The Local Govt. Board wrote with reference to the closing of the Workhouse, and stated that an Order of the Local Government Board would be necessary, to enable the Guardians to pay for the maintenance of the destitute poor sent from their Union to other Workhouses.

The alternative to boarding out the inmates would be to amalgamate the Union with the Unions adjoining and if the Guardians so desired the Board would take into consideration the propriety of adopting the latter course.

Ordered: "The Guardians desire to inform the L. G. Board that the scheme lately formulated by the Guardians, provided simply for affording Out Door Relief to the present inmates of the Workhouse who are all over 65 years of age and the Guardians wish to know whether such a scheme requires the sanction of the L. G. B. At present the Board of Guardians have no desire to amalgamate with any of the adjoining Unions as their poor is much lower than that of any of them."
