Clontock Contractor for labourers Cottages regarding houses built in Bunduff's fort for which he had not been paid for though they were finished and occupied nearly 12 months. Mr. Callaghan reported there were certain matters yet to put right, and it was decided to take no action.

Read letters from reports of houses at Droagh, regarding water supply, to action was taken.

Ordered that legal proceedings be taken against James Dorian, Bunduff's fort, for failure to comply with notice served on him under the Public Health Act.

Read letter from the Local Government Board dated 21st Febry. to L2338. Enclosing letter from a man named William Sharkey relative to the delay of Council in providing him with a cottage. Ordered that the Local Govt Board be informed that the Council, by resolution on 11th February, decided to abandon the cottage, owing to dispute regarding site, 9th March to L3244. Enclosing letter of complaint from a man named Patrick McGeary, relative to the condition of his cottage. Mr O'Callaghan, to whom the letter had been referred reported the house was not so bad as stated. Replastering both gable, and repairing smoke draught in kitchen chimney were required, and he would notice the Contractor at once 3rd June to L3405. Requesting particulars required by Rule 66 of the Labourers (Ireland) Order 1896.

Read letter of 7th inst from Thomas Lecky, Contractor for building one Labourers Cottage, stating he was emigrating to Canada and that his partner Mr C Davis, would complete the work and asking the Council to pay Mr Davis, the balance due on foot of Contract, when certified by Engineer. The Council agreed to do this.

Read letter from Mr C Calowill solicitor on behalf of John Hall, and Andrew McCay Castlecedley, regarding fences at plots taken on their farms. The letter was referred to the Engineer. Resolution from Irish Cattle Traders Association, regarding meat marking Bill, was adopted.

The Clerk submitted account from Mr Wm McLaughlin Engineer for inspecting, and reporting, as to best means of improving drainage at Ballynally. Ordered that he be paid £1-0-0 for the work.

Read letter from Mr J G Dickson solicitor informing the Council that if Mr Wm McLaughlin's claim for Engineer's fees under the Labourers Act, was not paid within one week, he was instructed to take proceedings. Ordered that Mr Dickson be informed that the Council cannot at present pay any money to Mr McLaughlin as Mr O'Callaghan reported that work had not been completed at houses, where final certificates had been issued.
