main from Barnamugagh at Kilmacenan Road.

Report Bartakesough Salt

The Bartakesough Salt reported having scoured the Sough Salt main on the 9th & 26th days of October 1925.

Report of Gas Manager

The Gas Manager reported that during the month of October 423 110 cft gas had been manufactured from 53 tons 19 cwt Coal. That the new retorts were working satisfactorily. All the gas plant was in good working order.

Gas Managers Collection Account

The Gas Managers Collection Account was submitted & showed £91.2.5 arrears outstanding.

Roads Administration

Trunk Road T 42. Approval of Scheme.

Read letter S.G.B./7 dated 7th October 1925 from the Department of Local Government and Public Health (Roads) re Trunk Road Grant £450 000 - Circular (S.G.B./202) of 29th April 1925.

Notifying approval of Scheme as submitted by the Council for the Improvement of Road T 42. Works No. 6171. Grant £165.

Ordered that tenders be invited for carrying out the works in accordance with the approved Specification and that same be considered by the Council at next Monthly Meeting.

Report of Town Surveyor.

The Town Surveyor reported on the desirability of having the stones quarried at Barnamugagh Quarry 400 tons removed to the back Pit by Motor Lorry being of opinion that the cost would be much less to remove the stones in bulk and that it would be much more convenient for breaking. This would clear the quarry and make room for a further 800 tons to be raised.

Ordered that tenders be invited for removing the stones from the Barnamugagh quarry to depot at New lime by lorry or by horses and carts. Tenders to be considered at a Special Meeting of the Council on the 16th November 1925 at 4 o'clock P.M.

Temporary Surface Men

The Council decided that William O'Donnell and Michael Dwyer be employed temporarily as表面 men till date of next monthly meeting wages at the rate of 30/- per week.

Proposed Purchase of a Lorry

The Council considered the question of purchasing a Motor Lorry for doing the work of the Council instead of Horse and Cart works as at present.

It was decided to ascertain whether Motor lorries are used in other Urban Districts and with what results.

Housing Minutes
Surcharges Remitted

Read letter S. 44670/25 dated 9th October 1925 from the Department of Local Government and Public Health relative to Surcharges made by the Auditor amounting to £114. 6. 6. in respect of Payment of Poor Rate on Artisans Dwellings at the Audit of the Accounts of the Council for the two financial years ended March 31st 1925 and to the Applications made to the Minister to enquire into and decide upon the lawfulness of the reasons stated by the Auditor for making the Surcharges. That the Minister has decided that the reasons stated by the Auditor for making the Surcharges referred to are lawful but on consideration of all the facts he is of opinion that the expenditure was incurred under such circumstances as to make it fair and equitable that the Surcharges should be remitted and he has directed accordingly.

Further stating that if the Council decide not to impose higher contributions from the tenants than at present to cover rent and rates then it will be necessary to arrange that the proportion of those amounts that is applicable to Poor Rate while being collected weekly with the rent shall be lodged separately to a Suspense Account until the end of each half year when the full amount could be transferred to the credit of the Poor Rate account.

Confirmation of Minutes

The minutes of last Monthly Meeting held on Monday the 2nd day of November 1925 were read and agreed.

Tenders for Carting or Lorrying Stone

There were ten tenders received in response to the Council's advertisement inviting quotations for Carting or Lorrying of 400 tons of Quarry's Stones from the Council's Quarry at Lannanagh to the Depot at New Inn including the fitting and piling the Stones. The tender of William Barr of No 4 Asylum Road Litterenny to do the work in accordance with the specification of the Surveyor for the sum of two Shillings per ton was accepted by the Council.

Main Roads.

Read letter R.D. 201 dated 9th September 1925 from the Department of Local Government and Public Health (Roads) Referring to Sections 1, 24 and 27. of the Local Government Act 1925 and stating that the Minister proposes to make an order to come into operation on the 1st April 1926 declaring the roads mentioned in the accompanying Schedule to be Main Roads in County Donegal for the purpose of the Act. That under Section 1 a "Main Road" means any road which the Minister by his Order declares to be a Main Road. Further stating that the Minister is prepared to consider any representations which the Council may desire to offer concerning the inclusion in the proposed Order of any of the "roads" described in the Schedule or the addition or substitution of other roads. Any representations which it is desired to submit should be communicated as soon as possible and in any event 14 days from the date of the letter. If necessary a Special Meeting should be summoned.

The Council unanimously agreed to the roads mentioned in the Schedule as being declared Main Roads.

Maintenance and Construction of Roads.

Whereas by Section 24 1(CA) of the Local Government Act 1925 it is enacted that on and after the 1st day of April 1925 the maintenance and construction of all County and Main Roads in a County shall be the duty of the Council of such County and whereas by said Section (3) of said Section is further enacted that on the application of the Council of an Urban District the Minister may by Order direct that the Council of such Urban District is to construct or maintain all or any of the Main Roads in such Urban District and while such Order remains in force it shall notwithstanding the provisions of sub Section (1) of said Section be the duty of the County of such Urban District in accordance with the provisions of such Order ^{main} to construct or maintain only roads but such Order shall not effect

of charge for the expense of such construction or maintenance and so much of such expenses as is chargeable on such Urban District shall be paid to the Council of such Urban District by the Council of such County in accordance with the regulations to be made by the Minister.

Resolved unanimously that we the Little Kenny Urban District Council hereby make application to the Minister for Local Government and Public Health for an Order under said Section of Said Act directing that the Council of the Urban District of Little Kenny is to construct and maintain all the Main Roads in such Urban Area in accordance with the provisions of the Local Government Act 1925 and with regulations to be made by the Minister.

The Minister is requested in accordance with the foregoing Resolution to make the Order applied for by the Council

Sewerage Scheme.

The form of application for sanction of the Local Government Department to a loan for £1000. for carrying out the Sewerage Scheme for the east side of the Main Street of Little Kenny was submitted signed on behalf of the Council by the Chairman countersigned by the Clerk and directed to be forwarded to the Minister for Local Government and Public Health.

Finance

General Account

On the report and recommendation of the Finance Committee the Treasurer's Advice Note for Payments detailed in the Financial Statement Book Expenditure No. 88 to No. 93 both inclusive amounting to £129: 15: 4 was signed as required.

Gas Works Account

On the report and recommendation of the Finance Committee the Treasurer's Advice Note for Payments detailed in the Financial Statement Book Expenditure No. 6 to No. Amounting to £28: 12: 1 was signed as required

Local Government Act 1925

Read letter from the Ministry of Local Government dated 16th Nov 1925 transmitting a copy of an Order dated 29th October 1925 and entitled the Local Government (Application and Adaptation of enactments) Order 1925

Rates on Small Houses

Read letter No Q. 54552 / 1925 M dated 19th November 1925 from the Department of Local Government and Public Health stating that many resolutions have been received by the Department from Rating Authorities requesting the introduction of legislation to transfer the responsibility for the payment of rates levied on small houses from the occupiers to the landlords. Usually the suggestion made refers to houses where the valuation does not exceed £4. Requesting the views of the council as to the reasons, which have operated to induce them to recommend the acceptance of this limit or such other limit as they may consider appropriate.

The opinions of the Council on the general question would also be appreciated together with a statement of the number of such small houses in their rating area.

The Council is unanimous in recommending that the limit should be not exceeding £6 Valuation. The difficulty in collecting the rates from this class of tenants is great and they could more easily pay the landlord a rent weekly or monthly which would include rates. By the transfer of such responsibility to the landlords the amount of rates in arrears would be greatly reduced and the closing of the Rate Collector's accounts half yearly greatly facilitated. The number of houses in the Urban District of Little Renny not exceeding £6 in Valuation is 300.

Rate Collector Accounts

Read letter No Q. 55130 / 1925 dated 25th November 1925 from the Department of Local Government and Public Health that before considering Mr Jones Application for a further extension of time for the closing of the first moiety of the current Rates the Minister awaits a Return to the end of the present month.

The Town Clerk stated that the rate Collector had now lodged the full amount of the First Moiety of the Current rates he having placed the balance in the Town Clerks hands before the Meeting.

The Sanction of the Ministry to the payment of the Collector's fees on the full amount of the First Moiety is respectfully requested by the Council.

Public Lighting and Water Supply

A number of residents from Rosemount appeared as a Deputation before the Council and urged that a public Lamp at Rosemount Terrace should be restored and undertaken on behalf of the residents that the lamp would not again be interfered with. They also complained as to the water supply to some of the houses in the locality owing to the defective mains.

The Council decided to restore the public Lamp on the understanding given and to have two of the houses connected with the water mains serving the Council's cottage in the locality.

Report of Medical Officer of Health

The Medical Officer of Health reported that a nuisance exists at House of Harry McMonagle Lower Main Street caused by the bad state of repair of the premises as set out in the Report and recommended the works necessary to be done to put the premises in repair.

Ordered that Notice be served on the Owner Mr James Stewart and one month allowed to carry out the recommendations of the Medical Officer of Health.

Report of Sanitary Sub Officer

Water Closet Accommodation

The Sanitary Sub Officer reported that the dwelling house owned by James Stewart and occupied by Harry McMonagle is unprovided with proper Water Closet accommodation.

Ordered that Notice be served on the Owner Mr James Stewart Main Street requesting him within one month to provide sufficient Water Closet accommodation for said dwelling.

Record of Sanitary Work performed.

The Sanitary Sub Officer reported that since date of last Meeting he had Visited and inspected 30 houses yards and Premises. At Church Lane he found a broken Sewer causing a nuisance to adjoining premise occupied by John Harris Cornhill Barberay and William McDermott. That the Sewer comes from Mr Dan Kelly's property. That Charles Ward has not done anything to ward at rear of Dan Kelly's in respect of which a Notice had been served on him.

Ordered that Notice be served on Mr Dan Kelly respecting Sewer at Church Lane. That the time mentioned in Notice served on Charles Ward be extended till date of next Monthly Meeting.

Malicious Injury Claim

A Claim by Mr John McTighe Esq. Town Surveyor for works done as Valuers etc in connection with the Council's defences of Malicious Injury Claims by Mrs Catherine Mullison and Mr William McCafferty £2: 2: 0 in each case was submitted and passed for payment by the Council subject to the Sanction of the Ministry for Local Government which is requested.

Report of Shops Act Inspector

The Shops Act Inspector reported that the provisions of the Act were being observed throughout the District.

Report of Water Manager

The Water Manager reported that there was but 2 feet of water in the Glencairn reservoir. Barnallingagh reservoir had each 6 feet 6 inches of water. That during the Month he spent 2 days on the Lough Salt-Main repairing Sludge Valves and putting Air Valves in order. That during the present month the Scrapping of the Lough Salt Main would be taken in hand. That owing to the frost there were several bursts in the water Services to the Council's houses all of which had been put in order.

That all fire plugs are in good order.

The Gas Manager reported that during November 443,560 C.F. of gas were manufactured out of 55 $\frac{1}{2}$ tons coal. That all the gas plant was in good working order.

The Loretaker Lough Salt reported having Scoured the Lough Salt-Water train on the 6th & 21st days of November and 4th December 1925.

Electric Lighting Scheme.

Appointment of Engineers

The Town Clerk reported that Mr R V McCarthy M.I.E.E. Londonderry had notified him that he regretted he could not having regard to his other duties undertake the work of advising the Council in their proposed Electric Scheme.

The Council directed that an advertisement be inserted in the Press, for an Electrical Engineer for the proposed Scheme. Applications to be considered at a Special Meeting of the Council on Monday 21st December 1925 at 4 o'clock P.M.

Electricity Special Order

Read letter No 10915 dated 24th November 1925 from the Department of Industry and Commerce. That it would be difficult to define the form of the Electricity Special Order which would be required until particulars of the local requirements are furnished. A copy of the Original draft of the Blackrock (Co Dublin) Electricity Order was forwarded for the Council's information.

Roads Administration

Report of Town Surveyor

The Town Surveyor reported that the new depot for Stones at New Lane had been forwarded, and that the Barking Contractor had delivered over about half of the quarried Stones. He asked that arrangements for the quarrying of a further 500 tons of stones be made. That a gully trap was required for road leading to Oldtown Bridge to connect Surface Water to Main Sewer also a Manhole frame and cover for Sewer at Kilmacrennan Road. That portion of roadway leading to Mr Clunes Terrace, had slid and a piece of retaining wall required to be built.

Ordered that tenders be invited for the quarrying of 500 tons of stones at Larnanugagh Quarry and that a Gully traps be provided for road to Oldtown Bridge and that the retaining wall at road leading to Mr Clunes Terrace be built by the Surface men.

Speed of Motor Cars

Read letter R.V./209 dated 12th November 1925 from the Department of Local Government and Public Health (Roads) Relative to the Speed of Motor Cars and to the existing powers for controlling dangerous driving and the speed limits that have been fixed.

Read letter No R.D./201 dated 21st November 1925 from the Department of Public Health Roads that no application under Section 24(3) can be considered unless received by the Department by the 4th December 1925.

The Council at their Special Meeting on the 16th November 1925 made application to the Ministry for an Order under the Section directing that the Urban Council is to construct and maintain all the main roads in the Urban District.

The Town Surveyor submitted an account for £10 in connection with the Trunk Road T 59 Improvement Scheme being 2½% on the amount of the grant of £400 to the Council this being the percentage allowed the Town Surveyor under the terms of his appointment for the works carried out under the loans expenditure the Council passed the account for payment subject to the sanction of the Ministry which is requested

Carting of Clay from New Line to Dumping Ground

The Town Clerk reported that tenders had been invited for the carting of 80 tons more or less of clay bank at New Line to Council's Dumping Ground at Port Road and that the tender of Harry McMonagle to do the work specified for the sum of £6: 5: 0 was accepted

Housing Minutes

Housing Scheme Act 1925

Read letter Rott 362/27034/1925 dated 20th November 1925 from the Housing Department Local Government and Public Health Relative to the proposed erection of 4 houses under the Working Classes Act and pointing out that the carrying out of the scheme in accordance with the plan proposed would render it necessary for the Council to charge a rent of 13/- per week per house in order to prevent the houses being a burden on the rate payers That the Minister is of opinion that the Council would do well to consider the question

of building to a cheaper plan and in this connection a plan of a four roomed house notified Standard proposed in the Department was enclosed for the Council's information That houses of a similar type to that now submitted have been erected in other Urban Areas at from £260 to £270 and that the amount of grants payable under the Housing Act 1925 in respect of each house is £70.

After carefully examining the Tenders and considering the different kinds of Coal offered on the recommendation of the Gas Manager the Council accepted the Tender in terms of advertisement of Messrs Samuel Morrison & Co Londoners for the supply of Luechow Gas coal at Oldtown Station at the rate of 31/- per ton.

Tenders for Quarrying Stones

The Council considered Tenders for raising mauling and piling for measurement at the Council's Quarry at Cammough of 500 tons stones 26 Cubic feet to the ton. The Tender of Charles Doherty of Dooballagh at 2/-10 per ton being the lowest was accepted. Sureties Patrick Lynch Magheraboy, Patrick Bellan Loughmaguin.

Electric Lighting Scheme.

Appointment of Electrical Engineers

In response to advertisement issued by the Council there were seven applications received for the appointment of Electrical Engineers for the Council's Electric Lighting Scheme for the District.

The Applications terms and experience of the several Applicants having been considered the Council was unanimous in their decision to appoint Mr J. J. Woods Electrical Engineer Ferney House Glenties Co Monaghan at the remuneration of 5% on the total capital outlay inclusive of all travelling expenses. Terms of Payment 50% when tenders have been accepted 25% within 2 months afterwards and the balance on completion of the Scheme. The appointment is however subject to Mr Woods accepting a fee of £10. for furnishing a Preliminary report with plans setting out full particulars of the Scheme which fee if the work is proceeded with in accordance with the Scheme proposed by Mr White is to merge in the fee of 5% on the total capital outlay. Should however the Scheme not be proceeded with no charge other than that the fee of £10 is to be made. The appointment is also subject to the sanction of the

Minister which is requested

The Local Government Ireland Act 1925

Read letter Ref. No. 50172/1925 this dated 3rd December 1925 from the Department of Local Government and Public Health Transmitting Copy of an Order made by the Minister on the 3rd November 1925 setting forth the rules to be observed in carrying into effect the provisions of Section 64 of the above mentioned Act and pointing out the classes of buildings that are eligible for the benefit of the Section (1) Entirely new structures begun and completed between 1st April 1920 and 1st April 1927 and (2) Buildings the construction of which have been substantially enlarged or improved within the same period - also stating the exceptions to which the Section does not apply.

Discharge of Surcharges

Read letter Ref. No. S.47608/25 dated 8th December 1925 from the Department of Local Government and Public Health Advertising to previous Correspondence in regard to certain Surcharges made by the Local Government Auditor at the Audit of the Accounts of the Council for the period ended 31st March 1925 that the Minister has had under further consideration surcharges of £7: 9: 0. £4: 18: 6. £55 and £15: 1: 6 in respect of expenditure incurred by the Council in providing and maintaining a stand for the washing of Motor Cars for the Public

That in their appeal the Appellants submit that under the Water works balances Acts and the Public Health Acts the Council have power to expend money to conserve the Water Supply of the District and prevent its misuse in the washing of Hackney Motor Cars.

That the Appellants further rely upon the provisions of Section 61 of the Public Health (Ireland) Act 1878 as to the Powers of the Sanitary Authority in relation to the supply of Water and to the definition of the term "Waterworks" as defined by Section 2 of the said Act.

That under Section 61 of the Public Health (Ireland) Act 1878 the Council have power to construct and maintain Waterworks and to contract with any person for a supply of water. The apparatus for supplying water to the Motor Wash Stand erected by the Council

may properly be held to come within the definition of Waterworks in that Act and that being so the Council would be empowered to maintain the apparatus to employ a person to take charge and to charge for the water required for washing motor vehicles. That it appears however that the charge of 1/- made by the Council includes a fee of 6^d for the services of the caretaker of the Motor Wash Stand who himself washes the cars and so far as there is a direct charge for washing undertaken by an employee of the Council the present arrangement would not seem to be covered by the Statute. That the Council should therefore see that they are acting within their powers in this matter.

That it further appears from statements made in the Appeal that no charge on the rate is at present being incurred under the arrangement and if that is so it is not likely that further objections to the proposal would arise at Audit. That the Council should however see that they are fully safeguarded in continuing the arrangement in its present form including the portion of the charge made thereunder for services of caretaker for washing cars.

That on full consideration of the circumstances the Minister has decided to discharge the surcharge on the merits.

The Council respectfully desire to point out that the Minister is under a misconception as regards the caretaker. The caretaker does not wash or take any part in the washing of the cars. The fee paid by the owner for each car washed is 1/- which is paid to the Council and the remuneration paid to the caretaker for his services in taking charge of the Wash Stand apparatus seeing that there is no unnecessary use of water and collecting the fee of 1/- per wash is 6^d per wash. The Council again request the Minister to sanction the appointment of Andrew McCool as such caretaker at the remuneration stated.

Extension of time - Rate collection Account.

Read letter No Q. 58652 / 1925 dated 16th December 1925 from the Department of Local Government and Public Health stating that the Minister sanctions an extension of time to the 5th December 1925 to enable Collector Jones to close the 1st moiety of rates for the current financial year.

The Collector has already closed the collection of the first moiety of the Rates.

Read letter from the Commissioners of Valuation dated 11th December 1928 requesting that for revision purposes the valuation lists relating to the Urban District may be forwarded.

Motor Wash Stand

Read letter P.H. 3594/26 Letterkenny Urban District dated 6th Feby. 1926 from the Ministry of Local Government Referring to entry in the Minutes of Proceedings of the Council on the Subject of the Motor Wash Stand and stating that as the Council base their claim to make a charge upon the terms of Section 66 of the Public Health (Ireland) Act 1878 in regard to agreements, it would seem to follow that the resolution of the 5th May. 1924 is no longer regarded as possessing obligatory force. That the Minister is advised that the resolution of the Council is of no effect except in so far as it may be regarded as a Public Notification that the Council would thenceforth enforce the provisions of Section 18 of the Waterworks Clauses Act 1863 and further that a by-law to the effect of the Council's resolution could not legally be made under the powers conferred by Section 5(2) of the Public Health (Ireland) Act 1891.

That the Council having land pipes for the supply of any of the inhabitants of their District are under an obligation to supply, if required water for domestic purposes, which does not include a supply for the purpose mentioned as exempted from the meaning of that expression in Section 12 of the Waterworks Clauses Act 1863, and may supply water for purposes other than domestic purposes on such terms as may be agreed upon between them and the persons supplied.

That it may also be pointed out that the use of water for the purpose of washing a Motor Car is not necessarily a use for non-domestic purposes. (Harrogate Corporation V Mackay 1907 2 K.B. 611).

That under the circumstances the Minister would suggest that the whole position should be re-considered by the Council.

The Council having carefully considered the foregoing letter are fully satisfied that they have legal authority for charging for the water supplied for the washing of Motor Cars under the existing arrangements and that they are empowered to employ and pay a caretaker for looking after the Wash Stand and would therefore again respectfully request the Minister for Local Government and Public Health to sanction the appointment of Mr Andrew McCool, as such Caretaker at the remuneration of Sixpence for each Vehicle washed at the Stand.

Water Supply to Bishops Palace

Read letter dated 9th February 1926 from the Most Rev W^m Mac Neely, D.D. Ard Duran Letterkenny drawing the Council's attention to the Water Supply at the Palace; that at no time is it fit for drinking frequently it is not suitable for any kind of household use. That it was not Soft Water etc.

The Town Clerk submitted copy of his letter dated 11th Feby. 1926 in reply to His Lordships that instructions had been given the Water Manager to make a careful inspection of all the Cistern pipes &c in connection with the Palace with the view of if possible remedying the present unsatisfactory supply. That the Water Manager reported that on inspection he found that the Palace cistern required to be cleaned out a large accumulation of sediment being found in same and on the turning on of the water this

Sediment was disturbed and so discoloured the water. That he requested the cistern to be thoroughly cleaned out and when this was done he would carefully flush the drain supplying the College and thus endeavour to remove all cause of complaint.

Technical Instruction Rate

Report of Town Surveyor

The Town Surveyor reported - That during the quarter ended 31st March last a considerable amount of cleaning on the main roads where necessary was carried out. The usual scavenging was done by the Surface men and the roads and streets kept in a clean condition under the 1925 Act. Your liability for the maintenance and construction ceased on the 31st March 1926, and the County Council became liable for the maintenance and construction for such as end from 1st April 1926. The scavenging of these roads would now appear to be the duty of the County Council and consequently I did not during the past week direct this work to be done or carried out by the Council's workmen.

That the contractor for quarrying stones for the Steans rolling of

Trunk Road No 42. (Known on Map as portion of Trunk Road "A to B" No 42 Post Road) has now 400 tons quarried leaving 100 tons to be quarried which he will have completed in about 10 days.

The quantity quarried would be sufficient to enable the Contractors Messrs Holmes Bros. to proceed with the contract but inasmuch as the Road is now under the control of the County Council the Urban Council should consider their position in the matter and whether it would not be advisable to arrange with the County Council for having the works carried out by them. They have the plant to enable the work to be promptly carried out.

Read letter No. 11582, dated 15th April 1926 from the Department of Industry and Commerce acknowledging receipt of certificate of service of the necessary notice on owners and lessors of property situated within 300 yards of the proposed generating station and stating that the certificate and other documents which have been filed in connection with the application of the Council are in order.

Re Application Special Order

Read letter No. 11607, dated 27th April 1926. That the Minister of Industry and Commerce has had under careful consideration the position involved by the issue of authorisation to establish new Electricity undertakings in view of arrangements for supply from the Shannon. That the Minister has to consider the fact that expenditure on generating plant could not be paid off during the first three years of the working of the undertaking and also that it is contemplated in the proposed legislation regarding the National Supply of electricity to impose upon him the duty of prescribing rates of charge to consumers proportionate to the charge for bulk supply. Such rates of charge could not be reasonably inflated to include provision for redemption of capital expenditure on unissued plant which has been installed

after the Shannon Scheme had been sufficiently advanced to ensure a bulk supply within three years from the date of such installation.

A further important matter for consideration is the probability of the adoption of a policy for Say Stat wherein of merging small distributing undertakings under one controlling body for an extensive area. The operation of the system in this country by procedure was authorised by the Electricity Supply Act 1919 but was suspended in view of the contemplated National bulk supply scheme. The Minister is bound to consider further the application of the system at an early date. Excepting under very exceptional circumstances therefore it is not considered that it would be reasonable to sanction expenditure on the generating plant at this stage of the progress of the National Scheme unless such sanction were made conditional upon no claim being put forward for recompence or compensation for any such expenditure in the probable event of amalgamation of the undertaking with others.

That in view of the foregoing statement as to the condition which must be applied to any Electricity Order the Council was asked whether they desired to reconsider the application recently made by them.

That in the event of the application being proceeded with by the Council the Minister will deem it necessary to limit the period of loan raised for generating plant to a short period and also to impose a condition that any net profits resulting from the working of the undertaking after due provision has been made for the Ordinary Capital Charges shall be utilised for redemption of that portion of the loan raised for payment of generating plant.

The Council having carefully considered the foregoing letter it was proposed by Councillor Miss Kate McCarron that the Council proceed with the application and agree to the condition the Minister proposed to the Electricity Order.

The Chairman (Mr. William Boyle) seconded the Motion. Councillor John P. Spear proposed an amendment that the consideration of the letter be adjourned until after the consideration of the tenders advertised for has taken place. The amendment was not however,

Seconded.

The Motion was declared carried by Councillor John P Spear dissenting.

Main Roads Scavenging &c.

Read letter No R.M.17 dated 22nd April 1926 from the Department of Local Government and Public Health (Roads) in reply to the queries in the letter of the Town Clerks of the 16th April last and stating as follows:- (a) The County Council responsible for the maintenance and construction of Main Roads and under obligation to cleanse the Roads so far as may be necessary for the proper maintenance of the Roads for traffic. When the road is a 'Street' Section 52 of the Public Health (Ireland) Act 1878 empowers the Urban District Council or Sanitary Authority to undertake the Contract for the proper cleansing of the street. Such extra cleansing must be done by the Urban Council.

(b) Provision as to openings in Main Roads. Duties in Urban Districts should be arranged between the Urban District and County Councils concerned.

Main Roads Scavenging

Read letter No. B.D./201/2 dated 28th April 1926 from the Department of Local Government and Public Health (Roads) that it would appear some local Authorities are in doubt as to their function in connection with the Scavenging of Main Roads in Urban Districts. Stating that when it is the duty of a County Council to maintain and construct Main Roads in Urban Districts the County Council is under obligation to cleanse the Roads so far as may be necessary for the proper maintenance of the Roads for traffic. When the road is a 'Street' Section 52 of the Public Health (Ireland) Act 1878 empowers the Urban District Council as Sanitary Authority to undertake a contract for the proper cleansing of the street.

That the exercise of this power may be enforced by the Minister.

Ordinarily the cleansing of a Street involves more than is required for road maintenance and preserves the Street

and its Sanitary condition. Such extra cleansing can and should be performed by the Urban District Council.

That there is no legal objection to the two Councils mutually agreeing that one council shall perform the other's duty and receive a reasonable payment for doing so. - Such an agreement would often prevent overlapping and confusion.

Report of Town Surveyor.

The Town Surveyor reported that during the past month the Surface men were occupied cleansing and scavenging the Urban Roads and cleaning Open Drains. No scavenging or cleansing of the Main Roads was undertaken during the period.

Extracts referred to:-

"A Diary is kept by the Sanitary Sub Offices but it conveys little information of value from a Public Health point of view."

"There is no Meat Inspector and Milk Supplies cannot be sufficiently inspected by an untrained man"

The quantity of Water is insufficient owing to the inadequacy of 5" pipe from source at Dough Salt. Supplies have to be curtailed at times. A larger main is required.

A sample of the Water might be submitted for analysis. Clothes are burned when infected. If the present inadequate provision for fever cases is remedied a disinfecter might be erected.

In my opinion a qualified Sanitary Officer should be in charge of this Urban District.

The Council have to state that the Diary kept by the Sanitary Sub Officer shows in a concise form the duties performed by him. The number of premises inspected and the steps taken to have nuisances found to exist abated. The report is submitted at each Monthly Meeting of the Council.

As regards meat Inspection the Council have directed the Sanitary Sub Officer to cause inspections to be made and should

Any suspicious case be found to call upon the Medical Officer of Health to examine same.

The Council cannot at present undertake the laying of a larger Water main from Dough Salt as the cost would be too heavy until the existing loan is repaid.

The Council ordered that a sample of the Water be sent for analysis.

Sanitary Salaries

Read Memo. dated the 14th May 1926 from the Department of Local Government and Public Health forwarding a negotiable receipt: Gov £ 5: 0: 9 being an advance on account of proportion of expenditure incurred by the Council on salaries of Sanitary Officers during the year ending 30th September 1926.

Amount to be lodged to the credit of the Council

Infection Disease and School Attendance

Read letter P.H. 13230/26 this dated 15th May 1926 from the Department of Local Government and Public Health re closing the Schools on account of the prevalence of infection diseases.

Ordered that the Circular be referred to the Medical Officer of Health for his guidance in the matter.

Reports of Sanitary Sub Office

The Record of Work performed by the Sanitary Sub Officer since date of last Monthly Meeting was submitted and showed that he had inspected the following Factories and found all provided with good and sufficient Sanitary accommodation. Viz Ward Wallace, The Cork Donegal Printing Company, W G McKinney's Mrs McFadden, Letterkenny Hosiery Coy Ltd and Mr. Mulhern. That he found at Motor Factory - John Buchanan's 7 men working in the factory no Sanitary convenience.

The Executive Sanitary Officer stated that Mr Buchanan had called with him and understood to provide suitable Sanitary accommodation in connection with the Works.

Sanitary Notice Complied with

The Sanitary Sub Officer reported that Mrs Jeannie Colhoun had complied with the requirements of ten Sanitary Notice for repairs to house occupied by Mr James Stewart at Lower Main Street - and owned by her.

Sanitary Notice NOT Complied with

The Executive Sanitary Officer reported that he had not issued the summons for non compliance with the Sanitary Notice served on Mr Daniel Diver MBE regarding repairs to house occupied by Mr Faughnan as Mr Diver called with him and undertook to have the specified works carried out.

Mr Diver who was in attendance at the Meeting promised the Council that the works would be executed by him.

Report of Inspector of Dairies.

The Inspector of Dairies Milkshops and Cowsheds reported having inspected the several Cowsheds in the District all of which with the following exceptions he found to be clean - The following sheds require to be lime-washed. Viz that of. Mr John McMillan Wmburner Mr A. MacCormick Wm McDermott. John Ki'Cay.

Ordered that Notice be served on each of the foregoing Persons and 14 days allowed for lime-washing to be carried out.

Report of Shops Act Inspector

The Shops Act Inspector reported that the provisions of the Shop Act were being observed throughout the District.

Application for Additional Water Supply

Mrs Catherine Matheson (Thomas Matheson & Co) applied for an additional Water Supply for her premises at Lower Main St in connection with her business via an inch pipe on the usual terms of the Council Application Granted.

Report of Town Surveyor

The Town Surveyor reported that during the past month he got all the open public sewers at the Isle cleaned and put in good order. As directed he had prepared and now submitted an Amended Specification for repairs to the Mortuary at Oldtown.

Ordered that tenders be invited for carrying out of the Works specified.

Electric Lighting Scheme.

Application for Loan of £8000.

Read letter dated 27th April 1926 from the Manager of the Helensburgh Bank Ltd Treasurer of the Council relative to the Council's letter of the 17th April last enquiring whether the Bank would grant a loan of £8000. to the Council for the purpose of establishing an Electricity Undertaking and if so on what terms stating that the Director instructed him to say that when the Order applied for from the Minister of Industry and Commerce has been made the Director will consider the question of the proposed advance.

Special Electricity Order

Read letter from the Department of Industry and Commerce No 11809 dated 29th May 1926 that the Minister has given careful consideration to the application for making a Special Order to authorise the Council to supply Electricity within the Urban District and also for sanction to raise a loan of £8000 for the purpose of carrying out the Works which would be involved by the making of such an Order.

Having regard to the circumstances set forth in the Memorial and other documents forwarded and also having regard to the fact that not a single objection had been lodged against the proposals evidence being thereby afforded that the proposals have the support of the Ratepayers of the District the Minister had decided to make a Special Order in accordance with the terms of the Draft Order which has been lodged - Steps will be taken to have the necessary Statutory procedure carried through as early a date as can be arranged.

That with regard to the proposed scheme as reported on by the Consulting Engineers and endorsed by the Council the Minister is prepared to sanction the raising of a loan for the purpose of establishing an Electricity Undertaking, but it is deemed advisable that the details of the Scheme should receive further examination in view of the necessity for bringing all newly constructed electricity undertakings into strict conformity with the System and requirements of the National Bulk Supply Scheme. That the Specification prepared by Mr. Wood have been submitted to the Electrical Consulting Engineers engaged on the Shannon Scheme - Dr. P. W. Sotman but it is considered necessary that in addition he should be given an opportunity to examine the tenders before any tender is finally accepted. Mr. Sotman will then be in a position to submit his considered opinion to the Council and no doubt his views will be of assistance to the Council when coming to its final decisions. It is to be understood, of course, that the furnishing of such advice will not involve any charge upon the Council.

Tenders for Electricity Works.

The Council opened Tenders received in reply to Advertisements for the following in connection with the Electricity Scheme.

Ordered that all the Tenders be forwarded to the Minister of Industry and Commerce for submission to Dr. Sotman in accordance with the foregoing letter from the Minister of Industry and Commerce.

A Special Meeting to be convened on return of the Tenders and Dr. Sotman's report thereon.

The Barretake Lough Salt reported having scoured the Water Main on the 8th and 22nd days of May 1926.

Report of Water Manager

The Water Manager reported having the previous day visited the two reservoirs that in Lannaghagh reservoir there were 9 feet of water and in Glenear reservoir 5 feet. That Mr Charles Ward had carried out the necessary repairs to the Water Service at his property Lower Main Street.

Fireplugs in Good Order

Report of Gas Manager

The Gas Manager reported that during the Month of May 118 130 cfs. of gas were manufactured out of 18 tons 14 cwt 1 qr of Coal. That all the Gas plant was in good repair.

Gas Manager Collection Account

The Gas Manager's Collection Account was submitted and showed arrears amounting to £ 81 : 18 : 1.

On the report and recommendation of the Finance Committee the Treasurer's Advice Note for payments detailed in the Financial Statement Book Expenditure No 7 to No 9 both inclusive amounting to £50. 10. 4 was signed as required.

Voice of Rates having been made.

Read letter Stat 28450/1926. This dated 21st June 1926 from the Department of Local Government and Public Health requesting to be furnished with a copy of voice of Rates having been made in respect of rates made by the Council for the current financial year.

Request complied with.

Electric Lighting Order

Read letter 1186 dated 10th June 1926 from the Department of Industry and Commerce Power Section sending copy of Lester Kenney Urban District Electric Lighting Order certified by the Secretary to the Department of Industry and Commerce as having been made by the Minister on the 8th June 1926.

Stating that as already informed an Electricity Order made by the Minister requires the confirmation of An Dail and An Seanad and that the Minister is taking steps to arrange for the moving of the Resolution of confirmation in the two Houses at early date.

Acknowledgement of receipt of Tenders.

Read letter No 11874 dated 14th June 1926 from the Department of Industry and Commerce Power Section acknowledging receipt of the tenders submitted to the Council in connection with the proposed Electricity Undertaking &c.

Electricity Special Order.

Read letter No 11981 dated 28th June 1926 from the Department of Industry and Commerce Power Section that the Lester Kenney Urban District Electricity Lighting Order 1926 which was made by the Minister for Industry and Commerce on the 8th June 1926 was approved by Seanad Eireann on Wednesday 16th June 1926 and by Dail Eireann on Friday 18th June 1926.

Re Tenders proposed Electricity Undertaking

Read letter No 12003 dated 3rd July 1926 from the Department of Industry and Commerce Power Section that the tenders are in connection with the construction of the proposed Electricity Undertaking had been duly received by the Minister for Industry and Commerce.

and had been examined. The Minister would like it to be understood that while he is prepared to give any reasonable assistance to the Council he is reluctant to trespass upon any of its rights consequently he does not wish to interfere with the discretion of the Council in regard to the final selection of the tenders nor can he relieve them of any of the responsibility in connection therewith.

That inspection of the tenders was suggested by the Minister primarily for the purpose of ascertaining that the distribution system when constructed could be conveniently and economically lifted up at a future date with the Shannon Scheme. It has been anticipated that when the Council acceded to the request of the Minister to send on the tenders for inspection the tenders would have been accompanied by a detailed analysis prepared by the Consulting Engineer and by a report from him as to conformity or non-conformity with the various clauses of his specification. In the absence of such analysis and report the remarks submitted must necessarily be of a general character.

Night tenders for supply and erection of the engines and alternators were examined seven being from manufacturing firms. These manufacturing firms all bear a good reputation for work of this kind and a certain amount of security is thereby obtained by the Council. The two lowest tenders are for precisely the same plant namely Blackstone & Co's engines coupled to the General Electric Company's alternators each of these companies submitting a separate tender at the same price £2830. Speaking generally these two tenders appear to conform with the specification but the checking of details by the Consulting Engineer would be advisable as would be seen by the accompanying rough table of efficiency guarantees. The guaranteed full consumption is somewhat higher than that guaranteed by the next lowest tender submitted by Messrs Crossley P.D.C. The guaranteed maximum variation is not so satisfactory however, in this latter case and no guarantees are given as to the efficiency of the exciters. If Messrs Crossley's tender is being considered by the Council it would be advisable also that full information as to the make and other details of the

electrical section of the plant should be obtained and considered. The fourth tender in order of price is that of Mr J. McAuley of Little Kenny. The advertisement inviting tenders stated that the Council was prepared to receive tenders from manufacturers of plant for the generating sets and switchgear and the Council itself must decide therefore whether this tender should be considered. Mr McAuley offers the same plant as that in the lowest tenders at a price of £2895. Several other tenders have been submitted at a comparatively small advance in price and in two or three cases there are certain minor advantages which could be valued by the Consulting Engineer if the Council considers it advisable. It should be borne in mind that the Auditor of the Department of Local Government must be satisfied in any case where the lowest tender is not accepted that the additional price is fully recouped by the extra value obtained. A small extra sum is asked for by certain of the tenders for tests as to parallel running at the manufacturers works and the Council would be well advised to agree to this extra Periodical free inspection of the plant is also included in the lowest tender and the Council should ask for a definite agreement on this point to the effect that free inspection should be continued for a period of at least two years at intervals of not more than four months. That as a result of a general examination of the specification and tenders by Mr. Sollman certain suggestions were appended with regard to which the Council should invite definite guarantees and if these be obtained it was considered that the Council would be safe in accepting the lowest tender which is inclusive of such guarantees or the greater proportion of them.

That the twelve tenders received for the switchgear range from £385 to £560. That the lowest tender is that of Metropolitan Vickers £385 and this firm submits an alternative tender at £406.

That several of the tenders draw attention to the fact that two distribution panels are provided in the specification whereas this section of the equipment can be readily and conveniently accommodated on one panel. Accordingly the tenders from Metropolitan Vickers & McAuley, The General Electric Co. and Ferguson Parkin only include four panels in all instead of five as specified and extra sum being asked for if the fifth panel be

required. That the Council would be well advised to consider whether the extra cost of providing five panels to the distribution board is necessary in the initial stages of the undertaking and if it is decided to save this item of cost the Consulting Engineer should report as to the comparative effect on the tenders submitted by other parties who conform to the specification in this respect.

That the consideration of the tenders for overhead distribution is attended with considerable difficulty having regard to the conditions set in the advertisement that tenders for this Section would be received from contractors who have carried out similar work. So far as the information obtained would go to show, of the four parties who tendered for the overhead distribution only one, The Irish Electric Construction Co. appear to have carried out the construction of an alternating current 3 phase system that company stating that they had erected systems which are precisely similar to that proposed for Letterkenny at Glenties, Edmond, and Dungloe. That it was for the Council to decide whether they should adhere to the terms set out in their advertisement.

That four tenders for this Section of the works were received and examined the following being the amounts of McAuley £190 Thomas Coffey £224/-, Irish Electric Construction £2398, and Thomas May £2750. That it was difficult to arrive at any comparison of these tenders having regard to the insufficiency of detail in the specification under certain headings for instance the street poles are merely stated by the specification to be approved make and no indication is given as to what class of pole, and no indication is given as to what class of pole the Consulting Engineer would approve of. The difficulty in tendering thus caused is clearly indicated by the separate prices quoted for poles which may be added to or deducted from the work of construction the prices for the 30 foot pole for instance ranging from £7. to £11.5. Similarly the requirement for consumers services is merely stated by the specification as that of cable approved by the engineer. That the consumers connections are of considerable importance and more details should have been given in the specification. There is also an

insufficiency of detail in the specification with regard to the conductors and apparently the parties tendering found it difficult to submit price which could be closely compared as is shown by the prices quoted per 100 yards of Section No. 1 which range from 74/- to 147/. That it appeared to be evident that before the Council could arrive at a decision with regard to the tenders for this Section further details must be obtained.

That the Minister will be very pleased to arrange that the Department should give any other advice and assistance in connection with the consideration of the tenders, or other matters relating to the construction of the undertaking which the Council may desire. It was suggested in particular that when the necessary details of the overhead distribution system have been arranged Mr Sollman should be given an opportunity to consider the revised proposals.

Mr Sollman's suggestion on the tenders received were appended.

The Council ordered that a Special Meeting be convened for Monday evening the 12th July 1926, at 7 o'clock, to consider the foregoing letter and tenders and that the Consulting Engineer be notified to attend the meeting.

Application to Erect Sign Board

An application by the North Western Electrical Engineering Ltd. dated 21st June 1926 for permission to erect a 9' x 4' outdoor sign board on the Council Wall at Market Square was considered.

The Council granted the permission subject to the sign board being removed at any time if required by the Council.

That the loan is sanctioned under Section 237 of the Public Health Ireland Act 1876, the Housing of the Working Classes Acts and the Local Authorities (Financial Provisions) Act 1921 and is to be obtained from the Hibernian Bank Ltd and to be repaid by equal half yearly instalments of principal and interest (currently 5 per cent) in fifteen years at 4^{1/2} per cent.

Confirmation of Minutes

The minutes of last monthly meeting of the Council held on 8th July 1926 and of Special meeting held on the 12th July 1926 were read and signed.

Finance

General Account

On the report and recommendation of the Finance Committee the Treasurer advised note for payments detailed in the Financial Statement Books. Expenditure No 43 to No 47 both inclusive amounting to £ 102 : 0 : 1 was agreed as required.

Gasworks Account

On the report and recommendation of the Finance Committee the Treasurer advised note for payments detailed in the Financial Statement Books. Expenditure No 16 to No 17 both inclusive amounting to £ 93 : 6 : 11 was agreed as required.

Storage and Sale of Petroleum

Read letter No T.R. 1151 dated 6th July 1926 from the Department of Local Government and Public Health relative to Storage and Sale of Petroleum and requesting that the form of Return accompanying the letter may be completed and returned to the Department as soon as possible.

Rates on Vacant Dwelling Houses

Read letter from the Department of Local Government and Public Health No P.H. 31863/26 this dated 14th July 1926 drawing attention to Section 16 of the Increase of Rent and Mortgage (Restrictions) Act 1923 which imposed on landlords the liability of defraying the rates levied on Vacant Dwelling houses to which the Act applied and pointing out that this Section has been amended by Section 9 of the Act of 1926 which came into operation as and from the 24/6/1926 and lays down as follows:-

Section 16 of the principal Act shall not apply to a dwelling house during any period not exceeding six months during which such dwelling house is empty or unoccupied for the purpose of the execution of addition alterations or repairs thereto or by reason of the Landlord thereof being bona fide unable to obtain a suitable tenant therefor at a rent equal to the standard rent and the increases permitted by the principal Act as amended by the Act

That as regards the future application of the Increase of Rent and Mortgage Interest (Restrictions) Acts 1923 and 1926 Section 4 of the latter Act shows the variation in the standard rental and valuation limits now laid down.

Read letter from the Department of Industry and Commerce Statistics Branch No M.1107 dated 19th July 1926 including a copy of the Statistics (Census of Production) Order 1926 and bringing the requirements of the Order under the Notice of the Public for the purpose of indicating

the class of information which will be called for

Epidemic Diarrhoea

Precautionary Measures.

Read letter from the Department of Local Government and Public Health No P.H. 33184/1926 this directing attention to the importance at the present time of taking practical measures for the prevention of Epidemic Diarrhoea. That in view of the seasonal conditions that exist it is not unlikely that this disease may appear in epidemic form and with little warning and Sanitary Authorities would do well to consult with the Medical Offices of Health as to the means which are available for controlling an outbreak &c.

Ordered that the attention of the Medical Offices of Health be directed to the circular

The Local Authorities (Officers & Employees) Act 1926

Read letter from the Department of Local Government and Public Health No 34067/1926 this drawing attention to the Local Authorities (Officers & Employees) Act 1926 which effects an important alteration of the Law relative to the making of appointments by local Authorities to offices to which the Act applies. The Circular pointed out the several offices to which the Act applies and stated that a copy of the Act would be circulated as soon as printed copies were available.

Cost of Administration in the Free State

The following Resolution transmitted by the County Council of the Administrative County of Cork was submitted to the Council and unanimously adopted. That we hereby call upon the Government to appoint a Commission to enquire into the Cost of Administration in the Free State both National and Local with a view to ascertaining and determining what economies can be effected in same generally, and in particular by way of reduction in the general upkeep of Public Offices and Institutions of all kinds and the reduction where possible in the number of Public Departments

Proposed Electricity Undertaking

The Town Clerk submitted correspondence with the Hibernian Banks Ltd Treasurer of the Council, The Munster & Leinster Bank Ltd and the Royal Bank of Ireland Ltd in reference to the required loan to the Council of £6000 for the purpose of establishing an Electric Lighting and Power Undertaking in the Urban District in accordance with Special Order obtained by them from the Minister of Industry and Commerce and approved of by Dail Eireann and An Seanad. All three Banks replied that they were not disposed to quote terms for the advance.

The Town Clerk submitted Copy letter sent by him to the Minister of Industry and Commerce, requesting him of the failure of the Council to obtain the necessary loan from the local Banks and asking his advice and assistance in the matter further pointing out the great loss that will result to the District should the Electricity Scheme not be proceeded with for want of funds.

Dublone & Little Kenny Railway Co Guarantee

Read letter from the Dublone & Little Kenny Railway Co. dated 29th July 1926 forwarding certificate of Arbitrator in the matter of the Council's guarantee for the half year ended 30th June 1926. Amount Certified £30.

Payment Ordered.

Re Fire Insurances.

Read communication from the National Assurance Co. Ltd. The Hibernian Fire and General Insurance Co. Ltd and the Irish Public Bodies' Insurance Committee relative to the rate of insurance on the Council's property.

The Council took no action in this matter as all their property is at present covered at a discount rate.

Vaccination Defaulters

The Medical Officer of Health reported of defaulters under the Vaccination Acts in the Urban District. He especially reported that they were all old defaulters and considered they should be all immunised forthwith. Ordered that on the return of the M.O.H from holidays that summons be issued against the defaulters.

Report of Sanitary Sub Office

The Sanitary Sub Offices reported that since date of last meeting he had inspected 30 houses and yards at St. Columba's Terrace and High Road. At St. Columba's Terrace he found a broken sewer pipe at Mrs. Tiringan's property.

Ordered that Mrs. Tiringan be advised to have the broken sewer pipe repaired.

Report of Shops Act Inspector

The Shops Act Inspector reported that the provisions of the Act were being observed throughout the District.

Report of caretaker Lough Dalg

The caretaker Lough Dalg reported having scoured the Water Main on the 2nd, 17th + 31st days of July, 1926.

Report of Water Manager

The Water Manager reported 5 feet of water in Glencar reservoir that the Reservoir at Barnamugagh stands at 8' 6" that he had put a new nose on the outlet of the Lower Reservoir at Barnamugagh the old one being worn out. That the cementing of the side of the Lower Reservoir at the inlet at Barnamugagh had been carried out that all the fire plugs are in good working order.

Report of Gas Manager

The Gas Manager reported that during the Month of July 158710^c of gas were manufactured. The carbonized coal being 31^t cut that there was only a few days coal in stock. The last wagon of coal

procured was Belgian coal and the yield of gas and coke was small. That all the gas plant was in good repair.

Gas Managers Collection Account

The Gas Managers Collection Account was submitted and showed arrears outstanding amounting to £81:0:1.

Acknowledgement Note of Condolence.

Read letter from Councillor Michael Morris dated 15th August 1926 thanking the Council for their Resolution and sympathy with him in his bereavement.

Public Slaughter House

The Council considered the question of providing a Public Slaughter House for the District and after a long discussion in which the several members expressed themselves in favour of the provision of such, it was decided that the Town Surveyor should prepare and submit to next meeting of the Council an estimate of the probable cost of providing same. The Town Clerk to make inquiries as to the existing scale of charges in connection with the Slaughter Houses at Derry and Strabane.

Notice of Motion - Road Contracts

Councillor John P. Speer gave notice that at the monthly meeting of the Council to be held on the 6th October 1926 he will move:-

That the Urban Roads throughout the District be put out to contract and the services of the Surveyor dispensed with.

Grating at Wash Stand

Ordered that a trapped grating be provided at the Motor Wash Stand at Market Square.

Main Roads

On the Motion of Councillor Dine it was decided that the County Surveyor's attention be directed to the unsatisfactory state of the Main Roads of the District. The mud spread on same rendering them filthy and almost impassable during wet weather and the dust from same destroying private and business premises when dry weather prevails.

Housing Minutes

Housing (Building Facilities) Act 1924

Read letter from the Housing Department Local Government and Public Health dated 26th July 1926 requesting information as to the assistance granted to private persons erecting houses under the above Act in the Council's functional area.

The Council have to state that no assistance was granted to private persons under the Act.

Housing Act 1926

Read letter from the Housing Department Local Government and Public Health No H 501/21463/1926 dated 12th August 1926 enclosing copy of the Housing Act 1926 and explaining the several sections of the Act.

Repairs to House No 25 Ballymacool Terrace

Ordered that repairs necessary to House No 25 Ballymacool Terrace be carried out by the Council's Workmen.

House Inspection Committee

The House Inspection Committee appointed to visit and inspect from time to time the new houses at St. Edmund's Terrace were instructed to make an inspection on Wednesday 18th August and to report to next Meeting of the Council.

Particulars to be supplied

Unsound Eggs

Read letter No P.H. 37193/26 Mis dated 21st August 1926 from the Department of Local Government and Public Health stating that the Minister for Lands and Agriculture has represented to him the desirability of securing the co-operation of the Inspecting Staff of Sanitary Authorities in the exercise of their functions of safeguarding the wholesomeness of articles of food as a means of supplementing the administration of the Agricultural Produce (Eggs) Act 1924. That it is desired that special action should be taken by the Sanitary Authorities to prevent the sale of unsound eggs at Markets. That the Sanitary Staff should be instructed to carry out during the next few months systematic examinations at Markets with a view to the detection of eggs unfit for human consumption.

That the Department are prepared to afford instruction to Sanitary Sub Officers in the testing of eggs on receipt of a request from the Sanitary Authority and will arrange for the assistance of their local Marketing Inspectors for the purpose. It was also suggested that Sanitary Authorities should display at egg markets under their control the official posters detailing the penalties under the Agricultural Produce (Eggs) Act 1924 for selling or offering

for sale eggs unfit for human consumption. It was stated that these posters can be obtained from the Department of Agriculture.

The Council ordered that application be made for a supply of the posters referred to and to have same posted as suggested. This being the only action taken by the Council in the matter.

Interest on Bank Overdraft

Read letter No 4.38316/1926. Letter Kenny Urban District dated 24th August 1926 from the Department of Local Government and Public Health referring to the minutes of the Council on the 5th July last and stating that the Minister for Local Government & Public Health sanctions an Overdraft not exceeding £700 on the account of the Council to 30th September 1926 and that 'Interest' may be paid thereon at the agreed rate.

A duplicate of the letter was enclosed for the information of the Council's Treasurer.

State Duty Grant Year ended 31st March 1926

Read letter dated 26th August 1926 from the Department of Local Government & Public Health informing the Council that arrangements have been made for the distribution of the balance of the State Duty Grant for the year ended 31st March 1926 that the share of the Council in the grant amounts to £1 : 7 : 6.

Read letter dated 30th August 1926 from the Rev John O'Doherty Adam in which he addressed Mr. Town Clerk, to convey to the Council that owing to his transfer to Rathmullan he could no longer represent them on the Joint Technical Instruction Committee and to extend to the Council his thanks for their continued kindness and confidence in him.

On the motion of Councillor Patrick Donnell seconded by Councillor Michael Moroney the Council unanimously decided not to accept Father O'Doherty's resignation but that he be requested to continue to represent the Council on the Joint Technical Instruction Committee for County Donegal.

Contribution in lieu of Rate
on Government Property

Read letter 2609001 dated 1st September 1926 from the Commissioners of Valuation requesting the accompanying form of application for payment of contribution in lieu of Rate for the current year to be completed and returned to the Department at an early date.

Application duly filled up was signed by the Chairman and Town Clerk for transmission to the Commissioners of Valuation.

Sanitary Accommodation in Factories

Read letter No 44.15 dated 1st September 1926 from the Department of Industry & Commerce Industries Branch referring to the Department's Circular of April last on the subject of the provision of Sanitary accommodation in factories and workshops in the Urban Area. Asking to be informed whether the Council has adopted any standards as to the number & type of sanitary conveniences in the factories and workshops in this area.

Inclosing a copy of the Sanitary Accommodation Order 1923 which is enforced by the Department in Rural Districts in the Seorstat and suggesting that any standard the Council will adopt will be at least as high as that enforced in the Rural Areas.

In reply the Council have to state that they have not adopted any standard as to the number & type of Sanitary Conveniences in the factories and the workshops in this Urban Area. Each case is and will be considered on its merits when the occasion arises.

Electricity Undertaking

Read letter No 19233 dated 1st September 1926 from the Department of Industry and Commerce Power Section relative to the Town Clerk's letter of the 14th August last asking for the information of the Minister for Industry and Commerce whether the Council has issued any Urban Stock and if so to what amount mentioning that a similar difficulty to that experienced by the Council occurred in another town but Stock was issued for the greater part of the amount required for a new Electricity Undertaking and the Local Authorities found no difficulty in having it taken up.

The Town Clerk had copy of his letter dated 2nd September in reply to the above in which he informed the Minister that the Council had not issued any Urban Stock that he feared as the district is but small did they do so the Stock might not be taken up. That seeing the Bank of Ireland is the Government Bankers it occurred to him that the Minister might be able to get them to let the Council have the necessary accommodation. That any assistance given will be greatly appreciated by the Council.

The Council approved of the reply sent by the Town Clerk.

Report of Shops Act Inspector

The Shops Act Inspector reported that the provisions of the Act were being observed throughout the District.

Report of M.O.H.

The Medical Officer of Health reported that he had inspected property owned by Mr Daniel Kelly at Cottage Row, and found three water closets in bad order and a Sewer pipe broken and blocked.

Ordered that notice be served on the Owner of the property and seven days allowed to have the Closets and sewer repaired and put in good order.

Waste of Water at Cottage Row.

The Medical Officer of Health reported that there was a very large waste of water at Cottage Row, caused by a broken Water pipe.

The Council directed that the Water Manager to have the broken pipe repaired and thus prevent further Waste of Water.

Reports of Sanitary Sub Office

The Sanitary Sub Office reported that since the date of last meeting he had inspected 30 houses and yards at High Road, Spurrs Lane and Cottage Row. At High Road he found 2 broken sewers. that there had since been repaired. At Cottage Row he found a broken sewer and 3 Water closets in bad order on Mr Daniel Kelly's property and had noticed the M.O.H. to inspect same.

Proposed Slaughter House

The Town Surveyor submitted a cost of the estimate of erecting a Public Slaughter House for the District. He suggested that a Site Selection Committee should be appointed by the Council.

The Council adopted the suggestion and the Chairman with Councillor Daniel Diver the Town Surveyor and the Town Clerk were appointed a Committee to examine and report on a suitable site. The Committee to meet on Monday evening the

13th September at 4 o'clock P.M.

Report of Water Manager

The Water Manager reported 5 feet of Water in Glencairn reservoir and 1 foot 9 ins water in Barnamugagh Reservoir. That the Water supply to the town is turned on each morning at 4.30 A.M. and ~~shut off~~ about off at 8 P.M. That all fire plugs are in good working Order.

Gas Managers Report

The Gas Manager reported that during the months of August - 174,600 C.F. of gas were manufactured from 30 1/2 tons Coal. That there was about one week's supply coal in stock which would be supplemented next day by two wagons from John Kelly Ltd Londonderry. That the gas plant was all in good repair.

Gas Managers Collection Account

The Gas Managers Collection Account was submitted and showed arrear outstanding amounting to £83 : 0 : 7.

Report of Bartalkeough Salt

The Bartalkeough Salt reported having cleaned the Water main on the 14th & 28th days of August - 1926.

Proposed Urinal Market Square

The Council directed that enquires be made as to the price at which Metal Urinals could be obtained with a view of having one erected in a suitable position at the Market Square.

Painting & Plating of Public Lamp Heads.

The Gas Manager was directed to make arrangements for the painting of the Lamp heads and the plating of same the work to be carried out under his supervision at the Gas Works.

Housing Minutes

Rents of 4 New Houses at St. Dunans Terrace.

Read letter No H 362/22823 Letter Penny Urban District dated 28th August 1926 from the Housing Department of Local Government and Public Health requesting that the Minister might be informed what action has been taken by the Council on the Department's communication on the 14th June last relative to the rents of 4 houses proposed to be provided by the Council under the Working Classes Act.

The Council in reply have to state that they will endeavour to let the houses at such rents as will prevent any loss to the Council. They also intend to offer the houses for sale to intending occupiers at the price at which they have cost the Council.

Large Buildings Telephone Installation

Read letter No. 501/22917/1926 Mis from the Housing Department Local Government & Public Health dated 30th August 1926 Stating that the Minister's Attention has been called by the Department of Posts & Telegraphs to the convenience which would result to that Department if the local authority when expressing approval of plans of large buildings in pursuance of Bye-Laws which may be enforced in the District would append the following foot-note to the formal document of approval:

By the desire of the Minister of Posts & Telegraphs it is requested that if a telephone installation is intended arrangements be made during the course of construction with the Engineer in Chief, Department of Posts & Telegraphs, Letran House Upper Stephens Street Dublin a copy of the communication was enclosed for the information of the Council's Engineering Office. The Council decided to append the condition to their formal document of approval in all cases coming within the scope of the Circular.

Report of Town Surveyor

The Town Surveyor reported that the repairs directed to be carried out to Cottages at Rosemount Terrace and McClures Terrace had been almost completed. That the House Inspection Committee on inspecting the new cottages at St. Dunans Terrace inspected the yards of the existing 4 houses there and recommended that a small portion of each yard be concreted the work to be done by the Council's workmen.

The Council unanimously decided to have the necessary works carried out.

Report of House Inspection Committee

The House Inspection Committee reported having visited and inspected the 4 new houses in course of erection at St. Dunans Terrace and found that the works were being carried out very satisfactorily by the Contractor Mr. James Johnston and that great progress was being made.

That we hereby request all County & Urban Councils, in the Free State to demand the repeal of Section 6. of the Local Government (Ireland) Act 1902, which enacts that there shall not be paid to any County Council or to any Urban District Council a greater recoupment of Sanitary Salaries than was paid to each Council in the Local Financial Year ended 31st March 1902.

The resolution was unanimously adopted.

Rate Collector's Account

Read letter dated 4th October from Mr. Neil Jones Rate Collector informing the Council that he was not able to close the collection of the first Moiety of the rates within the prescribed time namely 30th September 1926. He had done everything possible to get in the 1st Moiety within the time but had failed. He requested the Council to grant him an extension of time for one month to enable him to close the collection of the first Moiety.

The Town Clerk reported that the amount of the 1st Moiety

outstanding on the 30th September last was £ 792: 11: 11 and that the collector had this day 4th October made a lodgement of £ 269: 7: 3, which reduced the outstanding sum on this date to £ 523: 4: 8.

The Council unanimously extended the time for closing the 1st Moiety till 1st November 1926 subject to the sanction of the Minister for Local Government & Public Health, which sanction is respectfully requested.

Closing down of Gasworks.

The Gas Manager reported that owing to the stock of Coal having been exhausted and the impossibility of obtaining supplies the Gasworks had to be closed down on Saturday last 3rd October 1926.

The Town Clerk informed the Council that arrangements had been made with Messrs Alexander Russell & Co. Glasgow, for a parcel of 25 tons Patras Gas Coal, at the price of 80/- per ton into Wagons at Londonderry, exclusive of haulage and other charges. That the steamer was poised to load about 6th / 8th October.

The Council ratified the arrangement and decided that the Gasworks should re-open immediately on the supply of coal coming forward.

Joint Technical Instruction Committee

Read letter from Rev John O' Doherty P.P. Rathmullan that in deference to the wishes of the Council and because of the kindness shown him and confidence placed in him he consented to remain on the Technical Committee as a representative of the Council until the next Annual Election.

Report of Shops Act Inspector

The Shops Act Inspector reported that the provisions of the Shops Act were being observed throughout the District.

Report of Sanitary Sub Officer

The Sanitary Sub Officer reported having inspected 30 houses and yards at Upper Main Street and that he did not find any nuisances existing.

He further reported that Mr. Daniel Kelly had complied with the Sanitary Notice served on him respecting a broken sewer pipe and defective water closets in connection with dwelling houses owned by him.

Report of Water Manager

The Water Manager reported 3 feet of water in Glenar reservoir and 6 feet 9 inches in Barnamugagh reservoir. That owing to the small flow from Lough Salt to Barnamugagh reservoir the Town Clerk and himself visited Lough Salt on the 27th September last when it was found that the water rose in the well house at Lough Salt had not been cleaned out for some months. That they had then been dredged so far as Glossagh Bridge by which a considerable quantity of incrustation and silt were removed and the flow of water into Barnamugagh reservoir increased. That the dredging if any reported by John Duffy as having been done on the 26th September last had not been carried out in accordance with the instructions given to him. That an occasional visit to Lough Salt would keep the main in order. That all fire plugs were in good repair.

Ordered that the caretaker John Duffy be written to that the Council are not at all satisfied with the manner in which he has been lately discharging his duties. That it was evident from the inspection made by the Town Clerk and the Water Manager on the 27th last month that he had not attended the scouring of the main and the cleaning of the nose at the well house with the result that the flow of water into the reservoir fell away necessitating an inspection by the Officers of the Council. That the caretaker be cautioned that unless his duties are henceforth properly discharged the Council will be obliged to take serious notice of any remissness that may occur.

Report of Caretaker Lough Salt

The Caretaker reported having scoured the Lough Salt main on the 10th, 24th & 27th days of September.

Report of Town Surveyor

The Town Surveyor reported that Councillor Daniel Diver and himself had visited the Gasworks yard towards utilising portion thereof as a site for a Public Slaughter house. That Councillor Diver considered this site very suitable for the purpose and should

be so used. They also needed a plot of ground between Mr Francis Gallagher's forge and house at slate row occupied by Eddie Boyle. In the opinion of the Town Surveyor this site was in every way suitable and he considered the Council could not do better than acquire same for the proposed building.

The question of providing a Slaughter House for the District was adjourned sine die.

Electric lighting scheme.

The Town Clerk was instructed to obtain from the Ministry of Local Government and Public Health the Regulations issued in regard to the issue of Urban Stock.

Address to His Eminence Cardinal O'Donnell.

The Council having learned that His Eminence Cardinal O'Donnell intended Visiting Letterkenny during the last week in October being his first Visit to the Town since being created a Cardinal it was on the Motion of Councillor William Gallagher seconded by Councillor Daniel Diver unanimously agreed to present His Eminence with an Address of congratulation and welcome.

The following were appointed to draw up the address. namely the Chair man Councillor John P. Speer, John Curran, M. Moriarty, W. G. McElroy & the Town Clerk.

Petrol Store Licence

Mr James Wilkinson Main Street Letterkenny made application for a Petrol Store Licence for his premises already licensed at Letterkenny.

Application granted.

Banking Accounts

The Town Clerk stated that the Council's Treasurer Hibernian Bank Ltd made application to have the Ordinary General Account and the Gasworks account consolidated into the General Account inasmuch as they were advised that they had no security for the Overdraft on the Gasworks account. The Town Clerk informed the Council

that so far as he was concerned it made no difference in the keeping of the accounts whether they were consolidated or not that they had been kept separate since the date the Council became owners of the gasworks over 25 years ago and were kept separate by direction of the Council.

After fully considering the application of the Council unanimously decided not to consolidate the accounts and that the Treasurer be so informed.

Roads Administration

Report of Town Surveyor

The Town Surveyor reported that during the month the Surfacemen had been engaged cleaning water tables scavenging and generally looking after the Urban Roads including Side Streets in the town.

That the Council had piled at depots on the Ramelton and Kilmoreenan Roads broken stones intended to be used in the maintenance of the Urban Roads. During the month however a portion of these stones was taken by the County Council's Workmen and used in repairing Main Roads. He pointed out that he had previously asked the Council's authority to have these stones removed to depots along the Urban Roads but the Council did not consider it necessary to do so. The quantity of stones taken was about 8 tons.

The Council decided to take no action in the matter.

Maintenance of Urban Roads.

In pursuance of Notice of Motion Councillor John P. Speer moved the following Resolution:

Whereas the Main Roads inside the Urban District are now being maintained by the County Council (Such roads include the Main St and all the leading roads within the Urban Area) It is hereby resolved that the maintenance of the remaining Wedways and Streets be let out to contract and the services of the Surface-man dispensed with Seconded by Councillor John Curran

Report of Town Surveyor.

The Town Surveyor reported that since last meeting the Urban Roads had been maintained in good condition regularly cleaned and water tables attended to.
