Mr. W. Colburn J.P. stated that the action of the County Council at its last meeting by throwing out or rejecting all the Roads Contracted for and leaving the roads now without Contractors had left this District in a very bad state and seeing there are so many Mountain Roads ~~found~~ in this Rural District if roads of this class get flooded in winter and not under contract it will cost three times as much to put them in order again. and especially seeing that this Rural District has a Credit Balance of over £2000, to its Credit, one of the best in the County.

That the reason for making the reduction of the material was owing to the war and had the material not been reduced Contractors could not be obtained.

Mr. J. S. Sweeney proposed that the action of the County Council in rejecting all the tenders sent in at last half-yearly meeting in this Rural District be condemned - inasmuch as that according to the last audited Aps of the County Council the Letterkenny Rural District Council had one of the best Balances to its Credit of any Rural District in the County being over £2000, as against others having only £160 or so. - That the reduction of the material suggested



was owing to the war, and was for one year only, as otherwise Contractors could not be obtained.

That the County Council is requested to reconsider this matter at the first meeting of the County Council and place the said works under Contract, as by refusing to do so, and owing to so many Mountain Roads in this District it will take three times as much money to do the necessary repair.

That the Councillor representing this District on the County Council be requested to attend said meeting and support this Resolution and also that the Councils Solicitor be instructed to attend and support this Resolution seconded by Mr W. Colthoun P. and passed unanimously.

That a Copy of this Resolution be forwarded to the Secretary of the Co Council & also the Councillor representing this District and the Solicitor.

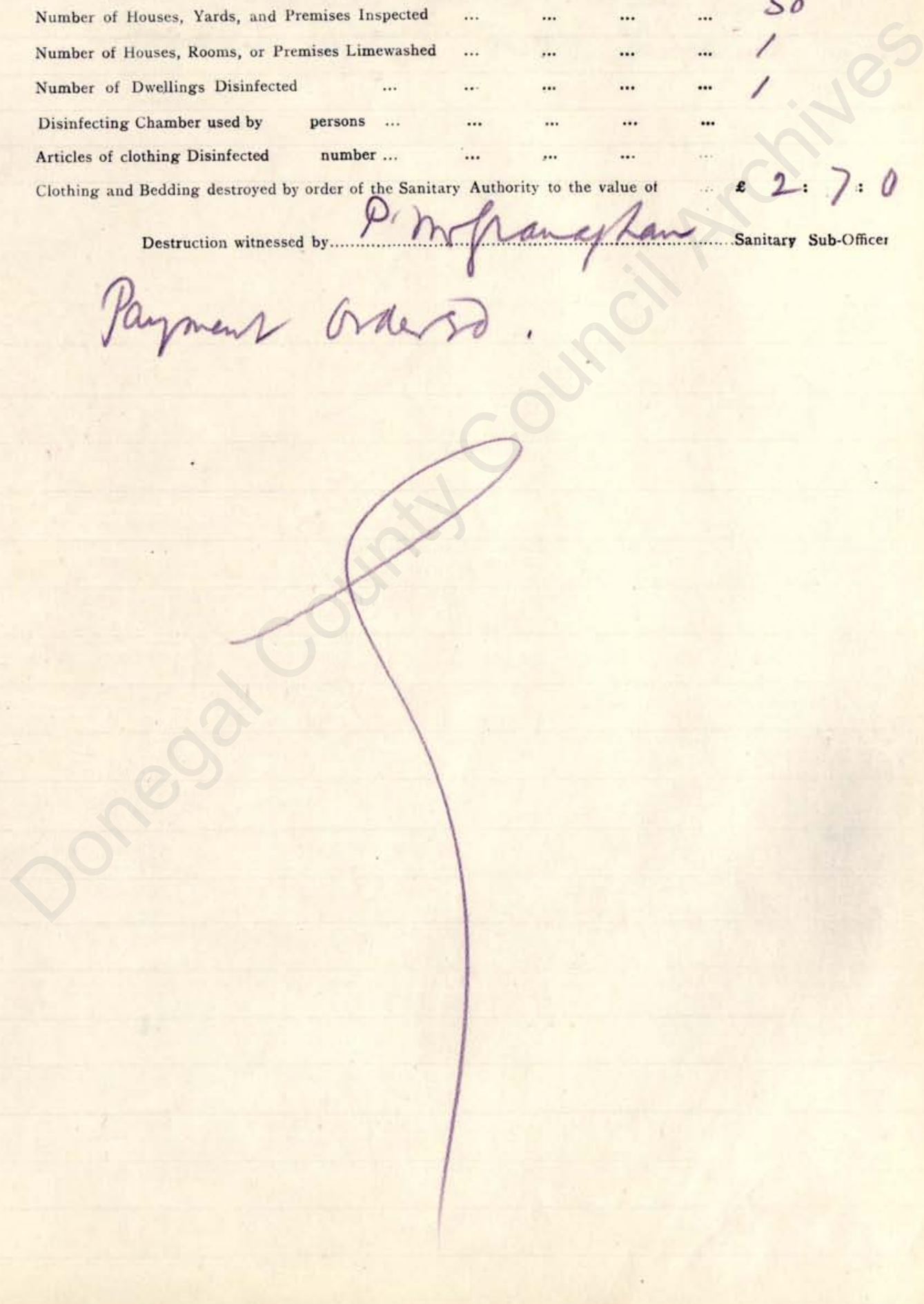
