The outgoing Cathaoirleach, Cllr Terry Crossan opened the meeting pending the election of the new Cathaoirleach. Cllr Terry Crossan welcomed the newly elected members, Cllrs Joy Beard, Fionán Bradley and Ali Farren. He thanked the outgoing members Cllrs Rena Donaghey, Nicholas Crossan and Johnny McGuinness and wished them well for the future. He also expressed his gratitude to the staff of Donegal County Council who assisted him throughout the year during his role as Cathaoirleach.

Cllr Terry Crossan went on to summarise his year as Cathaoirleach and highlighted the new Muff to Quigleys Point Greenway which was officially opened in April which is a great asset for Inishowen. He welcomed the revival of the Muff Feile event which will take place in August. He also stated that he was honored to participate with the Little Blue Heroes Foundation.

Cllr Terry Crossan also thanked his fellow members for their support and stated that they worked well together and showed great respect to each other and hoped that this would continue.

1. Election of the Cathaoirleach

Cllr Terry Crossan invited nominations for the position of Cathaoirleach. Cllr Jack Murray was proposed by Cllr Terry Crossan and seconded by Cllr Albert Doherty. Accordingly, Cllr Jack Murray was elected Cathaoirleach of the Inishowen Municipal District for 2024 to 2025.

Cllr Jack Murray thanked Cllr Terry Crossan as outgoing chair. He stated that he hoped that the members of the Inishowen Municipal District would continue to work as a team for the benefit of the Inishowen MD and highlighted a number of key issues:

- Defective Concrete Blocks.
- Promotion of tourism in the area.
- Buncrana Leisure Centre.

The Cathaoirleach invited nominations for the office of the Leas-Chathaoirleach. Cllr Terry Crossan was proposed by Cllr Jack Murray and was seconded by Cllr Martin Farren. Accordingly, Cllr Terry Crossan was then declared Leas-Chathaoirleach of the Inishowen Municipal District for 2024-2025.

The Members expressed their gratitude to the out-going chair Cllr Terry Crossan for his work throughout the year and congratulated Cllr Jack Murray and Cllr Terry Crossan on their appointment in the roles of Cathaoirleach and Leas-Chathaoirleach.

The meeting was opened by the Cathaoirleach, Cllr Jack Murray who welcomed all to the meeting.

24.36 Consideration of the Minutes of the Meeting of Inishowen Municipal District held on 14th May 2024

On the proposal of Cllr Paul Canning, seconded by Cllr Terry Crossan, the minutes of the Inishowen Municipal District held on 14th May 2024 were agreed.

24.36 PLANNING

Ryan Nolan, Executive Planner presented the planning report to members, and it was taken as read.

24.36.01 Tús Nua Project, Carndonagh

Following a query from Cllr Albert Doherty at the previous Inishowen Municipal District Meeting, Ryan Nolan advised that correspondence has issued, and discussions have taken place in relation to the Tús Nua project, Carndonagh.

Cllr Albert Doherty requested that the members be kept updated regarding plans for the Back Lane connecting the Diamond to the town car park and Bridge Street as outlined in the report.

24.36.02 County Donegal Development Plan 2024-2030

Ryan Nolan advised members that the County Donegal Development Plan 2024-2030 came into effect on 26th June 2024 except those parts of the plan affected by the Draft Ministerial Direction. Cllr Paul Canning requested that a public statement be issued to agents advising them of potential delays. Ryan Nolan advised that the Draft Ministerial Direction was mainly focused on zoning objectives and rural housing policy should not be affected. He advised that this is a challenging time and will continue to liaise with members. Cllr Paul Canning requested that a Planning workshop be organised to discuss the changes.

Cllr Martin McDermott expressed concerns regarding a survey currently being carried out by the National Parks & Wildlife Service regarding the corncrake and the implications that this may have on planning for rural areas and particularly the Malin Head area. Cllr Ali Farren concurred with these

concerns and highlighted the difficulties encountered in obtaining planning permission. He asked if a more practical approach be used going forward.

Cllr Martin McDermott proposed that a meeting be arranged with National Parks & Wildlife to discuss this matter. Cllr Martin Farren seconded this proposal.

24.36.03 Moville Health Check and Regeneration Plan

Cllr Martin Farren requested that he be kept updated in relation to the Moville Health Check and Regeneration Plan as outlined in the report.

24.36.04 Croi Conaithe Vacant Property Refurbishment Grant Scheme

Cllr Albert Doherty referred to the planning report which outlined 495 approved applicants with 20 grants paid under the Croi Conaithe Vacant Property Refurbishment Grant Scheme. He highlighted the potential issues for applicants in accessing finance when the grant is only paid to homeowners after they have completed works to their property. Cllr Fionán Bradley concurred with these comments and suggested that homeowners should also be advised at the beginning of the process on the documentation required to drawdown the grant when work is complete. He outlined, through his own experience, the difficulties that he encountered when he availed of the grant and the significant delays in trying to submit the appropriate information when trying to access the payment. He asked if this system could be simplified and streamlined in order to speed up the payment of the grant. Cllr Jack Murray concurred with these comments.

24.37 ENVIRONMENT

Matthew Byrne, Waste Regulation Officer presented the report, and it was taken as read. He highlighted the following items from the report:

- Professional users of pesticides and sheep dip.
- Grant Scheme for remediation of septic tanks increase from €5,000 to €12,000 at the beginning of 2024. There is no requirement to have registered the septic tank in 2013.
- Bathing Waters season commenced on 01st June.
- National food recycling week took place on 02nd to 09th June and was a great success.
- Half price event on bulky goods event will take place in Carndonagh recycling centre from 24th
 June to 06th July.
- Stop Food Waste summer campaign will take place between June and September.

24.37.01 River Pollution

Cllr Terry Crossan highlighted a pollution incident which occurred at Skeog River, Bridgend at the beginning of June where several fish were killed. He queried if enforcement measures were initiated and if the matter was followed up. Matthew Byrne agreed to follow up with Cllr Terry Crossan.

24.37.02 Half Price Bulky Goods Event

Cllr Martin Farren welcomed the Half Price Bulky Goods event that is currently ongoing to 06th July. He queried if this date could be extended.

24.37.03 Jet Ski Signage

Cllr Martin Farren expressed his disappointment that the jet ski signs were taking down/destroyed again at Glenburnie Beach and Sweet Nellie's Beach. He asked that these signs be reinstated as they are extremely important for the safety of all beach users.

24.37.04 Lifeguards

Following a query from Cllr Martin Farren, Matthew Byrne confirmed that lifeguards will be available on all blue flag beaches over the summer season.

24.37.05 Biodiversity

Cllr Albert Doherty requested that the Biodiversity Officer for Donegal County Council contact the different management companies following the Taking in Charge of private residential estates to encourage best practice in relation to biodiversity within the estate. Matthew Byrne agreed to follow up with the Biodiversity Officer.

24.37.06 Bathing Water

Cllr Joy Beard requested an update in relation to the water quality at Lady's Bay in Buncrana. Matthew Byrne agreed to follow up with Cllr Joy Beard.

24.37.07 Septic Tanks

Cllr Paul Canning requested the further resources be put in place for the inspections of septic tanks.

24.37.08 Bottle Banks

Cllr Martin Farren requested that the issues that he has previously raised in relation to the bottle bank in Moville be followed up and that the agreed works be carried out as a matter of urgency.

Cllr Paul Canning also requested the provision of a bottle bank at Killea and Bridgend.

24.37.09 Defective Concrete Blocks

Cllr Martin McDermott requested an update in relation to suitable sites for the disposal of defective concrete block material. Cllr Martin Farren concurred with these comments. Matthew Byrne agreed to follow up with Michael McGarvey, Director of Service.

24.38 ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Daniel McCrystal, Senior Enterprise Development Officer, Economic Development presented the report, and it was taken as read. He highlighted the following items from the report –

- Donegal has been named as the host destination for TBEX (Travel Blog Exchange) 2025. This
 event will be held in September 2025 and is expected to attract over 500 attendees. It is the
 world's largest conference and community of travel bloggers, writers, photographers,
 videographers and social medial influencers from around the world.
- Donegal Tourism attended the Balmoral Show in Belfast to promote the county.
- Tip O'Neil Diaspora Awards is scheduled for the 27th September. There will be a press launch on 04th July to announce the 2024 Tip O'Neil awardees and launch of ticket sales on Eventbrite.
- #LoveDonegalDay 2024 will take place on 25th September.
- Disrupt by the Sea event will take place on 26th September.

24.38.01 Election Hub

Cllr Albert Doherty referred to the Election Hub update in the report and to the live results tracker which was viewed over 5,000 times on 09th and 10th June. He highlighted concerns where several people did not receive a polling card and were concerned that they would not be able to vote in the local elections.

24.38.02 Inishowen Innovation Hub

Cllr Joy Beard queried if the opening hours of the Inishowen Innovation Hub could be extended to coincide with international business hours. This would attract more people to use the building. Cllr Jack Murray concurred with these comments. Daniel McCrystal agreed to follow up.

Cllr Jack Murray also requested that the Council maintain front line services in the building.

24.38.03 Inward Investment Brochure

Cllr Albert Doherty referred to the development of a new brochure promoting Donegal as a great place to live, work, study and do business. Cllr Albert Doherty stated that there must be adequate housing availability in Donegal to promote the county in this way.

24.38.04 Fire Hydrants

Cllr Paul Canning requested that the fire hydrants for the area be inspected to ensure that they are working properly. Daniel McCrystal agreed to follow up.

24.38.05 Tourism – Inishowen

Cllr Martin McDermott stated that Go Visit Inishowen should have access to the same funding source as the rest of the County. He outlined the difficulty for staff that currently works at Go Visit Inishowen and the need for appropriate funding. Cllr Ali Farren concurred with these comments. Daniel McCrystal agreed to follow up.

Cllr Joy Beard outlined the importance of providing adequate brochures and maps for visitors coming to the area. She outlined the difficulty that she found in trying to source brochures and outlined the difficulty for people in using QR codes as not everyone had a smart phone. Daniel McCrystal advised that the tourism team have developed a new tourism brochure and would follow up.

24.39 COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Fiona Doherty, Development Officer, Community & Enterprise presented the report, and it was taken as read. She highlighted the following items from the report -

- Community Recognition Funding 2024 Closing date Thursday 18th July.
- An Grianán of Aileach Fort.
- Friar Hegarty/Buncrana Coastal Walk Enhancement and Artwork Project.
- Newtowncunningham Town and Village Renewal Project.
- Moville Town and Village Renewal Project.
- Killea Clár Funded Project.
- Moville Shore Path and Outdoor Recreation Infrastructure Scheme.

24.39.01 Moville - Outdoor Recreational Amenities

Cllr Martin Farren requested that work on this project be completed urgently and asked that maintenance be carried out to some of the outdoor gym equipment as there appears to be oil leaking.

24.39.02 Burnfoot Flood Relief

Following a query from Cllr Canning in relation to Burnfoot Flood Relief, Fiona Doherty advised that she follow up with Seamus Hopkins, Senior Engineer, Water and Environment.

24.39.03 Clár Funding Scheme

Cllr Albert Doherty requested that a letter be issued from Inishowen Municipal District to Minister Heather Humphreys for the extension to the Clár areas in Inishowen.

24.39.04 Donegal Walks and Trails

Cllr Albert Doherty advised that he welcomed the Donegal Walks and Trails project outlined in the report.

24.39.05 Community Recognition Fund

Cllr Albert Doherty encouraged groups to apply for Community Recognition Funding.

24.39.06 Vacant Building

Cllr Albert Doherty referred to his previous query in relation to a derelict Council building and asked that all avenues be explored in reinstating the building for use by various community groups.

24.39.07 Malin Head Visitor Management Plan

Cllr Albert Doherty sought clarification on the reconfiguration of the design team in relation to the Main Head Visitor Management Plan as outlined in the report. Cllr Ali Farren outlined the importance of the project for the area and welcomed the more detailed report that is to be provided at the September Municipal District meeting. Cllr Martin McDermott requested a meeting to update all members in relation to this project. Fiona Doherty agreed to follow up.

24.39.08 Playground Maintenance

Cllr Fionán Bradley commended the Council along with the Friel family for the installation of a wheelchair swing, wheelchair accessible picnic tables and sensory play equipment at Buncrana Playground. Cllr Joy Beard concurred with these comments. She also queried if there were sufficient car parking spaces at the playground in Buncrana. Fiona Doherty advised that she refer the matter to the relevant service.

24.39.09 Beach Access

Cllr Fionán Bradley queried the possibility of making the area from Buncrana Pier to Lady's Bay fully accessible.

Cllr Ali Farren also outlined the need for disabled access for both Lagg and Culdaff beach.

24.39.10 Tidy Towns

Cllr Fionán Bradley requested that the hoarding on a building on the Main Street, Buncrana be extended upwards as it is unsightly and may impact on judging of the Tidy Towns competition. Fiona advised that she refer the matter to the relevant section.

Cllr Martin McDermott advised that Malin Town was recognised as Ireland's best kept village and thanked Fiona Doherty for the support and assistance in securing this result.

24.40 ROADS AND TRANSPORTATION

Stephen Flynn, Senior Engineer, Roads & Transportation, presented the report to the members and highlighted the main categories –

Restoration Improvement Programme 2024

- Restoration Maintenance Programme 2024
- Drainage Provision Programme 2024
- Low-Cost Safety Programme 2024
- Bridge Strengthening Programme 2024

24.40.01 Cockhill Road

Following sewer works that was recently carried out on Cockhill Road, Cllr Fionán Bradley queried if there were any plans to carry out reinstatement works.

24.40.02 St Oran's Road, Buncrana

Cllr Fionán Bradley raised concerns in relation to junction at St Oran's Road and Lower Main Street, Buncrana and asked for road markings to be reinstated.

24.40.03 Mill Bridge, Buncrana

Cllr Fionán Bradley requested that a solution be found for the Mill Bridge, Buncrana and did not agree with a suggestion to widen the footpath. He stated that a pedestrian bridge would be the most suitable option in this case. Cllr Joy Beard and Cllr Jack Murray concurred with these comments.

24.40.04 Slí na Sláinte Walk, Moville

Cllr Martin Farren acknowledged work that was carried out by the Council on the Moville Slí na Sláinte Walk following a recent storm. He also thanked the landowner for providing access to complete the works.

24.40.05 Bus Shelters

Cllr Martin Farren requested an update on this previous request for a bus shelter in Moville. Cllr Joy Beard also requested that a bus shelter be provided at Market Square, Buncrana. Cllr Jack Murray requested a bus shelter for Burnfoot area.

24.40.06 Traffic Calming Measures

Cllr Martin Farren requested an update on his request to have a traffic counter put in place at Clar corner, Moville. He advised that the road also needs to be realigned.

Cllr Albert Doherty requested that appropriate traffic calming signage be erected within Cedar Grove, Cherry Avenue and Donagh Park, Carndonagh.

Cllr Jack Murray requested calming measures be put in place at Heather Park, Buncrana.

24.40.07 Road Markings

Cllr Martin Farren requested that road markings be reinstated following resurfacing works that were carried out at Malin Road, Moville (Baker Corner).

Cllr Albert Doherty requested that road markings be carried out at Culdaff, Leiter and Glengad. Cllr Jack Murray requested that car parking spaces be marked at Church Street, Buncrana.

24.40.08 Donagh Park, Carndonagh

Cllr Albert Doherty requested that the gulleys at Donagh Park, Carndonagh be emptied and requested assistance in addressing the damaged perimeter fencing in the estate.

24.40.09 Public Lighting

Cllr Albert Doherty requested public lighting at Ballyloskey, Carndonagh.

Cllr Jack Murray requested that public lighting be available at Swan Park, Buncrana when required.

24.40.10 Inishowen Municipal District Boundaries

Cllr Paul Canning requested that that the boundary of both Buncrana and Inishowen Electoral Areas need to be realigned.

24.40.11 Drumfries National School

Cllr Jack Murray advised that signage at Drumfries National School is not working and asked that this be addressed.

24.40.12 Road Crossing

Cllr Jack Murray requested that the crossing at Maginn Avenue and Marion Park, Buncrana requires attention.

Cllr Jack Murray also requested an update in relation to his previous request regarding a crossing at Tooban/Burnfoot road.

24.40.13 An Crananla, Buncrana

Cllr Jack Murray advised following recent road works carried out in the area, there is issue with gravel blocking storm drains in the estate.

24.40.14 Signage at Shore Front, Buncrana

Cllr Jack Murray advised that he had received a signed petition requesting the removal of the recently installed Buncrana sign from its current location at the Shore Front, Buncrana. He asked that this sign be relocated and suggested Buncrana Pier as a more suitable location. Cllr Fionán Bradley and Cllr Joy Beard agreed with these comments. Cllr Joy Beard also raised concerns around the current location and queried if a risk assessment was carried out prior to the installation of the sign.

24.40.15 Hedge Cutting

Cllr Ali Farren queried the Council's policy on hedge cutting.

24.40.16 Workshop – Speed Limit Review

It was agreed that a workshop for Speed Limit Review would be held online on Wednesday 10th July at 10am.

24.41 HOUSING & CORPORATE SERVICES

Una Cresswell, A/Area Manager, presented the Housing and Corporate report, and it was taken as read.

24.41.01 Housing Adaptation Grants for Older People and People with a Disability.

Cllr Terry Crossan referred to the reduction in grant applications for 2024 when compared to the previous year as outlined in the report. He queried if this was due to the absence of a Clerk of Works and asked when this position with filled. Una Cresswell advised that the recruitment process for the Clerk of Works role is currently ongoing but, in the meantime, the Council are continuing to prioritise urgent grant applications.

24.41.02 Defective Concrete Blocks

Cllr Ali Farren raised concerns in relation to the remediation of social housing stock and highlighted a number of estates that are affected by defective concrete blocks. Una Cresswell referred to the update that was received by the Social Housing Remediation Team at the previous Inishowen Municipal District meeting and to date the status remains the same. Una Cresswell advised members when a suitable scheme is available, the council would then be in a position to begin a programme to remediate social houses. The situation continues to be extremely challenging, and the Council have moved several families due to defective concrete blocks over the last number of years. Cllr Ali Farren highlighted a case where a family were relocated outside their area and outlined the issues that this caused for the family. Una Cresswell advised that she could not comment on an individual case but advised that due to limited social housing, the council would explore all options in trying to find solutions to the different situations that arise within the area. Cllr Albert Doherty and Cllr Martin Farren also expressed their disappointment and frustration in the delay on getting a suitable programme/funding in place to address social housing stock despite all efforts from Donegal County Council and its members. Cllr Martin Farren stated that the concerns and issues raised by members of Donegal County Council over the years have been ignored at government level.

Cllr Joy Beard outlined the concerns that families are facing when living in homes badly affected by defective concrete blocks during storms and strong winds. She requested that Donegal County Council put a plan in place to provide short-term safe accommodation where families can take shelter during the bad weather and this should be publicised prior to any storm warnings.

Cllr Paul Canning requested that a workshop with members be organised in relation to housing matters. Una Cresswell agreed to follow up.

24.41.03 Social Housing through Turnkey Acquisition

Cllr Albert Doherty requested that the potential turnkey acquisition at Carndonagh be progressed as a matter of urgency.

24.41.04 Energy Efficiency Retrofit Works

This concluded the business of the meeting.

Cllr Paul Canning acknowledged the energy efficiency retrofit works that were carried out on social houses in Carrigans. He queried if there was a warranty given with the new heating system.


24.41.05 Date of next meeting

Golden Bridges and the US Trade & Investment Mission: 11th to 15th November 2024: Plans for Golden Bridges and the Ireland NW US Trade and Investment Mission 2024 are underway. This Mission will be led jointly by the Cathaoirleach of Donegal County Council and the Mayor of Derry City and Strabane District Council and will include a number of civic engagements, investment events/meetings, diaspora

engagements and will build on connections and relationships formed in recent years. It will also include an intense US market development programme for scaling businesses from the North West.

The NWCR Inward Investment Strategy: Continuing to progress the NWCR Inward Investment Strategy working in collaboration with Derry City and Strabane District Council including the development of digital and non-digital promotional material including videos and building on online social media and websites.

Training: 1140 Attendees on 55 Courses held.

Digital Start: 4 applications approved for this support to a value of €18,000.

Green for Business: 14 applicants approved for this support to a value of €30,996.

Energy Efficiency Grants: 4 applicants approved for this support to a value of €20,000.

Lean For Business: 16 applicants approved for this support to a value of €72,500.

Energy Efficiency Grant: The newly updated Energy Efficiency Grant is now live. Businesses with less than 50 employees can avail of a new 75% grant support to a maximum of €10,000. The previous grant was 50% support to a maximum of €5,000.

Export Development Programme: Several LEO clients have undertaken an export readiness exercise with Full Circle Consultancy to establish how ready they are to explore export markets. Notification of appeals and Schedule 8 (extension of time) modules are now live. Withdrawn and second applications are at pre go live status.

The grant schemes for remediation of septic tanks were changed at the start of 2024 to increase the amount to €12,000 and remove the requirement to have registered the septic tank since 2013. Given the increased value and access to funding, the EPA have demanded greater enforcement by local authorities up to & including prosecution to ensure these failed systems are fixed to protect the environment and public health.

Funded by the Department of the Environment, Climate and Communications, the Regional Waste Planning Office and Donegal County Council teamed up to host a FREE Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day on Saturday, August 31st, from 8:30 am to 1:30 pm at Donegal County Council's Letterkenny Recycling Centre, Carnamuggagh, F92EW80.

The event provided an opportunity for households to finally say goodbye to those potentially harmful products taking up space under your sink and in the shed. Some of the most common household hazardous products include oil-based paints, bleach, herbicides, and aerosols.

The collection day accepted household items that contain potentially harmful components.

- **Household Chemicals:** Disinfectants, detergents, bleach, oven cleaners, toilet bowl cleaners, and other potent cleaning agents.
- Personal Care Products: Nail polish, nail polish remover, aerosols, and other chemical-based cosmetic products.
- **Garden Chemicals:** Pesticides, herbicides, and other chemical treatments used in lawn and garden care.
- Paints and Solvents: Leftover paint (limit 10 cans/tubs per customer), varnishes, thinners, strippers, inks, glues, resins, and other solvent-based products.
- Automotive Products: Used motor oil, petrol, diesel, antifreeze, surface polish, and other automotive fluids.

Note: Hazardous waste such as medicines and gas canisters could not be accepted.

"Mishandled hazardous waste can be dangerous for our environment and our health," said **Carol Sweetnam of the Regional Waste Management Planning Office**. "The event is all about making it easy for householders to do the right thing and dispose of these materials safely."

Commenting on the event, Matthew Byrne, Waste Regulations Officer at Donegal County Council said, "It's really important that hazardous products are not placed in the general waste bin."



Scheme Description

Description:

The village of Bridgend sits at the base of the Inishowen Peninsula in Co. Donegal on the most strategically important border crossing in the North West. The village is bisected by the N13 / A2 transboundary route which facilitates in excess of 16,000 vehicle movements (per working day) across the border in both directions. The strategic importance of the route is supported by the fact that the N13 / A2 transboundary route forms part of the TEN-T comprehensive network. This is a network of multimodal strategic transport corridors identified to improve the mobility of goods and people throughout the European Union (EU).

The N13 Bridgend to County Boundary (TEN-T) Route Improvement Project focuses on a 1.2 km long section of the N13 National Primary Route through the village of Bridgend and onto the border with Northern Ireland (Derry) where it connects to the A2 Buncrana Road.

The juxtaposition in currency, regulation, taxation and employment opportunity between each jurisdiction has and continues to make, the area immediately both sides of the border and adjacent to this section of the N13 / A2 attractive to commercial, retail and residential development. This has increasing potential to significantly undermine the operational efficiency of the N13 / A2 transboundary route. These developments coupled with Brexit, the establishment of the North West City Region and associated European, Regional, National and Local policy developments has significantly increased the strategic importance and priority improvement of this section of road in recent years.

2.0 PROJECT PROGRESS TO DATE

This project commenced in 2021, and to date it has been developed through the following Phases of the Transport Infrastructure Ireland, (TII), Project Management Guidelines:

Phase 0 – Scope & Strategic Assessment
 Phase 1 – Concept & Feasibility
 Phase 2 – Options Selection
 Complete
 Complete

Phase 2, which commenced in Q1 2022 has taken significantly longer to complete than originally programmed, largely due to significant amendments to the Public Spending Code, and resultant changes to how transport projects are appraised by the Department of Transport, and TII, (i.e.) *change from the Common Appraisal Framework (CAF) to the Transport Appraisal Framework (TAF)*, June 2023.

Phase 2 is now however complete, and TII Gate Approval has been received to progress the project through Phase 3 – Design and Environmental Evaluation, subject to continued funding in 2024/25.

The Phase 2 Emerging Preferred Route Corridor (Option U) is now therefore confirmed as the Preferred Route Corridor, (See Preferred Route Corridor Map attached) FYI.

A 4th Non-Statutory Public Consultation Period will commence soon, (date to be confirmed), with the Preferred Route Corridor Map on public display and available for inspection at Carndonagh, Letterkenny and Lifford Public Services Centers and Council Offices.

The Preferred Route Corridor Map will also be available to view and download from the dedicated project website at, www.n13bridgend.ie, along with Feedback Forms, to allow members of the public, and/or other stakeholders to provide feedback to the project team on the Preferred Route Corridor, during the consultation period.



Amendment to Chief Executive Order 2023/R/H/0171 authorising the Disposal of Land at Ardmore, Muff

to Anne McLaughlin, Firdale, Ardmore, Muff, Co. Donegal – Ref: M2QPGW - Plots 1b & 1d

Background: Donegal County Council (DCC) acquired land in the 1960's from the McLaughlin family for the purposes of widening/realigning the R238 between Muff and Quigleys Point. Part of the land acquired was not occupied by DCC and was continuously farmed by the McLaughlin family as part of their overall landholding. To facilitate the construction of the Muff to Quigleys Point Greenway, Mrs Anne McLaughlin's beneficial rights over these lands were sought and as part of the land negotiations it was agreed that the land not required for the construction of the greenway would be disposed of to Mrs McLaughlin.

The disposal of the lands not required for construction of the greenway to Mrs McLaughlin was previously approved by the elected members of the Inishowen Municipal District on the 25th September 2023 on foot of which Chief Executive Order 2023.R.H.0171 was prepared authorising the disposal. A copy of the order is attached in Appendix A.

During the construction of the greenway, additional land to that previously agreed with Mrs McLaughlin was required to complete the works, thus reducing the area of lands available for disposal to Mrs McLaughlin. Mrs McLaughlin accommodated the Council's requirements and agreed to the change. This report seeks to amend Chief Executive Order 2023.R.H.0171 with respect to the reduction of the area of land available for disposal and the associated reduction to the payment due.

Proposal: Donegal County Council had proposed (CE Order 2023/R/H/0171) to dispose of 2 no. plots of land comprising of 0.1735 hectares and 0.2166 hectares respectively at Ardmore, Muff to Anne McLaughlin, Firdale, Ardmore, Muff, Co. Donegal. It is herein proposed to amend the area of said plots, as agreed with Anne McLaughlin, and the Council now proposes to dispose of 2 no. plots of land comprising of 0.1268 hectares and 0.1767 hectares respectively at Ardmore, Muff to Anne McLaughlin, Firdale, Ardmore, Muff, Co. Donegal.

DCC appointed independent valuer Avison Young who have recommended the sum of €1,200.00 for disposal of the lands on the basis that the McLaughlin family had uninterrupted and exclusive possession of the lands. This amount has been factored into the overall compensation amount for both permanent and temporary acquisitions required for the greenway meaning that once the compensation amount has been paid to Anne McLaughlin on the closing of the sale to the Council, the said sum of €1,200.00 will be treated as having been paid for plot 1b & 1d. A copy of the valuation is attached in Appendix B. This equates to a reduction of €300.00 in compensation due to Donegal County Council as set out in the original agreement which has been incorporated into the overall land agreement compensation package.

The plots comprising 0.1268 hectares and 0.1767 hectares respectively proposed for disposal are edged red and lettered "1b" and "1d" on the attached Land Registry compliant maps and form part of the lands registered under Folio DL81637F, Property No.1, Plan 11. A copy of the maps is attached in Appendix C.

Recommendation: It is herein recommended that: -

- 1. The plots of land (1b and 1d) at Ardmore, Muff be disposed to Anne McLaughlin as part of the overall land agreement that incorporates the payment of €1,200.00.
- 2. The disposal is to proceed subject to the approval of the Members of the Council under Section 211 of the Planning and Development Act 2000 and Section 183 of the Local Government Act 2001.
- 3. The Seal of the Council be affixed to the necessary documentation to effect the disposal when same is received.

DISPOSAL OF LAND AT ARDMORE, MUFF

SUBMITTED

Donegal County Council proposes to dispose of a plot of land at Ardmore, Muff to Anne McLaughlin, Firdale, Ardmore, Muff, Co. Donegal.

Donegal County Council (DCC) acquired land in the 1960's from the McLaughlin family for the purposes of widening/realigning the R238 between Muff and Quigleys Point. Part of the land acquired was not occupied by DCC and was continuously farmed by the McLaughlin family as part of their overall landholding.

Donegal County Council now propose to construct a Greenway alongside the R238 between Muff and Quigleys Point and in order to do so now need:

- To temporarily acquire land owned and registered to Anne McLaughlin to facilitate construction of the greenway scheme,
- To acquire Anne McLaughlin's beneficial interests in lands registered to DCC but occupied and farmed by Anne McLaughlin,
- To dispose of lands registered to DCC that are not required for the greenway scheme and are occupied and farmed by Anne McLaughlin.

DCC appointed independent valuer Avison Young who have recommended the sum of €1,500.00 for disposal of the lands on the basis that the McLaughlin family had uninterrupted and exclusive possession of the lands. This amount has been factored into the overall compensation amount for both permanent and temporary acquisitions required for the greenway meaning that once the compensation amount has been paid to Anne McLaughlin on the closing of the sale to the Council, the said sum of €1,500.00 will be treated as having been paid for plot 1b & 1d.

At a meeting of the Inishowen Municipal District held on the 5th September 2023, the members of the Inishowen Municipal District gave their gave their general approval to the disposal of the affected lands to Anne McLaughlin, Firdale, Ardmore, Muff, Co. Donegal





2. Social Housing through Turnkey Acquisition

The Council has a current county-wide turnkey acquisition process open, which will remain open until the 30th of September 2026. ETenders (reference RFT 2461070) refers, where all documentation and information can be obtained. Submissions are currently being accepted and must be made in accordance with the requirements of the procurement documentation.

The process has been opened to help address social housing needs across the county. Proposals are being accepted for 1-, 2-, 3- & 4-bedroom housing units in towns or villages throughout the county, on lands suitable for housing purposes.

Council staff continue to engage with Developers in Inishowen MD in relation to this turnkey process with significant interest received. As this is a competitive tender process, specific details can only be shared upon receipt of a final tender.

Council officials are continuing to dialogue with Developers regarding the additional valid proposal for Moville. Members will be fully informed of this proposal upon receipt of Irish Water requirements and final departmental approval.

3. Lands / Property for Social Housing Purposes

The Council is planning to develop further projects on existing landbank in various locations throughout the MD. Preliminary designs are underway for a number of these sites and are informed by the pertaining approved social housing need at local level.

In parallel with the construction and turnkey programmes outlined above, the Council is actively pursuing the acquisition of lands suitable for housing purposes, in towns and villages where there is currently not a social housing solution available / shortfall. In addition to the current expression of interest advertisement on the Councils' website for parcels of land, derelict sites / buildings with the potential to deliver social housing, the Council is also separately identifying parcels of land with social housing potential in areas of need.

A number of suitable land parcels have been identified in towns and villages across the Inishowen MD and engagement / negotiations are ongoing directly with multiple landowners / agents, to acquire these lands.

Acquisition of a site at Newtowncunningham has been completed with potential for 20+ housing units. The Council has currently an offer accepted (subject to contract) for lands in Moville (potential for 30 housing units).

Going forward, the land team will continue to identify further land parcels across the MD and work with the Council's local service team to assess their suitability for new social housing.
