### ROADS ACT 1993 SECTION 75, ROADS REGULATIONS 1994, ARTICLE 12 TEMPORARY CLOSING OF ROADS

## Glenties Harvest Fair Friday 12<sup>th</sup> September & Sunday 14<sup>th</sup> September 2025

Notice is hereby given that Donegal County Council intends to make an Order to have the following road closed to traffic on the dates indicated to facilitate events contained in the 2025 Glenties Harvest Fair Festival.

#### Road to be Closed:

The route being closed is the Main Street, Glenties (N56) beginning at the junction of the N56/R250 at Glenties Grotto and continuing as far as the vehicular entrance to Glenties Church Car Park on the N56 Mill Road, at the following times.

#### Friday September 12th 2025 from 8am to 9pm

• To facilitate the running of the annual Glenties Harvest Fair Day with traders positioned along the Main Street and live entertainment also taking place.

#### Sunday September 14th 2025 from 2pm to 8pm

 To facilitate the running of the annual Glenties Harvest Fair Float Parade and on street music and entertainment.

#### **Alternative Routes:**

- Traffic from R262 should be diverted left onto the N56 at Kilraine continuing on to Hillhead, Ardara and there divert right onto the R261 continuing on this route until rejoining the N56 at Maas.
- Traffic from Ardara/Killybegs should be diverted left onto the R261 at Hillhead, Ardara continuing on this route until rejoining the N56 at Maas.
- Traffic from Leitir Mhic an Bhaird/An Clochán Liath should be diverted right onto the R261 at Maas and continue on this route rejoining the N56 at Hillhead, Ardara.

- Traffic from Letterkenny/Ballybofey (R250) should be diverted right onto the N56 at Glenties Grotto and rejoin the N56 at Hillhead, Ardara via the R261 at Maas.
- Traffic intending to use the R253 should be diverted onto the R252 at the R253/R252 junction at Glenmore and advised that access to Glenties is not possible via this route.

Persons wishing to object to the closure should submit objections in writing to the Roads & Transportation Section, Donegal County Council, County House, Lifford before **4.30pm on Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> August 2025.** 

In the event of objections being made to the granting of proposed road closures, the Council reserves the right to make the details of the objections available to the licence applicant where it considers it necessary in order to fully consider the validity of any of the objections received.
