Read letters from the Local Government Board viz:—

Therefore stated that in dealing with contracts for labourers Cottages, the regulations laid down under Section 201 of the Public Health (Ireland) Act 1878 should be observed. The clerk stated this would be done.

23 July No 117 M urging the necessity for increased vigilance in connection with administration of the Public Health Acts in the District. The clerk directed the attentions of the Sub Sanitary Officer to the matter.

13 July 1896 forwarding report from their inspector Mr. O'Donnell consequent on his recent inspection of cottages erected and in course of erection.

Read letter from Dr Rankin Medical Officer of Health in Killea District, stating scarlatina of a mild type had occurred in his district at Mr. Masons of Castle and he was taking all necessary precautions regarding discontinuance of milk vending, disinfection, etc.,

On the motion of Mr. Rankin <sup>seconded by the Chairman</sup> it was resolved that the Donegal County Council be asked to apply the Registration Act in County Donegal.

Read application from sanitary officer Kitson for an increase to his salary. Ordered that same be specially considered at meeting on 11<sup>th</sup> September.

Read reports of existing nuisances from Medical Officers of Health of Kilderry District when usual notices under Public Health Acts were ordered to be served.

Ordered payment of £1 to John Duffy for repair to houses at Ballynakilly

Read letters of 7<sup>th</sup> September from Mr. Fracy Councils Solicitor regarding deduction of £3 made from his bill of costs in connection with Scheme C. Labourers Acts in respect of site which had been abandoned. Mr. Fracy stated he had investigated the titles and had more trouble over this plot than nearly all the others combined and it had only been abandoned at the last minute and if it did not come within the scope of his agreement with the Council and he was to charge for all legal work done in connection with it £3 would not cover the amount due him. On the motion of Mr. Craig, seconded by the chairman it was ordered that Mr. Fracy be paid £3 for law costs in connection with this site. The Local Government Board asked to sanction same.

Read report from Messrs. Kelly and O'Callaghan Engineers regarding D.K. Mooney's contract for building houses, stating there had been great delay in completing this contract and asking for direction regarding fines.

The Council decided ~~not~~<sup>not</sup> to strike any fines on the contracts owing to the exceptional circumstances of the present time.  
Messrs Kelly and O'Callaghan also reported they were getting matters referred to in Mr. O'Donnell's report attended to, but owing to the harvest it was not convenient for the Contractor to get much done.

Read letters from the Local Government Board. viz -  
20<sup>th</sup> August No 43581 regarding rates of interest on Local Loans  
27<sup>th</sup> August No L561/20 regarding cottage No 41<sup>a</sup> and stating as contract period had almost expired without any work having been commenced, Council ~~did~~ should cancel the contract and defer building cottage until after the war Mr. Kelly Engineers stated the contractor ~~had~~<sup>had</sup> commenced work on the house during the past few weeks.

The Seal of the Council was affixed to current agreements for building cottages of D. Hooney & M. Laughlin, D. McCafferty and H. Hamilton

It having been reported that Carrigans pump was out of repair the Acting Clerk was directed to write the contractor for keeping same in order requesting him to have the pump repaired at once

Read letter of 2<sup>nd</sup> September from Secretary Donegal County Council regarding National Registration Act 1915 Stating County Council decided not to take any action

The Acting Clerk submitted Form of Notice of Application for Compensation for Malicious Injury in respect of alleged malicious burning at Cornamble when it was ordered that same be referred to Mr. Tracy Solicitor to defend.

The Rent Collector submitted list of minor repairs required at three ~~houses~~<sup>cottages</sup> when same was referred to Local Councillors to have necessary repairs effected

Pursuant to notice the Council proceeded to consider application from Sub-Sanitary Officer Kiteon for an increase to his salary After discussion it was unanimously resolved, on the motion of Mr. Craig, seconded by Mr. Bryce to grant him an increase of £5 a year as from 1<sup>st</sup> July last.

17<sup>th</sup> Sept. No 60271 asking Council's reasons for increasing Sub Sanitary Officer Kitson's salary by £5 a year.

Ordered that the Local Government Board be informed that Sub Sanitary Officer Kitson is a good official who carries out his work well and is vigilant in the discharge of his duties.

29<sup>th</sup> Sept. No 29910, stating they would not raise any objection to payment of £3 to Mr Tracy, Solicitor in respect of his services in connection with proposed acquisition of site at Honey more.

24<sup>th</sup> Sept. No 9720 relative to Council's proposal to waive the fines incurred by Mr DeLooney in respect of delay in completing his contract under the Labourers Acts and stating Council are not empowered to remit such penalties in full.
