The following orders were made on the Clerk's report:—

"That notices stating that legal proceedings will be taken against tenants in arrears with rents, be served on every tenant, except those whose cases were adjourned at last District Court."

"That for the present not more than £2. per house be spent on repairs of Houses of the Working Class, and this amount only where necessary."

Reports from Rent Collectors were submitted as follows:—

Possession was demanded from all the tenants on whom Notice to Quit was served. The cases were heard at Ballyshannon District Court on 23rd June, 1924. The District Justice adjourned the cases to the August Court stating that he would give Decrees if the tenants had not settled with the Council before that date.

The cases of James Carty and Patrick Kerrigan were struck out as these tenants settled with the Council.

The orders made on Rent Collector's reports were:—

If arrears of Rent due by remaining tenants be not paid on or before the 19th August, 1924

Solicitor to be instructed to take proceedings²³⁰ for recovery of either rent due or possession of Houses. The next meeting will be held on Tuesday 5th August, 1924.

Minutes of Meeting as Road Authority held on 7th July 1924.

In the chair:— Councillor J. M. Judge

Others present were:— Councillors Joseph Curran, Patrick Connolly, John Doherty and Tho. O'Gorman (Sen)

Chairman pointed out that the minutes of last meeting should have contained a note to the effect that Council gave authority to accept or reject tenders for road metal without waiting for a meeting of Council, provided the conditions laid down by Roads Department were adhered to. Before signing the minutes of last meeting the following was ordered to be added.

"The Council ordered the Town Surveyor to accept or reject Tenders for Road metal. Tenders which did not comply with the conditions of letter no. S. G. a/56 dated 13/6/24 from Ministry of Local Government (Roads Department) to be rejected by him without waiting for a meeting of the Council."

Surveyor informed Council that in reply to advertisement for the supply of Road metal for improvement of portion of Trunk Road T. 18 works no. B 151 Tenders were received from Patrick Cleary Ex National Army man for the supply of 300 tons, from Bryan Doherty for supply of 50 tons and from John Cassidy for the supply of 50 tons according to the conditions specified, and he accepted Tenders, and men were now working.

The form of Contract was submitted to the meeting and approved. Proceedings then ended.

The Clerk read notice convening the meeting, also
minutes of meeting of General Purposes Committee
held on 16th July, 1924.

Chairman said as the notice pointed out this Special
meeting was called for the purpose of considering
the advisability of contracting a loan say of
£3,200 or thereabouts for the purpose of laying
down with tar macadam the part of the trunk
road from Sea View Entrance Gate to the Urban
Boundary at Finner. The old method of making
roads with waterbound macadam must be
discontinued and tar macadam substituted.

The cost of maintenance of the main Street
per year is roughly £290 so that if a loan
of about the sum stated could be negotiated
there would really be a saving to the Rate
payers. The streets would without very much
expenditure annually last at least twelve times
as long, they would be practically dustless
and at any rate are a necessity in any up-
to date seaside resort.

Councillor Dr. Flood agreed with Chairman
and suggested that provision ought to be made
for the safe guarding of Sewer and water pipes
and the raising of manhole frames and if
possible the changing of water supply hydrants
from middle of road to the foot paths.

Councillor J. Carty said that the Rates were
high enough already and believed that the
contraction of a loan should be avoided.

After the matter was fully discussed the

From Ministry of Local Government and Public
Health no G. 31308/24 dated 12th July 1924 enclosing
addressed to Chairman forwarding copy of Ministry's
letter of 21st June 1924, no. G. 21136/1924 regarding
the proposed increase in the salary of the Clerk
and Town Surveyor.

Councillor O'Gorman said that this matter
was dealt with at last monthly meeting.

Clerk pointed out that the letter from the
Ministry of Local Government and Public Health
was not read at that meeting.

Councillor J. Carty proposed:-

relative to speed limit of motor vehicles.

Clerk stated that the notices erected had good

effect but still there were cases of fast driving.

The Council decided to issue an order prohibiting
all motor traffic on the Promenade extending from the
Townland boundary at Finnes to the Hamilton Hall, Town-
land of Drumacree, Town of Bundoran, as this promenade
is a place of public resort, the order to be issued under
the authority of Towns Improvement (Ireland) Act 1854
Section 70.

Clerk was directed to draw the attention of the
Garda Síochána to the matter.

(Occasional Powers) Act 1924. *noted.*

From Same Department P. 30385/24 dated 21/7/24
on subject of faulty procedure on the part of local authorities
in the award of superannuation to officers. *Res noted.*

From Ministry of Industry and Commerce (M.S. 1691)
dated 16/7/24 requesting a Cinch Ordnance Survey map
showing the maritime limits of the Bundoran Urban
District.

Clerk stated that he had the necessary maps for-
warded. *Approved.*

Ref G. 31467/24 dated 14/7/24 sanctioning the
appointment of Thomas Fitzpatrick, as Beach Guard,
till 11th October next. *Approved.*

Loan
From Same Ministry (Roads Department) R.B/7
dated 1/8/24, with Form of Application for Loan for
Trunk Road Improvement, and requesting to be furnished
with a map detailed estimate and brief Specification
of the works proposed to be carried out, and stating
that the period of loan repayment should not exceed
five years.

Council were of opinion that the proposed loan
could not be paid off in five years and adjourned
the consideration of letter.

Motor Speed
From Tironaill County Council no. 606, dated 25/7/24
stating that the Resolution relative to proposed Speed
Limit of motor vehicles forwarded by the Urban
Council was unanimously adopted by the County
Council at meeting held on 22nd idem *noted*

From Chief Superintendent Garda Sioiciana, K/106 dated 23/7/24 in reply to Council's letter of 11th idem stating that he did not consider it necessary to have a member of the Garda appointed under the Petrol Acts.

Clerk stated that formerly a member of the Royal Irish Constabulary was appointed as Inspector under the Petroleum Act.

From J. Myles and Co. Electric Supply Station Ballyshannon, dated 5th Augst. 1924, Tender for lighting Bundoran Streets, from 10th August 1924 to 10th April 1925. Amount of Tender (£100) one hundred pounds. Extra lights at Drumacerrin Road, Fish Lane and Rectory, (Three) to be charged at £2 each extra.

Myles & Co amounting to £100 for Public Lighting of Bundoran Urban District from 10th August, 1924 to 10th July 19-April 1925 subject to these Electric Light Suppliers erecting and maintaining an additional lamp at Finist the cost of which is to be included in the amount of the Tender."

Clerk stated that a Clerk of Council cannot hold the position of Rate Collector except in a temporary capacity, but if the Ministry of Local Government, sanctions a continuance of the present arrangement he would continue to act till such time as a permanent collector is appointed.

Collector's Balance sheet showed that for the year ended 31st March, 1924, the Poor Rate outstanding amounted to £149-10-10 and the Town Rate outstanding amounted to £112-12-11 on 31st July 1924.

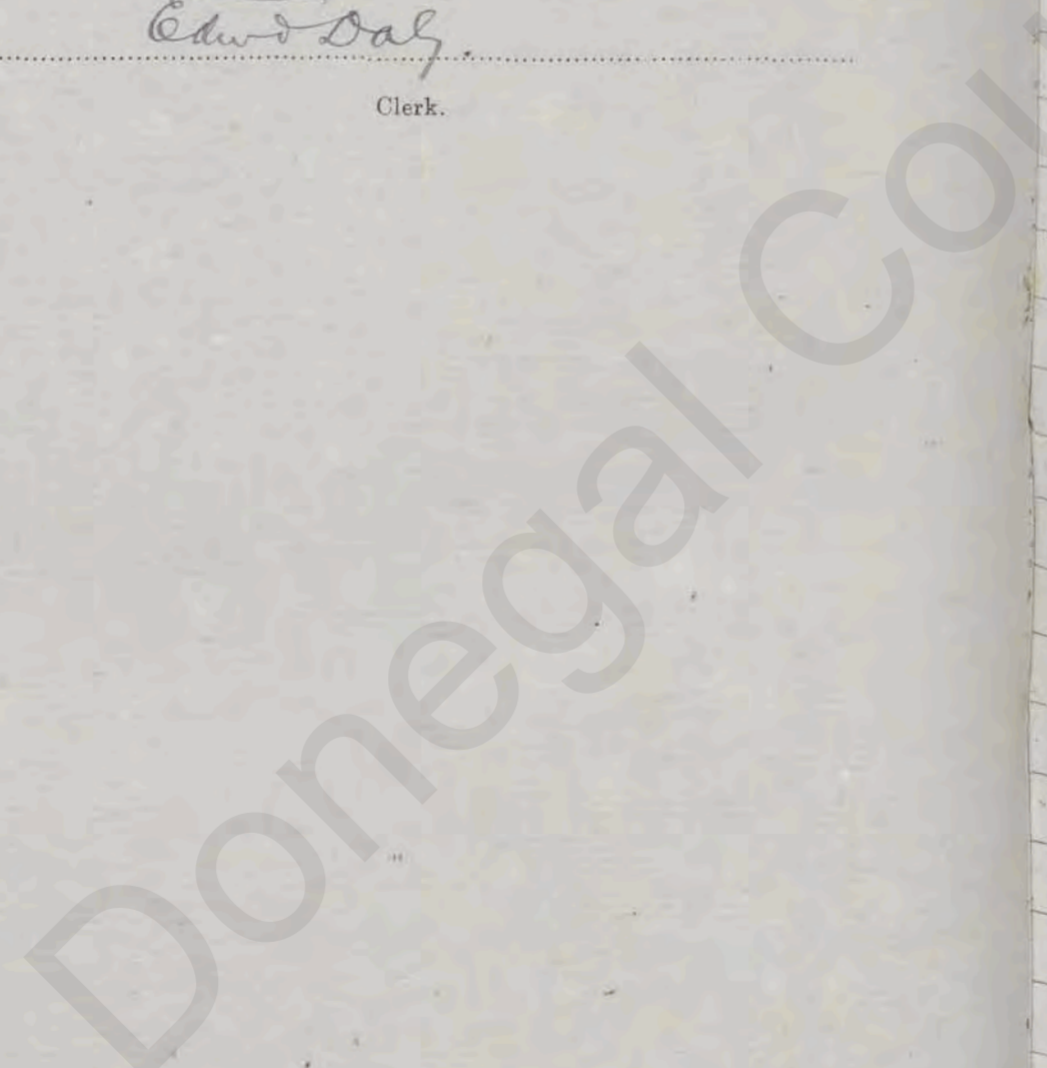

I have to submit the following Report on the Public Works in the Urban District of Bundoran for the Half Year ended 30th September, 1924.

Roads.

All road contracts in the District will expire on 31st March, 1925.

The increasingly heavy traffic coupled with exceptionally wet weather during the past Half Year has caused the Main Roads generally to break up rapidly.

A heavy Charabanc Service in connection with the Midland Great Western Railway, making six trips daily from Sligo to Ballyshannon was in operation during the whole of the Tourist Season.

A Charabanc carrying passengers and mails, also runs over the Main Road daily during the whole year.

A vast quantity of goods is transported by motor lorries between Ballyshannon and Sligo, and supplies carried by military lorries arrive periodically from Dublin at Finner Camp.

These vehicles, not to speak of the immense number of light touring cars are responsible for a vast amount of wear of the roads.

Though pot holes were filled as quickly as they had been formed the roads were still in an

unsatisfactory state.

I am of opinion that water bound macadam is totally unfit to bear the traffic that this Main Road has to carry, and it would be well if the Council considered the advisability of constructing the Main Road with tar macadam even if a loan sufficient to defray the cost has to be obtained.

All the District Roads in the Urban Area are in a fair state of repair with the exception of 176 perches of road leading to Kinelough.

The Contractor states that he has the required quantity of metal at Magheracar, but it has not as yet been delivered at the road.

At the present date three hundred tons of metal have been provided for repair of the section of Trunk Road T.18. Works No. B.151. and I expect the total quantity 640 tons. will be ready before the Road Roller is available.

Four hundred and five tons are ready for application to Main Road, and await the Road Roller.

Water Supply.

Numerous leakages have been repaired and except occasionally, the pressure was sufficient to keep up a supply at the highest levels.

A search was made for underground wastage, but so far the source has not been located.

In month of August a length of main supply pipe burst near Bundoran Bridge, on examination it was found that the wall of a concrete manhole had been laid over the pipe and had caused it to decay.

It was replaced by a new length of pipe

Sewers.

The Main Sewers were well flushed during the wet season and gave no trouble practically.

The outlets from the Septic Tank were regularly cleared but a large deposit of sludge in the chambers will require to be removed.

About fifty yards of cover of old drain broken down by the Road Roller had to be replaced with new ^{covers} the drain was cleared as the work progressed.

He said that under the Public Health Acts Amendment Act 1907 which this Council adopted long since, power is given to provide and maintain Sanitary Conveniences, and no matter what the cost public health must not be allowed to suffer.

Town Surveyor was asked for estimate of cost.

He stated that a Public Convenience with four closets and a Urinal Range would cost about £240

If glazed bricks were used the cost would be considerably higher.

Plans and Specification were examined and approved.
