Extracts from the Medical Officers Quarterly Reports (30<sup>th</sup> June 1901) relating to the Public Health in the Glenties Union Carrick. The District is in fairly good sanitary condition. The drawbacks as to the quality and quantity of the Carrick Water Supply are very much accentuated by the present drought

Dungloe W.O. 1. The District is in good sanitary condition except that there is no water supply

Dungloe W.O. 2. Water for domestic use is scarce and bad owing to absence of springs and long spell of dry weather. Cattle and hens are kept in the dwellings which are often too small for human inmates.

Glenties. Better ventilation is required in dwellings and it would be advisable if manure were kept at a greater distance from Dwellings

I have repeatedly reported on the very deficient water supply for the village of Glenties also the want of privy accommodation to the houses in the village. In sanitary reports made by me the Sanitary Authority order abatement of

nuisances in conformity with my recommendations but the same state recurs. Till the Sanitary Authority enforce the law the district is left open to outbreaks of any disease.

The Council directed the Clerk to notify the Sanitary Sub Officers of the districts concerned to make a thorough inspection regarding the alleged defects in the sanitary condition thereof and to report to the Council accordingly. No action be taken regarding the water of any district till the area of charge be absolutely arranged.

Read the following from Dr G. W. Thompson Medical Officer of Health of Droochary Dispensary District, 17<sup>th</sup> September 1901.  
 As medical officer of Health of the Droochary Dispensary District I hereby report to you that I have this day received the communication given below in inverted commas from James Boyle SSO "I hereby draw your attention to the house and premises of Daniel Walsh of Derrylacconnell from which several members of this family were removed to Glenties Workhouse said to be suffering from an infectious disease" I visited the place and found cattle in the dwelling house and manure near the same and I recommend the cattle to be kept out of the dwelling house, and the manure to be removed twenty yards from the dwelling house. In case the district council find on inquiry from Dr Kelly that Daniel Walsh his wife and two children who are in hospital or any one of them is suffering from an infectious disease I recommend that the relieving officer be requested to have the rest of the family who are in Derrylacconnell, namely Annie Walsh aged eighteen years, Patrick Walsh aged 12 years, Peter Walsh aged eight years and an infant 3 weeks old, removed to an isolated ward in the Hospital and that the Sanitary Sub Officer be requested to have the house thoroughly cleaned and disinfected and thereafter to whitewash both the inside and outside of the house.

The Council on the motion of P. H. O'Donnell seconded by Thomas Connell, agreed unanimously to the following resolution "That Dr Kelly be asked to report regarding the cases in the Fever Hospital." Subsequently Dr Kelly appeared before the Council and on being asked, said they were suffering from Simple Fever, but neither Typhus or Typhoid. The Council then ordered that the Sanitary Sub Officer have these premises limewashed and disinfected.

With reference to the alleged nuisance at Postnoo the following was read from Dr Kelly, Superintendent Medical Officer of Health.

Sir  
In conformity with your instructions I visited the townland of Lackagh and inspected a sewer that persons in the locality had complained of as a nuisance. At the time of my inspection (after rain) there was no offensive matter, but I am sure that in the hot weather the discharge from this pipe as it then was opening 4 feet from a water flow which is used by those in the locality was highly objectionable and in my mind a nuisance. I found that this pipe which was left open and discharging 4 feet from water supply has been continued as a closed pipe having a concrete covering for 18 feet further thus preventing any discharge, as in the first instance it now discharges into a County pipe crossing the road leading from the County Road leading direct to the Port and opening into a field passing through the corner of the field for 15 yards and then flows in the upper water table of the road leading to the Port for 30 yards at then breaks over the road in several places.

I do not undertake to say whose duty it may be but in my opinion the sewerage from this pipe should not be allowed to continue as in hot weather the effluvia must have been as described to me as dreadful - a public nuisance of this kind should be promptly dealt with.

With reference to the order of the Council on the extracts from the Medical Officers Returns, Form L the following was read from John Ward, S.S.O.

Gentlemen.

In compliance with your request I have surveyed and inspected the portion of my district in which the Glenties Dispensary District is situated, and with regard to the sanitary condition thereof I beg to make the following observations. Generally speaking the aforesaid district is in a fairly good sanitary condition. The practice of keeping cattle and fowl in houses has almost entirely disappeared. The houses too are much improved in consequence of my impressing on the owners the advantages of lime-washing. Manure heaps are allowed to accumulate and remain in the majority of the yards of the village of Glenties. In all these instances I have repeatedly brought the matter under the notice of the sanitary officer by serving him with the usual notices (Form B) but strange to say I have not received any notices (Form A) which you generally order to be issued when you are satisfied of the existence of a nuisance.

When I perceived that these notices were not forthcoming, I verbally pointed out to the owners of some of these places that they should keep them in a more sanitary state and I am glad to say that my suggestions are very often complied with, but

a recurrence generally takes place, as it is only the serving of the usual notices that makes compliance with the law compulsory

over this a coating of finer gravel 3" deep for the  
entire length opposite the houses forming New Ross.

When this is done the District Council should exercise  
their powers and deal severely with any parties  
found emptying refuse again on the roadside. The  
nuisance has been brought about altogether by  
the people inhabiting that street who have no  
more right to pollute their street than the  
inhabitants of any other street. The occupiers  
of those houses should be compelled to make

No 58-502 19<sup>th</sup> October 1901

The Local Government regret to observe that the Council did not see fit to have some leaflets regarding the dangers and preventatives of Pulmonary Tuberculosis printed and circulated in the District, and trusting that the Council give this important matter favourable reconsideration.

The Council after consideration agreed to act on the suggestions of the Local Government Board, and instructed the Clerk to have a supply of leaflets printed, and distribute them amongst the Councillors.

24/10/1901 Read report from Gerald B. Snape Esq. Inspector of Factories 124 Donegall St. Belfast regarding the Sanitary accommodation at Mr. Morton's Carpet Factory Kellybegs as follows: "Visited the workshop occupied by Messrs Morton & Co. Kellybegs found 2 earth-closets with rail only for seat to accommodate 114 workers. In my opinion this is insufficient and unsatisfactory."

25/10/1901 Read report from Dr. J. H. Gallagher Medical Officer of Health, Kellybegs as follows: "I consider the sanitary accommodation at Mr. Morton's Carpet Factory Kellybegs is sufficient for the number of hands employed here at present, but I again recommend that the sewer pipe be continued on to the sea."

26/10/1901 With reference to this report of Dr. Gallagher Charles Cannon S.P.O. reported that the sewer complained of is one leading from the Carpet Factory's privies, which empties

into a stream used by the inhabitants of the locality.

Resolved that the usual abatement of nuisance notices be sent to Mr. Boston.

Charles Cannon S.S.O. further reported that he served notices of abatement of nuisances on several people in Glencolumbkille all of whom complied, served others in Largymore but time given to comply has not expired yet.

James Boyle S.S.O. Dunglea reported that under his direction the house of Daniel Walsh Dungleaconnell who is at present in the Glenties General Hospital suffering from fever was thoroughly disinfected, and promising to forward an account of the expenses incurred by him in connection with the disinfection.

The Council directed the Clerk to communicate to Mr. Boyle that his account could not be entertained by them.

Mr. James Boyle S.S.O. further reported regarding the Typhus Fever Cases in Arranmore and that Dr. McBarthly suggested that a man should be employed to keep a strict watch of the 2 houses so that the inmates would not be permitted to mingle with the other people in the locality and requested the observations of the Council on the proceedings. The Council decided that no man was necessary for the purpose suggested.

The Board at the same time state that they regret to observe that the Council do not meet often for the consideration of business under the Public Health Acts and they do not effectually discharge their duty as the Sanitary Authority. The attention of the Council is drawn to the Public Health Act Section III. Report

The sanitary sub officers sometimes report insanitary houses &c without inspecting same. They report at each meeting. They do not keep Diaries They do not submit the blocks of their reports at each meeting of the Council There is no Inspector of Diaries D. Kelly reports that nuisances recur. Notices are generally served in pursuance of the orders of the Sanitary Authority but the matter often ends there. There are no sanitary conveniences in Glenties or Dungloe. No prosecutions under the Public Health Act have been instituted since last inspection. More attention should be given to sanitary matters. The pump at Tullybegs is out of order. There is no water supply at Burtonport, Dungloe or Glenties or Carricks, and that available is insufficient and inferior.

There is an offensive open drain at Dungleo complaints have also been received from Borlao & Tullybegs.

The Executive Sanitary Officer does not enter in his Report Book the results of the orders of the Sanitary Authority. There are no Bye-Laws under the Public Health Act

There is no register for Common Lodging Houses & no Disinfecting apparatus. Neither the Infectious Disease (Notification) Act nor the Prevention Act-1890 has been adopted by the Sanitary Authority.

The Common Lodging Houses to be Registered.

The Council meet almost every alternate fortnight since the quorum has been reduced to 7. We believe

no 3569. Read letter from the L. S. B dated 25<sup>th</sup> January 1902 forwarding to be laid before the Council a further letter which they received from Mr. O. Boyle relating to the condition of the Kincaulagh Graveyard and directing the Council to obtain a report from the Medical Officer of Health on the subject complained of.

With reference to the above the Council received the following report from Dr. J. E. Eardley

The Minutes of last Meeting were read and signed.

In accordance with your instructions I visited the Kincostragh graveyard and found the following state of affairs. The graves in many recent instances are not dug sufficiently deeply. Some of them have hardly sufficient soil to cover the coffins. There is a drain running from Mr Boyle's house thro' the graveyard and emptying itself out to road. It is open and would be a source of probable danger. In one place the walls are in bad repair. There is a manure heap in immediate proximity to Boyle's House which allows any foul matter to be conveyed to the open drain running thro' the graveyard. I would suggest the following: That the walls be repaired, the drain be covered over or pipes laid down and that the drain discharge itself some place when there will be no danger of its becoming a source of danger to the Public Health. That no new graves be made or opened until sufficient soil be brought to cover graveyard to a depth of 4 feet.

The Council ordered that Boyle be noticed to remove the manure heap and divert the drain from his premises. That the Rev. Monsignor Walker be noticed to have the boundary wall of the graveyard repaired and that sufficient soil be brought to cover graveyard to a depth of 4 feet at least.

That we, the Council of the General District of Glenties, desire to direct the attention of the Right Honourable the Chief Secretary for Ireland, to the fact, that in a considerable number of Unions in this country, the duty of the preparation of the Parliamentary Voters and Jurors Lists has been transferred by the Local Govt (Ireland) Act 1898, to Secretaries of County Councils. That duty can be satisfactorily done only by the Clerks of Unions, who have all the requisite local knowledge at their disposal to enable them to properly perform the work. That the section of Clerks most particularly affected by the operation of the Act in this respect, are officers upon whom has devolved an amount of work and responsibility, equal in every way to that borne by the more fortunate Clerks who were existing officers at the passing of the Act. That as the cost of the preparation of the Parliamentary Voters and Jurors Lists though paid by the County Council is essentially borne off the Unions concerned, we think it only just

and equitable, that this work should be transferred to the Clerks of the said Unions, that such retransference would be a merited addition to the remuneration of the Officers who have been so injuriously affected, by the operation of the Act, without the Guardians having to impose an extra burthen on the rates. That we cannot but view as unwise and unfair, from the standpoint of efficient and careful work, the centralization in the County Councils office of the preparation of the Parliamentary Votes and Jurors Lists for the whole of this County as well as for other Counties. That the result will be to enormously increase the yearly salaries of the already well paid County Secretaries (an increase of over £800 per year in Downal) and to greatly lessen those of the Clerks of Unions who have been appointed since the passing of the Local Govt. Ireland Act 1898 and who may in future be appointed. We therefore trust that the theory of vastly increasing the emoluments of one office in a County, to the impoverishment of all the other offices under the Local Govt. Board in the same County may be reconsidered and reversed. That therefore considering the justice of our request, we respectfully call upon the Chief Secretary to take steps to have the law amended, so that this duty should be retransferred to all Clerks of Unions.

That copies of this Resolution be sent to the Right Honorable the Chief Secretary and our County day of Members.  
 The Council wish to inform the Local Govt Board that they cannot see why this duty was ever transferred as it is a physical impossibility for the Secretary of the County Council to discharge this duty and it was worked out very badly in this Union and it is a duty which shall be amended.
