Read letter from the Local Government Board dated 18th February 1915 No. 8649 forwarding copy of the Auditor's report on the Council Accounts for Half-year ended 30th Sept 1914 accompanied by an attested Abstract of the Accounts

Read further letter from the Local Govt Board dated 2nd March 1915, No. 9643, forwarding a copy of the Auditor's Report on the Accounts of the Londonderry Port Sanitary Authority for the year ended 31st March 1914 together with an attested abstract of the Accounts

Read letter from the Local Government Board dated 18th February 1915, No. 8685, asking the Council to again take the subject of Londonderry Water supply into consideration with a view of taking action to provide a pure water supply, as their Inspector J. Stephenson has informed them that the wells of Londonderry when he inspected them some time ago were in a filthy condition, liable to pollution and constituted a grave danger to Public Health and that he is of opinion that the present water supply is unfit for drinking or cooking purposes

On the motion of Councillor Scott seconded by Councillor McFonologue it was resolved that the Local Govt Board be requested to state whether they are prepared to confirm the

area of charge for the water supply on
 Camdonagh town and town parks as fixed
 by their Sealed Orders of 23rd April 1884 No 14279/84
 and dated 18th February 1902 No $\frac{47477}{1901}$

On the motion of Councillor Scott seconded by
 Councillor Diver, it was resolved that Capt
 McFlintock be requested to erect a slaughter
 house in Camdonagh for the use of town of
 Camdonagh

On the motion of Councillor McFonnell
 seconded by Councillor Scott, Councillor Daniel
 McFarron was appointed the representative
 of this Council on Londonderry Port Sanitary
 Authority for the ensuing year

Read circular letter from Mr. Bernard
 McFadden Secretary, Donegal Co. Council
 stating that the Insurance Committee for the
 county has requested the various Rural
 District Councils in the county to adopt Part I
 of the Tuberculosis Prevention (Ireland) Act 1908.
 As they consider it will be impossible to stamp
 out Tuberculosis until this is done

Read letter from Mr. W. J. Ingram, Clerk of Unions, Strabane, dated 15th February, 1915, stating that he has just undergone an operation and is not feeling strong enough to undertake the Arbitration in connection with the adjustments to be made as between this Council and the Banerana Urban Council.

The matter was adjourned for a month.

Read letter from Mr. Charles Callaghan, Town Clerk, Banerana dated 22nd February 1915 requesting to be supplied with the plans of Banerana Waterworks as his Council intend to prepare a supplementary water scheme.

The plans were forwarded on Mr. Callaghan undertaking to return them if required.

Read letter from the General Post Office, London, dated 2nd January, proposing to deal with the drainage from Malin Head Wireless Station by a septic tank discharging into a stream 200 yards west of the site.

The communication was referred to the Medical Officer of Health, Dr. McLaughlin who considered the proposed mode of discharge objectionable in hot weather.

In a further letter dated 16th February the Post Office intimated they would not proceed with the scheme.

Stating that she has given permission to make a roadway and entrance to the Council's cottages recently erected at Linsfort and has arranged with Mr. O'Callaghan the spot for the roadway, that seems most satisfactory to all concerned but that the Council must repair her fence which has been damaged by the cottage tenants.

Ordered that the Engineer be directed to provide for this in his specification.

Read letter from Mr. James O'Donnell, the Council's Solicitor, dated 27th February, 1915, stating that the consent of the owner Mrs. Harvey will be necessary for the proposed roadway at Linsfort cottages.

Ordered that the Clerk write to Mrs. Harvey for her consent.

Read further letter from Mr. James O'Donnell, dated 27th February, 1915. Stating that it will be necessary to have the Council's title registered to Plot 2.5 B, Drumameir, exchanged by the consent of the Local Government Board, for Plot 2.5 A Drumameir acquired under the Inishowen R.D. Labourers (Unopposed) Order 1909. also asking for

the Land Certificate and the L. G. B. authority for the exchange

The application of Michael Toland of Glenmakee, to be accepted as tenant of cottage No 118 in succession to his brother John deceased was approved

The applications for the ~~no~~ cottage about to become vacant in Oxisternan, No 41 were adjourned for a month further applications to be received.

Read letter from the Local Govt. Board dated 23rd February 1915 No L. 1758/112/1915 sanctioning the payment of £27.5.0 to the clerk being final instalment of remuneration in connection with No 4 Improvement Scheme 1912

Also letter of same date No L. 1759/112/1915 sanctioning the payment of £1.5.0 to the clerk as final instalment of remuneration under Scheme 3, 1909 Paying orders were passed for these amounts

Read letters from Messrs Edward O'Fallagher and F. Nolan Engineers dated 20th and 27th February 1915 respectively making arrangements for the meetings of the several Sites committees

Read letter from Mr. Patrick Porter D.C., Buncrana dated 27th February 1915 stating he had attended the meeting of Buncrana Sites committee in Buncrana fourthouse same day but that only one other member Mr. B. McKrory attended out of the eight appointed and no meeting was held as they feared it would not be legal

An account from Mr. Bernard McKerr for 2/6 car hire incurred ^{in connection} with Dunerana Sites Committee was approved.

After due public and special notice the ~~The~~ Clerk submitted 7 additional Representations for new cottages under the Labourers Acts relating to the Electoral Divisions of Ardaraun, Camdonagh, Gleneely, Glenties, and White Castle.

On the motion of Councillor McConalogue seconded by Councillor Cole it was resolved that being satisfied as to the necessity for more cottages and of the sufficiency of our resources we hereby decide to refer these to the Sites Committees for inclusion so far as approved in the Improvement Scheme No 5 now in course of preparation.

On the motion of Councillor J.P. McIvor seconded by Councillor Edward Kearney a vote of sympathy with the relatives was passed on the death of Councillor W^m Quigley who was ever a friend to the poor and a help to all in need and in whose death would result a great loss to the district and to the Rural District Council

The vote was supported by Mr. Scott, chairman of the Board of Guardians

Councillor McIvor moved after due notice "that the vacancy in the representation of Whitecastle E.D. on this Council, caused by the death of Mr. William Quigley, be filled by the co-opting of Mr. Joseph Grant of Meenavenagharr, Quigley's Point." The motion was seconded by Councillor P.J. Cole and passed unanimously.

The following Letters from the Local Government Board for Ireland, and others, were read by the Clerk, and directions given to answer them, respectively, to the following effect (or Orders made on them, respectively, as follows):—

On the motion of Councillor Dr. Goos seconded by Councillor McBonalogue it was resolved that the County Council be requested to direct the Inspector of Weights and Measures to visit Quigley's Point and Malin Head for the purpose of adjusting the weights of traders in those districts

Read letter from Mr. John Anderson, J.P., Gulladuff House, Moville dated 10th April 1915 requesting the Council to make a granolithic foot path and crossing in Malin Road, Moville

The matter was brought to the notice of the local Councillors

Read letter from Andrew Robb, Esq., Solicitor, Derry, dated 17th March, 1915, requiring this Council and Boards to declare vacant the offices of District Councillor and Guardians held by Mr. P. J. Cole, otherwise he is instructed to take proceedings to obtain a mandamus in the King's Bench Division of the High Court to compel the Council and Boards to perform their duties

Read letter from Mr. James O'Donnell, Londonderry, the Council's Solicitor, dated 23rd March, 1915 relative to the disqualification of Mr. P. J. Cole stating⁽¹⁾ that he is of opinion it is mandatory on the Council to declare the office vacant (2) that a mandamus would lie against the Council if they failed to do so, the cost of which the Council would have to pay.

After a discussion it was Resolved on the motion of Councillor Lavanagh, seconded by Councillor McConnell that the whole correspondence be referred to the L.G. Board together with a full statement from

Councillor Cole setting forth the case from his point of view, for their opinions as to the Council's duty and also to state whether Mr. O'Connor must first proceed against Mr. Cole by quo warranto before a mandamus would lie against the Council.

Mr. Cole gave a verbal undertaking to keep the Council free from cost.
