Ordered that advertisements be issued inviting tenders for repairing the pump and keeping it in good working order for ten years

Uniform for sanitary sub-officers

Read application from the Sanitary Sub-officer asking the Council to provide him with a uniform and stating that District had agreed to contribute one third the cost of same. It was agreed to do so, and Messrs Hanna, Mitchell & Craig were appointed a committee to join with the Council in selecting the uniform

A & B cottages repairs

Mr W Laughrin Engineer to the Council was directed to report at next meeting as to what repairs were necessary to all the existing labourers cottages except those in three streets down and the estimated cost of same.

Stoughton well

Read report from Messrs Craig & Simpson in regard to Newtoncunningham Well, stating they found a plentiful supply of good water in it, in their opinion it was the same as every other well in the country, and called for no special attention from the Council. A discussion took place regarding the well which it was proposed to improve, and the Sanitary Sub-officer was instructed to report at next meeting as to whether the well was situated on private property before taking any action.

Ordered payment of 10/- Court costs in a Sanitary prosecution against Richard Rolstone, the latter having no means and the Sanitary Sub-officer having stated it would be impossible to recover the costs

W. Perry was appointed Registrar at a salary of £5 per annum.

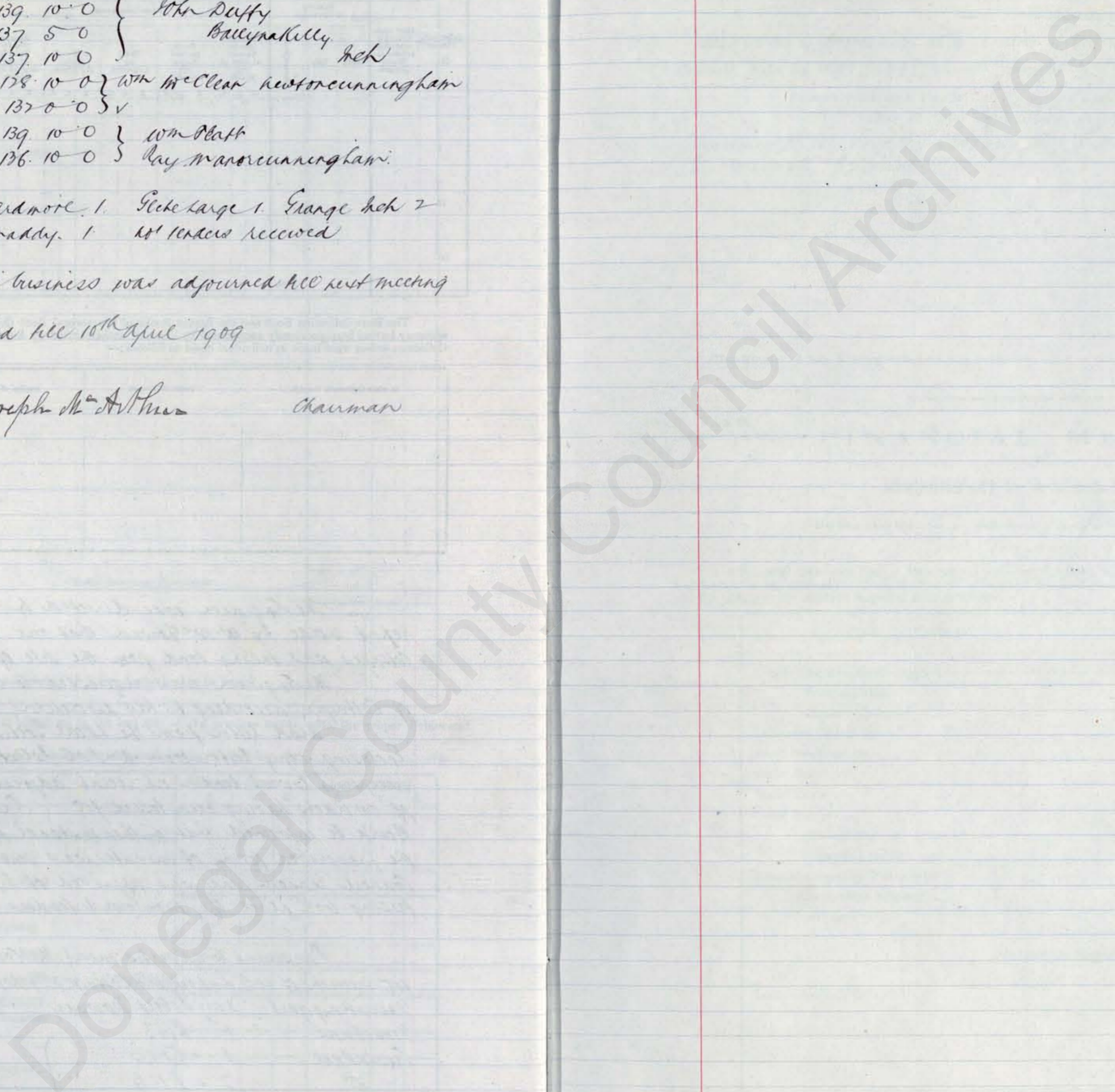
