Sir,

I am directed by the L.G. Board to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 14th. instant respecting the rate of remuneration to be allowed to you for your services during the time in which you temporarily discharged the duties of Executive Sanitary Officer in the Dunfaneghy Rural District.

In reply, I am to refer you to Article 4 of the Sanitary Order no. 1, dated May 3rd. 1900, which provides that "no officer shall be appointed under this Order unless an advertisement specifying . . . the amount of salary, proposed to be assigned (subject to our approval) . . . shall have been inserted by direction of the Sanitary Authority in some public newspaper circulating in the District."

Attention has been drawn to this matter on two occasions, namely in the Board's letters of April 19th., and July, 9th. 1901, but no evidence has ever been furnished to the Board to show that the provisions of this article were complied with, and their sanction was never given to your appointment.

As the Board have not sanctioned an increase in the salary fixed by them for the office of Executive Sanitary Officer, they consider that you cannot be paid for your temporary services at a higher rate of remuneration than £5 a year.

3rd. That the remission of the aforesaid tax of 4^d in the £ should in no way prejudice our rights under the Act of 1876, in regard to the repayment of ~~our~~ surplus monies advanced by the guaranteeing areas.

4th. That as the earnings of the Letterkenny line had not been ascertained by independent audit, and the ratepayers having no security that the Working Company, gave full credit for the legitimate earnings of the Letterkenny trains, we respectfully request that the Board of Works should seriously investigate this matter, in order to ascertain whether the ratepayers have been fairly treated.

The Clerk was directed to forward the original petition to the Chairman, Board of Works and to send copies to the Chief Secretary for Ireland, Mr. Hugh A. Law, M.P. and Mr. Jim Healy M.P.

Gentlemen,

During the past quarter very little surface labour has been done by road contractors, they being chiefly engaged in preparing their winter materials. The majority of your roads are in full fair repair some are unsatisfactory from loose stones and I now warn contractors that more attention must be paid by them to keep their roads free from loose stones as much as possible in future.

The statutory limit of expenditure having been reached for the current financial year, no proposals can be formulated at this meeting. I fear that sooner or later it will be found necessary to have the limit raised to a small extent. As the existing continuing liabilities that is continuing maintenance contracts for a term of years are £1220 yearly and this amount is not likely to become less. Deducting this figure from the legal limit £1648:15:0 the balance remaining is £428:15:0, to cover all necessary masonry repairs occasional road repairs and new works, also any sudden damages which may occur.
