### **MDD/081/25 STANDING ORDERS**

Cllr Jordan welcomed all attendees and referred to Standing Order No. 64 which stipulates that recording of the meeting is prohibited.

### **MDD/082/25 OUTGOING CATHAOIRLEACH'S ADDRESS**

Cllr Jordan thanked the Members and Staff of Donegal MD for their support over the last year. He added that the year was a successful one such as the progress of a number of housing developments including turnkey, the Wastewater Treatment plant in Mountcharles should be closed out in the final quarter of 2025 and he was delighted to host an MD reception for Katie George Dunlevy the previous week. Cllr Jordan advised there is more he'd like to see happen, including addressing the road safety issues at Dunkineely school, which he hopes to see closed out in 2025.

All members thanked Cllr Jordan for his work as Cathaoirleach, agreeing that he was very fair and accommodating as Cathaoirleach and very good at organising/coordinating events in his capacity as chair.

Mr. P Sheerin thanked Cllr Jordan, acknowledging the role of Cathaoirleach is demanding but noted that Cllr Jordan carried out the role with great willingness and patience.

## **MDD/090/25 HOUSING & CORPORATE SERVICES REPORT**

### **CORPORATE SERVICES**

Mr Sheerin acknowledged that Cllr Kennedy would soon be finishing her term as Cathaoirleach of the County Council, for which she had a very busy year. He advised that there was great sense of pride having the Cathaoirleach from the Donegal MD, acknowledging her contribution at the recent function presenting staff with Commemorative coins for their contribution to the success of the Council in the Local Authority Awards.

Cllr Naughton congratulated Cllr Kennedy on behalf of the members, on her successful year as Cathaoirleach of the County Council.

#### **Previous Meeting Follow Ups:**

In relation to the follow ups from the last Municipal District Meeting, Mr Sheerin noted the following:

#### **Nomination to Bundoran Waterworld (1 No. Member)**

It was agreed to defer this item to the MD meeting in July 2025.

#### **Fr Francis McLoone & Fr Adrian Gavigan.**

Cllr Naughton wished both Fr McLoone and Fr Gavigan well on reaching their respective celebrations of 50 years and 25 years in the priesthood. He expressed his gratitude to both priest for their service and pastoral care to the communities they have served over the years.

#### **‘Cully Coders’**

Cllr Brogan acknowledged the achievement of the ‘Cully Coders’, on winning the All Ireland FIRST Lego League (FLL) Masterpiece Challenge and representing Ireland at the FLL International Open in Greece, placing 5<sup>th</sup> overall. Cllr Brogan suggested making some sort of presentation to the group to acknowledge this achievement.

Cllr Naughton concurred with Cllr Brogan, congratulating this group of Primary School children on such a big achievement and suggested

he will follow up with Mr. P Sheerin to discuss what can be facilitated to acknowledge the group's achievements.

## **HOUSING SERVICES**

The reports circulated with the agenda were noted and taken as read.

### **Casual Vacancies**

Mr Sheerin advised that there has been a relatively high number of houses returned over the past number of months, 8 of which are on the current report, all at varying stages of progress. He noted there are a further 5 casual vacancies expected over the coming weeks in Laghey, Bundoran, Ballintra, Mountcharles and Frosses, which will likely be added to the next report, if keys are returned. Mr Sheerin advised priority is being given to progressing casual vacancies due to the housing need of the MD.

### **Energy Efficiency Deep Retrofit Works**

Mr Sheerin advised the Energy Efficiency Deep Retrofit Works planned for 2025, commenced the previous day (16<sup>th</sup> June), with 49 houses in the programme that is in line with the 50 per year over the last number of years, with the current program incurring a significant spend of over €1.2million.

### **Housing Capital**

Ms T Quinn referred to the circulated report, taken as read. She advised trial holes are currently being dug out at the Glencolmcille site and site clearance works being carried out at the Dunkineely site to facilitate a topology survey this week.

### **Land at Church Road in Bundoran**

Ms. E Sharpe recused herself from the meeting for the discussion of this item.

Cllr McMahon sought an update on the proposed purchasing of lands at Church Road, Bundoran by the Council and that this matter is being dealt with by Housing Capital Section. He submitted that the family have not had any updates on this matter in recent times and are anxious to receive an update. Cllr Naughton also noted that he understands that the Council is interested in purchasing the lands and submitted that the matter has been ongoing for a lengthy period. In response to the matters raised, Mr. P Sheerin advised that he would pass on the Members' comments to Mr. J Gallagher, Senior Engineer, Housing Capital and request for an official update to be provided in the first instance.

**Local Link - Pettigo to Donegal Town,**

Cllr Kennedy, referring to the Local Link bus service from Pettigo to Donegal advised that this route only operates on Mondays and Fridays (once daily) and only allows for a 2 hours visit to Donegal Town for services users. She submitted that this service does not allow for service users to attend appointments in Donegal town due to the short duration they have to spend in Donegal Town before they have to depart the town again. She asked that the Municipal District write to Rural Link outlining the comments and to seek an increase in this service to meet the needs of the residents in Pettigo. Cllr Kennedy advised that she has already been in contact with Rural Transport and has a reference no. for her request to them that she can pass on for reference purposes.

Mr Sheerin advised that a letter would issue to Rural Transport and would include the ref no. when provided by Cllr Kennedy.

**MDD/091/25 ROADS / TRANSPORTATION SERVICES REPORT**

Mr Sweeney referred to the circulated report taken as read.

**Previous Meeting Follow Ups**

In relation to the follow ups from the last Municipal District Meeting, Mr Sweeney noted the following:

- Rock Armour at Carntulla - The area office will investigate this issue.
- Ardaghey to Ardara Road –These works have commenced.
- Damaged Manhole Cover at Ballyshannon – This manhole cover has been repaired by the service provider.

**Dunkineely School Safety Scheme**

Mr Sweeney advised The Road Safety Engineer has just advised that the TII have approved the Feasibility and Options Report that was submitted for the Dunkineely School Safety Scheme so this scheme has now moved to phase 3 (Design and Environmental Evaluation), which will require the following:

1. Stage 1 Road Safety Audit of the preliminary design.
2. Completion of the Detailed Design Report
3. Stage 2 Road Safety Audit of the detailed design.
4. Seek approval from the TII for the Detailed Design Report.

Mr Sweeney advised the remaining phases will then be as follows:

- Phase 4 – Statutory Process (Planning consent)



- Phase 5 – Detailed Design and Procurement
- Phase 6 – Construction
- Phase 7 – Close Out

Cllr Brogan welcomed the movement on Dunkineely School Safety Scheme suggesting more signage would be beneficial.

Cllr Boyle queried how long the next phase will take, as this is a matter of urgency. He referred to a recent almost fatal accident in the middle of the street.

Mr Sweeney agreed to follow up with TII on an estimated timeframe.

Cllr Jordan queried if there is possibility the Council could ask the Garda to have presence in the area, as this does help reduce motorists speed when they see a Garda presence, at least until the scheme is at construction stage.

#### **Junctions at Parkhill, Coolcholly & Cavangarden, Ballyshannon**

Cllr McMahon expressed his concern regarding the junctions at Parkhill, Coolcholly & Cavangarden, citing that they are extremely dangerous and that the TII should be providing a report to identify solutions to remedy this.

Mr Sweeney advised surveys are being conducted and data being gathered by the area roads office, which will form part of the Road Safety Assessment reports to be submitted to the TII, and when this is concluded, the TII will be in a position to advise. He informed members that gathering this data takes a considerable amount of time.

#### **Ballyshannon- Belleek Road**

Cllr McMahon expressed his concerns on the safety of the Ballyshannon Belleek Road, stating it's one of the worst roads in the County, with traffic coming from the 6 northern counties into the republic and vice versa, accommodating large lorries etc.

Mr Sweeney advised he will discuss this with the Road Safety Engineer, as this road is a strategic link into Northern Ireland, and the TII may see it as improvement works to the N3.

Cllr McMahon noted the stretch of road from Celtic Weave into Belleek is the most dangerous and narrow part of the road, and asked if a hard shoulder could be provided on this stretch of road.

Mr Sweeney advised that the provision of hard shoulders would require land acquisition, CPO etc so it would then be considered a Road Scheme which would require it to be on a list of schemes for

consideration, which it currently is not the case, as the focus is currently on schemes such as the Ten-T.

Cllr McMahon advised there was previously a flashing beacon on the road and suggested it is reinstated or alternatively one of the signs showing the speed of the vehicle in red/green.

Mr Sweeney advised the TII are not in favour of these type of signs (showing speed in red/green) being used on National Roads, as they have been seen as a target for speed rather than a deterrent. Mr Sweeney agreed to follow up to see if a SLOW/Go Mall sign can be erected at this location.

### **Frosses**

Cllr Brogan asked if signs that flash a vehicles speed, in red or green depending on whether it is within or above the speed limit could be installed at Frosses.

Mr Sweeney advised there are several indicators on the approach road to the school in Frosses to manage the speed of vehicles approaching the school, they include the 50kph speed limit signs, caution children crossing signs, slow road markings, school flashing lights, and hatching along the middle of the road to narrow the carriageway.

Mr Sweeney did however advise that the speed limit at all schools is going to form part of the national speed limit review but the Council are waiting on the department to finalise their guidance document on the implementation of same in the vicinity of the schools.

Cllr Brogan asked when the 30kph limit will come into effect.

Mr Sweeney noted that a non statutory public consultation event has taken place, which was poorly attended but those who did attend were supportive of what is being proposed. The next step is the statutory process, i.e. a statutory consultation event, submissions, report with submissions, recommendation, members adopt or reject etc.

### **Mountcharles**

Cllr Brogan raised safety concerns about the crossing at Mountcharles, citing children are coming out of school around the corner and its very dangers.

Mr Sweeney advised it is also very close to the bus stop, so a solution to work for both will need to be found.

### **Barnesmore Gap Greenway**

Cllr Brogan welcomed the Barnesmore Greenway Project, advising the public consultation events were well attended and he hopes now

that the consultations are complete, there'll be no further delays in the planning for this project.

Mr Sweeney advised this scheme will need to go to An Bord Plenála for approval, but it will be of huge benefit to Donegal Town if planning approval is granted and funding can be secured for the delivery of the scheme.

### **Pettigo**

Cllr Naughton suggested a link road right around the football pitch in Pettigo.

### **Parking Fines**

Cllr Naughton raised concern that parking fines being issued to motorists dropping off donations to the SVP shop, and the traffic warden taking photographs as the motorist drove off. He queried if something could be done to address this in the bye-laws.

Mr Sweeney advised that the Traffic Wardens take photographs as evidence of where the vehicle was parked in the event of a parking fine being challenged.

Mr Sweeney also advised that the area immediately outside the SVP shop is a footway/footpath and vehicles found to be parked on a footway are being issued with fixed charge notices as parking on same is not permitted in accordance with the Road Traffic (Traffic and parking) Regulations 1997.

Mr Sweeney did however suggest that the loading bay across from the SVP shop could be changed to provide parking spaces, as the shop it was outside has since closed.

## **MDD/092/25 ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, INFORMATION SYSTEMS & EMERGENCY SERVICES REPORT**

Ms Browne referred to the circulated report, taken as read, advising that in follow up to the query raised at the previous MD meeting, a briefing report had been circulated to the members in relation to caravan and camping tourism.

Ms Browne highlighted events such as the upcoming 3<sup>rd</sup> International meeting of the Green Hydra Project, being held in Donegal, 11 Donegal businesses partaking in the Balmoral Show in May and the distribution of Donegal tourism brochures and golf brochure, which is also available online.

### **Festivals & Events**

Cllr Naughton proposed a meeting with Donegal Tourism and Failte Ireland should be held to discuss Festivals & Events within Donegal, noting the loss of the Bundoran Sea Sessions and Donegal Town Food festival this year. He noted the IMRO and insurance costs as having an adverse impact on community run events. He suggested a festival and events strategy should be put in place for the next 3 years.

Cllr Jordan seconded the proposal of having a meeting with Donegal Tourism and Failte Ireland, noting the loss of the Food Festival in Donegal Town and the difficulty the Rory Gallagher festival is having in sustaining itself into the future.

Cllr McMahon congratulated the committee of the Rory Gallagher festival on its success this year, acknowledging that more money is needed from government for these festivals. He advised the high cost of insurance for these events is a contributing factor to them not being able to continue. He stated it very important for towns such as Bundoran/Ballyshannon to have these festivals to generate much needed revenue.

Cllr Kennedy suggested discussing the cost of insuring these events, with someone from the insurance industry to get direction, given the reported issues with these costs.

Cllr Naughton welcomed the Donegal Rally and Errigal Arts Festival taking place, suggesting it would be worth looking at the possibility of having one day of the rally in the south of the County, as part of the event in years to come.

Ms Browne advised there are many challenges to festivals being ran, such as lack of volunteers, high cost of insurance, IMRO seeking to backdate monies, adding the current Festival & Events grant scheme is just over €49,000. She advised she will contact Failte Ireland to request a meeting and will revert with proposed dates.

### **MDD/093/25 ENVIRONMENT SERVICES REPORT**

Ms Bogan referred to the circulated report, taken as read. She highlighting items such as the bathing season officially commenced 1<sup>st</sup> June, so the lab will be taking water samples at designated areas, the progress report on implementing the Climate Action Plan will be brought to SPC's and then to the Plenary meeting for endorsement, participation in the Town Centre First Policy drop in event organised by the Regeneration team, Letterkenny University Hospital biodiversity day and the Council's compost giveaway events.

Cllr Naughton advised the compost giveaway events were a great success, acknowledging participation of Enviro Grind Ltd, a Pettigo based company with over 40 staff which is expanding.

**Public Toilets, Donegal Town**

Cllr Naughton advised this item needs to remain on the agenda until its closed out, he raised concern in relation to the number of quotations needed and the delays in progress as result.

Mr Martin advised the tendering process needs to be open to as many contractors as possible, testing the market to the standard required for that particular level of contract. This wouldn't be expected to have a major impact on the project.

Ms Bogan agreed to refer this to Mr Kevin McCloskey.

**MDD/094/25 COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AND PLANNING SERVICES**

**Community Development Report**

Ms Britton referred to the circulated report, taken as read. She referred to a response to follows ups from the previous meeting, which was circulated to members the previous day. Ms Britton advised there were 15 expressions of interest submitted for Clár funding 2025, 4 of which were in the Donegal MD, and these are being evaluated currently.

**Donegal Craft Village**

Cllr Brogan advised that the 18<sup>th</sup> July 2025 will be the 40 year anniversary for the opening of the Craft Village, and voiced concern that work needs to commence there as soon as possible. He advised two units remain unoccupied, requiring works and general works required in the craft village such as footpaths etc.

Cllr Jordan noted the tourism season has begun and the opportunity for crafters to make money is now, while he acknowledged the two vacant units have electrical issues, he advised these need to be addressed immediately, works completed and occupants in the two units.

Cllr Naughton advised that progress is too slow, advising that if maintenance isn't carried out on an on-going basis, these units will deteriorate. He stated his disappointment that the two units remain unopen.

### **Clár Funding Areas**

Cllr Naughton queried the fact that some areas of Ballyshannon are within Clár funded areas and others not. He asked how this was decided and if there was anything the members could do as an MD to change this to allow more areas to come within the catchment area.

Ms Britton advised this is decided by the Government nationally - Pobal HP Deprivation Index and acknowledged the frustration of applicants in the fact that some areas of Ballyshannon are inside the Clár area and others are not.

Cllr Jordan advised Cllr Albert Doherty moved a motion on this, and it is being reviewed.

### **Planning Services Report**

Ms A Quinn referred to the circulated report, taken as read. She noted an email circulated to members from Ms Patricia McIntyre regarding the Regeneration and Action Plan for Bundoran.

### **Planning enforcement**

Cllr Brogan raised concern over the time it takes for planning enforcement to react to complaints, citing an example where a complaint was made in April however it was September when someone came out from the Council to investigate it. He stated he understood it to be a staffing issue, but advised there is no point in coming out when the works are completed, it would be more beneficial to stop the works happening in the first instance. He asked that this be looked at.

Ms A Quinn agreed to bring this item to the attention of the planning enforcement section.

### **Rural Regeneration Development Fund (RRDF)**

Cllr Naughton advised he took a motion to the plenary meeting the previous month, seeking Donegal County Council to allocate €5m to address dereliction. He stated funding for this needs to be put aside and it is his intention to keep this on the agenda.

Cllr Naughton acknowledged the good work by Patricia McIntyre and her team regarding RRDF, regenerating towns and villages in the County.

## **2. House Acquisition and Buy and Renew Programme**

The Department of Housing Circular: Housing 11/2025 - Social Housing Second Hand Acquisitions Programme outlines four key priority areas under single housing units can be acquired as follows:

1. Tenant in Situ
2. Exiting Homelessness
3. Disability/Older Persons
4. Buy and Renew

The capital budget provided to Donegal County Council for 2025 under the Social Housing Programme is €2,000,000. Eligibility criteria has been defined within the Circular for each of these priority areas. Housing Capital is working closely with the Area teams to establish if ongoing acquisitions can now meet the criteria of the Circular.

### **3. Social Housing through Turnkey Acquisition**

The Council has a current county-wide turnkey acquisition process open, which will remain open until the 30<sup>th</sup> of September 2026. ETenders (reference RFT 2461070) refers, where all documentation and information can be obtained. Submissions are currently being accepted and must be made in accordance with the requirements of the procurement documentation.

Proposals are being accepted for 1, 2, 3 & 4 bedroom housing units in towns or villages throughout the county, on lands suitable for housing purposes.

Council staff are currently engaging with a number of Developers in the Donegal MD. Information and guidance are being provided on an individual basis to Developers to guide them through the process. This is a competitive tender process and therefore, specific details can only be shared upon receipt of a final tender.

AMPCO Builders Co. Ltd. is progressing the development of lands at Drumrooske, Donegal Town for a total of 35 units. The development will be completed in 2 phases with Phase 1 comprising 25 units and Phase 2 comprising 10 units. Recent photos of progress on-site are attached below.



### **4. Lands / Property for Social Housing Purposes**

The Council is actively pursuing the acquisition of lands suitable for housing purposes, in towns and villages where there is currently not a social housing solution available. In the Donegal MD, the following provides an update:

Additional lands are being considered across Donegal MD and Members will be informed of same upon the Council progressing to make offers to acquire.

#### DDBN / Donegal County Council & Donegal 2040 - Lunchtime Seminar,



Dubin Donegal Business Network hosted Donegal County Council's Director of Service Garry Martin and Head of Economic Development, Anne Marie Conlon for a lunchtime seminar for their members to share the Council's Economic Strategy for the County and work that is underway to grow Donegal's economy.

Information was provided on the Councils role across a range of areas that all contribute to promoting economic growth including detail on how the Council is working collaboratively with neighbouring counties including Derry and Strabane Council to position the region as a unique strategic crossborder region with a population of 320,000 people and which has the 4<sup>th</sup> largest urban agglomeration on the island.

They also focused on Donegal's potential across a number of areas including tech, tourism, blue economy and renewable energy as well as highlighting a number of key Donegal brand building initiatives. The need to support the delivery of key enabling infrastructure was also highlighted as was the work of Donegal 2040—a Donegal County Council initiative set up to position Donegal as a hub for investment, innovation, and sustainable development.

Donegal 2040's flagship development in Letterkenny was also highlighted i.e. development of the Alpha Beta Buildings as part of a Business and Innovation Quarter in the heart of Letterkenny and the members of the DDBN were invited to support the work of the Council and to engage directly with the team in the Economic Development Division of Donegal County Council.

#### **Green Hydra:**

### Update on Projects:

**ALPHA Innovation** is an initiative of Donegal 2040 DAC, supported by Donegal County Council's Economic Development Unit and Enterprise Ireland. It was set up to accelerate and enable ambitious individuals, SME businesses, startups & scaleups to innovate and build globally ambitious ventures across the county.

**Alpha's Startup Bootcamp showcase took place in Letterkenny on Monday June 23<sup>rd</sup>:** presenting the culmination of the hard work of this year's Innovation's Bootcamp 2025 Programme participants who showcased their business ideas to the invited guests. This year's Bootcamp participants clearly demonstrated to the attendees how they had applied the techniques of the ALPHA process in order to test the commercial viability and scalability of their business propositions. The tools and techniques of the process are broadly based on the lean startup methodology for rapidly building scalable enterprises.

The participants presented startup ideas in areas such as Data Science, Design, Engineering, Sustainability, Green Regulation, Compliance technology, and MedTech. This open showcase day is a real opportunity for participants present their propositions to an audience of target customers, peers, champions and advocates. Participants were presented with a certificate of completion to mark their entrepreneurial journey and celebrate their achievement.

## 1.2: Tourism Marketing Unit

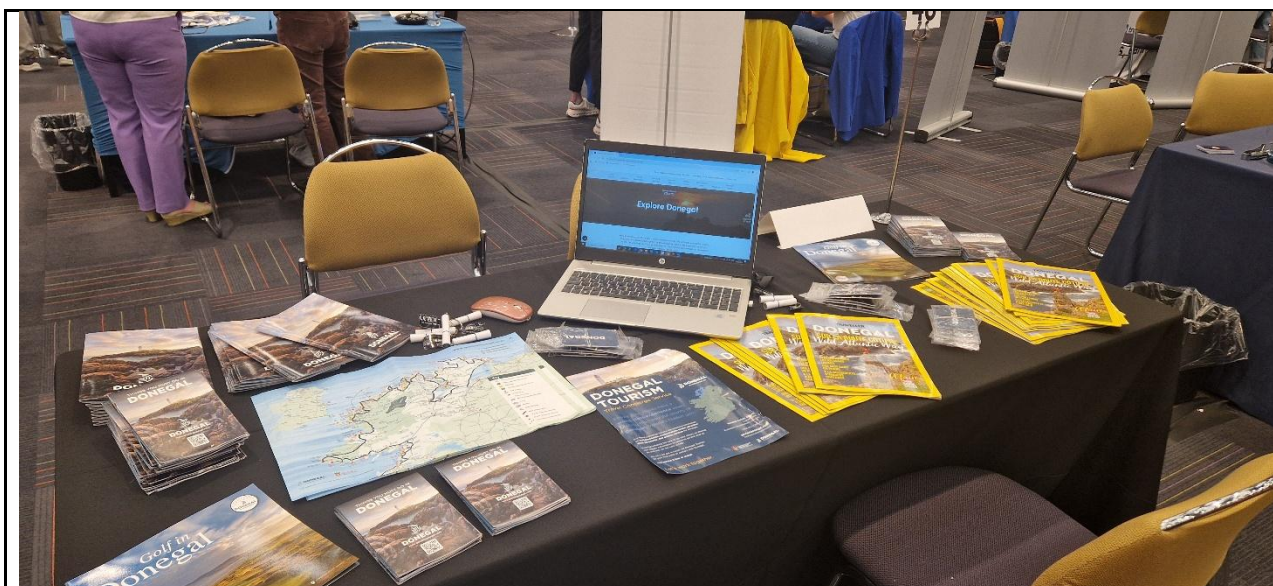
### Project Activity

**TBEX:** Donegal Tourism will host TBEX - Europe (Travel Blog Exchange) in September 2025. The TBEX community represents thousands of influencers and hundreds of millions of travellers around the world. In June 2025, Donegal Tourism travelled to Quebec to attend the TBEX Conference to present in relation to Donegal and to take part in the speed networking meetings. **Caravan and Camping Sector:** Donegal County Council Tourism Unit convened both the internal and external Caravan and Camping sector working group meetings in April and discussed issues for the forthcoming year. The next meetings will take place in September 2025 and will include further discussion around continued implementation of the recommendations set out in the KPMG study on the sector and plans for marketing activities to drive the messaging around the Campers 'code of conduct' and responsible campervanning.

**Caravan and Camping sector 'Campers Code' campaign:** Donegal Tourism ran a Caravan and Camping campaign over a 6-week period starting in May to drive home all the responsible Caravan and Camping messages within our 'Campers Code'. Across Facebook and Instagram our paid reach was 648,574 with over 80,000 views and 434 direct clicks to the camper code page. This campaign showcase videos and paid media behind the camper code info posts that ran until June 14th. This was also picked up by various media outlets such as Donegal Daily and Caravan Times. Mary Daly also discussed the topic on Highland Radio.

**Age Friendly/Disability Strategy/Caravan and Camping Committees:** Donegal Tourism continues to participate in these groups to see where the Tourism Industry in the county can learn from consultation and collaboration.

**Paths and Trails Promotion:** Donegal County Council Tourism Unit is working collaboratively with the Outdoor Recreation team on production of new videos that will be used to promote various paths and trails in the county. Filming took place with Walking Ambassadors such as Mairead Ni Maoningh, Noel Cunningham and Jason Black etc for several walks to capture insights and experiences. Filming is now in post-production with the view of content going live in late June to run over the summer.

**Donegal Golf Brochure:** The new brochure is available for download from [www.govisitdonegal.com/golf](http://www.govisitdonegal.com/golf) and at golf clubs across the county. The next meeting of the Donegal Golf Cluster will take place in the autumn.

**Donegal Trade Mission to Bonn:** Donegal Tourism will take part in a trade mission to Bonn, Germany together with Ireland West Airport Knock, Tourism Ireland and six other local authorities on the western



seaboard on the 3rd of July. The aim of the mission is to highlight the easy access to the West of Ireland from Germany via the Ireland West-Cologne air access route (4 flights per week). An evening event will enable businesses to meet with up to 40 tour operators and media from the Bonn area. The Gallen Group, McGrory's Hotel and Sliabh Liag Experience will accompany Donegal Tourism to the event.

**Go Visit Donegal Website:** The new website is moving from design to development stage to enhance performance and work seamlessly with the existing repository.

**Trade Newsletter:** A monthly newsletter is sent out around the middle of the month – we have recently started to promote the availability of the newsletter on our trade socials (LinkedIn and Facebook) and have seen a growth in subscribers as a result.

**Donegal Tourism/Fáilte Ireland Business Clinics 2025:** Donegal County Council Tourism Unit and Fáilte Ireland plan to collaborate on hosting tourism business clinics in Q4 of 2025. There will be one business clinic held in each Municipal District. This will provide the tourism sector with an opportunity to meet both teams and learn more about supports available. More details will be provided soon.

**Consumer Newsletter:** Newsletter in progress to be distributed to a consumer audience.

**TOURBO:** TOURBO presents an innovative response to a key EU priority: empowering public authorities and MSMEs to develop twin transition strategies—advancing both digital and green transformation—to drive regional economic development. Aoife Dunlevy and Sarah Nolan participated in a partner meeting in Vratsa, Bulgaria sharing learnings and updates. Donegal is due to host the next partner meeting in October expecting approx. 30 attendees.

**Sustainable Arctic & Peripheral Biking Tourism Project (SUB):** Margaret Sweeney, Donegal Tourism attended the Peer-to-Peer Programme in Sweden in June and was accompanied by two of our biking tourism businesses. The main objective of this Peer-to-Peer programme is to share best practices in cycling tourism and rural tourism development, facilitate peer-to-peer learning and potential partnerships and to explore opportunities for sustainable and inclusive tourism growth.



**EDIN:** The EDIN project, funded in partnership with INTERREG Europe, focuses on the improvement of the relevant policies to attract Digital Nomads to Donegal. The program is now in Semester 3 with Donegal County Council taking the Communications and Marketing lead on this project. On the 24 & 25 June 2025 Donegal County Council hosted a study visit of other project partners to the county, this 2-day visit was based around the Glenties MD, project partners were welcomed by Cathaoirleach of Glenties MD, Cllr. Michael McClafferty followed by site visits to gteic @ Gaoth Dobhair & gteic @ Árainn Mhór – MODAM, the Burtonport regeneration project and Crolla Distillery. Partners were based in Dungloe during the visit and feedback on the experience has been very positive.

**Night-Time Economy Buncrana** – Buncrana’s Night-Time Economy Grant Scheme will open on 25 June and close on Tuesday 8 July, local businesses, organisations, and individuals can apply for up to €1000 to fund events and activities after 6pm, with the aim of diversifying and increasing what Buncrana has to offer after 6pm. In June, the Cruinniú na nÓg event with Creative Ireland was well attended, 35 people attended a late café with youth performers. Event Management training was equally well attended.

Work is continuing with Town Team/ Town Centre First and NTE. DCC's Town Regeneration Officer, Patricia McIntyre presented at a Town Centre First event in Athone on 18 June, demonstrating the collaboration between TCF and NTE at a local level in Buncrana. On a national level, NTE advisors have come together to design a training portal for night-time workers to proactively encourage safer night life. Queries regarding access to NTA data, to understand the level of active and issued taxi/ hackney licences, has been raised at a national level.

**Donegal Tourism Strategy 2025 – 2023:** The Donegal Tourism Strategy 2025 – 2030 continues to progress and will be put forward for adoption at the Special Plenary Council meeting on 30 June.

## **2. Local Enterprise Office**

### **July 2025 (figures provided @ 31<sup>st</sup> May 2025)**

**Grant Aid (M1)** – 14 businesses who are manufacturing or trading internationally have received approval for grant aid totaling €297,146.35. Grant aid to recruit staff and purchase equipment as well as consultancy support is available. At the Evaluation Committee Meeting scheduled for June 24th, a further 6 applications will be considered valued at €110,150.

**TOV:** 37 approvals to the value of €78,735.53 have been approved this year to date to support online trading. The Scheme is now closed to new applications and is replaced with the Digital for Business and Grow Digital schemes with support to help small business adopt the latest digital tools.

**Digital For Business/Grow Digital:** 9 businesses were approved support to prepare a digital plan to a value of €35,856.

**Mentoring:** 94 business applicants have been approved year to date up to 12 hours of expert mentoring.

**Training:** 658 attendees have participated in 23 Courses year to date.

**Green for Business:** 14 applicants were approved a green consultant to a value of €30,996 to prepare a sustainability plan for the business.

**Energy Efficiency Grants:** 10 applicants were approved support to purchase new energy efficiency equipment to a value of €82,814.50. 75% support to a maximum of €10,000 is available for businesses employing up to 50 employees.

**Lean For Business:** 5 applicants have secured this consultancy support to improve the efficiency of their businesses to a value of €22,500.

**Market Explorer Grant:** 2 applicants approved for this support to the value of €12,868 to help explore new markets and grow international sales.

**National Enterprise Awards 2025:** At this year's National Enterprise Awards, Seabound Engineering Ltd from Greencastle won the Best Export Award. This marks the third consecutive year a Donegal business has been recognised at the National Enterprise Awards, following wins by Living Green in 2024 and Silver Strand Rope Works in 2023.





**Start Your Own Business Programme:** On 4<sup>th</sup> July we are also holding an in-person SYOB Bootcamp in the Local Enterprise Office, Letterkenny. The next online course is starting on 2<sup>nd</sup> September. The online course happens twice weekly over 4 weeks. Both these Start Your Business courses are a great way for anyone hoping to set up a new business to learn all about what they will need to get up and running. Places on both courses are currently available.

**Get Exporting Programme:** 1 Donegal business has been invited to Stage 3 (In Market Visit) of this national programme. Stage 3, which is currently ongoing, provides businesses with the opportunity to validate their export plan via a customised itinerary within their chosen export market. They are paired with their own in-market mentor and secure at least 4 qualified buyer meetings aligned to their target audience. The overall aim of this programme is to help the business secure their first export sale in their chosen market.

**Scála Business Accelerator Programme:** An 11-week Accelerator Programme focusing on scale-up entrepreneurs, with the potential for fast growth, commenced on April 30<sup>th</sup> with 13 participating businesses. The 11-week programme will end on July 9<sup>th</sup> with an in-person pitching session from each business.

**LEO Business Supports Clinic:** The Clinics take place twice per month – on-line and in-person at locations throughout the county. As well as learning about LEO supports, all attendees will get the opportunity for one-to-one business advice. In June, a virtual clinic was held on June 13<sup>th</sup> with an in-person session taking place on June 27<sup>th</sup> in The Workhouse, Dunfanaghy. Upcoming clinics include a virtual session on July 11<sup>th</sup> and in-person in Bundoran on August 1<sup>st</sup>.

**Donegal Profitnet Engineering Network:** The Donegal ProfitNet Engineering network had the opportunity to tour Terex Corporation at their Ballymoney site on 14<sup>th</sup> May. The Network attendees received a tour of the site and received valuable insights on the company's successful growth and

innovation journey. The network meetings have paused for the Summer with plans to develop and recruit new members for September.



**The Food Academy (SuperValu):** Two Food Producers from Donegal have been successful in receiving places on the forthcoming Food Academy 2025/6. Both applicants are accepting their place.

**The Food Starter Programme** is commencing on September 19<sup>th</sup> and is currently open for applicants. Food Starter is a programme designed to help those with a food idea, or those at an early stage of starting up a food or drink manufacturing business. The objective of the programme is to provide the participants with a base knowledge of what is involved in setting up their food business.

**Ambition - Management Development Programme** The Ambition Programme 2025 starts on September 2<sup>nd</sup>. A very successful information event took place online on 18<sup>th</sup> June 2025. We are currently open for applicants from female entrepreneurs planning to grow and expand their business.

**Enterprise Europe Network (EEN):** The current Enterprise Europe Network (EEN) programme, delivered through LEO Donegal on behalf of the LEO Network as part of the EEN-IE consortium, has seen strong progress since July 2023, with significant achievements in the areas of international partnerships, digitalisation, and sustainability. Highlights include the successful delivery of 29 regional events, 8 international missions, and the development of structured client pathways through tailored action plans and cooperation profiles. As this phase of the programme concludes on June 30, preparations are well underway for the launch of the next programme cycle beginning on July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2025, ensuring continuity of support for Irish SMEs seeking to grow and compete in the Single Market and beyond.

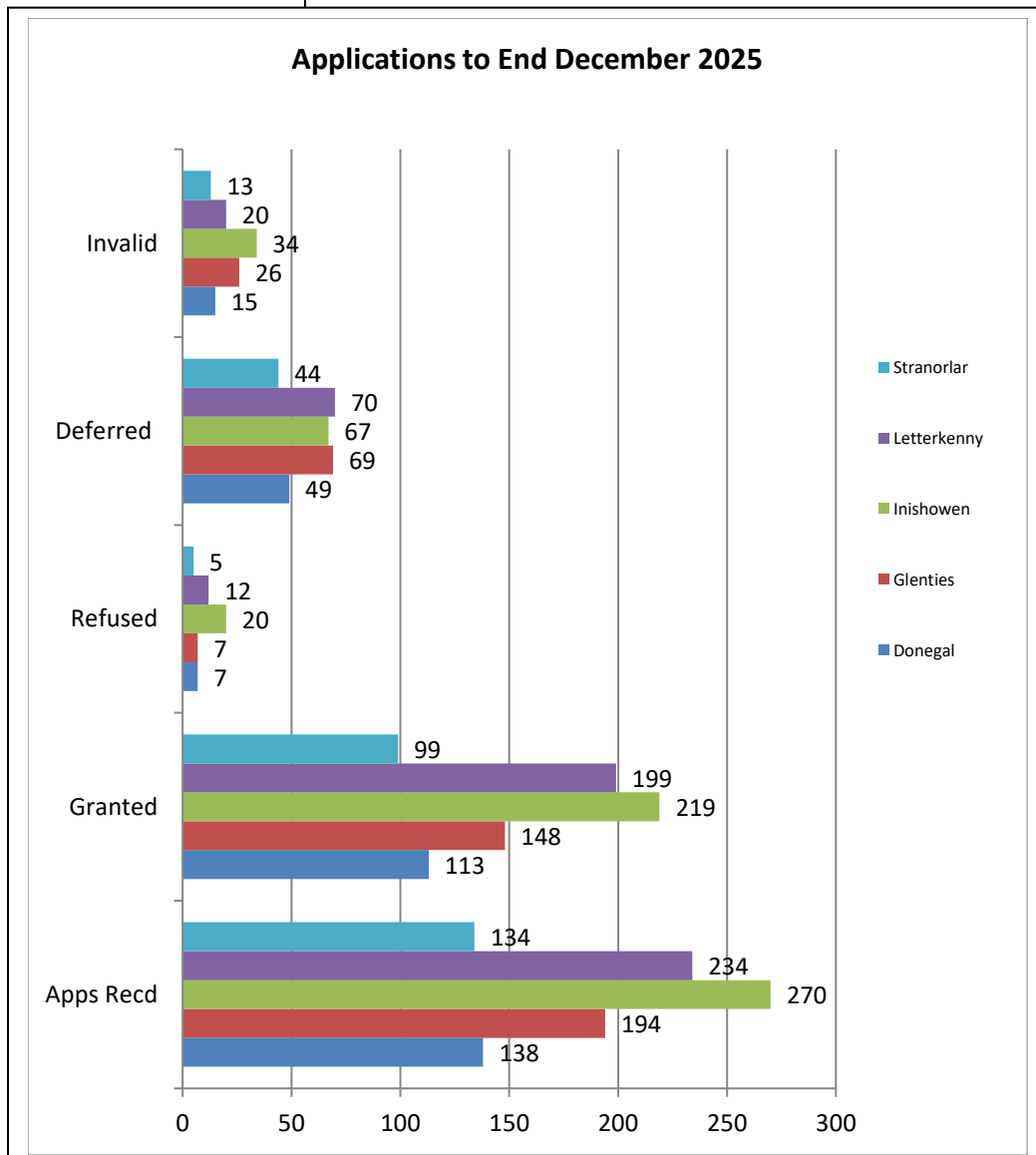

## 4.0 Addressing Vacancy and Dereliction

### 4.1 Property Activation Program

This initiative was launched in April 2023 with targets set for Local Authorities to bring properties back into use. Surveys commenced to identify and verify occupancy status of properties appearing vacant and contact made with some owners. This work will re-commence once staffing resources permit and options will be explored to establish funding source to acquire identified properties. The acquired properties may subsequently be used for social housing, made available for sale on the open market or used for other purposes e.g. community use.

#### 2023 Target:

To activate 350 properties and commence CPO in 6 cases. This has been achieved.

#### 2024 Target:

To activate 300 properties and commence CPO in 6 cases. This has been achieved.

#### 2025 Target:

To activate 300 properties and commence CPO in 6 cases.

## **4.2 Derelict Sites Register**

The update and upkeep of the Derelict Sites Register falls within the remit of the Regeneration and Development Team since last year. There are currently 22 properties on the Derelict Sites Register, which includes 18 properties that have been on the register for several years and 4 new properties that were added to the Register this year so far. At present, all the existing 18 properties are being reviewed to ascertain if each property continues to meet the criteria for inclusion on the Register.

In addition, a Derelict Sites Policy and Procedures document has been developed which sets out the obligations and legislative procedures to be followed in respect of derelict sites and compulsory acquisitions and sets out the Council's priority programme for making additions to the Derelict Sites Register. The Derelict Sites Policy and Procedures document was recently approved by the Elected Members at each MD level and by the Planning SPC.
