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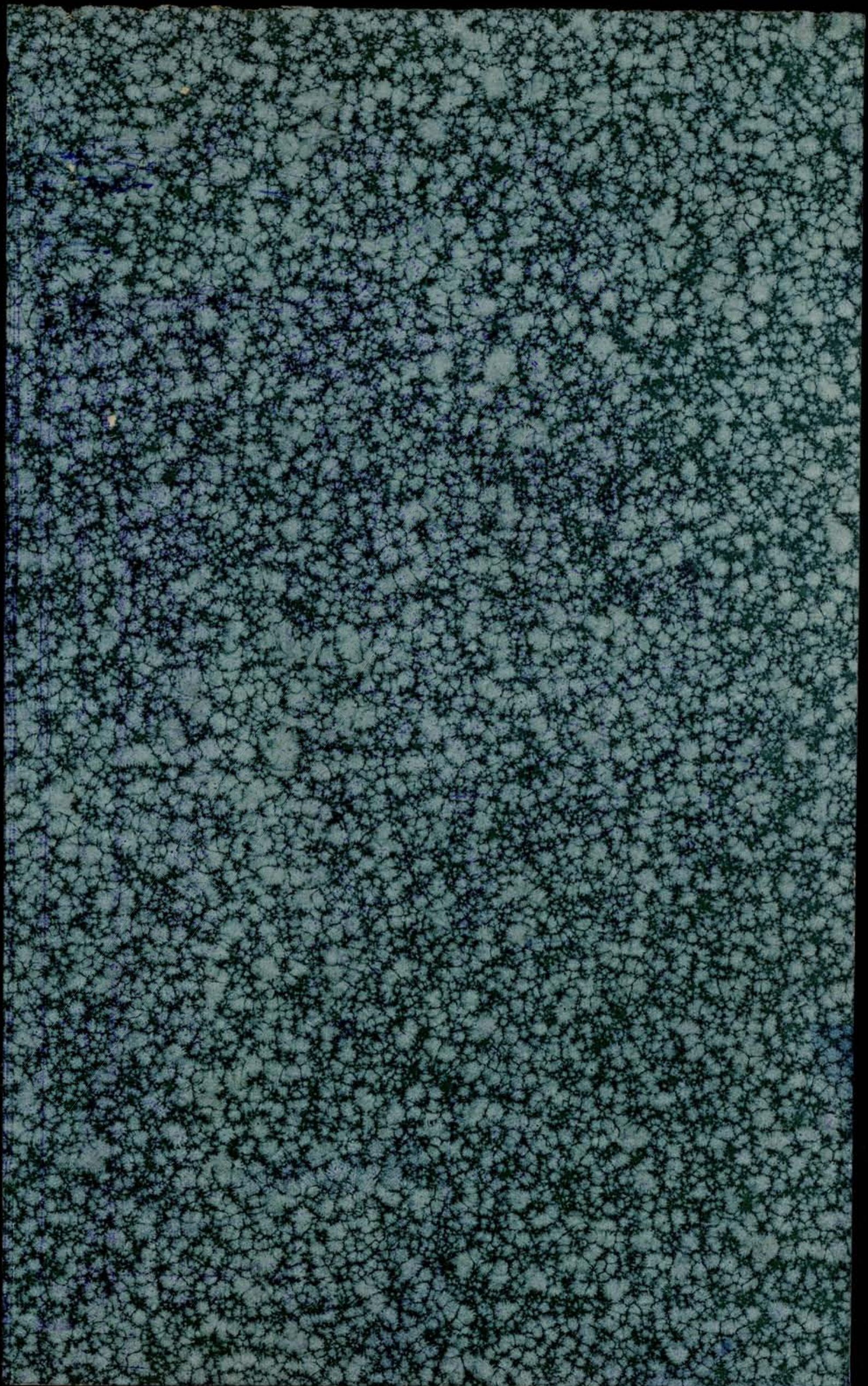

there are 9 Cottages in Drumacrin completed & ready for occupation. The owner of the land adjoining this block of cottages however complains ~~about~~ the drainage, and he (Mr. Kelly) recommends the Council to have a drain made to take away the water complained of. The cost of carrying out the work would be about £10.

He points out that as the time for completion of a number of cottages has expired he would ask the Council to make him an allowance for extra visits including the works.

Minute:- That the drainage above referred to be carried out at cost not to exceed £10 sanction of Local Government Board Requested. The penalty of £1 per week for delay in completion of work mentioned in clause 4 of specification for erection of Cottages to be reduced to £1 per month subject to approval of Local Government Board. Question of extras to Engineer to be considered later on.

The report of the Clerk of Works was submitted which showed that the quality of work & materials employed at erection of Labourers Cottages is good but the work is proceeding slowly.

# Ballyshannon Rural District.

## Amended Regulations made by the Ballyshannon Rural District Council with respect of the Letting of Cottages and Allotments under the Labourers' Acts.

From and after the Confirmation of this Regulation, the Regulations under the Labourers Acts which were made by the Rural District Council of Ballyshannon, on the 3rd day of December, 1910, and confirmed by the Local Government Board for Ireland on the 24th day of April, 1911, shall be amended by the substitution of the following Regulations for Regulations Nos. 3 and 11 of the said Regulations :—

3 (a) The tenant of each cottage in the District Electoral Divisions of Ballintra, Ballyshannon Rural, Bundoran Rural, Bundoran Urban, Carrickboy, Cliff and Cavangarden, shall pay the rent to the collector, or other person, authorised by the Council.

3 (b) The tenant of each cottage in Ballyshannon Urban District Electoral Division shall pay the rent (and Rates as hereinafter provided), to the collector, or other person, authorized by the Council.

11 (a) The tenant of each cottage in the District Electoral Divisions of Ballintra, Ballyshannon Rural, Bundoran Rural, Bundoran Urban, Carrickboy, Cavangarden and Cliff, shall pay all taxes, Poor Rate, and outgoings in respect of the premises during the tenancy and shall keep the windows of the cottage and the fences of the garden or plot in repair.

11 (b) The tenant of each cottage in the District Electoral Division of Ballyshannon Urban, shall pay all taxes and rates, as hereinafter mentioned, and shall pay all outgoings, payable in respect of the premises during the tenancy, and shall keep the windows of the cottage and the fences of the garden or plot in repair.

11 (c) In addition to the monthly rent set forth in the Schedule specified by the Regulations, each tenant in the Ballyshannon Urban District Electoral Division, shall pay along with his monthly rent to the collector, or other person, authorized by the Council, the monthly sum of one shilling and twopence towards the rates on his holding.

11 (d) Each tenant in the Ballyshannon Urban District Electoral Division shall pay to the collector or such person as aforesaid along with the monthly payment of rent in the month of May in each year, and in addition to the usual instalment of one shilling and twopence, a further sum which shall appear from the Rate Collector's Demand Note to be sufficient to discharge the rates on the said holding up till the 31st day of March following, assuming that all the said monthly instalments of one shilling and twopence each shall be duly paid up to that date.

11 (e) The Council shall discharge the rates payable on each holding in the Ballyshannon Urban District Electoral Division as they fall due if the sum sufficient to enable them to do so has been paid into their hands as aforesaid by the tenant of such holding.

11 (f) If any tenant in the Ballyshannon Urban District Electoral Division makes default in paying the said monthly sums of one shilling and twopence and the sum payable as aforesaid in the month of May in each year, his payments previously made shall be forfeited to the Council.

11 (g) On the determination of any tenancy in the Ballyshannon Urban District Electoral Division all sums paid by the tenant to the Council in respect of the rates as aforesaid, shall be retained by the Council to be applied by them towards the payment of the rates for the period during which the tenancy continued.

The Council submits that as these gentlemen were qualified when elected nothing that has occurred imposes disqualification; and paragraph (6) of Article 11, makes the acts of these persons valid even disqualified. There is nothing to be gained by pressing for vacancies.

Thomas Eorman (Jr) was co-opted by the Council at its first meeting and resides within the Urban area of Bundoran. As he was co-opted he represents in a manner all the <sup>Electoral</sup> Divisions and no Electoral Division in particular. This gentleman recently purchased premises in Bundoran Rural Electoral Division and will in future have a qualification in the Rural District.

In all the circumstances the Council urge that there being nothing to be gained by a change pending the triennial elections that the Local Board will favourably consider the views of the Council and allow the representation to proceed as it now stands.

Of course these gentlemen can still act as guardians for Bundoran Urban area.

That the keys of the town waterworks be lodged with the Clerk of the Council, who shall hold them and issue them only to be used by such persons as are authorised by him - That no person be permitted to introduce water from the watermain without the written permission of the Council. That the use of the water supply be not permitted for use of driving machinery or for steamrolling purposes. That water supply be cut off town from 11 pm until 5.30 am on Saturday and Sunday nights to allow a supply to accumulate in Reservoir and that 200 handbills be distributed amongst householders notifying them of same.

That the Clerk take any action he considers necessary in an urgency to maintain a sufficient water supply.

Below is given schedule giving particulars asked for. It will be observed that a number of the cottages were not completed within the specified time. This was occasioned through the difficulty in obtaining labour and materials generally, and in some cases through difficulty in obtaining title and the Engineer and we are of opinion that the work was carried out in a most expeditious manner under the circumstances, and that no penalty should be imposed for delay in completion of the work within the specified time, the work being in progress at same time as the military authorities were erecting a military encampment at Finner, within this District which absorbed nearly all available labour; and the winter months being unsuitable for proceeding with the work. The contractors themselves found they were unable to obtain materials from the wholesale firms with whom they had contracted for their supply.

We therefore request the Local Government Board to sanction the proposed payment of £5-0-0 per house in addition to contract price for the Cottages set out in attached Schedule
