The Reports of the Clerk on execution of Orders previously made.

Read letter from Mr. J. Steadman, Co. Surveyor, dated 7<sup>th</sup> August 1915, stating that owing to exceptionally heavy falls of rain in some localities in Inishowen recently, several roads suffered rather severely. In Meenacolin a bridge and water wall were carried away; In Galwilly the road was badly cut up; the Illies bridge was carried away, and a bridge in Tullydish rendered unsafe, requiring new superstructure &c. He strongly recommended the District Council to ask the County Council to apply to the L.G. Board to allow the Limit of Expenditure to be increased by £250 for this year.

On the motion of councillor James P. M'Ivor seconded by councillor Edward Kearney it was Resolved That an application be made at once to the Donegal County Council to ask the Local Govt. Board to allow the Limit of Expenditure in Inishowen R.D. to be increased by £250 for this year.

That we most respectfully ask the Clergy of all denominations, and in particular Managers of Schools, in co-operation with the District Councillors of the several Electoral Divisions of this Union, to use their best efforts and influence to urge lagging parents and guardians of children to send them regularly to school, so otherwise the Compulsory Education Act may have to be put in force with all its attendant prosecutions and costs. That a copy of this Resolution be sent to all Managers of Schools.

On the motion of <sup>Councillor</sup> ~~Mr.~~ Patsy McGrovy seconded by Councillor James Kelly, it was Resolved that the resolutions forwarded by Mr. J. Kelly, Hon. Sec. of a conference held in Dublin on 20<sup>th</sup> July last, be adopted, viz.

- (1) That we declare we will not have Conscription, +
- (2) That a National Committee be formed, with full power to add to their number, to do all acts necessary to have the country's voice heard on the resolution first adopted, the Committee to be composed of one delegate from each body represented at the Conference.

Read Letter from the Rev. J. McFafferty, Adm. Letterkenny dated 5<sup>th</sup> August 1915, asking the Council to appoint four delegates to a county convention to be held at Letterkenny, under the auspices of the United Irish League, on 17<sup>th</sup> Aug. 1915 at 12.30 p.m.

The following delegates were appointed:—  
Councillors Chas. McColgan, James Kelly, Denis Diver, and Patsy McConalogue J.P.

Read Letter from Mr. Jas. C. O'Donnell, Sobri, Derry, dated 22<sup>nd</sup> July 1915, forwarding an account from Mr. A. W. McLaughlin B.C. for £2.2.0 for inspecting measuring and estimating the damage done to a gate and gate piers, the subject of a Malicious Injury claim by Edward Collins of Dreenagh at the June Quarter Sessions in Carradonagh, and for attending Court & giving evidence. Mr. O'Donnell stated that 10/6 had already been paid to Mr. McLaughlin.

On the motion of Councillor Cole seconded by Councillor McConalogue a further sum of one and a half guineas was allowed.

On the Motion of Councillor Dever, it was decided that the several school teachers of this Union be requested to send to the Clerk of the District Council a list of the names of the parents and the number of non-attendant children as to days at school, said list to be read out quarterly at the meeting of the Council in November, February, May, and August, in each year.

Read Letter from Mr. F. Nolan, B.E., Engineer, dated 4<sup>th</sup> August 1915, forwarding Certificates of Completion and final certificates in several cases of Cottage Contracts, and recommending the Council to purchase a new design of Chimney pot which has been put on the market to try on one of the smoky cottages, as an experiment. Also asking whether Bonner & Sons, Contractors, can be induced or compelled to proceed with the building of the cottage in Tullysally.

It was decided to purchase one Chimney pot as suggested, but adjourn the question of action against Bonner & Sons till Sept. meeting.

Read Letter from Mr. Ed. Hallaghan B.E. Engineer, dated 8<sup>th</sup> August 1915, stating that Mr. Bonner came up to start at remedying the defects in the cottages at Buneraua, but had to put off work until he gets a Permit from the Board of Trade to get gravel from the foreshore. That he has promised them to proceed & finish up. Also that Wm. McLaughlin, Contractor, for the entrance road to Linsford cottages, has started work and will be finished for next meeting.

Read Letter from Mr. Patrick Doherty, Rent Collector, Dhoiville, dated 24<sup>th</sup> July 1915, stating that John Farren tenant of cottage No. 75, Ballylawon, had given notice to surrender his cottage on 31<sup>st</sup> July 1915.

The Clerk said he had put out notices inviting applications for the vacant cottages in Ballylawon and Glentogher, but had received none.

An application of Wm Donaghy, tenant of Cottage No. 106, Buncrana, applying for permission to board up the door of the back shed and to erect another small shed for turf, was granted on condition that he does the work at his own expense and that under no circumstances can any claim for compensation be entertained.

Read Circular Letter from the Labors Dept. L.G. Board, requesting a return in relation to the cottages authorized under the Inishowen Labourers Orders of 1909 and 1912.

Read letter from the L. G. Board dated 7th Sept 1915 forwarding copy of the Auditor's report on his Audit of the Accounts for half year ended 31st March 1915, in which he stated "the Council should impress upon their collectors the necessity of diligence in the discharge of their duty duties. They should call punctually upon the tenants for their rents, they should attend regularly for the checking of their books and they should make their lodgements at least once a month."

Read letter from the Director of Recruiting, War Office, London, dated 9th Sept 1915, requesting to be informed to what extent it has been possible to release eligible men to join H.M. Forces since April last.

It was resolved to reply that the Dist Council have no eligible men in their employment that they are able to release.

A supply of Pamphlets entitled "Why we should save and How" received from the Irish War Savings Committee was laid before the Council and distributed.

Read letter from Mr. James E. O'Donnell, Solicitor, Derry, dated 19<sup>th</sup> August 1915, forwarding Bill of Miscellaneous costs amounting to £ 8.17.3 and stating that if taxed the <sup>Taxation</sup> items amounting to about £ 2. would have to be added, and if settled without taxation he will accept £ 8. 8. 0.

On the motion of Councillor Scott seconded by Councillor Proctor it was resolved to dispense with taxation in this case as the amount is small and to accept Mr. O'Donnell's offer and pay him £ 8. 8. 0 in full settlement subject to the approval of the L.G. Board.

Read letter from Mr. R. O. D. Brown, Labry Hotel, Quigley's Point dated Sept. 10, 1915, sending report of a meeting held on 5<sup>th</sup> Sept 1915 at Glunelly, protesting against the actions of the County Surveyor in removing the footpaths in Whitecastle Division, and requesting the Council to give him instructions to have the footpaths put in as good repair as before the road was repaired under the Road Board Grant.

The question of taking steps to compel Messrs J. Bonner Sons to carry out their contract for building a fottage at Plot 34 Lullyally under the Duchowen, P.D. Labourers (Unopposed) Order 1912 as adjourned from last meeting having come under consideration the clerk stated that Mr. J. Bonner, Senr. informed him that morning that he had the material on the ground and was waiting for the payment of the balance of his contract for Buncrana fottage to enable him to start the Lullyally fottage

Read letter from Mr. George Baldricks, Licowen, Buncrana dated 4<sup>th</sup> September 1915, stating that he would have to take legal proceedings if the fences between his land and the fottage at Larry Row, Buncrana are not repaired according to specification as his crop has been destroyed by trespass.

Read letter from Mr. Edw. O'Fallashan, L.C., fottage Engineer dated 11<sup>th</sup> September 1915, reporting that the fottage at Buncrana are practically completed and the final certificates can be issued at next meeting, also that the fence and road approaches at Finisfort fottage are finished but not yet inspected; further adding with reference to Mr. Baldricks' complaint (set out above)

that the fence is an existing hedge which we did not disturb and he cannot understand about the trespass as neither of the occupants of the cottages has any cattle or sheep on the plot.

No action taken on Mr. Baldrick's complaint.

~~The Clerk~~ The Proposal of Mr. John J. Doherty, of Larrowmore, Glenties to become tenant of Labourer's Cottage No 35 on condition that the Council pay the arrears of rates due against it was read on the motion of Councillor Scott seconded by Councillor Kearney accepted, the Council to pay the arrears of Poor Rate

A Proposal of Mr. John Farrell to become the tenant of Cottage No 75 Ballyglawr was adjourned, the local Councillors to be consulted about the case

Read letter from Mrs. McCartney, Mrs. David Muller, Joseph Murray, and John Muller of Ballyglawr Cottages, Inverville dated 3rd Sept 1915, complaining of the conduct of Annie Mellor of Cottage No 62 and that none of the people living in the cottages is willing to put up with her any longer.

The Clerk was directed to notice the tenant, Francis Mellor, her husband, that the tenancy will be terminated unless she ceases to annoy the neighbours.

Read letter from Mr. P. A. Wilson, Local Registrar of Titles Lifford dated 6th Sept 1915 stating that the Land Certificate on Folios 7178 and 7268 may be retained here, the Land Certificate on Folio 7205 to be returned to him to have the exchange of plots 2.5a and 2.5b completed. (This Certificate was returned to him)

Read letter from the L. G. Board dated 27<sup>th</sup> August, 1915 No L. 8473/112/1915 Stating that owing to the abandonment of one cottage authorized by the Inchowen P. D. Labourers (Opposed) order 1912, the loan must be reduced by £170 and that the balance available for issue will be accordingly only £20 also saying that any expenditure incurred in excess of this sum will have to be met either out of Current Revenue or by means of a Supplemental loan obtained in the open market.

On the motion of Councillor Scott seconded by Councillor P. McLaughlin it was resolved that the Local Govt. Board be asked to permit to be charged to the loan of £42.50 sanctioned under the Inchowen P. D. Labourers (Unopposed) Order of 1912, the excess expenditure of about £32 on the loan of £510 as reduced now to £340 under the (Opposed) Order of 1912 and that they be requested to issue the balance of £20 of the latter loan.

The Resolutions of the Roscommon Co. Council was adopted and a copy ordered to be forwarded to the State Retrenchment Committee for Ireland, as follows:—

Resolved - That we express our opinion that the operation in Ireland of the National Health Insurance Act is needless, irritating alike to employers and workers and does not meet the approval of either of those two classes. It is almost a useless expense to the local rates and to the workers, as well as to the State, and we request Parliament to repeal the Act so far as it relates to the Rural Districts of Ireland.

Read, pericular letter of the Local Govt Board, dated, 8<sup>th</sup> Novr., 1915 No 162 M. Miscellaneous relative to Overdue Accounts, pointing out that in general the date on which a claim becomes due is that on which the services for which payment is claimed are completed.

On the motion of Councillor McFonabque seconded by  
Councillor Denis Doherty the Council after due notice  
adopted the legal annual limit of expenditure on  
roads viz £ 5257 .. 10 .. 0 as their estimate of roads  
expenditure for the financial year ending 31<sup>st</sup> March 1917.
